**RAY REPORT**—The Rays continue a six-game, seven-day homestand against the Reds (0-1, two to play) and Twins (three to play) at Tropicana Field...have won seven of their last 10 games and are 10-5 in their last 15 on the heels of a 2-5 start...are 4-3 on a stretch of 27 games in 29 days from April 14-May 13, with off days coming on April 23 and April 30...are 1.0 game behind the Yankees for the best record in the AL and first place in the AL East...are off to their best start since 2023 (19-3) and ties the sixth-best start in franchise history...have held sole possession of first five of the last seven days...have spent six days in first, seven in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

- ★ The Rays dropped the series opener yesterday to the Reds, 6-1...they have lost back-to-back series openers after winning the previous three and four of the last five.
- ★ After loading the bases with their first three batters of the game, the Rays went 0-for-3 with a walk to plate their only run of the contest...they finished the game 0-for-4 with the bases loaded and are 0-for-18 since April 5 in such situations with 6 RBI, 4 BB, and a .182 OBP...despite this, the club has the third-best batting average (.276/35-for-127) in the AL with runners in scoring position over that span...per Elias, the Rays have had 0-for-19 skids with the bases loaded twice in franchise history (July 31-Aug. 24, 2017 & Aug. 8-Sept. 9, 2004) and went a franchise-worst 0-for-20 between April 12-May 12, 2005.
- ★ Four of the Rays 15 RBI with the bases loaded this season have come via walks, tied for the second-most bases-loaded walks in the majors with the Twins and trailing behind the Angels (6)...three of the four RBI-walks have come in the last five games (April 16-pres.).
- ★ The Rays have scored first only three times in their last 14 games, including none of their last five contests, despite a 9-5 record in that span...their AL-best-tying seven comeback wins are tied for the fifth most in the majors...they have posted a 6-7 (.462) record in games when opponents score first, seventh best in the majors and third best in the AL behind the Orioles (7-7/.500) and the Twins (4-4/.500).
- ★ After having his contract selected earlier in the day, **Trevor Martin** made his major league debut last night in relief...he became the 198th Rays player to make their major league debut with the franchise and the first since **Cole Wilcox** (Sept. 19, 2025 vs. BOS).
- ★ **Steven Matz** takes the hill tonight for the Rays, as the team looks to keep their perfect record in his outings (4-0)...the last time the Rays won five consecutive starts or more by a pitcher to begin a season was 2023, when they won each of **Shane McClanahan's** first eight starts (March 30-May 8) and **Zach Eflin's** first five (April 1-May 4).
- ★ when he starts this season (4-0)...the time the Rays won five or more starts by a pitcher to begin a season was 2023 when they won each of **Shane McClanahan's** first eight starts (March 30-May 8).

**YANDY MAN CAN**—**Yandy Díaz** singled in the 5th inning on Saturday at PIT for his 910th hit with the Rays, tying **B.J. Upton** for fourth on the club's all-time list...with 102 HR, he is also two homers shy of matching seventh-ranked **Carl Crawford** (104HR) (see tables to the right)...Díaz reached base safely with an RBI-walk in the 1st inning last night, and has reached in 20 of 22 games this season while hitting safely in 17 of 22...Díaz ranks highly in the AL in hits (T3rd, 28), on-base pct. (4th, .420), average (T4th, .326/28-for-86), RBI (T6th, 19), OPS (T10th, .908), and total bases (T11th, 42).

- ★ From the 7th inning on, Díaz is batting .520 (13-for-25), fourth best in the majors...he paces the majors with a .516 (16-for-31) average against relievers...he also has the second-best average with RISP (10-for-20) in the AL behind DET **Kevin McGonigle** (.538/7-for-13).
- ★ Díaz has reached base safely 42 times, tied for fourth in the majors behind HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (50), LAA **Mike Trout** (44), and BAL **Taylor Ward** (43) and most in club history through the Rays first 22 games, surpassing **Evan Longoria** in 2012, **Jonny Gomes** in 2006, and **Fred McGriff** in 1998 (all 41 TOB)...the record through 23 games is held by McGriff at 45 times in 1998...with eight games left, Díaz is on pace to reach safely 57 times by the end of April, which would best **Tommy Pham** (52) in 2019 for the most TOB over such a span in Rays history.
- ★ He is 15 hits shy of reaching 1,000 for his career, which would make him the 20th Cuban-born player in major league history to reach the milestone.

**SIMPSON STREAKS**—**Chandler Simpson** has hit safely in his last eight home games, tied for the second-longest home hitting streak of his career behind a 10-game streak from July 22-Sept. 3, 2025...over this eight-game streak, he is batting .452 (14-for-31) with 1 3B, 3 RBI, 7 R, 6 SB, and a .968 OPS.

- ★ Simpson also has an active a 13-game hitting streak against NL opposition...it is tied for the fifth-longest streak in franchise history and marks the longest since **Harold Ramirez's** 13-game streak (April 19-Aug. 31, 2022)...with a hit tonight, he would tie **Yandy Díaz** (14G, April 2-Sept. 25, 2021) for the fourth-longest streak in Rays history.

**SMALL BALL**—The Rays pace the majors in contact rate (80.3%), infield hits (36, per Baseball-Reference), ground-ball hits (78), and sacrifice hits (9, T1st with MIL) while ranking second in strikeout rate (18.3%) to the Blue Jays (18.2%)...they lead the AL in singles (144) and bunt hits (6) while ranking second in stolen bases (24)...they have gone from first to third or scored on singles 16 times, tied with the Astros and Guardians for third in the AL to the Tigers (21) and Mariners (17)...they also are tied for third in the AL with 26 "productive outs," defined by Baseball-Reference as advancing any runner with none out or driving in a baserunner with the second out of an inning.

- ★ **Chandler Simpson** leads baseball with 12 infield hits while **Yandy Díaz** is tied for fourth in the AL with five...**Jonny DeLuca's** 5 RBI as a pinch hitter are the most in MLB, and he is one of three players in the AL with multiple hits as a pinch hitter (2-for-5) along with HOU **Joey Loperfido** (2-for-4) and TOR **Nathan Lukes** (2-for-2).
- ★ Seven Rays have recorded multiple stolen bases, tied with the Brewers and Rockies for the most in the majors...six have tallied a hit as a pinch hitter, second most in MLB to the Rockies (8).
- ★ The Rays have won the second-most games in the AL without the benefit of a home run (5), behind the Red Sox (6)...they have scored five runs or more without homering an MLB-best six times and have scored only 26 of their 104 runs via their 18 HR...the club is undefeated (4-0) when out-homering opponents.

**THE NATIONAL PASTIME**—The Rays have started the year 4-9 against the NL, with all games coming against NL Central opposition...MLB began scheduling teams to each of the other 29 major league clubs each season in 2023, with the Rays holding an 85-68 (.556) record in Interleague games over that span, second best in the AL behind the Astros (.557/83-66)...since AL and NL team began facing off during the regular season play began in 1997, the Rays have the fourth-best winning pct. (.531/330-291) in the majors.

**CIN CITY**—The Rays and Reds entered the series with both clubs above .500 on the season and the Reds leading the NL Central...Rays opponents have led their division at the start of the series in three of their last four sets (NYY, PIT, CIN)...last season, the Rays were swept in Cincinnati (3G) between July 25-27...this series marks the fifth time in franchise history the Reds have visited Tropicana Field, with the visitors taking each of the five series openers...despite this, the clubs have split the last four series in St. Petersburg, with the Rays taking each of the last two from June 19-21, 2017 (2-1) and July 26-28, 2024 (2-1).

- ★ In 15 career games against the Reds, **Yandy Díaz** has slashed .245/.315/.551 (12-for-49) with a .866 OPS...he has homered in four of the last nine games (April 18, 2023-pres.) and has an RBI in six of the last 11 games (July 10, 2022-pres.).
- ★ **Steven Matz** has made eight career appearances (six starts) opposite the Reds and has pitched to a 4-1 record, 4.46 ERA (34.1IP, 17ER), and 37 strikeouts against 10 walks, with his teams going 7-1 in those games...he has allowed three runs or fewer in five of the six starts and registered a 9.95 strikeout per 9.0 IP in those outings.

**CALL ME THE BREEZE**—Steven Matz takes the ball for his fifth start of the season and second at Tropicana Field...marks his 177th career start and seventh opposite the Reds...enters his 12th major league season and first with the Rays...is one of 14 active left-handed pitchers to cross the 1,000-inning mark for his career (1,015.1) and one of four in the AL along with NYY Max Fried (1,107.2), NYY Carlos Rodón (1,282.0), and DET Framber Valdez (1,104.2)...signed a two-year deal with the Rays on Dec. 16, 2025, 2022.

- ✦ Matz was one of three MLB pitchers to win each of his first three starts this season (also: LAA José Soriano, AZ Michael Soroka)...is the first Ray to turn the trick since Taj Bradley, Zach Eflin, and Shane McClellan in 2023...seven MLB pitchers accomplished the feat last year.
- ✦ He has accounted for three of the five wins by Rays starting pitchers this season.
- ✦ Matz is the only Ray to log 5.0 innings in four starts or more to begin the season, the longest run by a Ray pitcher since Drew Rasmussen's six-game streak to begin 2025.
- ✦ With a win tonight, would become the fourth pitcher in franchise history to tally four wins or more in their first five starts with the Rays, joining Eflin, Josh Fleming, and James Shields.

**LAST TIME OUT**—Did not factor into the decision on April 16 at CWS after working 5.1 innings and allowing two earned runs, including a solo homer to Miguel Vargas in the 3rd inning.

- ✦ The Rays are 4-0 in games Matz starts, the first time the team has won four straight starts by a pitcher to open a season since they won eight in a row started by Shane McClellan (March 30–May 8, 2023).

**TAKE ME TO THE TROP**—Has earned a win in both career appearances at Tropicana Field, with his most recent on April 10 vs. NYY in his home debut as a Ray...lasted 5.0 innings while walking two with seven strikeouts in each of those starts, receiving 7.20 runs of support per 9.0 IP...with a win tonight, Matz would become the 15th pitcher in Tropicana Field history to win each of his first three career starts in the venue and the fifth left-hander along with MIN/NYM Johan Santana (3GS, 2005-12), CWS John Danks (4GS, 2007-09), OAK/STL Mark Mulder (4GS, 2001-05), and SEA Jamie Moyer (5GS, 1998-2002)...he would also become the ninth pitcher to win his first two starts at the Trop as a Ray, first since Taj Bradley (2GS) and Zach Eflin (8GS) in 2023.

**STOCKING UP WINS**—Matz will be making his ninth career outing and seventh start opposite the Reds, owning a 4-1 record...in those six starts, he has pitched to a 4.38 ERA (31.2IP, 14ER) with 35 strikeouts, opposed to allowing three earned runs in 2.2 innings as a reliever...his team has won seven of his eight games appeared in vs. Cincinnati.

- ✦ In his most recent outing on June 21, 2025 vs. CIN (w/STL), allowed three earned runs as a reliever after Ely De La Cruz launched a two-run homer in the 7th inning...he tossed 1.2 innings, allowing two hits and two walks.
- ✦ In his last start on April 30, 2025 at CIN, he did not receive a decision after 4.0 shutout innings on five hits, no walks, and six strikeouts at Great American Ball Park.
- ✦ Has posted a 16-11 record against NL Central foes, boasting a 4.23 ERA (189.1IP, 89ER) with 181 strikeouts and one complete game (July 27, 2019 vs. PIT w/ NYM)...his 5.13 RSA against NL Central opponents is his most among any NL division.
- ✦ Is 8-12 with one save in Interleague games, turning in a 4.14 ERA (182.2IP, 84ER) with 160 strikeouts across 48 Interleague appearances (27GS).
- ✦ Made his MLB debut against the Reds on June 28, 2015 (w/ NYM) at Citi Field, logging a quality start after lasting 7.2 innings and allowing just two runs on five hits...as a hitter, went 3-for-3 with 4 RBI after hitting a two-run double in the 2nd inning over CF Billy Hamilton's head...became the first player to go 3-for-3 (or better) and drive in four runs or more in his first MLB game at any position since RBI became an official statistic in 1920...the 4 RBI marked a club record for a player's big-league debut and tied the Mets record for a pitcher in any game (7x, last: Dwight Gooden on May 11, 1990 vs. LAD)...marked the most RBI by a pitcher in his MLB debut since 1920.

**SPRINGING HIS BEST STUFF**—Matz holds a 19-11 (.633) career record in March/April, marking his second-best monthly winning pct. behind Sept./Oct. (9-3, .750)...his 212 strikeouts in the March/April window are his most of any month, with the next closest being 161 in July.

- ✦ His three wins this March/April are his second most during those months in any season of his career behind 2021 (4-1).

**AGING LIKE FINE WINE**—At 34 years and 327 days old, Matz is the oldest Rays pitcher to earn three wins in the span of his first four games with the franchise to begin a season, becoming the 11th-oldest MLB arm to turn the trick (last: BAL Kyle Gibson in 2023) since the Rays inaugural season (1998)...Matz entered the 2026 season with 10 years, 99 days of service time, most among Rays...he reached the 10-year mark last June and was one of 16 left-handed pitchers to appear in the majors last season to conclude the year with a decade of service time.

**MLB CAREER RUNDOWN**—In 2023, pitched to a 2-1 mark with a 2.14 ERA (42.0IP, 10ER) in eight appearances (3GS) with the Dodgers...began the year on the 15-day IL (left oblique strain) and was transferred to the 60-day IL on April 21 before making his season debut on Aug. 19 vs. MIA...from his debut through season's end, led the NL in WHIP (0.76) while ranking third in ERA behind SD Blake Snell (1.02) and NYM Kodai Senga (2.06).

- ✦ In 2022, went 3-0 with a 3.47 ERA (36.1IP, 14ER) in nine appearances (7GS) spanning seven stints with the Dodgers...made his MLB debut on May 11 at PIT and earned his first win on July 5 vs. COL...went 9-1 with a 2.56 ERA (91.1IP, 26ER) over 19 outings (17GS) with Triple-A Oklahoma City.
- ✦ In 2021, posted a 5-9 record and 4.62 ERA (101.1IP, 52ER) in 26 games (22GS) between Triple-A Oklahoma City and Double-A Tulsa.
- ✦ Did not pitch in 2020 following the cancellation of the minor league season...was not part of the Dodgers initial 60-man player pool, but reported to the alternate site in Rancho Cucamonga on July 10.
