METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets were postponed yesterday...The Mets have lost back-to-back games...The Mets are 68-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 30-9-3 in 42 series this year...The Mets are coming off an 11-day, 10-game homestand (6-4), the second-longest of the year, against the Rockies (3-1), Dodgers (2-1) and Nationals (1-2)...Today, New York hits the road for a seven-day, six-game trip to Pittsburgh (three games) and Miami (three games).

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets have lost back-to-back games...The team is seeking to avoid a three-game losing streak, which would match the longest of the season...They lost three games from June 26-29 and from July 17-23...The only season in which the Mets never had more than a three-game losing streak was 1972... That season their longest losing streak was three games...The Dodgers (two games) and Athletics (three games) did not have losing streaks longer than three games in 2020...Prior to that, the last such team was the 2018 Red Sox (three games)...The last such National League team prior to 2020 was the 2014 Dodgers (three games)... Courtesy of Elias.

EDUARRRDO ESCOBARRR: Eduardo Escobar is a lifetime .408 (31-76) hitter against the Pirates...That is the second-highest average against the Buccos all-time (min. 75 AB)...The Cubs' Nico Hoerner has one more hit in one more at-bat, good for a .416 (32-77) average...Escobar has reached base at a .447 clip against Pittsburgh...Only 10 players have a higher OBP vs. the Pirates.

AIN'T THAT THE PITTS: Pete Alonso has played six games in Pittsburgh and is 7-20 (.350) with three runs, three doubles, an RBI and four walks at PNC Park...Starling Marte played for the Pirates from 2012-19...He is a .290/.347/.445 hitter with 264 runs, 90 doubles, 24 triples, 46 home runs, 204 RBI, 111 walks and 111 walks in 476 career games at PNC Park.

X MARKS THE SPOT: Pete Alonso has hit a home run in 14 of the 15 current National League ballparks...All three of his home runs against the Pirates have come at home... PNC Park is the last remaining NL ballpark at which he's not gone deep...If Alonso hits a home run in this series, Elias says he will become the 23rd active player to hit at least one long ball in all 15 NL venues.

I GET KNOCKED DOWN, BUT I GET UP AGAIN: The Mets are 36-13 (.735) this season in the game immediately following a loss...That is the best such record in the majors.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: The Mets are playing the Pirates for the first time this season...According to Elias, they first played a fellow National League team on September 5 or later just once before, in 2001 when they also faced Pittsburgh on September 17...Last year, the Mets played the Pirates in seven straight games, including four games at Citi Field before the All-Star break and three games at PNC Park after the break.

ROAD WARRIOR: Brandon Nimmo is batting .306 with 50 runs, 13 doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 33 RBI, 31 walks with a .400 OBP and a .490 SLG in 65 road games this season...This compares to a .222/.297/.342 slashline with 20 extra-base hits, 13 RBI and 21 walks in 61 games at Citi Field...He has safely reached base in 31 of his last 32 road games, batting .333 (44-132) with 27 runs, eight doubles, six home runs, 18 RBI, 14 walks with a .414 OBP and a .530 in that span that started on June 12... His .306 average on the road ranks sixth in the National League.

FEELING O-K: Jeff McNeil has not struck out in his last eight games...That's tied for the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 10-game streak from August 6-16, 2018, his first month in the big leagues...It's the second time this season he has gone eight games without punching out once (also, May 18-25)...Dating back to August 20, McNeil has just one strikeout in his last 51 plate appearances...Overall this season, McNeil ranks eighth among qualified hitters and second in the NL with an 11.7 percent strikeout rate.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil leads the majors with a .356 (74-208) batting average on the road...Overall, he has recorded 21 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 18 RBI, 12 walks with a .402 OBP and a .510 SLG...Overall, McNeil ranks third in the majors with a .320 (138-431) batting average.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 39-27 on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...Their .591 road winning percentage is the third-best in MLB and second-best in the NL...New York is batting .258/.327/.415 away from Citi Field...Their .258 road average is the second-best in the NL and fourth in the majors and their .326 OBP on the road ranks fourth in the majors and in the NL.

AND I WOULD PLAY .500 TEAMS: The Mets will face the 49-84 Pirates today...Each of their next 13 games and 21 of the their 27 remaining games are against teams who currently have records below .500...The Mets are 46-20 against teams with a record below .500 this year, giving them a .697 winning percentage...Their .697 winning percentage is the fourth-highest in MLB vs. sub-.500 opponents.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 88 times this year...The team's 88 HBP is the third-highest total in franchise history...The 2019 Mets set the record with 95 HBP...The Mets were plunked 94 times last year...Mark Canha has been plunked 17 times this year, the fourth-highest single-season total in franchise history.

PIRATES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 29-35 at PNC Park since the ballpark opened in 2001.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso has collected 26 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985) with 24...That is the most by any player since the statistic was officially tracked in 1974...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) with 27 each are the only players with more in a season (data incomplete pre-1974)...Alonso has 11 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 12 of the Mets' 27 second-half wins.

WHEN YOU'RE 15: Francisco Lindor and Starling Marte have record at least 15 doubles, 15 home runs and stolen 15 bases this season...They are the first pair of Mets teammates to accomplish that feat in the same season since Carlos Beltrán, José Reyes and David Wright did so in 2008...Lindor and Marte joined Texas's Adolis García and Marcus Semien as the only pair of teammates to hit 15 or more home runs and record 15 or more stolen bases this season...Lindor also joined Trea Turner, Tim Anderson and José Ramírez as the only players with four seasons of 15 or more homers and 15 or more steals since 2017.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets have won 85 games this season, second-most in the NL and third-most in the majors...Their .630 winning percentage is third in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 85-50 record through the team's first 135 games...Only the 1986 (91-44) team posted a better record through the first 135 games of the season.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .643 winning percentage following the All-Star break...That is the third-highest winning percentage in franchise history, right below the 1969 (.671) team and the 1988 (.644) squad...The Mets are 27-15 in the second-half...The team's 27 wins are tied for the fifth-most in the majors.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 147 consecutive days...According to Elias, it's the fourth longest-streak in franchise history.

PUTTING UP LUG-O'S: Seth Lugo has not allowed a run in 10 of his last 11 appearances...He has tossed 11.0 innings in that span, allowed eight hits, four walks, struck out 15 and posted a 0.82 ERA (one earned run/11.0 innings)...In 17 games following the All-Star break, Lugo has posted a 1.56 ERA (three earned runs/17.1 innings) with seven walks and 20 strikeouts...Lugo ranks ninth in Mets history with 319 strikeouts as a reliever.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,269 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...Only the Braves with 1,294 have struck out more...The team's 1,269 strikeouts are already the eighth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.50 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (25.4 percent), the second-highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 101 strikeouts...That is 16 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Craig Kimbrel (53.1 IP in 2017, 54.0 IP in 2012) and Chapman (53.2 IP in 2012) round out the top five fastest to 100 K all-time...Armando Benítez owned the previous franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias...Díaz has posted a 0.83 ERA (three earned runs/32.2 innings) with 15 hits, seven walks and 63 strikeouts in 32 appearances since the start of June.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz has struck out 49.8% of batters faced (100/201), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 53 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.04 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 3-1 with 29 saves, a 1.52 ERA (nine earned runs/52.1 IP), allowing 31 hits and 17 walks...The Mets are 47-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

30 FOR 39: Díaz is seventh in the majors with 29 saves this year...He is seeking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with at least 30 saves...John Franco is the franchise leader with five such seasons.

WALKER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed three runs over 5.1 innings of work on August 30 against the Dodgers at Cit Field...Allowed five hits, three walks and struck out five batters...Did not factor in the decision.

FEW Ks, THAT'S OK: Through 23 starts this season, Walker has a K/9 rate of 6.82 and an ERA of 3.38...Cole Irvin (3.35 ERA, 6.34 K/9) and Miles Mikolas (3.32 ERA, 6.48 K/9) are the only other pitchers with an ERA under 3.50 with a lower strikeout rate (min. 20 starts)...His seven starts of 5.0 or more innings with three or fewer runs allowed and three or fewer strikeouts are tied for the fourth-most in the majors...Walker's 93 strikeouts through his first 23 outings are the second-fewest only behind Keegan Thompson (86 strikeouts) through a pitcher's first 23 outings this season with a sub-3.50 ERA)...Since 2015, Walker's 88 strikeouts are the 11-fewest by a pitcher with a sub-3.50 ERA through their first 22 outings of the season (Min. 90.0 IP).

BOUNCE BACK: Since allowing a season-high eight runs on August 5, Walker is 1-0 with a 3.44 ERA (7 ER/18.1 innings) over his last four starts and has held opposing hitters to a .227 batting average and a .660 OPS...Walker has not allowed more than three runs in each of those starts.

VS. PIRATES: In three career starts against the Pirates, Walker is 0-1 with a 7.94 ERA (10 ER/11.1 IP)...Last season, Walker made two starts against the Pirates...On July 9, Walker threw 5.0 innings of two-run ball on four hits, three walks and two strikeouts in the Mets 13-4 win at Citi Field...On July 18, Walker allowed six runs (five earned) over a career-low 0.1 innings in the Mets 7-6 comeback win at PNC Park...In four starts against NL Central opponents, Walker is 2-0 with a 3.52 ERA (9 ER/23.0 innings) with 23 strikeouts and nine walks...He has not allowed more than three runs in each of those starts.

ROAD IMPROVEMENT: In 13 road starts this season, Walker is 6-2 with a 3.29 ERA (25 ER/68.1 IP)...His six road wins are tied for sixth in the NL and tied for 12th in the majors...Last season, Walker went 3-7 with a 5.82 ERA (44 ER /68.0 IP) in 14 road starts...His six road wins are one shy of tying his career-high set in 2015 with the Mariners.

SPLIT FINGER SUCCESS: In 23 starts this season, Walker has used his splitter just under 28 percent of the time and has held opposing hitters a .198 (34-172) batting average in at-bats ending in the pitch...43 of Walker's 93 strikeouts this season have come via the splitter.

NICE TRY: Walker is tied for second in the majors with Merrill Kelly with four pickoffs this season...Since 2021, Walker has eight pickoffs, the most by a right-handed pitcher during that span and tied for the second-most overall with Max Fried in that span...His 17 pickoffs since his debut year of 2013 are the fourth-most by a right-handed pitcher.

FLOURISHED IN THE FIRST HALF: In 16 first half starts, Walker went 7-2 with a 2.55 ERA (26 ER/91.2 IP)...His 2.55 ERA is the lowest first half mark in his career and his seven wins are tied with 2021 season for the most in Walker's career during the first half of the season...Walker is the eighth Mets starting pitcher to allow four or fewer first half home runs (Min. 12 first half starts).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JACOB DEGROM (4-1, 1.98)

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his fourth win of the season after throwing 7.0 innings of one-run ball against the Dodgers on August 31 at Citi Field...Allowed three hits, issued one walk and struck out nine batters...Has five straight starts with at least nine strikeouts, the second-longest such streak of his career.

THE EXCELLENCE IS SUSTAINABLE: Since 2018, deGrom owns a 1.96 ERA in 97 starts...That is the best mark in the major leagues in that span (min. 400.0 IP)...Justin Verlander is second with a 2.37 ERA, while teammate Max Scherzer has posted a 2.66 ERA since 2018...Since 1920, only three other starting pitchers have held an ERA of 1.95 or lower over a span this long: Sandy Koufax, Greg Maddux and Clayton Kershaw.
