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TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 9-game, 10-day homestand today with the first of 3 games against the Detroit Tigers...Seattle is coming off a series win against the Twins on the homestand, and will host the Tampa Bay Rays (3 G, 8/7-8/9) during 50 Seasons celebration weekend to close out the homestand...tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzo**s on the call...Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** will serve as an analyst on both Radio (innings 1-3 and 8-9) and TV (innings 4-7)...former Mariners catcher **Dave Valle** will serve as an analyst on Radio (innings 4-7) and TV (innings 1-3 and 8-9).

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners won Sunday's game by a 7-6 final score in walk-off fashion...it marked the Mariners 9th walk-off win of the season, tied for the most in the American League with the White Sox.

- **Déjà Vu All Over Again** - The Mariners dropped Friday's game but came back to win Saturday and Sunday, with both wins coming on walk-offs against the Minnesota Twins for the second-consecutive season...In 2025, **Cole Young** walked off Saturday's game in his MLB debut and **Randy Arozarena** hit a walk-off single on Sunday...this season, **Cal Raleigh** supplied the walk-off on Saturday while rookie **Colt Emerson** singled home the winning run in the 9th inning on Sunday.
- **A Word on Ward** - New Mariners OF **Taylor Ward** leads the AL with 87 walks, while ranking 6th with a .383 OBP...overall in 2026, Ward is batting .246 (101x410) with 20 doubles, 7 home runs 30 RBI and an .730 OPS in 111 games.
- **All Hail Sir Anthony, the First of His Name** - New Mariners RHP **Seranthony Domínguez** has made 43 appearances with the Chicago White Sox in 2026 with a 3.99 ERA (17 ER, 38.1 IP), 23 walks, 47 strikeouts and 12 saves...Domínguez ranks 16th in the AL with a 28.5% strikeout rate.
- **Muñ I Need** - **Andrés Muñoz** has been outstanding over his last 16 games (6/16-c), going 2-0 with 9 saves, a 1.10 ERA (2 ER, 16.1 IP), 6 walks and 26 strikeouts.
- **Four Score and a Homer** - The Mariners are 40-15 (.727) when they score at least 4 runs in a game and 47-27 (.635).
- **Summer of J-Rod** - OF **Julio Rodríguez** has excelled after the All-Star break during his career, batting .293 (282x963) with 162 runs, 49 doubles, 3 triples, 61 HR, 162 RBI, 40 stolen bases and an .886 OPS.

MARINERS MAKE TWO MOVES AT DEADLINE...the Major League Baseball Trade Deadline was yesterday at 3:00 p.m. PT, with the Mariners making a pair of trades...on Saturday, the Mariners acquired RHP **Seranthony Domínguez** (#58) and minor leaguers C Boston Smith, OF Nolan Jones and cash considerations from the Chicago White Sox in exchange for RHP Luis Castillo...yesterday morning, the M's acquired OF **Taylor Ward** (#27) from the Baltimore Orioles in exchange for RHP Alex Hoppe and minor league RHPs Brock Moore and Harrison Kreiling.

ROSTER SHUFFLE...the Mariners made 7 roster moves prior to today's game: RHP **Seranthony Domínguez** and OF **Taylor Ward** reported to club, INF/OF **Brendan Donovan** was reinstated from the 10-day Injured list (right groin muscle strain) and C **Jhonny Pereda** was recalled from Triple-A Tacoma...in corresponding moves, C Mitch Garver and OF Rob Refsnyder were released from the roster and OF Stuart Fairchild was designated for assignment...the Mariners active roster is now full at 26 players and the Mariners 40-man roster is now at 36 players.

HOT OR NOT (HE'S HOT)...**Cole Young** went 4-for-5 with an RBI in Sunday's game...in 16 games since the All Star Break (7/17-c), he is batting .354 (23x65) with 9 runs, 1 double, 2 triples, 3 home runs, and 8 RBI for an .961 OPS over 69 plate appearances...he is the best second baseman in the American League this season by *Baseball-Reference* wins above replacement (4.0)...in a Major League-leading 113 games played, Young is batting .269 (111x413) with 54 runs, 15 doubles, 3 triples, 14 homers, 51 RBI and a .747 OPS in 453 plate appearances.

J's ON MY FEET...first baseman **Josh Naylor** went 2-for-4 with a double and 2 RBI in Sunday's game, extending his on-base streak to 24 games (7/4-c) last night...it is the longest active on-base streak in the Majors, ahead of Ryan Jeffers-MIN (23 G)...the 23-game streak is the longest on-base streak by a Mariner since **Randy Arozarena**'s 34-game on-base streak from March 31-May 12, 2025.

CELEBRATING 50 YEARS OF MARINERS BASEBALL...the 50 Greatest Mariners will be revealed this Saturday, August 8 in a pre-game ceremony...more former Mariners spanning multiple generations will be at T-Mobile Park than ever before...for more info, visit Mariners.com/50Seasons...on Friday, Aug. 7, the Mariners will hold an Alumni Home Run Derby following the game, led by Hall of Famer **Ichiro Suzuki** and other former Mariners...for more info on participants, format and rules visit Mariners.com/Derby.

CANZONE CAN CRUSH...**Dominic Canzone** is batting .257 (73x284) with 40 runs, 17 doubles, 1 triple, 18 home runs, 49 RBI, a .334 OBP and slugging .514 for an .848 OPS in 98 games this season...he leads Mariners hitters in HR, slugging and OPS...over the past two seasons, Canzone has combined to hit .277 (146x527) with 70 runs, 28 doubles, 1 triple, 29 home runs, 81 RBI, a .345 OBP and slugging .499 for an .844 OPS and an 140 OPS+...his 140 OPS+ ranks T-10th among MLB hitters with at least 500 PA over the last two seasons...of the top 10, Canzone is the only one who has yet to be named an All-Star.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Colt Emerson** recorded the first walk-off of his career in Sunday's win over the Twins, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Emerson joins Alex Rodriguez (3/31/96 vs. CWS), **Cole Young** (5/31/25 vs. MIN) and Danny Tartabull (9/11/1984 vs. TEX) as the only Mariners players to record a walk-off hit before their 22nd birthday?...Rodriguez (20 years, 248 days) is the youngest to do it, followed by Emerson (21 years, 13 days), Young (21 years, 306 days) and Tartabull (21 years, 317 days).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - AUGUST 4

- **1994** - Rich Gossage earns the victory at California and becomes the third pitcher in ML history to appear in 1,000 career games.
- **2005** - Félix Hernández makes his MLB debut at the age of 19 years, 118 days of age in loss at Detroit.
- **2008** - Raúl Ibáñez hits a grand slam and a two-run single in a 10-run 7th inning, establishing a club record for RBIs in one inning.
- **2010** - Ichiro Suzuki tied the club record with 4 stolen bases in one game against the Texas Rangers, the 2nd game of his career with 4 stolen bases.
- **2012** - On the 7th anniversary of his Major League debut (228th career start) Félix Hernández threw a 2-hit shutout in a Mariners 1-0 victory at Yankee Stadium.
- **2017** - Robinson Canó hit the 500th double of his career, the 7th second baseman to reach the threshold.
- **2023** - Eugenio Suárez records an RBI for the 10th-consecutive game (7/25-8/4), setting a franchise record.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season and the 52nd of his career...this will be his 58th career appearance, including the 6 relief appearances he made throughout the 2025 regular season...it will mark his 2nd career start against the Tigers.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT...on July 29 at Los Angeles-NL, tossed 5.0 innings, allowing 3 runs (3 ER) on 8 hits (1 HR) and 1 walk while striking out 5 batters...threw 92 pitches and 64 strikes.

JULY WRAPPED...Over 4 starts in July, owned a 2.29 ERA (5 ER, 19.2 IP) with 15 strikeouts, 5 walks, and a 1.017 WHIP...his ERA ranked 11th-best among AL starting pitchers in July (min 3 GS) while his WHIP ranked 15th best in the AL...threw 5.0+ IP with 3-or-fewer runs allowed in 3 of his 4 starts, only failing to do so in his final start before the all-star break due to leaving the game in the 2nd inning as a precaution after being struck by a come backer...recorded 2 quality starts with a scoreless 7.0-inning outing to begin the month on July 5...his July 5 start marked his 2nd career outing with 7.0+ scoreless innings and his 3rd outing with 6.0+ scoreless innings this season.

HOME TURF...across 10 home starts this season, owns a 2.93 ERA (19 ER, 58.1 IP), 12 walks and 62 strikeouts for a 5.17 K/BB and a 0.891 WHIP...his WHIP at home ranks 4th in MLB (min. 50.0 IP) while his 28.3 K% in home games ranks 14th-best and his K/BB ranks 13th best in MLB this season, just trailing **Logan Gilbert's** 5.18 (min. 50.0 IP)...his ERA ranks 11th lowest among AL pitchers (min. 50.0 IP).

WFH TODAY...has recorded 5.0+ IP in all 10 home starts this season, allowing 3-or-fewer runs in 9 of the 10...Hancock has recorded 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer runs allowed in each of his last 2 starts, marking the 2nd time in his career he has recorded such starts in back-to-back home games (last: 5/2-5/15)...has recorded 5 home starts with 2-or-fewer runs and 5+ strikeouts over 6.0+ IP, tied for 5th most in the AL (5 others)...the Mariners 23 such games this season are most in MLB...is 1-of-9 pitchers in MLB with 6+ home starts with 6-or-fewer base runners allowed over 6.0+ IP, along with **Bryan Woo** (7 G) and **Logan Gilbert** (6 G)...allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in each of his first 7 home games of the season, becoming the 7th Mariners pitcher all-time to do so (last: J.A. Happ, 2015).

TOP MARKS...is 1-of-8 pitchers in MLB with 102+ strikeouts and 27-or-fewer walks, along with **George Kirby** and **Bryan Woo**...joins just Zack Wheeler-PHI and Tarik Skubal-DET as 1-of-3 pitchers this season to have 102+ strikeouts, 27-or-fewer walks and 88-or-fewer hits...among those 3 pitchers, has the most innings pitched (110.1)...is 1-of-2 pitchers in Mariners history to record such marks through the first 20 outings of the season, joining **Logan Gilbert** (2025).

CROSS FIRE...owns a 1.016 WHIP against left-handed batters, ranking 8th best in MLB (min. 50.0 IP) while ranking 10th in K/BB (3.56) among AL pitchers...has thrown his cutter the 2nd most against left-handers (164 times) behind his 4-seam, owning a .174 (4x23) opponent batting average on the pitch to rank 9th lowest among pitchers with at least 100 cutters thrown to lefty batters...his whiff rate (34.3) on his cutter to LHB ranks 5th and his K% (26.9) ranks 8th best (min. 100 cutters).

QUALITY CONTROL...in his last home start on July 22 vs. CIN, recorded his 10th quality start of the season and his 7th quality start with 1-or-fewer walks, tied for 9th most such starts in the AL (4 others)...has recorded a quality start with 5+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks in 6 starts this season, tied for 7th most in the AL (4 others)...the Mariners are 10-5 when Hancock logs a quality start since the start of 2025.

NO FREE PASSES...has allowed 3-or-fewer walks over 5.0 IP in 18-of-20 appearances this season, tied for 8th most in the AL (7 others)...his 2.2 BB/9 is 10th best in the AL (min. 100.0 IP)...has contributed 10 starts with 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks (last: 7/22 vs. CIN) to a Mariners pitching staff that has the 2nd-most such games (57) in 2026.

TRAFFIC CONTROL...his 121 base runners allowed over 110.1 innings in his first 20 starts, are the 5th fewest among pitchers in 2026 through their first 20 games (min. 110.0 IP)...is 1-of-4 Mariners pitchers to record 121-or-fewer base runners over 110.0+ IP through their first 20 starts of the season, along with **Bryan Woo** (2024), **Logan Gilbert** (2024) and **Bryce Miller** (2024)...owns a baserunners-per-9 of 9.71, tied for 11th lowest in MLB in 2026 (min. 100.0 IP)...is 1-of-14 pitchers, along with **Woo** (4 G), to log 4+ starts with 4-or-fewer base runners allowed over 6.0+ IP this season (last: 7/5 vs. TOR).

CAN'T TOUCH THIS...allowed only 2 hits over 7.0 innings of work on July 5 vs. Blue Jays for his 4th start with 2-or-fewer hits allowed over 6.0+ IP this season...is 1-of-1 pitchers in 2026 with 4+ such starts...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits in 2 starts this season (5/26 at ATH and 3/29 vs. CLE)...is 1 of 10 AL pitchers with multiple such starts this season, joining teammates **Bryan Woo** (5/6 vs. ATL and 4/3 at LAA) and **Logan Gilbert** (5/10 at CWS and 7/4 vs. TOR)...the Mariners have combined for 7 such starts this season, tied for most in MLB.
