TODAY’S STARTERS: RHP RANDY DOBNAK (3-3, 2.54) vs. LHP RANGER SUAREZ (6-4, 3.44)

K-CITY TRIUMPH: The Royals began their final road trip of the season with a 3-2 win at Fenway Park last night, their 2nd straight victory on the heels of a 2-7 skid in their previous 9.

- + The Royals had 10 hits and 5 walks, but went 3-for-15 with runners in scoring position and stranded 10 baserunners.
- + **Carter Jensen** had 2 of the Royals 4 doubles, had an RBI and scored 2 of their 3 runs, while **Vinnie Pasquantino** and **Salvador Perez** each had RBI knocks.
- + **Seth Lugo** allowed 2 runs in 5.0 innings and four Royals relievers combined to pitch 4.0 scoreless innings.

WHAT’S AT STAKE: After winning the series-opening game here last night, the Royals can clinch the series with another victory today or tomorrow...it would be the Royals 1st series win since Aug. 28-30 in Cleveland and would snap a 3-series losing streak to the Marlins, Blue Jays and Diamondbacks.

- + A win today would mark their Royals 1st series victory in Boston since 2017 and would snap a run of 7 consecutive series losses here, during which they’re 6-17 (.261).
- + A win today would mark the Royals 4th consecutive road series victory, a streak that began in Anaheim from Aug. 14-16 and continued in Toronto and Cleveland...they have not won 4 straight road series in nine years, since 2017.

SERIES OF EVENTS: The Royals have lost each of their last 3 completed sets on the heels of a 5-series win streak...this marks the first time they’ve lost 3 straight series since June 9-17 vs. Texas and Houston and at Washington...they are 17-26-4 in 47 series, including 8-7-1 since the All-Star break.

STREAKING HAVOC: The Royals are 16 games under .500 (66-82) and 9.0 games out of a Wild Card spot with only 14 games remaining, but they’ve embraced the role of spoiler of late...dating back to the last road trip, 13 of their last 16 games have come against teams currently within 2.0 games of a playoff spot, and they are 7-6 in those 13 games...in fact, 24 of their final 30 games—dating back to Aug. 26—are vs. teams who are within 2.0 games of a playoff spot.

STREAK MODE: The Royals have won consecutive games on the heels of a 2-7 stretch in their previous 9 games...that was preceded by a Major League-best 13-2 run from Aug. 14-29...in 15 games before that, they went 4-11 from July 28-Aug. 12, which followed a 7-3 run out of the All-Star break.

- + Since the start of their series in Anaheim on Aug. 14, the Royals are 17-9 (.654) in 26 games, which is tied with the Yankees for the best record in the American League.
- + In the last 26 games, the Royals lead the American League in runs per game (.50), on-base pct. (.342), slugging pct. (.437) and OPS (.779) and rank 2nd in batting avg. (.263).

ROAD WORK: The Royals last night began their final road trip of the season, a 9-game trek to Boston (1-0), Houston and Pittsburgh...they are 27-46 (.370) on the road, but have won 7 of their last 10 road games since Aug. 14, a stretch in which they have allowed 3 runs or fewer in 8 of 10 games.

- + Since their series in Anaheim that started on Aug. 14, the Royals 7-3 road record ranks 3rd in the Majors and their 3.21 ERA (31 ER in 87.0 IP) during that time ranks 8th.

THIN MARGINS: The Royals have played 148 games and 98 have been decided by 3 runs or fewer, 1 shy of the Guardians and Blue Jays (99 each) for the most in the Majors...they’ve played 76 games decided by 2 runs or fewer, tied for 3rd most in the Majors to the Cardinals (81) and Guardians (77).

- + Last night was the Royals 43rd 1-run game this season, tied for the 3rd most in the American League to the Mariners (46) and White Sox (44)...the Royals have played 20 1-run games since the All-Star break, most in the AL.
- + They are 15-12 (.556) in their last 27 games decided by 1 run, after starting the season 4-12 (.250) in 1-run games.

RISPY BUSINESS: Including a 3-for-15 effort here last night, the Royals are batting .226 (.19-for-84) in scoring situations in 10 games since the calendar flipped to September.

- + The Royals are batting .285 in scoring situations at home this season, 6th best in the Majors...but they’re hitting .199 with runners in scoring position on the road, last in MLB.
- + The Royals are 47-30 (.610) this season when recording at least 2 hits in scoring situations and 19-52 (.268) when they have 0 or 1 hit with runners in scoring position.

QUALITY TIME: The Royals have 60 quality starts this season, 2nd most in the American League and 4th most in the Majors, trailing only the Dodgers (76), Phillies (69) and Mariners (63).

- + They’re 35-25 (.583) in quality starts, which is the 2nd-worst mark in the Majors, and their 25 losses in quality starts are the most in MLB, 3 more than any other team.

CARTER BLANCHE: **Carter Jensen** had 2 doubles last night, extending his on-base streak to 15 games, during which he’s slashing .321/.443/.786 (18-for-56) with 12 walks, 15 runs, 13 extra-base hits (1.229 OPS) and 13 RBI.

- + Each of Jensen’s last 11 hits have gone for extra bases over his last 9 games since Sept. 1, including 6 doubles, 1 triple and 4 home runs...according to *Elias*, this matches **Aaron Judge** in 2017 for the longest streak by a rookie in the Expansion Era (since 1961) and matches **Sean Murphy** in 2023 and **Dustin Garneau** in 2021 for the longest such streaks by any catcher in the Expansion Era...it’s also tied with **Hal McRae** (1977) for the longest run in club history.
- + Jensen’s 23 HR are 1 shy of **Bob Hamelin** (24) in 1994 for the Royals single-season franchise record by a rookie.
- + Carter ranks 1st among American League rookies with 56 extra-base hits and is 1 XBH shy of **Bobby Witt Jr.** (57 in 2022) for the Royals rookie record...it’s the 5th most XBH by a primary rookie catcher—in either league—since at least 1947, trailing only **Mike Piazza** (61 in 1993), **Geovany Soto** (60 in 2008), **Carlton Fisk** (59 in 1972) and **Johnny Bench** (57 in 1968), all of whom won Rookie of the Year.
- + Among 65 American League players with at least 100 hits, Jensen’s pct. of hits for extra bases (50.5%) ranks 1st.
- + Among Major League rookies, Jensen ranks 1st in doubles (31), tied for 1st with 56 XBH, 3rd in RBI (70), T-4th in HR (23) and 5th in walks (62).
- + He’s thrown out 17 of 49 would-be basestealers (34.7%), which ranks 1st out of 26 American League catchers who have had at least 40 steals attempted against them.

WHAT A RELIEF!: The Royals bullpen recorded 4.0 scoreless innings last night for the 2nd straight game, and they haven’t allowed an earned run in their last 10.0 innings since the 9th inning on Tuesday night vs. Arizona.

- + Since the start of the last road trip (Aug. 25), the Royals bullpen has a 2.95 ERA (19 ER in 58.0 IP) in 16 games, 9th best in the Majors during that time.
- + Since making his Royals debut on July 26, **Nate Pearson’s** 0.43 ERA (1 ER in 21.0 IP) in 20 appearances ranks 2nd in the Majors among relievers (min. 20.0 IP), trailing only Houston’s **Josh Hader** (0.42 ERA in 21.1 IP).

DAILY DOUBLE: The Royals lead the Majors this season with 269 doubles, 3 more than the 2nd-place Red Sox (266)...they’re attempting to lead the Majors in doubles for just the sixth time in franchise history, following 1977 (299), 1978 (305), 1982 (295), 1990 (316) and 1992 (284).

- + The Royals boast an AL-most seven players who have recorded at least 20 doubles this season, led by **Carter Jensen’s** 31 doubles, which rank tied for 3rd in the AL and lead all Major League rookies...he’s just 5 doubles shy of the Royals rookie record, set by **Alex Gordon** (36) in 2007.

GOOD DAY, SUNSHINE: Today marks the 1st of 2 straight day games this weekend in Boston...the Royals are 24-28 (.462) in day games but they have won 5 of their last 7 matinees and are an AL-best 16-12 (.571) in day games since June 1.

GLOVE LOVE: The Royals have been charged with only 65 errors in 148 games this season, 2nd fewest in the American League, 1 more than the Rangers (64 errors).

OUTS FROM THE OUTFIELD: The Royals have 32 outfield assists this season, 2nd most in the Majors to these Red Sox (34) and their most since 2023, when they led the American League and ranked 2nd in the Majors with 37 outfield assists.

- + **Isaac Collins** is tied with **Steven Kwan** for 2nd in the American League with 10 outfield assists, 2 shy of leader **Wilyer Abreu** (12), and all 10 of Collins’ assists have come from left field, which leads the Majors at that position and are the most by a Royal since **MJ Melendez** in 2023 (11).

VS. RED SOX: After winning the series opener last night, the Royals can clinch the series with a win today, which would be their 1st series victory at Fenway Park since 2017 and would snap a run of 7 consecutive losing series in this ballpark.

- + The Royals were swept by the Red Sox from May 18-20 at Kauffman Stadium, during which they were outscored 14-5 (-9)...the Royals have lost 8 consecutive sets to the Red Sox overall since their last win from Aug. 4-7, 2022 in Kansas City...in 26 games since, they are 8-18.
- + The Royals have scored 3 runs or fewer in 8 of 10 games vs. the Red Sox since the start of last season, a stretch in which they’re 3-7 and have been outscored 47-26 (-21).
- + The Royals are 7-22 (.241) vs. AL East teams this season, and 1-7-1 in 9 series with their only win coming in Toronto.
- + The Royals haven’t won consecutive games vs. the Red Sox within the same season since Aug. 6-7, 2022 in KC.

RANDY DOBNAK is making his 32nd career start (52nd appearance) today in the 2nd game of this 3-game set at Fenway Park vs. the Red Sox, who he is facing for the third time and second as a starter, joining Sept. 3, 2019 with Minnesota...he was acquired by the Royals from the Mariners on June 17 in exchange for cash considerations.

- + Across 13 starts with Seattle’s Triple-A Tacoma to begin the season, Dobnak went 5-5 with a 4.24 ERA (33 ER in 70.0 IP), and at the time of the deal on June 17, his 6 quality starts ranked 3rd in Minor League Baseball...as part of the trade, Randy had his contract selected, but was optioned to Triple-A Omaha, where he made 2 starts (June 19 and June 25) before being recalled on July 1.
- + On July 18 vs. the Padres, Dobnak joined the Royals rotation, filling the void of **Stephen Kolek**, who was placed on the Injured List with a right flexor strain...the outing marked his 1st MLB start since Sept. 3, 2021, with 1,779 days in between.

BOUNCING BACK: Dobnak earned a 6-1 victory on Sunday vs. Toronto to salvage the series, spinning 6.0 innings of 1-run ball on 4 hits...he faced the minimum through his 1st 5.0 innings, which included a hit-by-pitch in the 1st and a leadoff single in the 4th, both of which were erased on double plays by **Nathan Lukes** and **Vladimir Guerrero Jr.**, respectively...surrendered a solo homer to **Josh Smith** to open the 6th before stranding a pair of 2-out singles to end the frame, after which he exited in favor of **Anthony Gose** and the Royals bullpen, who slammed the door on the win.

- + The outing marked Dobnak’s 3rd win of the year and 1st since winning back-to-back starts from July 29-Aug. 4, snapping a stretch in which he lost 3 straight decisions.
- + Randy has completed at least 6.0 innings in 3 consecutive starts since Aug. 26—2 of which came against Toronto—for the first time in his career...this comes on the heels of a stretch in which he threw at least 6.0 innings just once in his 1st 9 appearances to begin the year, on July 29 at Minnesota (7.0 IP).
- + After receiving no runs of support in 3 of his previous 4 starts, he received a season-high 6 runs of support and left with the lead for the second time in his last 6 outings.
- + Following Dobnak’s 36.0-inning homerless streak, which included 6 straight homerless starts from July 23-Aug. 20, he’s yielded home runs in 3 consecutive starts (4 total HR) for the second time in his career and first since June 2-19, 2021 (3 straight)...he has never surrendered a home run in 4 straight starts.

STORY OF THE SEASON: After each of Dobnak’s 1st 15 appearances to open this season came in Triple-A with Tacoma (13) and Omaha (2), he was recalled by Kansas City on July 1, and he initially pitched out of the bullpen, making 2 bulk relief appearances on July 2 vs. the Rays and July 8 at the Mets...across 12 games (10 starts) with the Royals, Randy’s 2.54 ERA (18 ER in 63.2 IP) since his club debut on July 2 is the 5th-best mark in the AL to **Cy Young** Award candidate **Dylan Cease**, whose 1.73 ERA leads.

- + Despite not joining the Royals rotation until the 2nd half of the year, Randy is set to make his 11th start this afternoon, which will set a career high, surpassing the 10 starts that he made as a member of the Twins in the 2020 shortened season...he’s already set a new career high in innings pitched, ahead of his 50.2 IP thrown in 2021.
- + Dobnak has recorded 5 outings—including 4 starts—of at least 4.0 scoreless innings since making his Royals debut on July 2, which are tied with Cease, **Grant Holmes** and teammate **Noah Cameron** for the most such games in that span.

SECOND-HALF SURGE: Randy joined the Royals rotation to begin the 2nd half of the season, and has been one of the best pitchers in the American League since, posting a 2.67 ERA (16 ER in 54.0 IP), which ranks 9th in the AL to leader **Reid Detmers** (1.37).

- + Through his 1st 7 starts, Dobnak owned a 1.50 starter ERA (6 ER in 36.0 IP), which was the lowest mark through a pitcher’s 1st 7 starts with the club in Royals history, but in 3 starts since, he has yielded 10 runs in 18.0 innings (5.00 ERA).
- + Dobnak has allowed 1 run or fewer in 7 of his 10 starts since joining the Royals rotation, tied for the 3rd-most such starts in the Majors since the All-Star break, just 1 shy of the leaders, **Cam Schlichtler** and Detmers (7 each).

WALK THIS WAY: In 12 Major League appearances (10 starts) this season, Dobnak has struggled at times with his command, issuing 23 walks over 63.2 innings (3.3 BB/9), including a career-high-tying 4 walks in his start on July 18 vs. San Diego and on Aug. 20 vs. the A’s...this year’s rate is nearly 1 walk higher than his 2.4 BB/9 rate that he posted over 39 career appearances (21 starts) prior to the start of the season.

- + Dobnak issued at least 1 walk in each of his 1st 11 appearances (9 starts) to begin the campaign, but did not do so in his start on Sunday, snapping a career-high 12-game walk streak that dated back to the start of last season.
- + Despite surrendering 23 walks, none of them have scored, and in fact, 4 of them have been stranded as inherited runners thanks to Kansas City’s bullpen.

VS. RED SOX: Randy will make his 2nd career start (3rd appearance) vs. the Red Sox and his first since Sept. 3, 2019 with Minnesota here at Fenway Park, where he threw a scoreless 1st inning with strikeouts of **Rafael Devers** and **J.D. Martinez** as the opener for **Lewis Thorpe**...his last appearance vs. the club came on April 13, 2021 at Target Field, where he suffered the loss, after yielding back-to-back doubles to **Christian Arroyo** and **Bobby Dalbec** in the 8th, respectively, to break a 2-2 tie.

- + Dobnak has yielded 1 run or fewer in 6 of his 7 starts vs. the American League this season, posting a 1.16 ERA (5 ER in 38.2 IP) with a 1.11 WHIP...the lone exception was his start at the Blue Jays, however he did record a quality start...this is in stark contrast to his 6.46 ERA (11 ER in 15.1 IP) and 1.83 WHIP in 3 Interleague starts.

HOME RUN REPORT: Ten of the 18 runs that Randy has surrendered this season (55.6%) have come on 6 home runs, 4 of which have been hit over his last 3 starts since Aug. 26...across 39 games over his first five Major League seasons, he yielded 17 home runs, which accounted for 26 of his 81 runs allowed (32.1%).

- + After yielding a solo home run to **Fernando Tatis Jr.** in the 3rd inning on July 18 vs. the Padres, Dobnak rode a season-high 36.0-inning homerless streak that he carried into the 4th inning of his start on Aug. 26 in Toronto before **Nathan Lukes** connected on a 3-run HR...despite home runs accounting for a high percentage of his runs allowed, his 0.9 HR/9 rate since making his Royals debut on July 2 ranks T-11th in American League, trailing leaders **Peter Lambert** of the Astros and **José Soriano** of the Blue Jays (0.6 HR/9 each).

TOMORROW’S STARTER: LHP NOAH CAMERON (9-8, 3.93)

- + **Noah Cameron** will make his 28th start of the season and the 52nd of his career (53rd appearance) in tomorrow’s game vs. the Red Sox at Fenway Park.

+ In his most recent start on Monday vs. the Diamondbacks, Cameron did not factor into the decision of the Royals 5-4 defeat in 10 innings despite tossing 6.0 shutout innings allowing just 3 hits and 2 walks with 7 strikeouts...tossed a 1-2-3 inning in the 1st then erased a leadoff single by **Nolan Arenado** in the 2nd with a 5-4-3 double play...struck out the side in the 3rd and stranded a 2-out walk in the 4th...erased a 1-out single in the 5th and a leadoff single in the 6th to end his night.

+ Since July 24, Noah leads the AL with 59.2 innings pitched and a 0.77 WHIP, while his 1.66 ERA (11 ER in 59.2 IP) ranks 4th, trailing **Reid Detmers** (1.50).
- + Noah has yet to face the Red Sox, but across 10 starts vs. the AL East in his career, he is 3-7 with an 5.82 ERA (36 ER in 55.2 IP) and 39 strikeouts...his last game vs. an AL East foe came in Toronto on Aug. 27, when he earned his 9th win of the season after allowing 2 runs on 6 hits and 2 walks in 6.0 innings, with 3 strikeouts.

+ In 13 games (12 starts) on the road this season, Cameron is 3-5 with a 3.31 ERA (30 ER in 81.2 IP) and 74 strikeouts...his 3.31 road ERA ranks 10th in the AL (min. 12 GS).

MANAGER MATT QUATRARO (kwuh-TRAIR-roe)

- + **Matt Quatraro** is in his fourth season as Royals Manager...in January, he agreed to an extension that runs through 2029 and includes a club option for 2030...the option would represent his eighth season, which would mark the 2nd-longest tenure in franchise history, trailing only **Ned Yost's** 10 seasons as Manager.

+ His 290 wins are 5th most in club history, 10 shy of 300 wins and trails only Yost 746, **Whitey Herzog** 410, **Dick Howser** 404, **Tony Muser** 317 in Royals history.

+ Quatraro led the Royals to back-to-back winning seasons in 2024-25 for the first time since 2013-15...the Royals under Q are the eighth team in the Wild Card Era, according to *Elias*, to have back-to-back winning seasons after a 100-loss campaign.
- + Quatraro led the 2024 Royals to an 86-76 record in his second season as Manager.

+ Q finished runner-up in the 2024 American League Manager of the Year voting.

+ The 2024 Royals were the sixth team in the 162-game Era (since 1961), according to Elias, to have a 30-win improvement from one season to the next (excluding shortened seasons)...they were the third team to make the postseason following a 100-loss season, following the 2017 Minnesota Twins and 2020 Miami Marlins.

+ Before joining the Royals, he spent five years on **Kevin Cash's** staff in Tampa Bay and four seasons on **Terry Francona's** staff in Cleveland...during his 12 full seasons on a big league staff, his teams have reached the postseason seven times.

REPLAY SPECIALIST BILL DUPLISSEA

- + **Bill Duplissea** is in his 21st season with the Royals and has served as the Replay Coordinator since Instant Replay was instituted in 2014...during that time, the Royals 65.4% success rate is 1st in the Majors, ahead of the 2nd-place Yankees (64.0%).

+ Duplissea has overturned 22 of 31 challenges this season (71.0%), which is the best rate in the Majors according to the latest update sent from MLB yesterday.

+ In 12 full seasons of Instant Replay, the Royals have finished in the top 5 in success rate eight times and have finished in the top 10 in all 12 seasons.
- + Duper started with the Royals as a Bullpen Catcher in 2006, then added advance scouting duties in 2012...in his current role, he works closely with the coaching staff in scouting upcoming opponents, in addition to his in-game replay role.

+ Prior to joining the Royals, he spent 2004-05 as an Assistant Coach at the College of San Mateo, helping lead the Bulldogs to conference titles in both seasons.

+ Duplissea was a catcher for five seasons in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization, reaching Triple-A Albuquerque in 2000.
