ROSTER MOVES: RHP Edwin Diaz has been placed on the bereavement list...LHP David Peterson has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse...He will wear #23... Peterson went 2-6 with a 5.54 ERA (41 earned runs/66.2 innings)...Did not pitch after June 30 after recovering from right side tightness and surgery to repair a right foot fifth metatarsal fixation.

METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Nationals 7-3 in Washington last night... The Mets continue their first road trip of the year, a two-city, seven-game series against Washington (2-0) and Philadelphia (three games)...The Mets return to New York for their home opener on Friday, April 15 against the Arizona Diamondbacks.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Bullpen catcher Eric Langill celebrates his birthday today... Langill joined the Mets in June of 2011 and is in his 11th season as a bullpen catcher.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY, THERE IS SUCH THING!: Jeff McNeil celebrated his 30th birthday by hitting his first home run of the season last night...McNeil was the last player to homer on his birthday, doing so on his 29th birthday last year at Citi Field...He joins Mike Piazza and Jim Hickman as the only two players in franchise history to have homered on their birthday twice in their career.

ALL ABOUT THAT BASSITT: In March, the Mets acquired All-Star RHP Chris Bassitt from the Oakland Athletics in exchange for RHPs J.T. Ginn and Adam Oller...In 2021, Bassitt was named to his first All-Star team and finished 10th in the AL Cy Young voting...The 6-5, 215-pounder went 12-4 with a 3.15 ERA (55 earned runs/157.1 innings) and 159 strikeouts in 27 starts...Bassitt led the AL with a .750 winning percentage...He was leading the AL in wins (12) and innings (151.0) before he missed a month of the season after he was hit in the face by a line drive on August 17...He returned to the mound in late September to make two starts... Over the last three years, Bassitt is 27-11 with a 3.26 ERA in 66 games (63 starts) and ranked second in the AL in winning percentage (.711), third in ERA, fifth in opponents OPS (.661) and eighth in wins during that span (min. 300 innings).

BIG BASSITT FISHING: Bassitt tonight will make his Mets debut and attempt to be the second-straight Mets starting pitcher to win his first start with the club after Max Scherzer did so last night...Before Scherzer, the last Mets starter to win his team debut was David Peterson, who won his major league debut on July 28, 2020.

NEW FOE, WHO DIS?: Bassitt has yet to face a NL East team in 106 career games... Bassitt tonight will make his first ever start with an NL club...Against the National League, Bassitt has pitched to a 3-4 record with a 3.29 ERA (29 earned runs/79.1 innings), striking out 70 NL batters and walking 26.

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets have won each of their first two games...The last time the Mets won each of their first two games of the season was in 2019...The last time the team won three or more games to start the year was from April 5-9, 2012...The team's longest winning streak to start a season is five games...The 1985 won five straight from April 9-14...The 1985 team would go on to win eight of their first nine contests.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: The Mets lead the majors with a .347 batting average and a .453 OBP...The team has recorded back-to-back games with 10 or more hits...The Mets recorded games with 10 or more hits in three straight games only twice last season, from July 17-19 and again from August 10-12.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha is 4-6 with two runs, an RBI, three walks with a .778 OBP through the first two games of the season...He is tied for second in the majors in both hits and walks and leads MLB with seven times on base...He is tied for fourth with a .667 batting average...Canha has posted a .380 OBP since 2019... That ranks sixth in the major leagues during that span.

DOUBLY DOUBLE-E: Eduardo Escobar has seven doubles in his last six games dating back to last season, including at least one in each of those six games...His six-game streak with an extra-base hit is the longest active streak in the majors...Escobar had an extra-base hit in a career-high seven consecutive games from April 26-May 2, 2018...He also had another six-game XBH streak from June 3-8, 2018.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo made his 2022 debut last night...He went 2-5 with a run and a triple...Nimmo batted .292/.401/.437 with 51 runs, 17 doubles, three triples, eight home runs, 28 RBI, 54 walks, five steals with an .838 OPS in 92 games last year...His career .393 career on-base percentage ranks second in year history, behind only John Olerud's .425 mark (min. 1,000 plate appearances).

PATRIOTIC PETE: Pete Alonso has reached base safely in each of his last 21 games at Nationals Park...He has hit .383 (31-81) with 15 runs, five doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 17 RBI, eight walks, a steal with a .446 OBP and a .765 SLG in that span that dates to September 2, 2019...This includes an 11-game hitting streak at the ballpark...He is batting .405 (17-42) with eight runs, four doubles, a triple, three home runs, eight RBI, two walks, a .447 OBP and an .762 SLG in the stretch that dates to June 19, 2021...Overall, he is a .373 (38-103) with 17 runs, eight doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 20 RBI and 10 walks in 27 career games in D.C.

NATS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won the season series against the Nationals in three of the last four years.

MULTI-HIT McNEIL: Jeff McNeil has collected multiple hits in both of his games this season and leads the majors with five hits total...He has 112 multi-hit games in 370 appearances since making his major league debut in 2018...Only three Mets have had more games with multiple hits through their first 370 career games: José Reyes (122), David Wright (117) and Steve Henderson (113).

MOVING ON UP: Alonso currently ranks 14th in Mets history with 106 career homers...Up next on the Mets all-time HR leaderboard: Jose Reyes (108), Ed Kranepool (118), Edgardo Alfonzo (120).

OUCH: The Mets were plunked once again last night...Overall, New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 311 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 40 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 55 HBP in the last four seasons.

WASHINGTON, D.C., IT'S PARADISE TO ME: The Mets improved to 2-0 against the Nationals this year...The Mets have won 10 of their last 13 matchups dating back to August 10 of last year...Robinson Canó has hit .375 (27-72) with 14 runs, four doubles, three home runs with eight walks and 10 RBI in 19 career games at Nationals Park.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets improved to 2-0 on the road this year...The team finished the 2021 season going 30-51 (.370) with a 4.39 ERA, 224 walks and 686 strikeouts on the road...The team's 30 wins were tied for 23rd in the majors... Outside of 2020, the team's 30 road wins were the fewest for the franchise since they went 29-52 in 2009...Despite this, the Mets' 686 road strikeouts were a franchise record, edging the 2019 Mets by one punchout.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets improved to 2-0 against the NL East yesterday... Last year, the team went 39-37 against the NL East last season...They posted a 3.58 ERA (255 earned runs/640.1 innings) and hit .243/.314/.400 against the division.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Mets Manager Buck Showalter begins his first season with the team...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins with 1,551.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES: The 2022 Mets enter the season with several new players on the roster, including: RHP Chris Bassitt (trade), OF Mark Canha (free agent), INF Eduardo Escobar (free agent), OF Travis Jankowski (free agent), OF Starling Marte (free agent), RHP Adam Ottavino (free agent), LHP Joely Rodríguez (trade), RHP Max Scherzer (free agent) and LHP Chasen Shreve (free agent).

HE'S KEITH HERNANDEZ: Earlier this year, the Mets announced that the team will retire Keith Hernandez's uniform #17 prior to the Saturday, July 9 game vs. Miami... Hernandez was elected to the Mets Hall of Fame in 1997, ranks second in team history in batting average (.297) and earned six Rawlings Gold Gloves with the Mets, the most in franchise history... Hernandez will become the fourth player to have his number retired by the Mets, joining Tom Seaver (#41), Mike Piazza (#31) and Jerry Koosman (#36). In addition, the Mets have retired #14 for Manager Gil Hodges, #37 for Manager Casey Stengel and #42 across baseball for Jackie Robinson.

SEE YOU SOON, SEAVER: The countdown is on until the unveiling of the Tom Seaver statue...The statue will be unveiled in a special pre-game ceremony to the right of the Home Run Apple in front of Citi Field on Opening Day...Seaver won 311 games, had a 2.86 ERA and struck out 3,640 batters over a 20-year major league career that spanned from 1967-1986, earning 12 All-Star selections in the process...He led the NL in wins three times, ERA three times and strikeouts five times...Seaver was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1992...He spent 12 years with the Mets and went 198-124 with a 2.57 ERA and 2,541 strikeouts and is the Mets' all-time leader in wins, strikeouts, shutouts (44), ERA, complete games (171) and starts (395)...He won three Cy Young Awards with the team in 1969, 1973 and 1975, as well as the NL Rookie of the Year Award in 1967.

BASSITT NEWS & NOTES

WELCOME TO THE METS: Bassitt was acquired by New York on March 12, 2022 in a trade with Oakland...The Athletics received RHPs J.T. Ginn and Adam Oller... Bassitt tonight will make his Mets debut and attempt to be the second-straight Mets starting pitcher to win his first start with the club after Max Scherzer did so last night...Before Scherzer, the last Mets starter to win his team debut was David Peterson, who won his MLB debut on July 28, 2020.

LAST TIME OUT: In his final Spring Training start, Bassitt faced the Marlins at home on April 3...He pitched 5.0 innings giving up four runs, three earned, on six hits...Had six strikeouts and two walks...He left the game with 90 pitches.

GRAPEFRUIT LEAGUE: Bassitt made two starts in Spring Training, both against the Marlins...Totaled 9.2 innings between the two outings and posted a 2.79 ERA (three earned runs/9.2 innings)...Also tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and allowed one hit with five strikeouts and no walks in an intrasquad game on March 24.

2021 RECAP: Last season, Chris Bassitt pitched his way into his first career All-Star game and into AL Cy Young contention, posting a 3.15 ERA (55 earned runs/157.1 innings) in 27 starts, striking out 159 batters and walking only 39... Was 10-2 with a 3.28 ERA (43 earned runs/118.0 innings) in 19 starts before the All-Star Break...Threw his first career complete game shutout, a two-hitter, on May 27 vs. the Angels...Finished the first half on a career-best 10-game winning streak...Held or shared the AL lead in innings (118.0) and wins before the break... Had a 2.75 ERA (12 earned runs/39.1 innings) in eight starts after the break...On August 17 at Chicago-AL, he took a line drive to the face and suffered multiple facial fractures...Underwent surgery on August 24 and returned to the mound less than one month later on September 23 to make his final two starts of the season (6.1 IP, 4 H, 1 ER, 4 BB, 5 K)...Received two fifth-place votes for AL Cy Young and finished 10th in the balloting.

NEW FOE, WHO DIS?: Bassitt has yet to face a NL East team in 106 career games...Bassitt today will make his first ever start with an NL club...Against the National League, Bassitt has pitched to a 3-4 record with a 3.29 ERA (29 earned runs/79.1 innings), striking out 70 NL batters and walking 26.

IN THE TOP 10: Chris Bassitt's 3.15 ERA in 2021 ranked third among all AL pitchers (min. 150 IP)...He also ranked third in the league with a 0.9 HR/9 ratio, fourth in the AL with a 7.3 hits per 9.0 innings ratio and 10th with a 2.2 walks per 9.0 innings ratio...Bassitt ranked fifth in the AL with 16 quality starts on the year... Bassitt led the AL in Win-Loss % (.750)... Bassitt's 3.9 WAR was a career-high and ranked ninth among AL pitchers.

FOOL'S GOLD: Bassitt's six-pitch arsenal allows him to have multiple strikeout pitches...Last season, he racked up at least 30 strikeouts with his four-seamer (55), slider (32) and curveball (32)...His most effective strikeout pitch was his curveball, which generated a 50 percent strikeout rate (32 punchouts in 64 plate appearances ending with the pitch)...Plate appearances ending with his slider had a 41 percent strikeout rate...Last season, his curveball and slider both had a swing and miss rate of 39 percent.

LET'S GET IT STARTED: In April, Bassitt has a career ERA of 4.02 (36 earned runs/80.2 innings) with 81 strikeouts and 33 walks...Last April, Bassitt was 2-2 with a 3.93 ERA...After losing his first two starts of the season, the A's won each of his last four April starts, with Bassitt allowing just two runs in each of those four outings.

DAY AND NIGHT: Bassitt posted a 2.61 ERA (17 earned runs/58.2 innings) in 10 afternoon starts last season...In those daytime outings, he struck out 58 batters over 58.2 innings of work...In 2021, Bassitt started 17 games at night with an 8-3 record, 3.47 ERA (38 earned runs/98.2 innings) and 101 strikeouts, with a complete game shutout in May.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (0-0, 0.00)

LAST OUTING: In his last spring start, Carrasco faced the Houston Astros... Carrasco threw 4.1 innings of two-run ball on April 4...He had five punchouts and allowed four hits and one walk.

2021 RECAP: Missed the first three months of the season on the injured list with a hamstring injury...His first start came on July 30 at home against Cincinnati, when he gave up a leadoff homer, then retired 12 of the last 15 batters faced without yielding another run...His best start came on August 26 vs San Francisco where he only needed 78 pitches to complete 7.0 innings... He retired the final 13 men he faced and allowed one hit in his last 6.0 innings.

- Ranked third in the NL with 37 home runs last season...Tied for seventh in the league with 67 extra-base hits and was 11th with 291 total bases...He tied for 11th in the NL with 94 RBI, was 13th with a .519 SLG and 15th with an .863 OPS.
- Struck out in 31 percent of his April plate appearances in 2021, then cut his K-rate to 18.2 percent for the rest of the season, leading to a career-best 19.9 K%.
