**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets are set to open their 65th season with an 11-7 victory on Thursday...The Mets continue their first series of the season today against the Pirates (1-0)...Following this series, the Mets head out on their first trip of the year against St. Louis (three games) and San Francisco (four games).

**ROSTER MOVES:** The Mets announced that they have signed OF Tommy Pham to a minor league contract...Yesterday, LHP Bryan Hudson was claimed off waivers by the White Sox...In addition, INF Vidal Brujan and C Ben Rortvedt were sent outright to Triple-A.

**CY OLD:** The Mets scored five runs in the first inning off of reigning Cy Young Award winner Paul Skenes...Including Thursday, there have only been three instances where the Mets scored five or more runs in an inning off a reigning CY winner...*Courtesy of Elias.*

**OPEN SESAME:** The Mets improved to 42-23 all-time on Opening Day, and their .646 winning percentage is best in Major League history...They lost their first eight Opening Day contests and have now won 42 of their last 57...The win snapped their two-game losing streak on Opening Day...The Mets move to 7-2 on Opening Day at Citi Field...The Mets 11 runs scored are tied for the second most runs they've scored on Opening Day, only trailing the 1994 team, which scored 12 runs on Opening Day.

**HERE'S CARSON!:** Carson Benge lined a solo homer to right field in the sixth inning on Thursday...Marked his first career Major League homer and hit...It is the second time that a Met has homered in his Major League Debut on Opening Day (also: Kaz Matsui 4/6/04 at ATL)...He is the 17th player in franchise history whose first career hit was a home run...He becomes just the third Met to reach base three or more times in their debut on Opening Day (also: Rod Gasper 1969 and Kazuo Matsui 2004).

**IT TAKES TWO:** No Mets player has ever homered in their first two career Major League games.

**WE REMEMBER:** The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship...From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

**PIRATES-METS NOTES:** The Mets have earned the series victory against the Pirates at Citi Field over the last four years...They have not dropped a series to the Pirates at home since they went 1-2 in 2018.

**IN THE CITI:** The Mets are 697-627 all-time at Citi Field...The team went 48-32 at the ballpark in 2025...The team's .605 winning percentage at home in 2025 ranked sixth in the majors.

**WHAT AN ENTRANCE:** Mets batters drew nine walks and Mets pitchers issued none...It is only the fifth instance in franchise history (last 5/6/21 at STL)...Their five runs scored in the first inning are the most they've ever scored in the first inning on Opening Day and their 10 plate appearances are their most in a single inning on Opening Day since they had 10 plate appearances in the fifth inning in 2018.

**THE FRANCHISE:** A new display dedicated to the Tom Seaver collection, featuring highlights from his remarkable career, will open at the National Baseball Hall of Fame...The exhibit will open during the July 24-27 Induction Weekend in Cooperstown when fellow Mets legend Carlos Beltrán is enshrined in the Hall of Fame...One of the faces of baseball during the 1970s, Seaver compiled 311 victories, 3,640 strikeouts and three National League Cy Young Awards during a 20-year career with the Mets, Reds, White Sox and Red Sox...He was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1992 with what was at the time the highest percentage of the vote in the history of the Baseball Writers' Association of America balloting.

**SPRING TRAINING:** In three Spring outings (three starts), Peterson recorded a 4.15 ERA (6 ER/13.0 IP) with nine strikeouts...Held Spring batters to a .235 (12-51) average...Last pitched on March 22 at Miami, tossing a spring-high 5.0 innings (1R, 5H, 1BB, 4K).

**VS. PITTSBURGH/NATIONAL LEAGUE:** Has recorded two runs or fewer in four of his five career appearances vs. the Pirates...He has recorded a 4.71 ERA (11 ER/21.0 IP) and a 11.14/9.0 IP...Made 25 appearances vs. the National League last season, posting a 4.53 ERA (70 ER/139.0 IP)...The Mets were 14-11 last year when Peterson started against a National League team.

**2025 YEAR IN REVIEW:** Over a career-high 30 starts in 2025, he went 9-6 with a 4.22 ERA (79 ER/168.2 IP), 65 walks and a career-high 150 strikeouts...He allowed three earned runs or less in 22 of his 30 starts this season and one or zero earned runs in 10 starts...He picked up at least eight strikeouts in five of his 30 starts this season...Allowed four or more earned runs in eight of his last 16 starts after not allowing more than three earned runs through his first 14 starts of the season...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, finished third in HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.59), tied for fourth in opponent GIDP (20) and sixth in groundball percentage (54.7).

**GOING THE DISTANCE:** Completed at least 7.0+ innings in six of his 30 starts last season...Mets starters completed 7.0 innings 10 times in 2025, six of those starts came from Peterson...Him and Nolan McLean were the only Mets pitchers to complete 8.0 innings this season...His two 8.0+ innings pitched starts were the most by a Mets southpaw in a single season since Jon Niese (2014)...He completed pitched 5.0 or more in 24 of his 30 starts this season, and 6.0+ innings in 16 of those starts...His 24 such starts were the most on the team and his 16 such starts of 6.0 or more innings were the most on the team...He became one of 13 left-handed starters this season to record at least 16 starts with 6.0+ innings pitched...He joined Sean Manaea (16 in 2024) as the only Mets lefties to record as many 6.0+ IP starts since Steven Matz (16 in 2016 and 2019)...Peterson's 24 starts of 5.0+ innings pitched, his 16 starts of 6.0+ innings pitched, six starts of 7.0+ innings pitched and two 8.0+ innings pitched are all his most in a single season.

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL STAR:** On July 10, 2025, Peterson was named to his first career All-Star Game after posting a first-half career-best 3.06 ERA and 93 strikeouts (previous: 3.09 ERA in 2024 and 84 K in 2022)...He became the first Mets starting pitcher to be named an All-Star since Kodai Senga in 2023 and is the first left-handed Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Johan Santana (2009)...He threw 1.0 scoreless inning in the Midsummer Classic on July 15, becoming the first Met to do so since Jacob deGrom in 2019 and the first left-handed Mets pitcher to do so since Tom Glavine in 2004.

**LEFTY LEADERBOARD:** His 614 strikeouts are the seventh-most by a left-hander in franchise history...Tug McGraw is next on the list with 618 K...His 115 career starts are the eighth-most in franchise history by a southpaw...Vs. left-handers this season, he posted a .228/.275/.289 slash line (34-149) and allowed just one home run to 161 lefty batters faced...Among qualified left-handed pitchers facing left-handed batters this season, he finished fifth in groundball percentage (63.7), tied for fifth in strikeouts (48), seventh in opponents' SLG (.289), 10th in OPS (.564) and 13th in opponents' OBP...He reached 500.0 career innings pitched on May 18, becoming one of 18 left-handed pitchers to reach the milestone with the franchise...He also became the 13th Mets southpaw to reach 500 strikeouts on May 6 and was the first to do so since Steven Matz (recorded his 500th strikeout on 9/11/19).

**QUALITY CONTROL:** Recorded 15 quality starts in 30 total outings last season, including 12 of his last 23 starts...Recorded five straight quality starts from July 3 - August 1, which was tied for the longest such streak in his career (also: 8/14-9/3/24)...Peterson recorded 27 quality starts since his start to last season (5/29/24), with 25 of them coming in his last 46 games (since July 1)...From July 1, 2024 to the end of this season, he was one of 12 pitchers (one of five in the NL) to record at least 25 quality starts and one of five left-handers to do so (also: Tarik Skubal, Framber Valdez, Max Fried and Cristopher Sánchez).

**APPLE PICKING:** Last season, Peterson recorded a net bases prevented of eight (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant, which was tied for the second-best in the majors with six others, trailing Matthew Boyd and Max Fried...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 33 net bases prevented is the most among qualified Major League pitchers...Max Fried is next on the list at 23...Peterson has recorded 18 career pickoffs (three this season), which is tied with Sid Fernandez for the seventh-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20)...According to *OPTA*.

**CAREER NOTES:** Set new career highs in strikeouts, innings pitched and starts last season...Had a career-high 15.0 scoreless inning streak from June 5-17...He threw at least 5.0 innings in 12 straight starts from April 12 - June 17, which was the longest such streak of his career...Over parts of six Major League seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 37-30 with a 4.12 ERA (285 ER/622.2 IP), 262 walks and 614 strikeouts in 131 games (115 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.

- Recorded 13 scoreless outings of at least 1.2 innings, which was tied for the eighth-most such games in the majors and tied for the sixth-most such games in the NL in 2025.
