Three States, Three Days

Atlanta today is playing its third game in its third state over the last three days. All three have been day games.

The Braves played the Twins in Minneapolis, Minnesota on Wednesday afternoon, before visiting Chicago, Illinois for a make-up game against the White Sox yesterday. Atlanta has split the first two games of this three-state run.

Atlanta will complete its current road trip in yet another state, playing on Sunday night in Williamsport, Pennsylvania. Counting the final game of a homestand last Sunday, the Braves will play eight games in eight days across five states from August 16 to August 23.

TODAY'S GAME: The Braves and Brewers today open a three-game, two-state weekend series with what is the fourth of six scheduled meetings between the teams this season...Atlanta and Milwaukee will play a pair of games here at American Family Field today and tomorrow, before participating in the 2026 MLB Little League Classic on Sunday night in Williamsport, PA.

 The two clubs played at Truist Park in Atlanta in June, with the Braves winning two-of-three games to take the series.

 Atlanta's two wins in their series earlier this year match the club's total against Milwaukee from each of the last two seasons...The Braves went 2-4 against the Brewers in both 2024 and 2025, and Atlanta has won the season set between the two teams just once since 2018 (5-1 in 2023).

 Atlanta has, however, won three straight series here at American Family Field, going 2-1 in 2023, 2024 and 2025...The Braves are three games over .500 here all-time since the stadium opened prior to the 2001 season, playing to a 39-36 record...Atlanta's .520 winning percentage here is fourth best by any visiting team in baseball.

PITCHING MATCHUP: RH Jacob Misiorowski of the Brewers is set to face LH Chris Sale for the Braves this afternoon, and the two enter play ranked first and second, respectively, among qualified pitchers in baseball in ERA...In a recent poll by MLB.com, Misiorowski and Sale rank first and third in the race for the 2026 NL Cy Young award.

 Misiorowski enters play 12-5 with a 1.75 ERA (27 ER/139.0 IP) through 23 starts on the year...He leads the majors in ERA, strikeouts (210), FIP (2.17), WHIP (0.75) and average fastball velocity (100.7 mph).

 One of Misiorowski's five losses this season did come to Atlanta, June 19 at Truist Park...The 6-foot-7, 197-pound Missouri native allowed five hits and two runs over 6.0 innings in that start, fanning seven...The defeat snapped a career-best seven-game winning streak.

 Sale enters this afternoon with a 12-8 record and a 2.16 ERA (31 ER/129.0 IP) through 22 starts...He ranks second in the majors in ERA and FIP (2.32), seventh in WHIP (1.02), 11th in strikeouts (160) and fifth in strikeouts per 9.0 innings (11.16).

 Sale has never lost to Milwaukee, pitching to a 2-0 record with a 1.62 ERA (7 ER/39.0 IP) over six career starts prior to today...The 6-foot-6, 180-pound Florida native faced the Brewers on June 20 earlier this season and allowed just two unearned runs over 5.2 innings, fanning seven in a no-decision.

 The left-hander has not allowed more than three runs in 19 consecutive starts dating to April 12, the longest active streak of its kind in the majors...In 43 total appearances since the start of last season, he has allowed more than three earned runs just three times.

FIRST-PLACE TEAMS: Atlanta today continues a stretch of seven consecutive games against teams currently in first place in their division...The Braves beat the White Sox (AL Central, +3.5), 2-0, yesterday afternoon before playing three against the Brewers (NL Central, +5.0) and Dodgers (NL West, +9.0).

 Atlanta (NL East, +5.0) has played just nine games against the five other teams currently leading their divisions, and has gone 5-4 (.556) in these affairs...Two of its five wins in these games came versus Milwaukee at Truist Park in June.

 Over a larger sample size against good opponents, Atlanta's 33-24 (.579) record against teams at or above .500 ranks second best in all of baseball...The only team that has been better, naturally, is Milwaukee (41-21, .661).

 At the start of this current seven-game stretch against first-place teams, Atlanta owned the second-hardest remaining strength of schedule in baseball over the remainder of the season, with its opponents combining for a .530 winning percentage...Only Cincinnati, with a .557 opponents mark, had a harder schedule the rest of the way.

STARTING PITCHING: RH Grant Holmes carried a no-hitter into the seventh yesterday afternoon and finished his outing with 6.0+ scoreless innings to earn the win...Since the All-Star break, the Braves' 3.06 ERA (60 ER/176.1 IP) from the rotation is best in the NL and behind just the Yankees (2.68) in the majors.

 In 33 total games since the break, Atlanta's rotation has 11 scoreless starts and has allowed no more than one run in 16 of its turns (48%)...Braves starters have allowed more than three runs just five times in that span.

 The Braves' 11 scoreless starts since the All-Star break are three more than any other starting staff in baseball.

 Atlanta's three scheduled starters in this series versus Milwaukee - Chris Sale, Martín Pérez & Tyler Mahle - rank seventh, ninth and 21st, respectively, in the NL in ERA since the break (min. 5 starts)...These three have combined to pitch to a 2.34 ERA over 17 total turns in that span.

RONALD NEARING HISTORY: Ronald Acuña Jr. slugged his 13th home run of the season and the 199th home run of his career on Saturday night vs. Arizona...In the five games since, while this note has been on the front page of the game notes, he has gone 3-for-21 with two singles, a double and nine strikeouts.

 Acuña Jr.'s next home run will stand as the 200th of his career, and he is looking to become the fastest player in major league history, by games played, to reach at least 200 home runs and 200 stolen bases.

 Alfonso Soriano holds the current record, swiping a pair of bases in his 929th career game to reach 203 home runs and 201 stolen bases...Acuña Jr. currently has 220 stolen bases to go with his 199 home runs...Today's game will be the 894th of his career.

Makes his 23rd start of the season and the 335th of his career in the opener of a series at Milwaukee...Atlanta is 13-9 in his 22 turns this year.
- 🔥

Will make his seventh career start against Milwaukee...Is 2-0 with a 1.62 ERA (7 ER/39.0 IP) and 52 strikeouts in six previous starts against the Brewers, and has never been charged with a loss by the club.
- 🔥

His 1.62 ERA (7 ER/39.0 IP) in six career starts against Milwaukee is the fourth-lowest by any pitcher against the franchise since its first season in the city in 1970, minimum five starts...Only Steve Kline (1.45), Rick Ankiel (1.50) and Andy Messersmith (1.51) rank ahead of him.

In his most recent turn against Milwaukee on June 20, he allowed two unearned runs over 5.2 innings with seven strikeouts in a no-decision, a game Atlanta won 4-3.
- 🔥

Ranks second among qualified major league pitchers in both ERA (2.16) and FIP (2.32) this season, trailing only Milwaukee's Jacob Misiorowski in each.
- 🔥

Has not allowed more than three runs in 19 consecutive starts, dating to April 12 vs. Cleveland, the longest active such streak in the majors...Is 10-7 with a 1.91 ERA (24 ER/113.0 IP) and 144 strikeouts over the span.
- 🔥

Since the All-Star break, Sale is 3-2 with a 2.03 ERA (7 ER/31.0 IP), striking out 43 against three walks over five starts...His 0.73 FIP in that span is the lowest among qualified major league pitchers.
- 🔥

His 2.16 ERA (31 ER/129.0 IP) would be the lowest by any pitcher age 37 or older in major league history, minimum 60 percent starts, ahead of Cy Young's 2.20 mark across his age 37-44 seasons from 1904-11.
- 🔥

His 2.37 ERA (114 ER/432.1 IP) since joining Atlanta in 2024 is the lowest among qualified major league starting pitchers over that span.
- 🔥

His .698 winning percentage (37-16) since the start of 2024 is the highest among pitchers with at least 50 starts over that span.

- 🔥

His 2,739 career strikeouts rank 27th in major league history and seventh among left-handers...His 11.14 strikeouts per 9.0 innings (2,739 SO/2,213.0 IP) is the highest rate in major league history (since 1901) among pitchers with at least 1,500.0 career innings.
- 🔥

His 415 career appearances are the third-most among active starting pitchers, minimum 60 percent starts, trailing only Justin Verlander (556) and Max Scherzer (494).
- 🔥

His fastball has averaged 96.0 mph in 2026, his highest mark in any season since he became a full-time starter in 2012.
- 🔥

It is the second-hardest average fastball among qualified major league left-handers this season, behind only Philadelphia's Jesús Luzardo (96.5).
- 🔥

Is one of two left-handers in Braves franchise history to record a 10-strikeout game at age 37 or older, joining Hall of Famer Warren Spahn...All three of Sale's have come this season (11 strikeouts May 2 at Colorado, 10 on June 28 at San Francisco, 11 on July 23 vs. San Diego), while Spahn did so four times from 1958-60, all with Milwaukee.

Took a 2-0 loss August 14 at home against Arizona, allowing one earned run on five hits over 6.0 innings without a walk and striking out nine on 108 pitches...Atlanta was shut out.
- 🔥

Recorded his 32nd career start with at least nine strikeouts and no walks in that outing.
- 🔥

Through his first 70 appearances with Atlanta, his 2.36 ERA is the second-lowest by any Braves pitcher in the Atlanta era (since 1966), trailing only Greg Maddux's 2.03.
- 🔥

Surpassed 2,200.0 career innings pitched during his July 29 start at New York (NL), entering that outing with 2,195.0.
- 🔥

Was named to his 10th career All-Star team this season, his third in as many years with Atlanta...His 10 selections are tied with Justin Verlander for the most among active pitchers.
- 🔥

Carried a 2.06 ERA through his first 18 starts, the lowest by a Braves starter through 18 turns of a season since Tom Glavine posted a 1.75 mark in 2002...Is the sixth pitcher age 37 or older in the Live-Ball era (since 1920) to open a season that way, most recently Justin Verlander, who carried a 1.86 ERA through 18 starts in 2022.

Recorded his 500th strikeout as a Brave on July 4 against New York (NL), becoming the ninth left-hander in franchise history to reach the mark.
- 🔥

Reached 150 career wins April 26 against Philadelphia, becoming the 265th pitcher in MLB history to do so.
- 🔥

Reached 400 career strikeouts with Atlanta on April 6, the 13th pitcher in franchise history to reach the mark.

In his 16th major league season, Sale was selected to seven consecutive AL All-Star teams from 2012-2018, was selected to the NL All-Star team in 2024, 2025 and 2026, and has eight career Top 10 finishes in Cy Young voting, winning the award with Atlanta in 2024.
