- ♦ In honor of Jackie Robinson Day, the D-backs and Super Star Car Wash hosted a FREE Jackie Robinson Outreach Clinic with 100 kids from Boys & Girls Club of the Valley and Pilgrim Rest Baptist Church to learn the fundamentals of baseball.
- ♦ All kids received a D-backs t-shirt with No. 42 on the front, Thomas No.5 on the back and a Jackie Robinson Day logo on the sleeve as well as a signed poster and 4 tickets to a D-backs home game.

**SIX SPOT:** Last night marked the third game where the D-backs scored 6+ runs in an inning this season (previous: March 28 vs. Rockies, 14 runs in 3rd inn. and April 6 @ Braves, 6 runs in 1st inn.).

♦ Arizona's 3 games with 6+ runs scored in an inning are second most this season, behind the Royals (4

SUÁREZ SAYS SEE YA: Since 2018, Eugenio Suárez's 33 game-tying or go-ahead home runs in the fifth inning or later are the most in the Majors, ahead of Pete Alonso/NYM (30), Carlos Santana/MIN (30), Aaron Judge/ NYY (29) and Kyle Schwarber/PHI (29) [source: Stats Inc.]:

VS. CARDINALS: The D-backs meet the Cardinals 5 more times in the next 12 days...last season, the D-backs went 3-3 vs. Cardinals (2-1 on the road, 1-2 @ home).

- ♦ Over his last 7 games vs. Cardinals (since 2023), Corbin Carroll is hitting .421 (8-for-19)/1.184 OPS with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 3 RBI, 4 walks and 3 stolen bases...he has consecutive multi-hit games vs. Cardinals (also: July 26, 2023) and 3 in his last 5.
- ◆ Gabriel Moreno has hit safely in his last 3 games vs. Cardinals (since April 18, 2023).

STOPPING THE OPPONENT RUNNING GAME: Through 14 games this season, Gabriel Moreno has held opponents to an MLB-low 1 stolen base in 3 attempts (all by Rockies)...Moreno's 40.3 caught-stealing pct. (31-for-77) since 2022 is highest among all MLB catchers.

- ♦There has been only 3 stolen base attempts against Arizona over 187 stolen base opportunities.
- ♦ The 3 stolen base attempts vs. Arizona is the fewest among all MLB teams...the second fewest is 5 stolen base attempts vs. Dodgers and Rangers.

BARRELING IT UP: Ketel Marte's 26 hard-hit count (number of batted balls with exit velocity of 95 mph+) ranks tied for third in the Majors (also: Mookie Betts/LAD), behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (31) and Bobby Witt Jr./ KC (30), while Lourdes Gurriel Jr.'s 25 are tied for fifth (also: multiple).

◆Christian Walker's 20.0 barrel pct. (percentage of batted balls that are classified as barrels) ranks fourth, behind Bobby Witt Jr./KC (26.2), Edouard Julien/MIN (22.7) and Joey Gallo/WSH (20.8).

COME ONE, COME ALL: Over the first 8 home games this season @ Chase Field, the D-backs welcomed 275,204...it is the first time since 2003 (273,788) where Chase Field has seen 270,000+ total fans in their first 8 home games.

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs have scored 2+ runs in the first inning in 8 of their first 14 games this season...no other team has more than 5 instances so far this season (Angels, 5).

♦ In the opening frame, the D-backs have scored 2 runs 4 times, 3 runs 3 times and 6 times once, tallying 24 runs on .453 hitting (34-for-75)/1.340 OPS with 8 doubles, 7 home runs and 7 walks.

INNINGS 1-6: In Innings 1-6, the D-backs' .319 AVG, .371 OBP and 112 hits lead the Majors:

AVG: D-backs (.319), Brewers (.311), Braves (.295), Astros (.287) **OBP: D-backs (.371)**, Rangers (.367), Brewers (.364), Cubs (.358) **H: D-backs (112)**, Dodgers (110), Astros (105), Padres (105)

**SWINGING ON STARTERS:** D-backs hitters, against opposing starting pitchers, are batting .330 (95-for-288)/.894 OPS with 52 runs, 15 doubles, 13 home runs and 22 walks.

♦ Among all teams' offenses vs. starting pitchers, the D-backs are first with a .330 AVG, 95 hits and 52 runs.

RISP-Y BUSINESS: The D-backs' .326 AVG with runners in scoring position is fourth in the Majors, behind the Brewers (.377), Rangers (.346) and Braves (.340).

- ♦ Arizona's .326 AVG with RISP in their first 14 games of the season ranks second all-time in franchise history, behind 2017 (.336).
- ◆ Eugenio Suárez is batting .500 (6-for-12)/1.450 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 homer and 11 RBI with runners in scoring position.
