IY Sports Detroit/MILB.tV • Radio: 97.1 The TIGERS RALLY LATE TO COMPLETE SWEEP OF RAYS: Trailing 3-0, the Tigers rallied for two runs in both the sixth and eighth innings to defeat the Rays, 4-3, on Thursday. Colt Keith had two hits, including a triple, and drove in two runs, while Justyn-Henry Malloy had the go-ahead RBI with a sacrifice fly in the eighth inning. Parker Meadows also had two hits, including a double. Reese Olson started and threw 4.0 innings, giving up two runs on four hits with three strikeouts. Beau Brieske pitched 2.0 perfect innings of relief to pick up his fourth win of the season, while Jason Foley struck out two in a scoreless ninth inning for his 27th save.

CHIEF KEITH: Colt Keith finished yesterday's game 2x4 with a triple and two RBI. He recorded his 35th multi-hit game of the season, which leads all American League rookies and ranks fourth among all MLB rookies. Dating back to May 8, Keith ranks third among all rookies (min. 200 plate appearances) in hits (117), fourth in total bases (177) and fifth in batting average (.287) and RBI (53).

WALK IN THE PARKER: Parker Meadows had a pair of hits, including a double, in yesterday's game, recording his 17th multi-hit performance over 44 games since being reinstated from the injured list on August 3. Since that date, Meadows is slashing .297/.340/.514 with 10 doubles, five triples, six home runs and 23 RBI. Among American League hitters in that span, he ranks tied for fifth in fWAR (2.0) and tied for 10th with 21 extra-base hits.

BEAU KNOWS PITCHING: Beau Brieske worked 2.0 perfect innings in yesterday's game to earn his fourth win of the season. Brieske has allowed just one earned run in 11 appearances this month, compiling a 2-1 record with one save, a 0.60 ERA (15.0IP/1ER) and 14 strikeouts. Among American League pitchers with at least 15.0 innings pitched this month, he ranks first in opponent batting average (.109), second in ERA (0.60), third with a .174 opponent slugging percentage and sixth with a .450 opponent OPS.

SECOND HALF SURGE: With yesterday's win, the Tigers improved to 30-11 (.732) since August 11, which is the best record in the Majors over that span and the team's best record in a 41-game span since going 30-11 from August 15-September 27, 2011. Since August 11, the Tigers lead the Majors with a 2.60 ERA (374.0IP/108ER) and a +67 run differential.

icket • Spanish Radio: MLB/Audacy Apps ANOTHER ONE-RUN GAME: The Tigers played their 55th one-run game of the season yesterday, improving to 31-24 in those games. Detroit has won 13 of its last 15 games decided by one run. The Tigers 55 one-run games, which are the most in the Majors, are the most they've played in a season since also playing 55 in 1976.

TIGERS AND WHITE SOX: The Tigers and White Sox begin their final series of the season tonight. Detroit has gone 9-1 against Chicago (AL) this season, including taking two-of-three games in the first series at Comerica Park. The Tigers have clinched the season series vs. the White Sox for the second straight year.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: The Tigers begin their final series against an American League Central opponent tonight. Detroit is 27-22 against divisional foes this season, going 9-1 vs. Chicago (AL), 6-7 vs. Cleveland, 6-7 vs. Minnesota and 6-7 vs. Kansas City. The Tigers have clinched a winning record against the AL Central for the second straight season.

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers are 3-0 on their current six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Tampa Bay (3-0) and three games vs. Chicago (AL) (September 27-29). The Tigers are 41-36 at Comerica Park this season, including a 15-5 record in their last 20 games in Detroit.
