FIRST WATCH

In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **HR** (25), **batting average** (.304, 112-368), **slugging percentage** (.571) and **on-base percentage** (.366).

ALL-STAR

Named by his peers to the **National League All-Star** team, **RHP Luis Castillo** threw a perfect bottom of the fourth inning in Tue's 4-3 loss at Cle's **Progressive Field** (**Carlos Santana** struck out, **J.D. Martinez** struck out, **Alex Bregman** 4-3)...**Castillo** was joined by **RHP Sonny Gray**, who was added to the **NL All-Star** roster to replace Wsh's **Max Scherzer** but did not pitch...was **Gray's** second **All-Star** selection...he was an **American League All-Star** in 2015 but did not appear in the game at Cin's **Great American Ball Park**...**Castillo** and **Gray** are the first **Reds** starting pitchers named to the **All-Star** team since **Johnny Cueto** and **Alfredo Simon** in 2014.

ACE

RHP Luis Castillo in his last 23 apps beginning 9/1/18 is 11-4 and in that span ranks second among all Major League starting pitchers with an ERA of 2.01 (139ip, 82h, 61bb, 158k)...**LAD's Hyun-Jin Ryu** leads the majors in ERA in that span at 1.73...**this season Castillo** ranks among the National League leaders in **wins** (T10th), **ERA** (3rd), **strikeouts** (10th) and **strikeouts per 9 innings** (5th, 10.53)...since the distance from the pitching rubber to home plate was set at 60 feet, 6 inches in 1893, only 3 times in Major League history has a pitcher made 3 consecutive starts in a season with at least 8 strikeouts and no more than 2 hits allowed in each game (list below)...**Castillo's streak**, to open this season, was snapped in the 4-3 walkoff loss on 4/15 at LAD (5ip, 4h, 2er, 5bb, 7k)...no pitcher ever has done it in 4 consecutive starts.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 3-game series vs **Ryan Coleman's** first-place **Cubs**, **Game 4** (1-2) of a 6-game road trip that included a **2-1 series loss** at Col's **Coors Field** and **Game 1** in a stretch of **10 straight games vs NL Central Division** rivals (0-0 at Chi, 4g vs StL, 3g at Mil)...the Redlegs finished the first half with a **5-4 homestand** vs the first-place **Cubs** (2-1), first-place **Brewers** (3-1) and the **Wild Card** contending **Indians** (0-2)...following this series return to **Great American Ball Park** for a brief 4-game homestand vs the **Cardinals** before hitting the road again for a 3-game visit to Mil's **Miller Park**.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds have won the **first 3 series** of a season vs the Cubs for the first time since they won the **first 5 series** of 2013...over the **previous 4 seasons** (2015-2018), the Cubs' **.671 winning percentage** vs the Reds (51-25) was the best by any team against any division opponent...**Joey Votto** ranks third among all active players with **34 HR** and **114 RBI** against the Cubs, trailing in both categories only **Albert Pujols** (57-146) and **Ryan Braun** (38-133)...in the team's most recent meeting, an 8-6 Reds win on 6/30 at **GABP**, **Votto** went 0-for-4 to snap an 11-game hitting streak vs the Cubs during which he hit .511 (23-45, 2 2b, 2hr, 4rbi).

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES: The Reds and Cubs are meeting at **Wrigley Field** for the second of this season's 3 meetings...the Reds have lost **22** of the **last 31 games** played in **The Friendly Confines**...since a 4-1 Reds win on 6/25/14 and beginning 9/15/14, the Cubs have won **21** of the last **24 night games at Wrigley Field** between the teams...beginning 6/25/14, **Joey Votto** has reached base safely in **39 straight games at Wrigley Field**, the longest streak by a visiting player since **STL/LAD's Wally Moon** reached in **47 consecutive apps** here from 8/30/1957 - 9/15/1962...is the longest streak ever by a Reds player at **Wrigley Field** and the longest by any player since Chi's own **Mark Grace** reached safely in **45 straight games** here from 9/28/1996 - 7/22/1997...during this current 39-game on-base streak at **Wrigley**, **Votto** is hitting .393 (55-140, 16 2b, 1 3b, 6hr, 20rbi, .650slg, .503obp)...his **118 career hits** here are the most by any active opposing player (118-354, .333, 16hr, 57rbi).

ROCKY MOUNTAIN HIGH: In Sat night's 17-9 Reds win at Coors Field...

- The Reds became the first Major League team in the **modern era** to produce in a game at least **5 triples** and at least **3 HR**.
- The Reds tied the franchise record with **5 triples** (**Nick Senzel** 2, **Phillip Ervin**, **José Peraza**, **Eugenio Suárez**)...was accomplished for the eighth time **since 1900** and for the first time since a 21-4 win vs the Phillies on 6/5/1929.
- The Reds became the first team in Coors Field history with **5 triples**.
- Phillip Ervin** tied the club record with **6 hits**, accomplished for the fourth time (**Tony Cuccinello** 1931, **Ernie Lombardi** 1937, **Walker Cooper** last on 7/6/1949 vs Cubs).
- For the second time in modern franchise history, 4 players produced at least 4 hits (**Nick Senzel** 4, **Yasiel Puig** 4, **Phillip Ervin** 6, **José Peraza** 4)...**Lonny Frey**, **Frank McCormick**, **Ernie Lombardi** and **Harry Craft** each had at least 4 hits vs Brooklyn on 6/8/1940.
- Nick Senzel** (4h; 1 1b, 1 2b, 2 3b) and **Phillip Ervin** (6h; 4 1b, 1 2b, 1 3b) each fell a home run shy of the cycle.
- The Reds had **24 hits**, their highest total since they produced a club-record 28 hits in a **24-12 win on 5/19/1999** at **Coors Field**.
- The Reds' **12 extra-base hits**, 3 shy of the club record (**5/19/1999** at **Col**) and their most in a game since they had **13 extra-base hits** in a **17-4 win on 8/26/2001** at **Montreal**.
- The Reds scored **17 runs**, their highest total since **8/19/2005 vs Ari** (17-3 win) and their highest total on the road since **8/26/2001** at **Mil**.
- The Reds' **47 total bases** was their highest total since they had **49 total bases** in a 22-3 win on 9/4/1999 at **Phi**.
- Phillip Ervin** (6) and **Nick Senzel** (4) established career highs for **hits in a game**...**Yasiel Puig** tied his career high (4).
- The scheduled **6:10 p.m.** start began after a weather delay of **3:08** and was completed in **3:53**, at **1:10 a.m.** local time.

REHABBING: **LHP Alex Wood** is scheduled to throw a bullpen today in preparation for a rehabilitation start for Louisville on Wed night in Pawtucket (4ip, 60-65 pitches)...already made 2 rehab apps for Louisville, on 7/6 at **Columbus** (1.1ip, 2h, 1er, 1bb, 2k, 31 pitches) and **Fri vs Toledo** (2ip, 4h, 3r, 2er, 0bb, 2k, 51 pitches)...has been on the Reds' injured list all season with a **lower back injury**...has been on the 60-day IL since 5/31...made 1 start for the Reds in spring training, on 2/25 at **Sea** (1ip, 2h, 3er, 1bb, 0k, 1hr)...rehabbing **LHP Amir Garrett** (left lat strain) has joined the team here in Chicago...**C Tucker Barnhart** (right oblique strain) is rehabbing in Cincinnati.

2-WAY PLAYER: **RHP Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in 57 of the Reds' 90 games so far this season, including 39 times solely as a **pitcher**, twice as a **pinch hitter/pitcher**, once as a **pitcher/LF** (6/2 vs Wsh), 3 times as a **CF**, 3 times as a **LF**, 6 times solely as a **pinch runner**, once as a **pinch runner/CF** (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a **pinch runner/LF** (5/9 at Oak) and once as a **pinch runner/RF** (5/24 at Chi)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...**Lorenzen** this year became the **first player in Reds history**, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in **each of the first 6 games of a season** (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with more than 300 career innings pitched (374.1) to play center field since **Hal Jeffcoat** in 1958...**Ron Mahay** was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...**Mahay** played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

BLACK & BLUE: **Derek Dietrich** has been hit by a pitch **17 times**, the most in the Major Leagues this season and including **6 times** in the 4-game series at Mil from 6/20-6/23 (2-10, .200, 1 3b, 1rbi, 1bb, 7r, .529obp)...he is the only player in **modern Major League history** to get hit by a pitch **6 times** in a series of any length...was hit by a pitch twice in that series opener vs the Brewers, a 7-1 Reds win...in the 11-7 win in Game 2 became the first Reds batter in the modern era to be **hit by a pitch** 3 times in a game, tying the **Major League record** accomplished many times.

Tonight's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

RED HOTS

Luis Castillo at just **26 years old** already is in his third **Major League** season...selected by his peers, he joined **RHP Sonny Gray** as the first pair of **Reds starting pitchers** named to the **All-Star team** since **Johnny Cueto** and **Alfredo Simon** in **2014**...threw a perfect fourth inning in the National League's 4-3 loss at Cle's **Progressive Field** (struck out **Carlos Santana**, struck out **J.D. Martinez**, **Alex Bregman** 4-3)...**Gray** did not pitch...tonight is making his ninth career start and third of the season vs the Cubs, his fifth career start at **Wrigley Field**...will take a career-high **12.2-inning scoreless streak** into tonight's game...in his final appearance prior to the All-Star Game break, a 1-0 win on 7/4 vs Mil, didn't allow a hit until **Keston Hiura** singled with 1 out in the seventh inning...did not return after play was stopped by rain with 2 outs in the top of the eighth inning...**David Hernandez** inherited the 2-0 count on **Jesús Aguilar** and issued a walk charged to **Castillo**...produced 8 starts in which he threw at least 5.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer and 2 runs or fewer, a single-season franchise record... was the National League's **Pitcher of the Month for March/April** (7gs, 3-1, 1.45)...through his first 7 starts of this season led the Major Leagues in ERA (1.45)... made his first career **Opening Day start**, but in the 5-3 win vs Pit was the victim of a blown save...became the fifth straight different **Opening Day** starter for the Reds (**Johnny Cueto** 2012-2015, **Raisel Iglesias** 2016, **Scott Feldman** in 2017, **Homer Bailey** in 2018)...since his **Major League debut** in 2017, leads the Reds' pitching staff in almost every statistical category, including **wins, starts, innings pitched** and **strikeouts**.

- Has a 4-game hitting streak (7-14, .500, 1 3b, 1hr, 5rbi, .857slg, .500obp).
- In his last 20 starts is hitting .324 (23-71, 4 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 9rbi, 1sb).
- Made 35 starts at 2B (last, 7/13 at Col), second-most on the team (Derek Dietrich, 39gs)...made 11 starts at SS (last, 7/4 vs Mil), also second-most on the team (José Iglesias, 79gs).
- Made 10 starts in the outfield, including 8 starts in LF (last, 6/14 vs Tex) and 2 starts in CF (6/9 at Phi, 6/22 at Mil).
- Since Scooter Gennett suffered a right groin injury in spring training, has played primarily 2B and occasionally CF or LF, while José Iglesias has been playing SS.

66 YASIEL PUIG, of

First Half: 82g, 78gs, .257, 20hr, 51rbi, 13sb

- Name is pronounced yah-SEE-el PWEEG.
- Is tied with Eugenio Suárez for the team lead in HR and is tied with Suárez and Joey Votto for the team lead in hits...beginning 5/10 leads the team with 16 HR and 38 RBI.
- In Sat's 17-9 win at Coors Field had 4 hits, including a double and HR, and 4 RBI.
- Beginning 6/15 homered in 10 of his last 23 apps (30-81, .370)...his 10 HR in that span are third-most most in the Major Leagues (Mike Trout 1st, 12).
- In 19 apps beginning 6/19 is hitting .388 (26-67, 4 2b, 1 3b, 8hr, 18rbi, 4sb, .836slg, .432obp).
- In 30 apps beginning 6/4 is hitting .355 (39-110, 7 2b, 1 3b, 11hr, 23rbi, 6sb, .736slg, .395obp).
- Leads the team and ranks T7th in the National League with 13 stolen bases, 2 shy of his career high (15sb, 2017, 2018).

15 NICK SENZEL, cf

First Half: 55g, 52gs, .263, 8hr, 27rbi, 8sb

- Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
- In Sat's 17-9 win at Coors Field produced a career-high 4 hits, including a double and 2 triples, and fell a home run shy of the cycle.
- Has hit safely in 40 of his first 58 career apps, including 17 multi-hit games.
- Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
- Went hitless on 6/2 vs Wsh, snapping a 9-game hitting streak (14-41, .341, 5 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .378obp) and a 20-game on-base streak (26-86, .302, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 8rbi, 4sb, .358obp)...is the longest hitting streak by any Reds batter this season and ties Joey Votto's for the longest on-base streak by a Reds hitter.
- On 5/3 was promoted from Louisville and that night vs SF made his Major League debut, started in CF and batted second in the order (1-5, 2bb, 1r).
- Recorded his first career hit in his Major League debut (single off Tony Watson), his first HR in his second appearance (solo off Dereck Rodríguez), his first stolen base in his third game and his first career leadoff HR (off Drew Pomeranz) & first career 2-homer game in his fourth appearance.
- Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on 3/25 during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his 5/3 promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

First Half: 87g, 83gs, .248, 20hr, 54rbi, 1sb

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
- Leads the team in apps, total bases, extra-base hits and RBI...is tied for the team lead in runs, hits and HR.
- In the first half hit 20 HR, his new career high prior to the All-Star break...hit 19 HR in the first half of last season, when he was an All-Star.
- Hit safely in 6 of his last 8 apps of the first half (10-32, .313, 2 2b, 4hr, 9rbi, 1.083ops).
- Homered in 4 of his last 10 apps (5hr).
- On 7/1 vs Mil produced his fifth career 2-homer game, his first of the season.
- Made all of his starts batting second, third or fourth...beginning 5/10 made 50 of his last 51 starts batting third, including each of his last 33 starts.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

First Half: 81g, 77gs, .268, 8hr, 22rbi, 2sb, .360obp

- Prior to 2019, in his career after the All-Star break posted a .323 BA, .443 OBP, .549 SLG and .992 OPS.
- His career batting averages are .289 through April, .295 through May (619-2,100) and .316 beginning June 1 (1,192-3,773)...beginning June 1 this season is hitting .283 (34-120, .368obp).
- In his last 38 apps beginning 5/24 is hitting .331 with an on-base percentage of .400 (47-142, 11 2b, 4hr, 15rbi).
