CINCINNATI REDS (20-13) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (18-16) May 3, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 1:35 EDT - Game #35/Home #20 RHP Chase Burns (3-1, 2.65 ERA) vs. RHP Braxton Ashcraft (1-2, 3.71 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won back-to-back games after defeating Cincinnati, 17-7, on Saturday (also beat the Reds, 9-1, on Friday)...Will wrap up this seven-game homestand (were swept in a four-game series from April 27-30 vs. St. Louis) before embarking on a six-game, seven-day road trip to Arizona (Tuesday-Thursday) and San Francisco (May 8-10) after today's game...Are in the final game of a stretch of 10 straight games vs. the National League Central (have gone 4-5).

SWEEP DREAMS: The Pirates would earn their first sweep of the Reds since sweeping a four-game series from April 20-23, 2023 here at PNC Park with a win today...The Pirates have gone 45-21 (.681) against the Redlegs at PNC Park in 66 games here since the beginning of the 2018 season...Pittsburgh's 17 runs on Saturday vs. Cincinnati were its most in any game since July 1, 2019 vs. Chicago-NL (18-5) and were its fourth-most in any game vs. the Reds in the Modern Era (since 1901)...The Pirates also defeated Cincinnati, 23-4, on April 27, 1912 at Forbes Field, 18-3 on May 2, 1925 at Forbes Field & 19-1 on August 21, 1968 at Crosley Field.

BEAT 'EM UP: The Pirates have won each of their last two games by at least eight runs (9-1 on Friday vs. Cincinnati/17-7 on Saturday vs. Cincinnati), marking the first time they've done that in back-to-back games since May 17, 2023 at Detroit (8-0) and May 19, 2023 vs. Arizona (13-3)...The last time they had done that in consecutive games against the same team came on June 26, 2019 (14-2) and June 27, 2019 (10-0) at Houston...The last time they had done that in back-to-back home games came on May 29, 2006 (14-3) and May 30, 2006 (12-1) vs. Milwaukee...Pittsburgh has won at least three straight games by eight runs twice in the Modern Era (since 1901), coming from September 5 (G1)-6 (G2), 1901 (four) and September 15 (G2)-17, 1975 (three).

WALK THIS WAY: Pittsburgh tied a Major League record (per the Elias Sports Bureau) by walking in seven straight plate appearances during the second inning of Saturday's 17-7 win vs. Cincinnati...The only other teams to ever do that within an inning were Chicago (AL) on August 28 (G1), 1909 vs. Washington (second inning) and Atlanta on May 25, 1983 vs. Pittsburgh (third inning)...The Pirates became the first Major League team to draw at least seven walks in an inning since Minnesota on April 17 (G2), 2014 vs. Toronto (eight)...Their 11 walks were their most in a game since September 26, 2021 at Philadelphia (also 11)...Pittsburgh's 140 walks rank fourth in Major League Baseball, behind Milwaukee (153), New York-AL (151) and Chicago-NL (149).

HIGH FIVE: The Pirates scored five runs in three different innings (first, second and fourth) on Saturday vs. Cincinnati...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, the five-run first and second innings marked Pittsburgh's first time scoring at least five runs in consecutive innings of a game since May 8, 2005 at Arizona (eighth/ninth) and its fourth game in team history scoring at least five runs in consecutive innings to begin a game (also September 24, 1901 vs. New York, May 26, 1964 vs. Philadelphia and Sept. 26, 1992 vs. New York)...It was also the fourth time in team history where the Pirates scored at least five runs in three different innings within a game, along with August 9, 1887 vs. Boston, August 1 [G1], 1893 at St. Louis and April 27, 1912 vs. Cincinnati...They were the first Major League team with five runs/zero hits in an inning (second) since New York (AL) on April 27, 1994 at Seattle.

RED-HOT REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds went 2-for-3 with a double, an RBI, two walks and a career-high-tying three runs on Saturday vs. Cincinnati...His fourth-inning double was the 200th of his career and marked his third straight game with an extra-base hit (since Thursday vs. St. Louis)...Reynolds, who is two hits shy of 1000 for his career, is 8-for-18 (.444) with three doubles, a triple, a home run, five RBI and six walks in his last five games (since April 28 vs. St. Louis)...His 28 walks this season are tied with Baltimore's Taylor Ward for the fourth-most in all of Major League Baseball (his .408 OBP ranks fifth in the National League).

PICK SIX: Pirates pitchers have recorded at least six strikeouts in 71 straight games (since last year on August 18 vs. Toronto)...That is tied with Cincinnati (August 2 [G2], 2020-April 23, 2021) for the third-longest streak by any team during the Modern Era (since 1901), behind only New York-AL (77 games, August 4, 2018-April 23, 2019) and Miami (76 games, April 5-June 29, 2023).

TOTAL TEAM EFFORT: Each of Pittsburgh's nine starting position players had at least one RBI on Saturday vs. Cincinnati...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, it marked only the fifth time since RBI became an official stat in 1920 where that happened for the Pirates (also April 19, 1921 at Chicago, September 3, 1924 vs. St. Louis, August 6, 1941 at Chicago and September 16, 1975 at Chicago)...It marked the Pirates' eighth game in the Modern Era (since 1901) with at least 17 runs and zero home runs, along with May 1, 1902 vs. St. Louis (18-6), June 11, 1904 at Boston (19-1), August 22, 1907 at New York (20-5), April 27, 1912 vs. Cincinnati (23-4), July 6 (G1), 1918 vs. Boston (17-1), September 25, 1923 vs. Philadelphia (18-5) and June 14 (G1), 1930 at Philadelphia (19-12).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

May 3, 2014: Pittsburgh scored six times in the final two innings to erase a 6-2 deficit and capture an 8-6 win over Toronto at PNC Park. Neil Walker broke a tie with his two-run double off Todd Redmond that scored Ike Davis and Josh Harrison in the bottom of the eighth inning. Bryan Morris improved to 3-0 after pitching a perfect eighth inning, while Mark Melancon secured his first save of the season.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2018 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Ashcraft lost an 11-7 decision after allowing a career-high six runs (had seven strikeouts) over 4.1 innings on April 28 vs. St. Louis (he was reinstated from the Major League Bereavement/Family Medical Emergency List prior to the game)...His 36 strikeouts during the month of April ranked sixth among all National League pitchers.

AGAINST THE REDS: Ashcraft is 0-2 with a 3.29 ERA (13.2ip/5er) and 13 strikeouts in three career starts against Cincinnati...He allowed one run in 3.1 innings last season on August 9 at PNC Park (no-decision in a 2-1 loss), surrendered two runs in 4.1 innings last year on September 25 at Great American Ball Park (lost a 2-1 decision) and gave up two runs in 6.0 innings in his 2026 debut on March 30 in Cincinnati (lost a 2-0 decision).

HOME DELIVERY: Ashcraft threw a career-high 94 pitches over a career-best 7.0 innings of work during Pittsburgh's 8-4 victory on April 22 at Texas...Ashcraft, a 2018 graduate of Robinson High School (located approximately 110 miles south of the Rangers' Globe Life Field), pitched in front of over 150 friends and family that evening.

GIRL DAD: Ashcraft, who is expecting his first child with his wife, Cassidy, had the gender reveal of his baby come in the form of a pink sleeve worn by his catcher, Joey Bart, on his right arm as he took the field for the first inning on April 16 vs. Washington.

IN THE BALLPARK: Ashcraft surrendered a career-high two home runs in his last start on April 28 vs. St. Louis...He allowed four home runs over his first 31 career games (99.1ip)...He was only the 14th Major League pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to allow four or fewer home runs over his first 31 games (minimum 99.1 innings), and he was the first Major League pitcher to do that since Detroit's Kevin Ritz from 1989-92.

HISTORIC STRETCH: Ashcraft had at least eight strikeouts while issuing one/zero walks and allowing one/zero runs in back-to-back starts on April 5 vs. Baltimore and April 11 at Chicago (NL)...He joined Bob Friend (Aug. 20-24, 1959), Rick Rhoden (June 21-27, 1986), Joe Musgrove (Sept. 20-26, 2020), Mitch Keller (May 8-14, 2023) and Paul Skenes (Sept. 4-10, 2025) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have consecutive starts with at least eight strikeouts, one/zero hits and one/zero walks.

HOW LOW CAN YOU GO: Ashcraft posted a 2.29 ERA (63.0ip/16er) in the first 13 starts of his Major League career (since last year on June 23 at Milwaukee)...That trailed Zach Duke (1.85 ERA, 2005), Paul Skenes (1.90 ERA, 2024), Cy Blanton (2.03 ERA, 1934-35), Bob Moose (2.06 ERA, 1967-68), Tim Wakefield (2.15 ERA, 1992) and Red Witt (2.21 ERA, 1957-58) for the lowest by a Pirate thru 13 starts in the Live Ball Era (since 1920).

HOMER HIATUS: Ashcraft allowed three home runs in 69.2 innings pitched last season, coming on July 4 at Seattle (Dylan Moore, two-run), September 9 at Baltimore (Jeremiah Jackson, solo) and September 15 vs. Chicago-NL (Michael Busch, solo)...He was one of only two Major League pitchers from May 26 (debut date) through the end of the regular season to pitch at least 65.0 innings and allow three or fewer home runs, along with Milwaukee's Aaron Ashby (he allowed three home runs over 65.2 innings).

THREE'S COMPANY: Ashcraft pitched at least 3.0 innings and allowed one or zero runs in each of his first six Major League starts, joining Los Angeles' Fernando Valenzuela in 1981 (seven starts) as the only pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1901) to accomplish that...The streak was snapped last year on Sept. 15 vs. Chicago-NL (gave up three runs).

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: Ashcraft struck out six batters over 3.0 perfect innings of relief during his penultimate appearance last season, which came on September 20 vs. the Athletics...He became the third Pirates reliever during the Modern Era (since 1901) to accomplish that feat, joining Bob Patterson (May 25, 1991 vs. Philadelphia) and Chan Ho Park (October 1, 2010 at Florida)...Ashcraft also joined starter Bubba Chandler, who had six strikeouts and zero walks, as the only pair of Pirates pitchers in the Modern Era to each have at least six strikeouts while also giving up zero walks in the same game.
