◆This season, the D-backs' .988 fielding pct. is tied for the second-best overall mark in the NL (also: Dodgers), behind the Braves (.989), while their 34 errors are second fewest, behind the Braves (30).

CARROLL'S HOME STREAK: Corbin Carroll has reached base safely in 12 straight home games (since May 25), his second-longest single-season streak, behind his career-best 18-gamer (Aug. 22-Sept. 30, 2023).
