# **AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees will complete their seven-game road trip today with the final game of a four-game set at Baltimore (1-2 thus far)...are 3-3 on the road trip after winning two-of-three at Milwaukee and going 1-2 in their first three games at Baltimore...

- Milwaukee and going 1-2 in their first three games at Baltimore... after this road trip, will return to the Bronx for a seven-day, six-game homestand vs. Detroit (Fri.-Sun.) and Houston (5/7-9). ▶ Their 20-12 record (.625) is the third-best in the AL and sixth-best in the Majors, trailing only Atlanta (20-9, .690), Cleveland (20-10, .667), Philadelphia (21-11, .656), Baltimore (19-11, .633) and Milwaukee (19-11, .633)...their 20 wins are tied for the most in the AL and tied for the secondmost in the Majors most in the Majors.
- Marks the sixth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees have gone 20-12 or better to start a season (also went 24-8 in 2022, 22-10 in 2018, 21-11 in 2010 and '17, and 20-12 in 2015)... with a win today, would mark the sixth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees went 21-12 or better to start a season (went 24-9 in 2022, 23-10 in 2018, 22-11 in 2010, and 21-12 in 2015 and '17).
- The Yankees are in the midst of a 17-day stretch without an off day (4/19-5/5)...marks their longest stretch of the season without an off-day...are 7-6 so far.

  Have won seven of their nine completed series this season and have lost just one series this year (7-1-1).

Yankees pitchers tossed their second shutout of the year...RHP Luis Gil (6.1IP, 2H, 0R, 1BB, 5K) tossed a career-high 6.1 scoreless innings to earn his second win of the year...3B Oswaldo Cabrera (2-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI, 1SB) hit a game-winning two-run HR in the fifth inning...RF Juan Soto (1-for-3, 1BB, 2SB) and C Jose Trevino (1-for-3, 1R) were the only other Yankees to record hits...LHP Caleb Ferguson (0.2IP, 2K) and RHP lan Hamilton (0.1IP, 1BB, 1HP) were both scoreless in relief...RHP Clay Holmes (1.2IP, 1H, 3K) tossed 1.2 scoreless innnings and stranded two inherited runners in the eighth inning to record his 10th save of the year.

CLOSE CALLS: The Yankees have had 21 of their 32 games decided by 2R-or-fewer, the most such games in the Majors...14 of their last 17 games, 15 of their last 19 games and 16 of their last 21 games have been decided by 2R-or-fewer.

  Are 8-3 in one-run games this year...their 11 one-run games are tied with Atlanta and Chicago-AL for the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (12) and Oakland (12).

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers tossed their second shutout of the season on Wednesday at Baltimore... have posted a 2.97 ERA (288.0IP, 95ER) this year, the third-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.57) and Seattle (2.96).

▶ Have held opponents to 3R-or-fewer in 20 of 32 games this year (are 14-6 in those games)...are 17-7 this season when holding their opponent to 4R-or-fewer.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 3.25 ERA (174.1IP, 63ER) in 32 starts this year, the fifth-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.03), Philadelphia (2.50), Kansas City (3.01) and Seattle (3.21)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 26 of their 32 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 19 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 14 starts.

The Yankees are one of only two teams in the Majors to have five pitchers who have made at least six starts this year and have an ERA below 3.90: Rodón-2.48, Gil-3.19, Schmidt-3.19, Stroman-3.69 and Cortes-3.86 (also the Phillies).

WHAT A RELIEF: Yankees relievers have posted a 2.53 ERA (113.2IP, 32ER) this season, the fourth-lowest in the Majors, trailing only Cleveland (2.43), Oakland (2.45) and Seattle (2.51).

Have posted a 0.91 ERA (29.2IP, 3ER) in their last nine games (since 4/23).

WHERE'S OSWALDO: INF/OF Oswaldo Cabrera hit a gamewinning two-run HR in the fifth inning on Wednesday at Baltimore...eight of his 15 career home runs have either tied the game (three) or gave the Yankees the lead (five).

It is 18RBI this season are tied for the second-most by a Yankee, trailing only Juan Soto (25).

GIL-IN' & DEALIN': RHP Luis Gil tossed a career-high 6.1 Scoreless innings to earn his second win of the season on Wednesday at Baltimore...allowed just 2H to his 22BF...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in four of his six starts this year, going 2-1 with a 3.19 ERA (31.0IP, 11ER) and 40K.

HOLMES SWEET HOLMES: RHP Clay Holmes recorded a five-out save on Wednesday at Baltimore (1.2IP, 1H, 3K), marking his fourth career save of at least five outs (also 2.0IP on 5/18/22 at Baltimore and 1.2IP on 6/20/23 vs. Seattle and 7/22/22 at Baltimore)...entered the game in the eighth inning with two runners on and one out and struck out his first two batters faced to strand both inherited runners.

- Has not allowed an earned run in 15 appearances this season (15.0IP, 13H, 3R/0ER, 1BB, 16K, 2HP)...his 15.0IP are the most among Major League relievers who have not allowed an earned run this season.
- Has not allowed an earned run in his last 18 appearances dating back to 9/25/23, the second-longest streak in his career (29G from 4/9-6/18/22).
- His 10 saves are the most in the AL and tied for the most in
- His save on Wednesday marked his 54th career save, surpassing David Robertson (53) for eighth place on the Yankees' all-time saves list.
- Reached double-digit saves for the third time in his career (also 20SV in 2022 and 24SV in 2023)... is the seventh pitcher in franchise history (since saves became an official stat in 1969) to record at least three such seasons, joining Mariano Rivera (16), Dave Righetti (seven), Goose Gossage (six), Aroldis Chapman (five), Sparky Lyle (five) and Steve Farr (three).

THE GREAT JUAN: OF Juan Soto reached base twice on Wednesday at Baltimore...also recorded 2SB, marking his fifth career game with multiple stolen bases (first since 9/15/23 at

- career game with multiple stolen bases (first since 9/15/23 at Oakland with San Diego)...has reached base safely in 29 of his 32 games this season, hitting .325/.439/.575 (39-for-120) with 22R, 6 doubles, 8HR, 25RBI, 26BB, 45B and 25F... has reached base multiple times in six of his last eight games and in 20 of his 32 games this year...his 20 such games are the most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors.

  > Owns a season-high nine-game hitting streak (since 4/23), batting .333/.439/.636 (11-for-33) with 8R, 1 double, 3HR, 5RBI, 7BB, 3SB and 1SF over that span...marks the longest hitting streak by a Yankee this season and longest since Anthony Volpe's 10-game streak from 9/27/23-4/2/24...the last longer single-season streak by a Yankee was DJ LeMahieu's 10-game streak from 8/1-18/23...marks Soto's longest hitting streak since a nine-game streak from 7/25-8/5/23...his last longer streak was his career-high 16-game streak from 6/24-7/14/22.

Is the only Yankee in the last 18 years (since 2007) and the fifth in the last 25 years (since 2000) to reach base at least 65 times in the club's first 32 games of a season, joining Jason Giambi (68TOB in 2006), Derek Jeter (67TOB in 2006), Alfonso Soriano (67TOB in 2003) and Bernie Williams (65TOB in 2003).
- Is tied for first in the Majors in walks (26, first in AL), ranks second in times on base (65, first in AL), OBP (.439, first in AL) and WAR among position players (2.2 - FanGraphs, first in AL), tied for fourth in RBI (25, tied for second in AL), fifth in OPS (1.014, first in AL), tied for fifth in HR (eight, tied for fourth in AL) and tied for ninth in hits (39, tied for fourth in AL)...also ranks fourth in the AL in BA (.325), fifth in SLG (.575) and tied for sixth in extra-base hits (14).

**BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters** lead the Majors in plate appearances per walk ratio (9.03), are second in walks (136, first

- appearances per walk ratio (9.03), are second in walks (136, first in AL) and pitches per plate appearance (4.05, second in AL), tied for second in home runs (40, second in AL) and fourth in on-base percentage (.333, first in AL).

  ▶ The Yankees are 20-5 (.800) when scoring at least 2R, the best such record in the Majors... are 19-3 (.864) this season when scoring at least 3R (also the best record in the Majors).

  ▶ Have hit 18HR over their last nine games (since 4/23) after hitting 3HR in their previous seven games (4/15-22)... have hit multiple home runs in four of their last six games and five of their last eight games... their 11 multi-HR games are tied for the fourth-most in the Majors, trailing only Baltimore (14), Texas (14) and Milwaukee (12). **LAST TIME OUT:** Made his sixth start of the season on Saturday at Milwaukee, recording his second win of the season after allowing 1ER over 6.0IP (2H, 1BB, 8K, 1HR)... surrendered his only run on a solo HR to Rhys Hoskins in the first inning...following the HR, retired 16 of his final 18 batters faced (1 double, 1BB)...his 8K marked a season high and his most in a game since his 10K on 9/17/23 at Pittsburgh.

ROAD RULES: Has made four road starts this season, going 1-1 with a 3.20 ERA (19.2IP, 19H, 7ER, 10BB, 20K, 3HR)...allowed 3R-or-fewer in all four starts and 2R-or-fewer in three of those starts.
