METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and fell, 5-2, to the Twins...New York is in a stretch of 17 straight games without an off-day (0-1). The Mets wrap up a five-game, six-day, road trip (1-2) against Washington (1-1) and Minnesota (0-1)...Following this series, the Mets head home for the start of their penultimate homestand, a seven-game stand against Arizona (four games) and Cincinnati (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: On this day in 1965, Todd Zeile was born...The utility player spent three seasons in New York and batted .265/.353/.454 with 38 home runs and 117 RBI...We wish him well.

NEVER FORGET: On Monday, September 11, the Mets will hold a special pregame ceremony to honor the memory and victims of those who perished on September 11, 2001 and from injuries sustained in responding to the crisis... Mike Piazza, whose game-winning home run against the Braves lifted the spirits of our city when baseball resumed after the 9/11 attack, will hold a pregame press conference at time to be determined.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has recorded 181 strikeouts...That is the second-most strikeouts by a rookie in franchise history...He is 10-7 with a 3.07 ERA (51 ER/149.1 IP) with 70 walks and 181 strikeouts in 26 starts this season... His 3.07 ERA ranks sixth in the majors and third in the National League

GOT TO GO TO MO'S: Ronny Mauricio went 0-3 last night, snapping his career-opening hitting streak at five games...He is batting .364 (8-22) with one run, one double, one RBI and three steals in his first six career games...He is one of five players in franchise history to record a hit in each of his first five career major league games.

30-FOR-30: Lindor has recorded 31 doubles and 26 home runs this season.. He is looking to become the 12th player in franchise history to record a 30/30 season...The last player to accomplish that feat was Pete Alonso in 2019...He has stolen 26 bases this year...He is looking to become the fourth player in franchise history to record 30 doubles, 30 home runs and 30 steals in a single-

LINSANITY: Over his last 69 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .292 (76-260) with 54 runs, 14 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs, 41 RBI, 30 walks, 20 steals with a .374 OBP, a .523 SLG and an .897 OPS...Lindor has stolen a career-high 26 bases this season.

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks sixth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.4 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.2 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (18.9) and Mookie Betts (18.3) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.3 fWAR since 2021 is fifth in the majors.

DINGERS!: The Mets have socked 185 home runs this season...That is tied for the fourth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs...The team's 185 home runs are tied with the 2004 team for the seventh-most in a single season in franchise history...Next up is the 1987 team which hit 192 in the season...Four teams in franchise history have cracked 200+ home runs in a single year 2019 (242), 2017 (224), 2016 (218) and 2006 (200).

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .287 with 41 runs, 12 doubles, three triples, nine home runs, 32 RBI, 35 walks with a .371 OBP and a .455 SLG in 69 games on the road this season...This compares to a .237/.340/.446 slashline in 65 games at Citi Field...Francisco Lindor has posted a .284/.353/.535 slashline with 53 runs, 22 doubles, two triples, 15 home runs and 26 walks in 72 games on the road in 2023...He has posted .214/.306/.387 slash in 66 games at Citi Field...Pete Alonso is slashing .246/.353/.579 with 23 home runs and 50 RBI in 68 road games...He is batting .202/.306/.474 at Citi Field.

Pete Alonso became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 482 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...He is second in the majors and in the NL with 102 RBI.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: Over his last 16 games, DJ Stewart is batting .333 (19-57) with 10 runs, three doubles, nine home runs, 18 RBI and a 1.247 OPS... In 39 games this year, Stewart is batting .265 (26-98) with 13 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 21 RBI, 10 walks, a .348 OBP and a .622 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1969, the Mets downed the Cubs. 7-1, in front of 51,448 fans at Shea Stadium...The win moves the Mets only 0.5 game behind Chicago in the NL East...Tom Seaver was brilliant, tossing a complete game and allowing a run on five hits with a walk and struck out five...Donn Clendenon and Art Shamsky went deep for hthe Mets...Tom Seaver helped his own cause, going 1-4 with a run and a double in the win.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Brooklyn Cyclones earned a walk-off win on Friday night as they defeated the Delaware Blue Rocks, 4-3...The win improved the team to 65-64 on the season and into sole possession of first place in the North Division by a half game...Any combination of Brooklyn wins and Jersey Shore losses that equate to three over the course of the weekend would clinch a playoff berth for Brooklyn...INF/OF Jett Williams went 3-4 with one doubles in the win...In 34 games in Brooklyn, Williams is batting .300/.447/.558 with 23 runs, nine doubles, two triple, six home runs, 17 RBI and 10 walks...He as walked 99 times in 113 games between two levels this season.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 4.0+ innings in the Mets' 8-7 loss to the Mariners at Citi Field...Allowed four runs on seven hits while fanning four batters...Did not issue any walks.

TWIN FLAME: Tonight, Peterson will make his first career appearance against the Twins...Peterson owns a career 4-3 record against American League opponents, posting a 4.01 ERA (27 ER/60.2 IP) over 16 appearances (ten starts).

SEVENTH HEAVEN: In his start on August 27, Peterson pitched a seasonhigh 7.0 innings...Was the fourth time in his career that he has pitched 7.0 or more innings...Peterson has only gone deeper in a start once in his career, throwing 7.1 innings in a 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay on May 14, 2023...In those starts, Peterson owns a 1-0 record.

MAKIN' IT MAJOR: Since returning to the majors on June 27 after a stint with Syracuse (AAA), Peterson has pitched to a 2-1 record with a 3.28 ERA (18 ER/49.1 IP) in 15 games, nine of which were starts.

A MINUTE IN THE MINORS: Peterson was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on April 29, was recalled on May 9, then optioned again on May 16...In his first start with Syracuse following his May 16 option, he dealt 8.0 shutout innings, allowed just two hits and struck out nine...For his effort, he as named International League Pitcher of the Week...All told, he has made seven starts for the Syracuse Mets this season...Has a 1-2 record with a 4.86 ERA (20 ER/37.0 IP).

NEW YORK, NEW YORK: Over 11 road outings (nine starts) this season, the southpaw has pitched to an 7.74 ERA (37 ER/43.0 IP)...This season, Peterson has pitched to a 3.18 ERA (16 ER/45.1 IP) in 12 home outings (eight starts).

LETHAL LEFTY: Peterson has limited lefties to a .243 (66-272) average in his career...He whiffed 32 of the 96 left-handed batters he faced last year, a 33 percent strikeout rate that ranked fourth among all left-handed pitchers to face a minimum of 90 LHB in 2022.

SLIP 'N' SLIDE: Peterson held batters to a .175 (24-137) average with his slider last season and 78 of his 126 strikeouts came on the pitch...His 52.0 slider-strikeout percentage was the second-highest in MLB (min. 150 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Díaz (54.7) and his 47.9 whiff percentage with the pitch was the third- highest in the majors behind only Díaz (54.7) and Seattle's Andres Muñoz (50.8).

STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT: Peterson struck out at least five batters in 11 straight starts from June 20-September 9 last season, the secondlongest streak by a left-handed starter last season...It was the sixth-longest streak by a Mets left-handed starter in franchise history...Peterson had 82 strikeouts across 58.2 innings during that span (13 G/11 GS) good for a 12.58

2022 RECAP: Set career-high marks in wins (seven), games (28), starts (19), innings (105.2), and strikeouts (126) last season...Went 7-5 with a 3.83 ERA for New York...Appeared mostly as a starter until mid-September...His final five appearances of the season came out of the bullpen...Went 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 ER/91.0 IP) as a starter...In nine relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER/14.2 IP).
