METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves 3-2 last night...New York has lost three of its last four games...The Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (15-6)...The Mets are 60-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 27-7-3 in 37 series this year...The Mets continue a 10-game, nine-day road trip (1-3) to Atlanta (1-3), Philadelphia (four games) and New York-AL (two games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY, THERE IS SUCH THING: Happy Birthday to Mets Hall of Famer and SNY broadcaster Ron Darling...He ranks fourth in team history in wins with 99 and is also in the top 10 in club history in complete games, innings, strikeouts and shutouts...A member of the 1986 World Champions, he won Game 4 of the World Series in Boston to even the series...Darling was an All-Star in 1985 and earned a Gold Glove Award in 1989...He has been a member of SNY's broadcast team since its inception in 2006.

I GET KNOCKED DOWN, BUT I GET UP AGAIN: The Mets are 31-10 (.756) following a loss this year...The .756 winning percentage is the best in the majors.

TAKE IT TO THE BANK: Starling Marte is a career .388 (47-121) hitter with 24 runs, 14 doubles, five home runs, 16 RBI, seven walks with a .439 OBP and a .629 SLG in 31 career games at Citizens Bank Park...He has safely reached base in each of his last 11 games at the ballpark, batting .444 (20-45) with 13 runs, five doubles, two homers, seven RBI and a 1.157 OPS in that span...Tyler Naquin has hit .368 (7-19) with two runs, a double, a triple, an RBI and a walk in six games in Philly...Jeff McNeil owns a .305/.379/.415 slashline with 13 runs, eight doubles, a triple, a home run, seven RBI and 11 walks at the yard...Darin Ruf, who played for Philadelphia from 2012-16, has appeared in 149 career games at the ballpark and recorded a .236/.323/.468 slashline with 50 runs, 16 doubles, 23 home runs, 55 RBI and 42 walks in 365 career plate appearances.

PHILLY PETE: Pete Alonso is hitting .333 (17-51) with five doubles, five homers, 19 RBI and 12 runs scored against the Phillies this season...The only Mets with more RBI in a season against the Phils are Mike Piazza (22 in 2002) and Darryl Strawberry (20 in 1987)...Michael Conforto (2018) and David Wright (2012) have also driven in 19 runs in a season vs. Philadelphia...Only two players have more RBI against a single opponent this season: José Ramírez (21 RBI vs. Detroit) and Willy Adames (20 RBI vs. Pittsburgh).

BIG BASSITT FISHING: Chris Bassitt enters today having not allowed an earned run over his last 24.0 innings...In three starts in August, Bassitt is 3-0 and has not allowed an earned run over 20.0 innings...He has walked four and struck out seven in that span...Over his last 10 starts since June 14, Bassitt has gone 6-3 and posted a 2.03 ERA (15 earned runs/66.2 innings) in that span with 14 walks and 60 strikeouts...He is set to make his fourth start against the Phillies tonight...Bassitt is 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (two earned runs/16.2 innings) with six walks and 16 strikeouts in his three previous appearances.

WIN, WIN, WIN: Bassitt has won three consecutive starts for the second time in his career (also, September 7-18, 2020)...He has not allowed an earned run in any of those starts...Only three pitchers in Mets history have had a longer streak of consecutive starts with a win while allowing no earned runs...R.A. Dickey won five in a row from May 27-June 18, 2012 without yielding a single earned run...Tom Seaver (June 21-July 26, 1974) and Jerry Koosman (August 19-September 3, 1973) each did it in four straight starts.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 129 consecutive days...According to Elias, It's the fifth longest-streak in franchise history.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha has recorded multiple hits in back-to-back games and in three of his last five contests...Over the last five games, Canha is batting .467 (7-15) with three runs, four doubles, a home run, four RBI, a walk with a .500 OBP, a .933 SLG and a 1.433 OPS...He is batting .299 (61-204) with 11 doubles and four home runs with an .814 OPS against right-handed pitching this year.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 76 games this season, second-most in the NL and third-most in the majors...Their .639 winning percentage is third in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 76-43 record through the team's first 119 games...Only the 1986 (78-41) team posted a better record through the first 119 games of the season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 36-24 on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...Their .600 road winning percentage is the third-best in MLB and second-best in the NL...New York is batting .258/.324/.416 away from Citi Field...Their .258 road average ranks fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL as does their .324 OBP on the road.

PHILS-METS NOTES: The Mets have outscored the Phillies 74-46 in 14 games this season...The Mets have won eight of their last 10 games against the Phillies.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East (3-4)...Overall, the Mets are 40-18 against the East this year...They have lost only one series in the division all season long (against Atlanta, August 15-18) and have already clinched the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...New York must win one of its three remaining games against Atlanta to lock up all four season series vs. division foes (last accomplished by the Mets in 2015)...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.22 ERA against the East, while hitting .259/.332/.416...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 285-198.

JUICY J: Jeff McNeil leads left-handed hitters with a .324 (35-108) batting average against left-handed pitchers this year...McNeil is second in the majors with a .350 (64-183) road batting average...He is batting .350/.399/.503 with 23 runs, 17 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 15 RBI and a 11 walks in 49 games on the road this year...He leads the majors in batting average with a .419 mark in the month of August...In 17 games this month, he is batting .419/.448/.661 with 11 runs, nine doubles, two triples, eight RBI and two walks.

STARTING OFF: Since the start of July, Mets starters have posted an MLB-best 2.57 ERA (71 earned runs/248.1 innings) in 43 games with 276 strikeouts and 59 walks...The Dodgers are second in that period with a 2.61 ERA, followed by the Astros with a 3.18 ERA...New York's 276 strikeouts in that span lead the NL and are second in the majors...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.48 in that span...The Mets rank fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.48 ERA from their starters.

LIFE IN THE FAST LANE: Edwin Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 96 strikeouts...That is 21 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has done so in 48.1 innings...He is seeking to become the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in a season in major league history...Aroldis Chapman currently owns the record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 4, 2012 in 51.0 innings...Armando Benítez owns the franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 21 outings dating back to June 22, covering 21.0 innings, establishing a career-high scoreless streak...42 of Díaz last 59 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards and since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.33 ERA (one earned runs/27.2 innings) with 11 hits, four walks and 58 strikeouts...He has converted all 16 saves in that period.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz has struck out 52.5% of batters faced (96/183), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 48 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.88 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 27 saves, a 1.30 ERA (7 ER/48.1 IP), allowing 27 hits and 14 walks...The Mets are 42-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is seeking to record 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year...He is seeking to become the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He would be first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado accomplished the feat in 2007 and 2008.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 18-8 in the second-half...The team's 18 wins are the tied for the second-most in the majors, and their .692 winning percentage ranks third...The team is batting .277/.341/.451 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average, are second in OBP and are third in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 127-93 following the break.

30 FOR 20: Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season...He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons...Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 78 times this year...Since the start of 2019, the Mets have plunked 48 times by the Phillies...That is the most in the majors against any one opponent...It's tied for their third-highest total in franchise history...The 2019 Mets set the record with 95 HBP...The Mets were plunked 94 times last year...Mark Canha (14), Brandon Nimmo (13) and Pete Alonso (10) all rank in the top 10 in hit by pitches this season.

AW SNAP: Brandon Nimmo had his 25-game road ob-base streak snapped last night...It was the longest such streak of his career...Overall, he is batting .310/.399/.491 with 47 runs, 11 doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 31 RBI and 27 walks in 59 road games this season...This compares to a .209/.286/.311 slashline with 24 runs in 51 games at Citi Field in 2022...Nimmo's .399 road OBP is fourth in the National League and eighth in the majors.

BASSITT NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: On August 14, Bassitt earned his 10th win of the season after 5.0 shutout innings against the Phillies at Citi Field...Bassitt is on a three-game win streak and...He struck out five Phillies batters and walked two.

WIN, WIN, WIN: Bassitt has won three consecutive starts for the second time in his career (also, September 7-18, 2020)...He has not allowed an earned run in any of those starts...Only three pitchers in Mets history have had a longer streak of consecutive starts with a win while allowing no earned runs...R.A. Dickey won five in a row from May 27-June 18, 2012 without yielding a single earned run...Tom Seaver (June 21-July 26, 1974) and Jerry Koosman (August 19-September 3, 1973) each did it in four straight starts.

MAKE 'EM EARN IT: Bassitt has thrown 24.0 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run and has not yielded one in his last three starts...He is seeking to become the sixth Met ever with four straight starts without allowing an earned run...Jacob deGrom (2021), R.A. Dickey (2012) and Dwight Gooden (1985) have done it in five straight starts...Tom Seaver (1974) and Jerry Koosman (1973) went four starts in a row without allowing an earned run...DeGrom has also had two four-start streaks (2018, 2019).

2022 SEASON, PART 2: In five starts since the All-Star Break, Bassitt has pitched to a 1.64 ERA (six earned runs/33.0 innings) going 3-1, with 30 strikeouts and eight walks...He ranks 10th in the majors in ERA since the break...Last year, Bassitt was 2-2 with a 2.75 post-All-Star Break ERA...He fanned 41 batters and walked 10 in eight games.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Bassitt's six wins are tied for fifth in the NL and tied for eighth in MLB...His last road start came on August 3 against the Nationals where he went 7.0 scoreless innings, striking out four batters and walking one...He has thrown 11.0 consecutive scoreless frames on the road...Across his last four road starts, Bassitt owns a 2.77 ERA (8 ER/26.0 IP) with 17 strikeouts and seven walks...In his career, Bassitt is 24-13 with a 4.32 ERA on the road (162 earned runs/337.1 innings) with 301 strikeouts and 127 walks.

IT'S NOT ALWAYS SUNNY IN PHILADELPHIA: Bassitt will face the Phillies for a second straight start, marking the second time this season where Bassitt will face an opponent in back-to-back starts...Bassitt owns a 1.08 ERA (2 ER/16.2 IP) in three starts against the Phils...Bassitt never faced an NL East before this year...In 11 intradivisional starts, he is 6-3 with a 2.37 ERA (18 ER runs/68.1 IP), 61 strikeouts and 17 walks (Mets are 11-3).

DON'T GIVE IN TO PEER PRESSURE: In his last start, Bassitt held the Phillies hitless in six at-bats with RISP...Opponents are 3-30 (.100) with RISP against him since the All-Star break, the best mark in MLB (min. 30 batters faced)...This season, he is holding batters to a .179 batting average in those situations which ranks fourth in the NL and eighth in the majors (min. 100 batters faced).

LET'S GO STREAKING: Has gone 6.0 innings or longer in 17 of his 22 starts this year matching a career high set in 2021...Snapped a nine-game streak of 6.0+ innings pitched after only going 5.0 innings in his previous start...His nine-game streak was the longest of his career...Prior to this year, his longest such streak was seven games from July 11-August 21, 2015...Bassitt has struck out six or more batters in 14 of his 22 starts, Max Scherzer is the only Mets starter with more games of six or more strikeouts with 15...After earning his 10th win, Bassitt is now on a three-game win streak, a season-high...The Mets join the Braves and Dodgers as the only teams with three pitchers with 10 or more wins...The Astros lead the majors with four pitchers with 10 or more wins.

LIVIN' IT UP IN THE CITI: His 134 strikeouts are the sixth-most and his 1.126 WHIP is the ninth-lowest in franchise history among starters through their first 22 games as a Met.

CAREER YEAR: Bassitt has generated 12 or more swings and misses in a 11 starts this season, a career-high...Tied a career-high set in 2021, with a third game this season going 7.0 innings or longer without allowing an earned run...Those three games are tied with teammate Max Scherzer for the second-most such games this season...The only pitcher on the Mets staff with more such games is Taijuan Walker who has done it four times...Set a career high after working 8.0 innings for the second time this season...Prior to this year, Bassitt had gone at least 8.0 innings one time in three separate seasons 2021, 2019, and 2015.

- Hitting .333 (17-51) with five doubles, five homers, 19 RBI and 12 runs scored against the Phillies this season...The only Mets with more RBI in a season against the Phils are Mike Piazza (22 in 2002) and Darryl Strawberry (20 in 1987).
- Drove in the winning run in five of the Mets last 13 games...Has 10 go-ahead RBI and nine game-winning RBI in 25 games since the break...Leads the majors with 23 game-winning RBI and 31 go-ahead RBI this season...The Mets record for game-winning RBI is 24 (Keith Hernandez, 1985).
- Hitting .305 (29-95) with seven doubles, five homers, 21 RBI, 17 runs and a .931 OPS since the All-Star break.
- Tied for fifth in MLB and tied for third in the NL with 29 homers...Leads the NL and is second in MLB with 99 RBI...Ranks tied for 16th in the NL with 67 runs.
- Ranks 11th in MLB and sixth in the NL with a .522 SLG...Is 14th in the majors and eighth in the NL with a .873 OPS...Is 16th in the NL in OBP (.351).
- Has not homered in his last 14 games, a season-high HR drought...His longest homerless streak is 15 games...Went deep in five of his previous 10 contests.
- Owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (eight) and is third in games with multiple RBI (24) this season.
- Is 9-for-his-last-18 (.500) against LHP with two doubles, a homer, seven walks and a 1.432 OPS since the All-Star break...Batting .341 (15-44) with a 1.099 OPS against lefties since June 25...Prior to that date, was hitting .190 (11-58) with a .716 OPS vs. southpaws.
