**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets split a twinbill with the Marlins yesterday... The Mets conclude the 2023 schedule with a six-game homestand (1-1) against the Marlins (1-1) and Phillies (three games).

**SHEA MEETS HIS MATCH CEREMONY:** The Amazin' Mets Foundation partnered with America's Vet Dogs during the 2022 season to sponsor and co-raise a service dog in-training. Shea, named in a fan voting contest, spent 16 months as part of the Mets family and regularly visited Citi Field...During formal training, Shea worked daily with a Certified Service Dog Instructor to learn skills that will assist in mitigating his first responder's disabilities...Upon completion, Shea will officially be paired with his first responder, retired NYPD officer Richie Carter, on Thursday evening...Richie dedicated 20 years of service to our city and spent over 250 grueling hours at Ground Zero following the attacks of September 11, 2001.

**SENGA GENESIS:** Kodai Senga finished his first season in the major leagues going 12-7 with a 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) with 77 walks and 202 strikeouts...His 12 wins are tied for the most in franchise history in a single-season by a Japanese born player...Masato Yoshii also had 12 in 1999...His 2.99 ERA ranks fifth in the majors and second in the National League...His 2.99 ERA is the seventh-lowest by a Japanese-born pitcher in MLB history (min. 100 innings).

**STRIKE THAT:** Senga recorded 202 strikeouts...That is the second-most strikeouts by a rookie in franchise history...Doc Gooden recorded 276 strikeouts in his rookie season in 1984...His 202 strikeouts are tied for the seventh-most in the NL...He is the 13th pitcher in franchise history to record 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Jacob deGrom and Noah Syndergaard were the last pitchers to do so...Tom Seaver owns the franchise record with nine such seasons.

**30-FOR-30:** Francisco Lindor became the fourth player in franchise history to collected 30 stolen bases and 30 home runs in a season...He joined join David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson (1991, 1989, 1987) and Darryl Strawberry (1987)...He joined Barry Larkin (1996), Álex Rodríguez (1998), Jimmy Rollins (2007) and Hanley Ramírez (2008) as the only shortstops in major league history with a 30-30 season...In addition, joined Johnson, Rollins, José Cruz (2001), Carlos Beltrán (2004) and José Ramírez (2018) as the only switch hitters with a 30-30 season.

**DOUBLE TROUBLE:** Lindor hit a home run in both ends of the doubleheader yesterday, smashing three homers in total...He was the first Met since Brandon Nimmo (October 4, 2022 vs. Washington) to homer in both games of a doubleheader...It marked the 32nd time a Met has homered in both games of a doubleheader...He joined Dave Kingman (4/26/81), Tommie Agee (5/11/69) and Gil Hodges (5/30/62) as the only Mets in franchise history with three homers across a doubleheader...Courtesy of Sarah Langs...Game one marked his 15th career multi-homer game and his first since homering from both sides of the plate on April 15, 2022 vs. Arizona.

**METS MINOR LEAGUE AWARDS:** Today, the Mets will honor their Minor League Player Award recipients in a pregame ceremony...In addition, several players will be available for a media availability at 5:15 p.m. in the press conference room.

**STEAL THIS ALBUM:** The Mets lead the major leagues with a 89.1% success rate in stolen bases this season...The team has stolen 115 bases out of 129 attempts...It's the highest success rate in franchise history...The previous high was 82.3% which was accomplished in 2004.

**MARLINS-METS NOTES:** The New York Mets have won eight of 12 meetings with the Miami Marlins this season...The Mets have won the season series with the Marlins every year since 2018, going 62-36 against them over that time.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo has recorded career-highs in hits (161), RBI (68) and home runs (24) and matched his high in doubles (30) and games played (151)...He is on a nine-game hitting streak, batting .385 (15-39) with eight runs, four doubles, one triple, one home run, eight RBI, five walks with a .455 OBP and a .615 SLG...He has safely hit in 24 of his last 26 games...Since August 28, Nimmo is batting .336 (37-110) with 18 runs, 10 doubles, two triples, six home runs, 17 RBI, 10 walks with a .397 OBP and a .627 SLG.

**IN THE CITI:** The Mets conclude their home schedule with a six-game homestand...New York is 40-37 at home this season...The team is 599-560 since Citi Field opened in 2009.

**100:** Pete Alonso is three RBI away from 500 for his career...He would become the 10th player in Mets history to record 500 RBI...He has collected 117 RBI this season, tied with Bernard Gilkey (1996) and Johnson (1991) for the sixth-most by a Met in a single season...He became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 497 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

**DINGERS!** The Mets feature eight players who have recorded at least 10 home runs this year...The team record is 10 players with 10 or more home runs, done in 2017...The 2019 team featured nine players, while the 2007 and 2005 teams feature eight players as well...Brett Baty is one home run to become the ninth player with 10 or more home runs this year...The Mets have socked 210 home runs this season...That is the fifth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs...The 2023 team became the fifth team in franchise history record 200 or more homers in a year...The team's 204 home runs are the fourth-most in a single season in franchise history...They previous four years with 200 or more homers are: 2019 (242), 2017 (224), 2016 (218) and 2006 (200).

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso has recorded his second season with 45 or more home runs, becoming the only player in franchise history to do so...He recorded his third season with 40 or more home runs...He became the fifth player in major league history with three or more seasons of 40 or more homers in their first five years, joining Ralph Kiner (four), Ryan Howard (three), Albert Pujols (three) and Eddie Mathews (three)...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...He is second in the majors and in the National League with 45 home runs...Alonso's 192 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Fanned seven batters over 4.0 innings pitched in the Mets' 5-4 loss to the Phillies on September 21...Allowed four runs on five hits while allowing just two walks.

**MIAMI VICE:** Tonight, Peterson will make his seventh career appearance and sixth career start against the Marlins...Peterson owns a career 2-2 record against Miami, posting a 2.57 ERA (8 ER/28.0 IP) over six games (five starts)...Peterson last faced the Marlins in Miami on March 31, 2023, allowing one run and striking out five over 5.0 innings.

**STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT:** On September 15, Peterson matched a career-high 10 strikeouts and reached double digit strikeouts for the first time this season...Peterson has had four 10 strikeout games in his career, and last struck out 10 batters on July 1, 2022 vs. Texas...Peterson is the third Mets pitcher to strikeout 10 or more batters in a game this season, behind Kodai Senga (five 10+ K games) and Max Scherzer (one 10+ K game)...Senga also struck out 10 batters in his start on September 14, the day before Peterson accomplished the feat.

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** In his start on August 27, Peterson pitched a season-high 7.0 innings...Was the fourth time in his career that he has pitched 7.0 or more innings...Peterson has only gone deeper in a start once in his career, throwing 7.1 innings in a 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay on May 14, 2023...In those starts, Peterson owns a 1-0 record.

**MAKIN' IT MAJOR:** Since returning to the majors on June 27 after a stint with Syracuse (AAA), Peterson has pitched to a 2-2 record with a 3.74 ERA (27 ER/65.0 IP) in 18 games, 12 of which were starts.

**A MINUTE IN THE MINORS:** Peterson was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on April 29, was recalled on May 9, then optioned again on May 16...In his first start with Syracuse following his May 16 option, he dealt 8.0 shutout innings, allowed just two hits and struck out nine...For his effort, he as named International League Pitcher of the Week...All told, he has made seven starts for the Syracuse Mets this season...Has a 1-2 record with a 4.86 ERA (20 ER/37.0 IP).

**NEW YORK, NEW YORK:** This season, Peterson has pitched to a 3.18 ERA (18 ER/51.0 IP) in 13 home outings (nine starts)..Over 13 road outings (11 starts) this season, the southpaw has pitched to a 7.47 ERA (44 ER/53.0 IP).

**LETHAL LEFTY:** Peterson has limited lefties to a .240 (68-283) average in his career...He whiffed 32 of the 96 left-handed batters he faced last year, a 33 percent strikeout rate that ranked fourth among all left-handed pitchers to face a minimum of 90 LHB in 2022.

**SLIP 'N' SLIDE:** Peterson held batters to a .175 (24-137) average with his slider last season and 78 of his 126 strikeouts came on the pitch...His 52.0 slider-strikeout percentage was the second-highest in MLB (min. 150 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Díaz (54.7) and his 47.9 whiff percentage with the pitch was the third- highest in the majors behind only Díaz (54.7) and Seattle's Andres Muñoz (50.8).

**2022 RECAP:** Set career-high marks in wins (seven), games (28), starts (19), innings (105.2), and strikeouts (126) last season...Went 7-5 with a 3.83 ERA for New York...Appeared mostly as a starter until mid-September...His final five appearances of the season came out of the bullpen...Went 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 ER/91.0 IP) as a starter...In nine relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER/14.2 IP).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TYLOR MEGILL (8-8, 4.92)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 6.0 innings in the Mets loss to the Phillies at Citizens Bank Park on September 22...Allowed three runs on five hits while walking one and fanning six batters.

**A MINUTE IN THE MINORS:** Megill made six starts with Triple-A Syracuse after being optioned on June 22...The right-hander went 0-3 with an 8.67 ERA (26 ER/27.0 IP) over those six starts...Megill recorded two quality starts with Syracuse, July 9 at Worcester and July 29 at Lehigh Valley.

  - Has 117 RBI, tied for the sixth-most in a single season in Mets history...Became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.
  - Has 26 career homers vs. the Marlins, tied for the third-most among active players and tied with David Wright and two others for 10th-most all-time.
  - Has reached the 40-homer mark for the third time in five big league seasons...Only one player (Ralph Kiner) has had more 40-HR seasons through his first five career seasons...Only one active player (Nelson Cruz, four) has more than three 40-HR seasons.
  - Has 15 home runs and 40 RBI in his last 46 games...Had his fifth multi-homer game of the season on September 3 vs. Seattle.
  - Tied with Howard Johnson for fourth on the Mets all-time home run list with 192 homers...Mike Piazza (220) is next.
  - Ranks 10th in franchise history with 497 career RBI...Passed Keith Hernandez (468) on August 16...Passed Kevin McReynolds (456) on August 1.
  - Ranks second in the majors with 46 home runs and ranks second with 117 RBI...Ranks 12th in the majors and eighth in the NL with a .517 slugging percentage...Tied for 11th in the majors and ranks sixth in the NL with 69 extra-base hits...Ranks 11th in the NL with 286 total bases.

- Left the game on September 10 at Minnesota after being hit by a pitch...X-rays on his right hand were negative...Homered in his next appearance on September 12.
  - Went deep on September 5 at Washington, his first long ball since August 1...Had three RBI, two runs scored and his first career stolen base in that game.
  - Was named NL Rookie of the Month for July...Had eight home runs, 16 RBI, 14 runs scored and a .974 OPS during the month and tied for fourth in the majors in home runs.
  - Joins Pete Alonso (53, 2019) and Darryl Strawberry (26, 1983) as the only Mets rookies to have 20 or more home runs in a season...Became the 11th rookie catcher in major league history with 20 or more homers in a season.
  - His 23 homers this season are tied for the second-most by any catcher in the majors and tied for fourth among all rookies.
