# ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (53-48) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (51-50) July 24, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 12:35 EDT - GAME \#102/HOME \#52 LHP MATTHEW LIBERATORE ( $2-2,4.15$ ERA) vs. LHP MARTíN PÉREZ ( $1-5,5.61$ ERA) 

THE PIRATES:...lost 2-1 last night in the middle game of their three-game series against the Cardinals...Are tied for the second-best record (11-7) in the National League this month along with Arizona (the Mets have a National League-best 12-7 record in July)...Have won 12 games in their last at-bat (the most since winning 13 games in the final at-bat of 2022)...Have gone $38-4$ (.905 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season.... Have drawn at least one walk in 66 straight games, which is the longest active streak in MLB (the longest streak for the season is 75 straight games by the Phillies from $4 / 15$ to $7 / 9$ )...Have played in 34 one-run games, which are the second-most among National League teams behind the Cubs (36)...Have the fourth-most quality starts (48) in MLB behind the Mariners (62), Phillies (55) and Royals (52)... Have the fourth-best ERA (3.51) among all starting rotations in MLB behind the Phillies (3.20), Mariners (3.28) and Royals (3.50)... Rank seventh in MLB in innings pitched (549.0) among starters...Rank second in all of MLB in stolen base percentage ( 83.3 percent) behind the Brewers ( 84.7 percent)...Have gone 12-2 on the 14 occasions the team has stolen multiple bases in a game this year... Have won nine straight and 12 of their last 13 games when scoring at least four runs... Have gone 17-2 since the beginning of June when scoring first in a game...Have gone 16-16 in games started by opposing lefties....Are 7-6-3 in their first 16 home series.

A FAN-TASTIC SHOW OF SUPPORT: Last night's paid attendance of 32,422 was the largest for a Tuesday game at PNC Park since July 5, 2022, against the Yankees (37,733)...The largest crowd to attend a game on a Tuesday in PNC Park history is 38,867 on June 24, 2008, which also came against the Yankees...The first five games of the current homestand has drawn an average attendance of 33,665 .

ON DECK: The Pirates will begin a road trip Friday night with three games against the Arizona Diamondbacks before traveling to Houston for three more against the Astros from July 29-31...The Pirates have gone 5-1 on the road in the month of July after taking two of three games at Milwaukee and sweeping the White Sox in three games in the final trip leading up to the All-Star break.

ABOUT TODAY'S STARTER: Martín Pérez gets the start this afternoon in the finale of this three-game series against the Cardinals...This is Pérez second start this month against St. Louis after allowing just one run in 7.1 innings on July 4 here at PNC Park...Since that game, Pittsburgh's starting rotation has recorded a 2.91 ERA (52.2ip/17er) in the last nine games at PNC Park.

ABOUT THIS SERIES: Each of the last 13 games between the Cardinals and Pirates has been decided by three or fewer runs...According to StatsPerform, no other matchup in MLB has an active such streak of 10 or more consecutive games...The Pirates are 0-2 in their first two series against the Cardinals this season heading into the deciding game of this series today (the Pirates are 7-9 in the rubber game of a series)...Beginning tomorrow, the Pirates won't face
 their division for 24 straight games until the team hosts Cincinnati on August 22.

KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew McCutchen ranks 11th in Pirates history coming into today with 1637 hits...He is one shy of tying Hall of Famer Fred Clarke for the 10th-most in team history.

CALL TO THE PEN: Carmen Mlodzinski stranded his inherited

STARTING OFF: The 33-year-old lefthander is in his 13th Major League season, having played for the Rangers (2012-18; 2022-23), Twins (2019), Red Sox (2020-21) and Pirates (2024)...He was named an American League All-Star with the Rangers during the 2022 season...Today will be his 16th start of the season for the Pirates and his 304th career appearance on a Major League mound (excluding Postseason)...A native of Guanare, Venezuela, Perez was signed by the Rangers as an international free agent as a 16 -year-old on July 2, 2007.

He made one rehab start with Triple-A Indianapolis on June 22 vs. Iowa (CHC), allowing two runs (one earned run) on five hits with four strikeouts and no walks over 5.0 innings of work ( 63 pitches, 41 strikes).

LAST TIME OUT: Had a no-decision (3.2ip/6r/6er) in the team's 8-7 walkoff win Friday night against the Phillies.

GOING DEEP: He has pitched into the eighth inning twice this season: 7.1 innings on July 4 vs. St. Louis and 8.0 innings on April 9 vs. Detroit.

REACHING MILESTONES: In his outing on June 28 at Atlanta, Perez made his 300th career Major League appearance, making him the 15th active player to have made $300+$ appearances and $250+$ starts and the sixth left-hander to do so, joining Clayton Kershaw, Chris Sale, Wade Miley, Patrick Corbin and Jose Quintana.

Along with 300 appearances, Perez also eclipsed 1,500.0 career innings pitched in that start, making him just the ninth Venezuelan-born pitcher in Major League history to record $300+$ appearances and $1500+$ innings pitched, joining Felix Hernandez, Johan Santana, Anibal Sanchez, Carlos Zambrano, Carlos Carrasco, Freddy Garcia, Wilson Alvarez and Kelvim Escobar.

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF: At the time of his injury on May 26 vs. Atlanta, Perez ranked among the NL leaders in opponents grounded into double plays per 9.0 IP (1st, 1.41), opponents grounded into double plays (T2nd, 9) and pitches per batter faced (5th, 3.62) [min. 50.0 IP...stats represent start of the season thru May 26].

VS. ST. LOUIS: Perez will be making his fifth career appearance/start against the Cardinals today...He has gone 1-0 with a 2.36 ERA ( $26.2 \mathrm{ip} / 7 \mathrm{er}$ ) in his previous four start assignments.

He had a no-decision in his only start against the RedBirds this season at
PNC Park after allowing one run in 7.1 innings in a 3-2 10-inning loss.
2023 RECAP: Split the season between the starting rotation and bullpen for the World-Champion Rangers...Ranked in the 71st percentile in groundball percentage according to Baseball Savant, inducing opposing hitters into 18 grounded into double plays, which were tied for the seventh-most in the American League (his 1.14 grounded into double plays per 9.0 innings also ranked third among American League pitchers with at least 100.0 innings pitched).

- Appeared in three postseason games for Texas last year, including a relief appearance in Game 2 of the World Series.
- Made two starts while pitching for Venezuela in the World Baseball Classic.
