### SLAKEBITES

**THE NL CHAMPS:** Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

**ROSTER MOVES:** The D-backs recalled LHP **Blake Walston** today from Triple-A Reno and optioned **LHP Andrew Saalfrank** following last night's game.

**MARTE'S 1K MILESTONE:** Today marks career game No. 1,000 for **Ketel Marte**...over 999 career games since 2015, he is batting .280 with 229 doubles, 41 triples, 112 homers, 435 RBI, 354 walks and 55 stolen bases.

**UN-BEE-LIEVABLE:** Last night marked the second-ever "Bee Delay" at Chase Field...the first happened on April 3, 2014 vs. Giants after the third pitch of the game, which resulted in a 40-minute delay...Arizona now owns a 1-1 record in Bee-delayed games.

**YOU'VE GOT TO BEE KIDDING:** Last night's 8:35 p.m. start marked the latest local game start time in Chase Field/Bank One Ballpark history (previous: 8:22 pm, 1998 Opening Day, D-backs first-ever game).

**THANK YOU, BLUE SKY PEST CONTROL & MATT HILTON (AKA THE BEE GUY):** The D-backs would like to thank Blue Sky Pest Control's **Matt Hilton** (Branch Manager - Phoenix Office), who arrived to remove the swarm of bees from the Chase Field backstop netting.

**THE BUZZ ABOUT LAST NIGHT:** The D-backs won 4-3 last night, marking their second walk-off victory of the season.

- ◆ **Christian Walker** went 3-for-5 with 2 HR and 3 RBI.
- ◆ **Gabriel Moreno** collected a game-tying, two-out single in the eighth inning.

**WALKER CREATING A BUZZ:** Since April 22, **Christian Walker**'s 4 homers are tied for the most in the NL (also: Nick Senzel/WSH) and 9 RBI are second.

- ◆ He is currently riding an 8-game on-base streak...he is batting .357 (10-for-28)/1.250 OPS with 1 double, 4 homers, 9 RBI and 5 walks in the span.
- ◆ Defensively, Walker boasts a 31-game errorless streak this season, tied for the second-longest (also: 2 others), behind Teoscar Hernández/LAD (32).

**DODGER BEE-LIGHTS:** Since 2022, **Christian Walker**'s 19 RBI vs. Dodgers are tied for the most among all players (also: Manny Machado/SD) while his 9 home runs vs. Dodgers are second most, behind Machado (10).

- ◆ Since 2022, **Ketel Marte**'s 11 doubles vs. Dodgers are the most among all players while his 13 extra-base hits are second, behind Machado (14).

**YOU HAD TO BEE-LIEVE:** Last night, **Christian Walker** recorded his first career walk-off homer (second walk-off hit; last: June 28, 2022 vs. Padres, single off T. Rogers).  
◆ It marked Walker's tenth career multi-homer game (last: Sept. 26, 2023 @ White Sox).

**TURNING TO MAY:** Last season, for the month of May in franchise history, the D-backs finished with their second-most stolen bases (28), fourth-most home runs (40), fourth-highest slugging pct. (.446), tied for fifth-most walks (101) and ninth best OBP (.333.).

**SNAKES AMONG NL LEADERS:** **Ketel Marte**, among NL leaders, is tied for third with 10 doubles, tied for fifth with 15 extra-base hits, tied for sixth with 38 hits, tied for sixth with 37 hits and 10th with a .508 SLG, while **Christian Walker** is tied for fifth with 7 homers and 20 walks, tied for sixth with 22 RBI (also: **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.**) and tied for seventh with 24 walks (also: Ketel Marte).

**bWAR RANKINGS:** **Ketel Marte's** 2.1 bWAR makes him 1 of 3 NL players (pitcher or position) with a 2.0+ bWAR (also: Mookie Betts/LAD (3.1) and Ranger Suárez/PHI (2.0)).

**HARD HITTING:** The D-backs' 322 hard hit balls (No. of batted balls with exit velocity of 95 mph+) rank fourth in the NL, behind the Dodgers (383), Padres (337) and Braves (334).

- ◆ **Ketel Marte's** 54 hard hits are second among NL players, behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (64).

**GOLDEN BACKSTOPS:** D-back backstops' 6 stolen bases allowed and 12 attempts are the fewest in the Majors.

- ◆ **Gabriel Moreno's** 55.6 caught-stealing pct. (5-for-9) leads the Majors and Tucker Barnhart's 33.3 pct. (1-for-3) is tied for 10th.

- **Moreno** leads active catchers with a 41.0 caught-stealing pct. (34-for-83) and **Tucker Barnhart** is 11th with a 30.8 CS pct. (171-for-556).

**ON DECK - SAN DIEGO PADRES:** The D-backs face the Padres for 3 games from May 3-5.

- ◆ Last season, the D-backs took the season series vs. Padres 7-6 (3-4 @ home, 4-2 on the road), outscoring them 26-16 (+10 run differential).
- ◆ The D-backs won 5 of their last 6 games vs. Padres.

### NEXT STARTER: RHP ZAC GALLEN (3-2, 3.38)

- ◆ Took the loss in his last start on April 26 @ Mariners (L; 3 ER in 5.0 IP).
- ◆ Has allowed 3 or fewer runs in 5 of his 6 bids in 2024.
- ◆ In 5 starts vs. Dodgers @ Chase Field, is 1-0 with a 2.48 ERA (8 ER in 29.0 IP) with 7 walks and 36 strikeouts.
- ◆ Has made 4 straight quality home starts vs. Dodgers (since July 31, 2020)...in his last 2 home starts, has only allowed 1 run on 5 hits over 12 innings.

SNAKEBITES

**AT A GLANCE:** In his eighth MLB season...has spent seasons with the Yankees (2017-22), Cardinals (2022-23) and Rangers (2023).

• Signed by the D-backs as a free agent on March 29.

**WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:** Third start and first home start of 2024.

- In 17 home starts (12 quality) in 2023, went 7-5 with a 3.61 ERA (42 R-40 ER in 99.2 IP) and 91 strikeouts.
- In his last 6 regular season starts dating back to Sept. 13, 2023, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (6 ER in 40.0 IP), 0.90 WHIP, .205 opponent average (30-for-146) and 29 strikeouts.

**LAST START:** Made his second D-backs start (second quality) @ Cardinals on April 24 (L; 3 ER in 7.0 IP, 4 K).

**VS. DODGERS:** Has made 2 career starts vs. Dodgers (both on road).

- In his last start on April 29, 2023 @ Dodgers, tossed 6.2 innings with 1 run allowed on 5 hits with 7 strikeouts.

**VS. NL WEST:** Has made 4 consecutive quality starts vs. NL West opponents since April 24, 2023 (@ Giants, @ Dodgers, vs. Giants, @ Dbacks).

- Posted a no decision in his last home start on June 14, 2023 vs. Giants (3 ER in 6.1 IP, 7 K) while with the Cardinals.

**D-BACKS DEBUT:** Earned the win in his D-backs debut on April 19 (6.0 IP, 1 R, 4 H, 0 BB, 3 K) in a 17-1 victory @ Giants.

**LIMITING LEFTIES:** In his career (538 PA), has held lefties to a .220/.259/.315 slash line with 11 homers, 20 walks and 125 strikeouts.

- His .577 opponent OPS vs. lefties is third among active starters (min. 500 LHB faced) to Chris Sale (.531) and Clayton Kershaw (.561).
- Has issued walks to just 3 of 215 (1.4%) left-handed batters faced over the last 2 seasons (2022-23), the lowest walk pct. against lefties in MLB (min. 200 LH batters faced) over that span.

**IT'S UNDER CONTROL:** Has 2 or fewer walks in his last 13 regular-season starts, including 6 starts with 1 walk and 3 starts with no walks.

- His 1.56 walks per 9.0 innings since August 4, 2023 are sixth among pitchers (min. 10 starts).

**INNING BREAKDOWN:** Is 31-15 with a 2.32 ERA (114 R-105 ER in 407.2 IP), 0.97 WHIP, .208 average (311-1494) and 359 strikeouts when he pitches 6.0+ innings (64 GS).

- In his last 6 home starts tossing 6.0+ innings, is 3-1 with a 1.89 ERA (8 ER in 38.0 IP), .237 average (33-for-139) and 37 strikeouts.
- In innings 1-5, owns a 0.90 ERA (1 ER in 10.0 IP) with a 0.70 WHIP, .171 opponent average (6-for-35) and 6 strikeouts.

**RISPY BUSINESS:** Is holding runners in scoring position to a .111 average (1-for-9) with 4 strikeouts.

**PITCH BREAKDOWN:** Is limiting opponents to a .182 average (2-for-11) with 2 strikeouts off his curveball and a .143 average (1-for-7) off his changeup.

**2023 RECAP:** Earned All-MLB Second-Team honors after going 10-11, 3.20 ERA (67 ER in 188.2 IP) with 166 strikeouts in 32 starts between the Cardinals (21 GS) and Rangers (11 GS).

- Ranked among MLB qualifiers in home runs per 9.0 innings (7th, 0.86) and ERA (8th, 3.20).
- Set career highs in virtually all categories, including wins (10), innings (188.2) and strikeouts (166) in 2023.
- Started the season with the Cardinals, going 6-9 with a 3.42 ERA (46 ER in 121.0 IP) over 21 starts with 108 strikeouts and 35 walks allowed...ranked among NL leaders in quality starts (T-7th, 12) and ERA (9th, 3.42).
- Was acquired by the Rangers on July 30 in a trade with the Cardinals along with RHP Chris Stratton in exchange for LHP John King, INF/OF Tommy Saggese and RHP T.K. Roby.
- Went 4-2 with a 2.79 ERA (21 ER in 67.2 IP), 58 strikeouts and 13 walks over 11 starts (8 quality) as a Ranger...ranked among AL leaders from Aug. 1-end of season in innings (4th), opp. OPS (7th, .630) and ERA (8th).
- Marked his third consecutive season of 30+ starts and 150.0+ innings.
- His 1.71 ERA in June (6 ER in 31.2 IP) was his lowest in any month of his career with more than 1 start.

**2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS:** In 6 postseason games (5 starts), went 3-1 with a 2.90 ERA (10 ER in 31.0 IP) and 17 strikeouts with the World Series Champion Rangers.

- Went 3-0 with a 1.83 ERA (5 R-4 ER in 19.2 IP, 14 K) in 4 road games (3 starts).

**GO GAMECOCKS:** Attended the University of South Carolina from 2012-14.

- Was teammates with D-backs first baseman Christian Walker in 2012, when they finished as National runner-ups after falling to the University of Arizona.
- Tossed 8.0 scoreless innings in his first College World Series appearance, defeating Arkansas 2-0, on June 21, 2012.

**HOW HE STARTED:** Yankees fourth-round pick in the 2014 draft out South Carolina.

- Made his Major League debut on April 12, 2017 for the Yankees @ Rays (8-4 win, ND, 4.2 IP, 5 H, 3 R-2 ER, 2 BB, 67K).
