TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Mets continue a three-game series tonight with the 12th of 19 matchups between the teams this season...The teams will meet for another three games next week, August 23-25, at Citi Field for Players' Weekend.

A This marks New York's final trip to Atlanta this season... The Braves have not lost a series to the Mets at SunTrust Park over the last two years... They are 3-0-2 in series play against the Mets here over this stretch.

A After dropping their first two games to the Mets this season, the Braves have won seven of nine with New York, while averaging 6.7 runs (60 total runs) against the NL-East rival.

A LH Dallas Keuchel has never faced the Mets... After tonight, Keuchel will have pitched against 27 major league teams, with the Braves, Astros and Dodgers being the only three he has never faced... The lefty is 1-1 with a 2.96 ERA (9 ER/27.1 IP) in four starts at SunTrust Park this season, as opposed to 2-4 with a 6.40 ERA (23 ER/32.1 IP) in six games on the road.

A LH Steven Matz is 5-1 with a 3.61 ERA (21 ER/52.1 IP) in 10 career games, all starts, against the Braves...The lefty has faced the Braves three times this season, going 1-1 with a 6.23 ERA (9 ER/13.0 IP) against the Atlanta.

21 OVER: The Braves moved a season high-tying 21 games over .500 with last night's win, tying the club's high-water mark for the past six years...They were also 21 over .500 after play on July 15th of this season and on September 25th of last season.

A The last time the Braves were 22 games or better over .500 was 2013, when that club finished the season 96-66 (30 games over)...Their high-water mark that season was 32 games over after Sept. 3.

SERIES PLAY: The Braves won last night's series opener with New York (NL); 5-3, and can take this set with a victory tonight or tomorrow...The Braves are 23-9-6 in series play in 2019, after they won 24 series all of last season.

A The Braves have not won a series at SunTrust Park since the All-Star break, going 0-1-2 in three sets against Washington, Kansas City and Cincinnati.

A They last won a set here on July 5-7, winning two of three from the Marlins.

A Overall, the Braves are 10-4-4 in series play here this season.

14 WINS: LHP Max Fried collected his 14th win of the season last night, tying him for the NL lead in that category.

A Fried has won each of his last five starts, extending his career-best winning streak...Fried is the first Atlanta left-hander to win 14 games in a season since Mike Hampton, who also won 14 in 2003.

100 RUNS FOR ACUÑA JR.: Ronald Acuña Jr. scored his 100th run of the season in the first inning last night, becoming the first National Leaguer to triple-digit runs this season...Yesterday was the Braves' 121st game of the season, and Acuña Jr. is just the third Braves player in the modern era to reach 100 runs as fast...Dale Murphy reached 100 runs in 114 games in 1983, while Tommy Holmes needed 115 games in 1945.

A The only other players 21 or younger to score 100 runs by their team's 121st game in the last 112 seasons were Hall-of-Famers Lloyd Waner (1927), Mel Ott (1929), Jimmie Foxx (1929), Joe DiMaggio (1936), Ted Williams (1940), and Al Kaline (1955), plus Vada Pinson (1959) and Alex Rodriguez (1996).

60 HOME RUNS: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. hit his 60th career home run last night, driving a full-count, 4th-inning pitch from Zack Wheeler out to left field.

A Acuña Jr. became the sixth player in baseball history to hit 60 home runs prior to turning 22, joining Mel Ott (86), Tony Conigliaro (84), Eddie Mathews (72), Frank Robinson (60) and Ken Griffey Jr. (60).

40 HOME RUNS?: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. is on pace to hit 46 home runs this season...Only two players in history have hit 40 home runs in their age 21 season or younger: Hall-of-Famers Eddie Mathews (47 in 1953 for the Braves) and Mel Ott (42 in 1929 for the New York Giants).

A For reference, through 121 team games, Mathews had 38 homers, while Ott had 31...Andruw Jones has the most home runs in a single-season of Braves history, regardless of age, hitting 51 in 2005.

ACUÑA JR. IN AUGUST: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. hit his major league-best ninth August home run last night...Over the last two, his 20 home runs are easily the most in the majors...Nelson Cruz is closest with 14.

A Acuña has hit safely in 11 of 12 games this month, batting .370/.414/.907 (20-for-54).

A The franchise modern-era record for most home runs in a calendar month is 15, set by Joe Adcock in July of 1956.

LOOKING FOR 30/30: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. enters tonight's game with a National League-most 28 stolen bases this season, leaving him two shy of the fifth 30 home run/30 stolen base season in Braves franchise history...The Mets have allowed 102 stolen bases this season, the most in the majors by far...The next closest team is Los Angeles (AL) with 77 allowed.

A Acuña Jr. is also looking to become the second player in baseball history to have at least 30 home runs and 30 stolen bases in a season prior to his 22nd birthday...The only player to do so was Mike Trout, who had 30 home runs and 49 stolen bases as a 20-year-old in 2012.

A Only three Braves have gone 30/30 at any age, with OF Ron Gant doing it last in 1990 and 1991.

Tonight's Game

- A* Makes his 11th start of the season and the 194th of his career...Is his 203rd career appearance.
- A* Needs nine strikeouts tonight for 1,000 in his major league career.
 - A* Has 12 career games of at least nine strikeouts, including one this season... Fanned 12 batters on July 23 vs. Kansas City.
 - A* Forty-eight active pitchers have 1,000 career strikeouts, including one pitcher on the Braves staff (Julio Teheran - 1,148).
- A* Returns home to make his fifth start of the season at SunTrust Park...Is 1-1 with a 2.96 ERA (9 ER/27.1 IP) in his first five starts here.
 - A* Has a 6.40 ERA (23 ER/32.1 IP) in six starts on the road, including allowing eight runs in just 3.2 innings in his last start, August 8 at Marlins Park.
 - A* Opponents are batting just .172/.219/.273 in four games at home, and .331/.407/.624 against him away from SunTrust Park.
 - A* Of the 151 pitchers to make at least 10 starts this season, Keuchel's 3.44 difference in ERA between home and road starts is 12th biggest in the majors, while his .159 difference in batting average is the largest gap in baseball.
- A* Allowed a career high-tying three homers in his last start, August 8 at Miami...Has allowed a career worst 1.66 home runs per 9.0 innings this season.
 - A* Opponents have hit eight homers in six starts against him since the All-Star break...Thirteen of the 23 runs he has allowed since the break have come via home run (57%).
- A* Has never faced the Mets.
 - A* With his start tonight, will have pitched against 27 of the 30 major league clubs...Has never faced either Atlanta or Houston, the two teams he has played for, and the Los Angeles Dodgers.

2019 Recap

- A* Started, 7/23 vs. KC, and logged his sixth career double-digit strikeout game... Fanned 12 Royals over 6.0 innings, one off his career high.
- A* The last Atlanta pitcher to fan more batters in a single start was Kris Medlen, who struck out 13 Nationals over 7.0 innings on September 14, 2012.
- A* Keuchel also doubled in the fifth inning in his last start, and became just the third pitcher in Atlanta franchise history to strike out at least 11 batters and double in the same game, joining Greg Maddux (April 24, 1994 vs. Pittsburgh) and Julio Teheran (August 1, 2013 vs. Colorado).
- A* Beat the Padres on 7/12, allowing just six hits and one run over 7.0 innings.
 - A* In three career starts against San Diego, is 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (3 ER/21.0 IP)...Has allowed exactly one run in each of the three turns.
 - A* Earned the win in Atlanta's final start before the All-Star break, 7/7 vs. MIA, and in Atlanta's first game after the break, 7/12 at SD...Became the third Braves pitcher to start and win consecutive regular season games for the Braves in the modern era (since 1900) and the first since Johnny Sain on September 6 and September 11 of 1948.
- A* Pitched at least 7.0 innings in each his three starts from 7/2-12, going 2-1 with a 2.11 ERA (5 ER/21.1 IP) in that span.
 - A* Was the first Atlanta starter to pitch at least 7.0 innings in three consecutive turns since 2017, when Jaime García did so from 5/31 to 6/11.
 - A* Lowered his ERA by nearly two full points during the stretch, from 5.06 after his second start of the season to 3.09 following his start at SD.
- A* Went a season-long 7.1 innings and allowed five hits and two runs to earn his second win of the season, 7/7 vs. MIA.
 - A* Was his first daytime start of the season...For his career, is 26-22 with a 3.53 ERA (166 ER/423.2 IP) in 64 career starts during the day.
- A* Made his first career appearance at SunTrust Park, 7/2 vs. PHI...Allowed just five hits and two runs over 7.0 innings, but took his second loss of the season.
 - A* Became the 18th different Atlanta pitcher to make a start at SunTrust Park.
- A* Earned his first win of the season, 6/26 at CHI...Held the Cubs to three runs over 5.2 innings in Atlanta's 5-3 win.
 - A* Was his first win in the majors since 9/24/18 at Toronto, while with Houston... Went 275 days between wins.
- A* Signed by the Braves to a one-year major league contract on 6/7...Was recalled to Atlanta on 6/21.
 - A* Became the first former Cy Young winner to join Atlanta midseason since the Braves acquired reliever Mark Davis from the Kansas City Royals in 1992.

Career Recap

- A* Selected by the Houston Astros in the seventh round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft...Signed by Jim Stevenson.
- A* Is a four-time Rawlings Gold Glove Award winner (2014-16, 18), two-time American League All-Star (2015, 2017) and the 2015 AL Cy Young Award winner... Has pitched in parts of seven seasons in the Major Leagues (2012-18).

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 8 **1st Batter/Retired:** 32/25 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 16/5

- Is 1-0 with 3.38 ERA (9 ER/24.0 IP) in 32 games with Atlanta...Twenty-seven of his 32 appearances have been scoreless, including 14 of his last 16.
- Celebrated 10 years of major league service time on July 27.
- Allowed four earned runs in 1.0 inning, 5/7 at LAD...Has a 1.96 ERA (5 ER/23.0 IP) in his other 31 games.
- Eighteen of his 32 appearances have been less than 1.0 inning.
- Holding left-handed batters to a .150 (6-for-40) average with 12 strikeouts...Righties are 12-for-49 (.245) with 15 strikeouts.
- Atlanta acquired him from the Oakland A's on 4/28 in exchange for cash considerations...Was designated for assignment by Atlanta on 5/14 and re-signed to a major league contract on 5/18.

Shane Greene • RHP • 6-4 • 200 • 30 yrs • #19

Saves/Opp: 0/2 **Holds:** 1 **1st Batter/Retired:** 6/1 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 4/4

- Is 0-1 with an 14.54 ERA (7 ER/4.1 IP) in six games with the Braves, and 0-3 with a 2.55 ERA (12 ER/42.1 IP) in 44 games on the season...He has converted 22 of 27 save opportunities.
- Has allowed runs in four of his six appearances with the Braves, and has also allowed all four of his inherited runners to score...Made his Braves debut on 8/3 vs. CIN, allowing a run in the ninth inning to blow a save.
- Acquired from Detroit on 7/31 in exchange for LHP Joey Wentz and OF Travis Demeritte...Prior to joining the Braves ranked fourth in the American League with his 22 saves, while his 1.18 ERA was the second lowest in baseball to San Diego's Kirby Yates among qualifying relievers.
- Was 0-2 with 22 saves and a 1.18 ERA (5 ER/38.0 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 12 walks in 38 games out of the bullpen for the Tigers this season.
- Originally drafted by the Yankees in the 15th round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of Daytona State College in Florida, Greene made his major league debut with New York in 2014.

Luke Jackson • RHP • 6-2 • 210 • 27 yrs • #77

- Is 6-2 with a 3.60 ERA (22 ER/55.0 IP) in 53 games this season...Has converted 18 of his 25 save chances after logging just one career save prior to 2019...His seven blown saves are tied for second most in the majors.
- Per Statcast, has an expected batting average of just .209 and an average exit velocity of 86.9 mph...Opponents are officially batting .267 (58-for-217).
- Logged his fourth hold of the season on 8/8 at MIA, his first since 4/27 vs. COL.
- Earned his 18th save, 8/11 at MIA...Has four saves of at least 1.1 innings.
- Left-handers have just 15 hits in 80 at-bats (.188) against him...Righties are hitting .314 (43-for-137).
- Has fanned 73 batters in 55.0 innings for a career-best 11.95 SO/9.0 IP ratio.
- Recorded his second consecutive two-inning save, 5/15 vs. STL, to become the first Braves closer with back-to-back two-inning saves since Hall of Famer John Smoltz in 2002

Chris Martin • RHP • 6-8 • 225 • 33 yrs • #51

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 1 **1st Batter/Retired:** 5/5 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0

- Is 0-3 with a 3.83 ERA (18 ER/42.1 IP) in 43 games on the season, including a 10.38 ERA (5 ER/4.1 IP) in five games with Atlanta.
- Earned his first hold with the Braves, 8/11 at MIA, in his last appearance...Fanned two in a scoreless inning.
- Acquired from Texas on 7/30 in exchange for LHP Kolby Allard...Made his Braves debut on 8/2 vs. CIN with a perfect eighth inning.
- Went 0-2 with a 3.08 ERA (13 ER/38.0 IP) in 38 games out of the bullpen for Texas this season with 43 strikeouts and just four walks.
- Before joining Atlanta, had a rate of 0.95 BB/9 which ranked fifth best among qualifying relievers in the majors.
- Was in his second season with the Rangers, joining Texas as a free agent in December of 2017... He spent the previous two years in Japan from 2015-2017, while also playing for Colorado and New York (AL).

- Is 4-2 with a 3.88 ERA (22 ER/51.0 IP) in 49 games this season between Atlanta and San Francisco...In six games with the Braves, has a 7.71 ERA (4 ER/4.2 IP), but a 0.86 FIP.
- Converted his first save chance with the Braves, 8/13 vs. NYM...Was his 184th career save.
