METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell Pirates, 14-2, last night in Pittsburgh... The Mets have lost three straight and five of their last seven games... New York is in stretch of 17-straight games before the All-Star break... They are 3-5 in that span... The Mets are in the midst of an eight-game road trip (2-3)... They travel to Washington D.C. for a four-game series (2-2) and to Pittsburgh, PA (0-1) for a four-game series... Following this trip, the Mets head to Citi Field to close out the first-half with a six-game homestand against Nationals (three games) and Rockies (three games).

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to today's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves... RHP Eric Orze (#53) has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse... RHP Ty Adcock was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse following last night's game... Orze's first appearance will be his major league debut... The right-handed pitcher was selected in the 5th round of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of New Orleans... He has appeared in 26 games at Triple-A this year, going 3-0 with a 3.76 ERA (16 ER/38.1 IP) with 22 walks and 56 strikeouts... In addition, RHP Edwin Diaz is expected to be reinstated from a 10-game suspension.

JULY! JULY! JULY!: The Mets are 2-3 this month, posting a 5.93 ERA, while batting .197/.235/.405... This compares to 16-8 record with a 4.17 ERA and a .280/.356/.504 slashline in June... The team's .197 average in July is 25th in the majors, while their .356 OBP is 30th... The team's 5.93 ERA in July is 27th in the majors.

IDON'T WANT TO BE A PIRATE: Pete Alonso is a .361 (13-36) hitter with five runs, five doubles, one RBI and five walks in 10 career games at PNC Park... Jose Iglesias has hit .348 (23-66) with five runs, four doubles, six RBI and 10 walks in 21 career games at the yard... Tyrone Taylor has hit .310 (18-58) with four doubles, two triples, one home run, nine RBI and three walks with a .500 SLG in 17 games in Pittsburgh.

FEELING A LITTLE DRAFTY: The Mets have a homegrown player on their roster from the 2021 (Christian Scott), 2020 (Eric Orze), 2017 (David Peterson, Mark Vientos), 2016 (Pete Alonso), 2013 (Jeff McNeil) and 2011 (Brandon Nimmo) drafts.

MAKERS MARK: In 42 games this season, Mark Vientos is batting .291 (43-148) with 26 runs, eight doubles, 11 home runs, 29 RBI with 13 walks, a .346 OBP, a .568 SLG with a .913 OPS... Entering 2024, Vientos had played a total of 81 games and hit .205 (52-254) with six doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, 15 walks with a .255 OBP, a .354 SLG and a .610 OPS.

AM I SEEING DOUBLE?: Francisco Lindor has recorded 25 doubles this season... That places him tied for second in the majors... Lindor has recorded 25 or more doubles in three straight years... Since he entered the league in 2015, Lindor has collected 290 doubles... His 290 doubles are tied with Vic Power for the 17th-most by a Puerto Rican born player... Next up is Jose Valentin (302).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: In 43 games batting in the leadoff spot this year, Francisco Lindor is hitting .289/.350/.517 with 32 runs, 17 doubles, eight home runs, 23 RBI, 12 walks, 10 steals with an .867 OPS... He ranks 12th in the majors and sixth in the NL with a 3.3 fWAR... Francisco Lindor has posted a 2.7 fWAR since May 1... That is third in the National League in that span, behind only Bryce Harper (3.3 fWAR) and Shohei Ohtani (3.0 fWAR)... It is eighth in the majors in that period... In 57 games since May 1, Lindor is batting .268/.323/.475 with 10 home runs and 32 RBI.

PIRATES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won 12 of their last 16 games against the Pirates... New York is 32-39 at PNC Park.

RECORD SCRATCH: The Mets are in the midst of 18 straight games against teams who currently have records below .500... The team is 2-3 in this stretch... The Mets are 24-19 this season when facing a team with a record below .500.

JUST DINGERS: J.D. Martinez has hit 10 home runs this year... Overall, he has hit 325 home runs in his career... That is the eighth-most amongst active players.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets hit the road for the final time before the All-Star break... New York is 21-19 on the road... Their .525 road winning percentage is tied for the ninth-best in the majors and the fourth-best in the National League... The Amazins' have hit .266/.328/.446 on the road in 2024... They are second in the majors in AVG, SLG and OPS... They have scored 224 runs on the road, averaging a major league-best 5.58 runs/game... The Mets went 32-49 on the road in 2023.

INVADER NIMS: Entering June, Brandon Nimmo was batting .214/.350/.378 with 29 runs, nine doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 29 RBI and a .728 OPS... In 27 games since then, he is batting .295/.388/.552 with 25 runs, seven doubles, one triple, six home runs, 23 RBI, 13 walks with a .941 OPS... He has safely reached base in 17 of his last 18 games... He owns a 2.6 fWAR this season, which is 15th in the National League.

MEET THE METS: Following a loss on May 29, the Mets have played 31 games, going 20-11 in that span... Their 20 wins are tied for the third-best in the majors, while their .645 winning percentage is tied for second in MLB... The Mets have hit .270/.341/.494 in that period with 72 doubles, six triples, 52 home runs, 102 walks, 26 steals and an .835 OPS... They have outscored their opponents 189-151 during those 30 games... Their 189 runs are the second-most in the majors in that span, while their 6.10 runs/game leads MLB.

Sproat, who was promoted to #98 on MLB Pipeline's Top 100 Prospects, has appeared in 13 games (12 starts) with the Cyclones and Rumble Ponies this season... He is a combined 6-1 with a 1.71 ERA (14 ER/73.2 IP) with 28 walks and 85 strikeouts... In eight starts at Double-A this year, Sproat is 4-0 with a 2.05 ERA (11 ER/48.1 IP) with 12 walks and 52 strikeouts... The right-handed pitcher was selected in the second round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida... The Futures Game will be played on Sunday, July 14 in Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Took the bump on July 1 in Washington...Hurled 6.1 innings and allowed two earned runs on seven hits with one walk and struck out two.

THREE'S COMPANY: Peterson is on a career-best three-game winning streak...He has posted a 3.49 ERA (11 ER/28.1 IP) over five games (three straight wins and two no decisions) with 13 walks and 19 strikeouts.

RETURN OF THE PETE: Made his season debut on May 29 vs. Los Angeles-NL... Allowed three runs (two earned) on seven hits with one walk and struck out three over 5.0 innings of work...Was his first start of the season...The southpaw has started the season on the 60-Day IL after undergoing left hip surgery in the off-season...In six rehab starts this year, Peterson went 2-1 with a 1.52 ERA (3 ER/23.2 IP) with three walks and 35 strikeouts.

STARTER/RELIEF: Last year, Peterson made a career-high 21 starts and went 2-8 with a 5.24 ERA (60 ER/103.0 IP) in those starts...In six relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (2 ER/8.0 IP).

STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT: On September 15, 2023 Peterson tallied a career high-tying 10 Ks, his first double-digit strikeout performance this season...Peterson has four 10 strikeout games in his career, one each season from 2020-2023...Peterson was one of four Mets pitchers to strikeout 10 or more batters in a game this season, along with Kodai Senga (five 10+ K games), Max Scherzer (one 10+ K game) and José Quintana (one 10+ K game)...Senga also struck out 10 batters in his start on September 14, the day before Peterson accomplished the feat.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Peterson reached a season-high 7.0 innings pitched in two starts last season, on August 27 and September 28...Were the fourth and fifth times in his career that he has pitched 7.0 or more innings...Peterson has only had one longer start in his career, throwing 7.1 innings in a 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay on May 14, 2021...In those starts, Peterson owns a 1-0 record.

HIGHEST HIGHS: Peterson set career-highs in innings pitched (111.0), starts (21), and strikeouts (128)...Kodai Senga was the only other Mets starter with at least 111.0 innings pitched, 21 starts and 128 strikeouts last season.

MAKIN' IT MAJOR: Upon returning to the majors on June 27 after a stint with Syracuse (AAA), Peterson pitched to a 2-2 record with a 3.38 ERA (27 ER/72.0 IP) in 19 games, 13 of which were starts...Peterson pitched to a 2-7 record before the All-Star Break, owning a 6.46 ERA (39 ER/54.1 IP) in 11 starts during that time...Post-Break, Peterson pitched to a 1-1 record and a 3.65 ERA (23 ER/56.2 IP) in 16 games (10 starts).

NEW YORK, NEW YORK: Peterson pitched to a 2.79 ERA (18 ER/58.0 IP) in 14 home outings (10 starts)...Over 13 road outings (11 starts) this season, the southpaw has pitched to a 7.47 ERA (44 ER/53.0 IP)...Peterson's 4.58 home/road ERA differential was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 10 or more starts both at home and on the road...Courtesy of Elias.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP SEAN MANAEA (5-3, 3.67)

WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA: In his first career start with the Mets, April 1 vs. Detroit, Manaea did not allow a hit through his first 5.2 innings...It was the longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their team debut and the second-longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their first career start with team...Tracy Stallard threw 6.0 no-hit in his first career start with the Mets on June 2, 1963 vs. Pittsburgh after making 13 relief appearances to begin his career with New York...He joined Kenny Rogers (7/28/99) as the only Mets pitcher to allow one hit and throw 6.0 or more innings in their team debut... He recorded eight strikeouts, which tied Johan Santana (3/31/08) for the most punch outs by a Mets left-handed pitcher in their team debut and were tied for the seventh-most by any Mets pitcher int their team debut...Credit Elias.
