THE BIG APPLE TV+: Tonight's 7:10 p.m. game against the Philadelphia Phillies will be aired exclusively on Apple TV+. Fans can access the game for free by using the Apple TV app or by visiting tv.apple.com. The service is accessible to anyone with internet or wireless access, no cable or satellite subscription is required.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets were off yesterday...On Wednesday, the Mets defeated the Reds, 10-2...The Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (12-2)...The Mets are 57-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 26-6-3 in 35 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-game homestand (7-1), their longest of the year, against the Braves (4-1), Reds (3-0) and Phillies (three games)...Following this series, the Mets head out on a 10-game, nine-day road trip to Atlanta (four games), Philadelphia (four games) and New York-AL (two games).

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets have won six straight games, eight of their last nine, 15 of their last 17 and 19 of their last 24 games...The Mets are seeking to tie their longest winning streak of the season, a seven game streak from July 24-August 1...New York has posted a 2.17 ERA (13 earned runs/54.0 innings) in this current streak with 14 walks and 70 strikeouts...They are batting .305/.393/.437 in the stretch...The team is outscoring opponents 40-14 and have not trailed at any point during the winning streak...Mets starters are 6-0 with a 1.40 ERA (six earned runs/38.2 innings) during the winning streak.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets have won six straight at Citi Field and are 10-1 in their last 11 games in Queens...Overall, the Mets are 38-18 at home...They are third in the majors and second in the National League with a .679 winning percentage at home...The team's .679 winning percentage is currently tied for the third-highest in team history with the 2000 (55-26, .679) and 1986 (55-26, .679) teams...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700) had a better record at home...The Mets have posted a 3.27 ERA with 162 walks and 547 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

RETURN OF THE MAX: Since returning from the IL, Max Scherzer has gone 3-1 with a 1.37 ERA (7 ER/46.0 IP) in seven starts...That is the lowest ERA in the NL and the second-lowest mark in the majors since his first start back on July 5, trailing only Dylan Cease's 0.84 ERA...He and Gerrit Cole are tied for the major league lead with 61 strikeouts...Scherzer's three double-digit strikeout games since coming back from his injury are tied for the most in the NL...Only Shohei Ohtani (four) has more 10+ K games since July 5.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks fourth all-time with 109 double-digit strikeout games in his career, one more than Pedro Martinez...With 10 or more punchouts tonight, he would tie Roger Clemens for third all-time...Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212) are the top two.

THE 7.0 LINE: Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings six times in 15 starts this season...Each time Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings this season, he has finished his outing with one or no runs allowed and has allowed three hits or fewer four times...Despite missing seven weeks on the Injured List, those six outings of 7.0+ innings while allowing one or no runs are still tied for the sixth-most in the majors.

FOR STARTERS: Since Scherzer returned from the IL on July 5, Mets starters have posted a 2.25 ERA (48 earned runs/192.0 innings) in the team's last 32 games with 207 strikeouts and 485 walks...The Dodgers are second in that period with a 2.79 ERA, followed by the Phillies with a 3.10 ERA...New York's 207 strikeouts in that span also lead the majors...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.52 in that span...The Mets rank fifth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.52 ERA from their starters.

TYLER THE CREATOR: Tyler Naquin went 2-4 with a home run, a double, two runs and two RBI on Wednesday...Seven of his 11 hits with the Mets have been extra-base hits (three home runs, two triples, two doubles)...His seven extra-base hits are tied for third-most by a Met in their first 10 games with the franchise...He is one of eight Mets to have at least seven extra-base hits through their first 10 games with the franchise...He has posted a 1.254 OPS as a Met, sixth-best by a Met through their first 10 games with the franchise (min. 20 AB).

HIGH FIVE: The Mets have scored five or more runs in each of their last nine games...That is the longest streak by any team in the majors this year...It's tied for the second-longest streak in franchise history...The last time the team had a nine-game streak was from April 27-May 6, 2017...The franchise record is 12 games from August 11-24, 2007...The Mets are hitting .308/.389/.494 in that span with 61 runs scored...Overall, the Mets are 54-5 this season when they score five or more runs.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets begin a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East, the only division with three 60-win clubs thus far...Overall, the Mets are 37-14 against the East this year...Their .726 division winning percentage is the best in baseball...They have not lost a series in the division all season long...According to ESPN Stats & Info, New York has either won or tied each of their 15 series this season against the East...That is the third-longest streak by a team to start a season since the MLB implemented divisions in 1969...It's the longest since the Braves went 16 straight to start the 1999 season...Since May 27, the team has gone 24-7 in the division...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.16 ERA against the East, while hitting .265/.342/.424...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 265-168.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 15-4 in the second-half...The team's 15 wins are the second-most in the majors, as is their .789 winning percentage...The team is batting .299/.370/.483 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average and OBP and are second in runs and third in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 107-63 following the break.

BAKERS DOZEN: Jeff McNeil is on a 13-game hitting streak, batting .407 (22-54) with nine runs, seven doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI with a .421 OBP and a .704 SLG in that span...This is the second longest streak of his career and the longest hitting streak by a Met this year...He has recorded seven multi-hit games in that span...He has recorded 141 multi-hit games in his career...That places him tied for 32nd in franchise history with John Milner.

PHILS-METS NOTES: The Mets have outscored the Phillies 66-44 in 12 games this season...The Mets have won four straight against Philadelphia and six of their last seven games...The last time they met was May 29.

BACH IN A NEW YORK GROOVE: Daniel Vogelbach is the first Met to reach base in at least 13 straight starts to begin his Mets tenure since Norichika Aoki (15 starts) in 2017... Since he made his Mets debut on July 24, the Mets are first in MLB in each of the triple-slash categories (.311/.383/.512) and winning percentage (.875) and second in runs per game (6.18) and extra-base hits (69)...He is batting .341 (15-44) with six runs, four doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, 10 walks with a .473 OBP and a .568 SLG in 15 games with the Mets.

QUICK REFLEXES: New York has a tendency to immediately responded with a pair in the bottom half of the frame after allowing runs in the top frame...According to Elias, in 210 chances this season, the Mets have responded 65 times in the half-inning after allowing their opponent to score...That is good for a 30.9 percent rate of punching back, the best in the NL...Since the All-Star break, the Mets have scored in the subsequent half inning following a foe's score in 11 of 28 opportunities (39.3 percent).

RUNNIN' DOWN A DREAM: Francisco Lindor has scored at least one run in each of his last 13 games...It is the longest streak in the majors this year...The only player with a longer streak since 2010 is Mike Trout (15 games, July 5-23, 2012)...It is tied for the longest streak in franchise history with David Wright...Wright recorded with a 13-game streak from July 13-29, 2008...Overall, he has scored 16 runs in that span, batting .417 (20-48) with two doubles, four home runs, 14 RBI with a .491 OBP and a .708 SLG.

FWAR WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Francisco Lindor ranks fourth in the majors and third in the National League with a 5.0 fWAR...He is on an 18-game on-base streak...It is tied for the second-longest on-base streak in his career...He owned a career-best 29-game streak from July 16-August 17, 2017...It is his longest as a Met...Since July 23, he is batting .409 (27-66) with 20 runs, five doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI, 11 walks with a .494 OBP and a .667 SLG...In 36 games since the start of July, Lindor is batting .331/.413/.561 with 29 runs, six doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 25 RBI, 18 walks and a .974 OPS...He ranks tied for second in the majors with 21 go-ahead RBI behind teammate Pete Alonso (30).

JUST SHORT: Francisco Lindor has hit 20 home runs this season (19 as a shortstop)...Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016... He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...Lindor blasted 20 home runs in 2021...He has recorded 81 RBI in 111 games this season (79 as a shortstop)...That is the second-most RBI by a shortstop in Mets history...José Reyes owns the record, recording 81 RBI in 153 games in 2006...He is tied for fifth in the majors and tied for third in the NL with 81 RBI...The Mets are the only team in the majors with two players with at least 75 RBI this year.

HECK OR HIGH-WATER MARK: The Mets are a season-high 34 games over .500...Prior to this year, it's the most games over .500 since they were 34 games above after they were 92-58 on September 19, 2006...The last time the team was 35 games above .500 was when they were a season-high 35 games over on September 13, 2006...New York has won 73 games this season, second-most in the NL and in the majors...Their .652 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 73-39 record through the team's first 112 games...Only the 1986 (75-37) team posted a better record through the first 112 games of the season.

30 FOR 20: Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season...He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons...Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs...Alonso is second in the majors and leads the National League with 96 RBI...He is eighth in the majors and fourth in the NL with a .542 SLG.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is seeking to record 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year...He is seeking to become the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He would be first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado accomplished the feat in 2007 and 2008.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 18 outings dating back to June 22, covering 18.0 innings, establishing a new career-high scoreless streak...37 of Díaz last 50 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards and since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.36 ERA (one earned runs/24.2 innings) with 11 hits, two walks and 53 strikeouts...He has converted all 15 saves in that period.

MINDFULNESS WITH THE METS: The Mets launched Mindfulness with the Mets, presented by Empire Blue Cross Blue Shield...The program encourages young students to learn about the importance of mental health and positive thinking...Earlier today, the Mets hosted a yoga clinic at Citi Field...Students from Child Center of New York participated in yoga and agility activities with professional trainers and enjoyed a workshop with the Mets team dietitian...All participating students had lunch in the Bullpen Plaza and received Mindfulness with the Mets T-shirts and yoga mats.

Q & A WITH MIKE PIAZZA: True Vodka will host a Q&A with Hall of Famer Mike Piazza today from 4:45 p.m.-5:15 p.m. in the Piazza 31 Club at Citi Field...Piazza will discuss his partnership with True Vodka and the Mets...True Vodka samples and appetizers will be served.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Scherzer today will toe the rubber for his 400th career start...In his last outing, tossed a quality start to earn the win in his Mets debut at Nationals Park on April 8, defeating his former squad...Was pitching in D.C as a visitor for the first time in his career...In 6.0 innings, allowed three runs on three hits, including one home run, with a walk and six strikeouts...Became the first Mets starter to win his team debut since David Peterson won his major league debut in Boston on July 28, 2020.

MAXIMUM OVERDRIVE: Scherzer has won 12 consecutive decisions and his teams have won each of his last 14 regular season starts...He is unbeaten in his last 20 starts, going 12-0 since June 4, 2021 with a 2.64 ERA (34 earned runs/116.0 innings) to go along with 147 strikeouts and just 23 walks in that span...His teams have won each of his last 14 regular season starts dating back to July 18, 2021...A win today would tie his career-best winning streak...He won a career-high 13 consecutive decisions to begin the 2013 season (April 6-July 3, 2013), a year that culminated in the first of his three Cy Young Awards.

IT'S ALWAYS SUNNY IN PHILADELPHIA: Today, Scherzer will make his 26th career start against the Phillies...His 2.50 ERA (44 earned runs/158.2 innings) against the Phillies is his best against any National League East opponent...It is his fifth-best career ERA against any opponent he has faced (min. 10 starts) behind Toronto (2.48), Chicago-AL (2.43), Tampa Bay (2.41) and Arizona (2.38).

YOU CAN TAKE IT TO THE BANK: Scherzer is 8-1 with a 2.23 ERA (19 earned runs/76.2 innings) in 12 starts at Citizens Bank Park...His teams are 11-1 when he starts a game in this ballpark (only loss was September 2, 2020)...He has never allowed more than three runs at CBP and has held the Phillies to seven hits or fewer in all 12 of his outings here...Each of his last five starts against the Phils have come in the City of Brotherly Love (today's will make six in a row)...He has not faced Philadelphia in his home ballpark since 2019, when he made all three of his starts against the club at Nationals Park...The last time he squared off against the Phillies at home and on the road in the same season was 2018.

CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD: Scherzer entered the 2022 season as the active leader in strikeouts...He ranks 18th on MLB's all-time strikeout list and is within striking distance of several pitchers above him this season...He needs 59 strikeouts to pass John Smoltz...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

2021 RECAP: Signed with the Mets on December 1, 2021...Was traded from Washington to the Dodgers on the day of the trade deadline last season...Led the majors in WHIP (career-best 0.86) and opponent batting average (.185)...Had the second-best ERA (career-best 2.46) in the majors and ranked fourth in strikeouts (236)...Notched his ninth career 200-strikeout season...Started the NL Wild Card Game for LA, throwing 4.1 innings of one-run ball in a 3-1 win over St. Louis...Made two appearances in the NLDS against the Giants and recorded the final out of the decisive Game 5 in that series to earn his first career MLB save...Made one start in the NLCS against Atlanta...Finished third in the NL Cy Young vote, his sixth career top-3 finish.

FRIDAY'S STARTER: RHP CHRIS BASSITT (1-0, 0.00)

LAST TIME OUT: In his Mets debut, Bassitt faced the Nationals for the first time in his career in Washington D.C. on April 9...He pitched a three-hitter across 6.0 scoreless innings striking out eight and walking one with 93 total pitches.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Became the second Mets pitcher to debut with a line of at least 6.0 scoreless innings with eight or more strikeouts...The only other Mets debut of 6.0 or more innings, no runs and eight or more strikeouts was Collin McHugh's MLB debut in 2012.

- Hitting .366 (26-71) with six doubles, five homers, 18 RBI, 14 runs and a 1.120 OPS since the All-Star break.
- Ranks fifth in MLB and third in the NL with 29 homers...Leads the NL and is second in MLB with 96 RBI...Tied for 16th in the NL with 64 runs.

- Named an All-Star for the second time...Drew a walk in his lone plate appearance in the Midsummer Classic...Reached the semifinals of the Home Run Derby.
- Broke David Wright's franchise record for first-half RBI, driving in 78 before the break...Wright drove in 74 before the break in 2006.
