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THE TWINS: Have gone 2-2 through four games on their final roadtrip of the season, winning games two and four over the weekend in Anaheim...tonight, Minnesota will begin their final road series of the season with the first of three at Oracle Park against the Giants.
✦ Twins have six games remaining...after this roadtrip, they return home to finish the season with a three-game series vs. the Rangers from September 25-27.

DISNEY DOMINANT: The Twins beat the Angels yesterday afternoon in Anaheim by a score of 8-0, their fifth shutout of the season and second on this trip (3-0 win on Friday)...Dean Kremer (4-5) was the starter and winner, pitching 6.0 shutout innings, with one hit allowed, three walks and eight strikeouts...Bailey Ober pitched 3.0 shutout innings of relief and earned his first career save...marked the 14th different Twin to record a save in 2026, extending the club record...the offense recorded 13 hits and went 5-for-10 with runners in scoring position...Brooks Lee, Josh Bell and Alan Roden each recorded three hits, as Roden drove in four runs, including his first major league homer of the season.

SAVE, BIG MONEY: 14 different pitchers with saves is tied with Washington and Chicago-NL for most in baseball...previous Twins record was nine in 1965, 2019 and 2022...below are the 14 and when they got their first save:

WORTH NOTING...Jeff Hoffman and Tommy Nance are the only relievers in the Twins 'pen currently without a save for Minnesota.

CALL ME 'BATO: The Twins have selected the contract of first baseman Aaron Sabato from Triple-A St. Paul. Sabato, 27, played in 113 games for the Saints this season, hitting .273 (114-for-417) with 29 doubles, one triple, 25 home runs, 75 RBI, 66 runs scored, 41 walks, a .349 on-base percentage, a .528 slugging percentage and an .877 OPS...on September 11 vs. Syracuse, he set the Saints single-season record by hitting his 29th double of the season, and his 25 home runs are tied for most in a season in Saints' Triple-A history.
✦ The Rye, New York native was selected by the Twins in the first round (27th overall) of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of North Carolina...over parts of six minor league seasons in Minnesota's organization, the 6-foot-11, 239-pound first baseman has played in 599 games, hitting .231 (496-for-2146) with 115 doubles, three triples, 111 home runs, 353 RBI, 321 runs scored, 318 walks, 21 stolen bases, a .339 on-base percentage, a .443 slugging percentage and a .781 OPS.
✦ To make room for Sabato on the 28-man and 40-man rosters, the Twins have designated catcher Alex Jackson for release or assignment...Jackson played in 33 games for the Twins this season, hitting .304 (21-for-69) with four doubles, one home run, five RBI, 12 runs scored, two walks, a .342 on-base percentage and a .748 OPS.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: Aaron Sabato will be the 14th different player to make his major league debut for the Twins this season, which will tie a Twins record (since 1961)...Twins to debut in 2026 were Andrew Morris, Kaelen Culpepper, Connor Prielipp, Walker Jenkins, Kendry Rojas, Kyle Fedko, Mike Paredes, Emmanuel Rodriguez, Ben Ross, Gabby Gonzalez, Woosuk Go, John Klein and Marco Raya...below are the all-time Twins/Senators franchise record (since 1901) for debuts in one season (credit *Elias Sports Bureau*):

WE WERE GIANTS: The Twins and Giants are playing each other for the 28th, 29th and 30th times in their history this week...27 games are Minnesota's fewest vs. any opponent in their history (since 1961)...the Twins are 14-13 all-time against San Francisco, going 7-2 at Target Field, 6-9 at Oracle Park and 1-2 at the Metrodome...dating back to June of 2017, the Twins have won 10 of their last 15 over the Giants.

✦ Twins last played the Giants for three games at Target Field from May 9-11, 2025, sweeping in three games.

✦ Twins last visited Oracle Park for three games from July 12-14, 2024, winning just one game.
✦ Over his last 13 games vs. the Giants, Josh Bell is hitting .306 (11-for-36) with eight walks, a .432 on-base percentage and a .904 OPS.

WALK TO REMEMBER: Walker Jenkins finished the four-game series in Anaheim with nine hits in 17 at-bats, including two home runs, three RBI and just one strikeout...below are his first 16 career games (August 28-September 16), compared to his last four games:

THAT'S HOW I(L) ROLL!: Twins have gone just 16-29 against National League opponents this season...they have gone 5-10-0 in series play vs. the NL...Twins last NL opponent was the Padres at Petco Park, getting swept in three games from August 21-23...their last win vs. an NL opponent was a three-game sweep of the Braves at Target Field from August 17-19.

KEEP THEIR HEADS RINGIN': Josh Bell drove in his 90th and 91st RBI on the season yesterday.

✦ 91 RBI are seventh-most in the AL...the last Twin to finish the regular season in the top 10 in the AL in RBI was Eddie Rosario, completing the 2020 pandemic season tied for sixth with 42 RBI...the last in a full 162-game season was Rosario (109) and Nelson Cruz (108), finishing sixth and seventh in 2019.

✦ 91 RBI are the second-most of Bell's career (116 in 2019 for Pittsburgh).

✦ He's the first Twin to reach 90 RBI since Jorge Polanco recorded 98 in 2021.

✦ His 767 career RBI rank 28th on MLB's list among active players.

AL-WAYS ON TIME: Alan Roden has 10 hits in his last 20 major league at-bats in six games, dating back to August 12...in that span, he is hitting .500 (10-for-20) with three doubles, one home run, five RBI, two walks, a .545 on-base percentage, an .800 slugging percentage and a 1.345 OPS.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: On this day in 2010, the Twins defeated Cleveland by a score of 6-4 and clinched their sixth division title in nine years as Ron Gardenhire earned his 800th managerial win...in 1997, Brad Radke pitched 10 innings to beat the Brewers 2-1 and earned his 20th win...he is one of 13 pitchers in club history to win 20 games and the last Twins starter to pitch 10 innings in a game.
