## STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT-The Rays have gone 2-3 during a 10-day, three-city road trip through Atlanta (1-2), Minnesota ( $1-1,1$ to play) and Pittsburgh (3 to play)... have won two of their last three games, but have six-gmeir last eight (4-4),...are 190 19-25 their 10-17 contests on May 19 is tied with the R ars for third worst in the AL ahead of the Athletics ( $9-19 / 321$ ) and White Sox (6-23/207) this after posting an 11-4 mark in their previous 15 contests from May 3-18 the Rays are 4-8 during a stretch of 19 games in 20 days from June 7-26

The Rays capitalized on a 10th-inning Twins error in last night's come-from behind, 3-2 win it marked the third time they won despite going hitless in extra innings, joining Aug. 9, 2008 at SEA and June 9, 1998 at NYM.
Tampa Bay was held to 1 -for-14 with RISP and overcame a season-high-tying 12 men left on base (also April 26 at CWS)...it marked the first time the Rays won while stranding $12+$ and scoring three runs or fewer since June 8, 2021 vs. WSH (3-1,12 LOB). Tampa Bay earned its 21st comeback win, tied with Washington for the MLB lead The victory marked their first in an AL Central ballpark since Sept. 13, 2023 in Minnesota (5-4), snapping a four-game losing streak, the Rays longest since June 20-Sept. 28, 2016 (6G).
Three straight and four of the Rays last eight games have been decided in the final at-bat...they are 10-6 in such contests, going 5-1 in their last six.
The Rays have been held to three runs or fewer in nine of their last 12 games, going 2-7 in those affairs...since May 1, they are 3-16 when plating three runs or fewer compared to 18-6 when scoring $4+$ times.
Tampa Bay has been out-hit in a season-high-tying five straight and 10 of its last 11 games...since April 29, the Rays are 13-1 when out-hitting their opponent and 9-22 when being out-hit or hits are even.
Today, the Rays will be opposed by a rookie starting pitcher for the 11th time, going
WHAT'S AT STAKE-With a win today, the Rays would:
Win their third straight rubber game (May 30 vs. OAK; June 13 vs. CHC) and claim their first road rubber match since April 10 at LAA. Improve to 8-6-0 over their last 14 series and 4-2-0 in their last six road sets. Improve to 13-11 in series finales, including 7-1 in their last eight
Win their third straight series over the Twins for the first time since May 26, 2017April 22, 2018...they would also claim series victories at Target Field in back-toback seasons for the first time since 2016-17.

ROAD TRIPPIN'-The Rays are 9-6 over their last 15 road games after a 7-10 start...their .600 road winning pet. in that span (since May 15) ranks fourth in the majors behind a trio of AL East rivals (NYY -.722; BAL - .647; BOS - .625)...the Rays have played 32 road games, tied with the Mets for the fewest in the majors...they are in the midst of a stretch from June 14-July 7 in which 15 of their 21 games take place on the road

Isaac Paredes (3rd, .316) and José Caballero (5th, .300) rank among AL leaders in road average...Randy Arozarena is 10-for-26 (.385) over a nine-game road hitting streak. Yandy Diaz has and 7 Se it ond longest by a Ray since his own 15-game run from July 30-Aug. 30, 2023 (15G).

BLOOMING IN JUNE-Randy Arozarena is batting . 298 (14-for-47) with 3 2B, 2 HR, 6 RBI, 9 BB and 8 SO over 16 games in June...his . 459 on-base pct. this month ranks third in the AL behind NYY Juan Soto (.532) and NYY Aaron Judge (.523)...he has reached base safely in 12 of 21 PA (.571 OBP) during a five-game hitting streak...Arozarena has produced a 13.1 pct. strikeout rate this month-he entered June at 28.7 pct .

\text { Amed Rosario is batting . } 378 \text { ( } 14 \text {-for-37) in June, fourth in the AL (min. 35AB)... }
$$ min. 200 AB , he is one of nine AL hitters with a . $295+$ AVG this season (.296). Brandon Lowe is slashing .274/.375/.565 (17-for-62) with 2 2B, 2 3B, 4 HR, 16 RBI and a .940 OPS over his last 19 games.

Jose Siri is hitting .258/.313/597 (16-for-62) with 6 2B, 5 HR and 11 RBI in 18 games since May 29, ranking among AL leaders over that span in doubles (T5th), extrabase hits (T5th, 11) and slugging pct. (9th).
IT STARTS AT THE TOP-Yandy Díaz is riding a season-high 21-game on-base streak, batting .282/.347/.341(24-for-85) with 32B, $13 B$, 6 RBI, 9 BB and 13 SO...it marks the thirdlongest active streak in MLB behind BAL Gunnar Henderson (26G) and CLE Steven Kwan (24G)...it marks his longest streak since a career-high-tying 22-game run from April 27
May 28, 2023, which was also the last instance of a $21+$ game on-base streak by a Ray.

Díaz also owns an 12-game hitting streak, going 18-for-52 (346) it ties the third ongest active streak in MLB behind PIT Bryan Reynolds (17G) and Kwan (13G) and
ties the second-longest streak of his career behind a 14-game run (May 3-21, 2021).
RALLY RAYS-The Rays 21 comeback wins are tied with the Nationals for the major league lead...Tampa Bay has come from behind in four straight and 10 of its last 11 wins, including four multi-run comebacks in its last seven victories...its only win that did not occur in come-from-behind fashion during that span was June 5 at MIA (5-3)...last night, they picked up their MLB-leading 10th win when trailing after six ing MLB leaders in wins when trailing after seven (1st 7) and eight frames (T2nd, 4)...their 16 wins after conceding the first run are fourth in MLB behind the Yankees (18), Mets and Nationals (both 17). Tampa Bay has scored first in five consecutive games for the first time since Sept.
$21-27,2023$ (6G)...the club the club is 4-8 in its last 12 games when plating the
opening run and has split its last 12 games (6-6) when the opponent scores first.

CLOSE SHAVES-The Rays own the best record in the majors in games decided by two runs or fewer (25-11/.694)...their 14-6 (.700) mark in one-run contests is tied with the Twins (14-6) for second in the majors behind the Mariners (17-7/.708)...since April 29 they are 16-5 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 6-18 in all other contests. despite splitting their last four, they have gone 10-3 in their last 13 one-run games.
TWO-OUT TROUBLE-Over their last eight games since June 11, Rays pitching has been tagged for a .391/.446/.618 (43-for-110) line with two outs-all three marks are the highest in the majors during that span...the Twins are 9 -for-27 (.333) with two outs in this series... or zero outs, the lowest such opp. average in MLB in that timeframe.

TWIN CITIES SHOWDOWN-The Rays conclude their lone trip to Target Field of 2024 today...these two teams will meet again from Sept. 2-5 at Tropicana Field...last season, Tampa Bay went 5-1 against Minnesota, winning the season series for the first time since 2018...the Rays have won seven of the last nine meetings overall, with the club's bullpen turning in a 1.34 ERA (33.2IP, 5ER) in those games...the Rays and Twins have played in four straight one-run contests, the longest streak in the history of the head-to-head series. Randy Arozarena is a career .366 (26-for-71) hitter in 20 games vs. the Twins,
his highest mark vs. any opponent (min. 15AB)...he has hit safely in all 11 of his his highest mark vs. any opponent (min. 15AB)...he has hit safely in all 11 of his appearances at Target Field, going 16-for-42 (.381)...the last longer streak by
visiting player to begin his career belongs to HOU Jose Altuve (17G, 2013-18).

TODAY'S START-The right-hander will take the mound for his 15th start of the season, including his seventh on the road....has recorded a 5.04 ERA (55.1IP, 31ER) in his last 10 starts compared to a 2.14 ERA (21.0IP, 5ER) in his first four...has thrown 5.0+IP in 12 of his 14 starts..is seeking his first victory since May 11 vs. New York-AL.
LAST TIME OUT-Took the loss on June 14 at Atlanta...set season highs in runs allowed (7) and earned runs allowed (6), while his 2.0 innings signaled a season low...allowed five runs in the 1st inning, the first Ray to do so since Taj Bradley (also 5R) on June 27, 2023 at Arizona....was the first Tampa Bay hurler to allow 6+ hits in an opening frame since Corey Kluber (8H) on Sept. 10, 2022 at New York-AL...allowed four straight extra-base hits in the inning: Ozzie Albies (2B), Marcell Ozuna (HR), Matt Olson (2B) and Austin Riley (2B).

ZACK IS BACK-Littell, the former Twins hurler, is set to make his fourth career appearance (2nd start) against his old club...made his lone star opposite Minnesota last season on Sept. 12 and took the loss (L, 7.0IP, 5H 3ER, OBB, 8SO)...the 8 SO at the time signaled Littell's career high

All three of his previous appearances against the Twins have come at Target Field (Aug. 26-27, 2022 with (F).
He has made 35 career appearances (7GS) vs. the AL Central, going $6-4$ with a 4.01 ERA ( $76.1 \mathrm{IP}, 34 \mathrm{ER}$ ), including $0-2$ with a 5.25 ERA (12.OIP, 7ER) this season...is $5-0$ with a 2.72 ERA (39.2IP, 12 ER ) in 28
relief appearances against the division, compared to $1-4$ with a 5.40 relief appearances against the division
ERA (36.2IP, 22ER) in his seven starts.

DAY 'N' NITE-In seven daytime starts, Littell is 2-2 with a 2.77 ERA (39.0IP, 12ER) and has allowed only 2 HR...this, compared to 0-3 with a 5.79 ERA (37.1IP, 24ER) and 8 HR allowed in seven nighttime starts.

Min. 35.0 IP , his 2.77 daytime ERA is seventh lowest in the AL under the same parameter, his 5.79 nighttime ERA is seventh highest in the AL.

NO SPIN ZONE-Littell's split-finger, an offering his utilizes 22.0 pct. of the time, produces an average spin rate of 789 revolutions per minute.. min .250 pitches thrown, it marks the fifth-lowest average spin rate any pitch thrown in MLB...SD Matt Waldron's knuckleball registers 259 rpm, followed by splitters from SEA Logan Gilbert (668), NYM Tylor Megill (704) and BAL Dean Kremer (777).

PINPOINT PRECISION-Littell's 3.9 pct. walk rate is sixth lowest in the majors behind teammate Zach Eflin (1.6\%), SEA George Kirby (2.6\%), CIN Nick Martinez (3.3\%), CHC Shota Imanaga (3.6\%) and DET Jack Flaherty (3.6\%).

According to Elias, his free pass to NYY Anthony Rizzo on May
11 snapped a 123 BF streak without a walk, fourth longest in Rays 11 snapped a 123 BF streak without a walk, fourth longest in Ray history behind Zach Eflin (165BF, 2024), Corey Kluber (150BF, 2022) and David Price (124BF, 2013)...five of his 13 walks have come in a total of two frames: the 1st inning on April 10 at LAA (3BB) and the 2nd on May 11 vs. NYY (2BB)...excluding his statistics in those two frames, he has produced a 2.5 pct. walk rate (7BB/273BF) in all other innings.
From April 17-May 4, he recorded 6+ SO without issuing a walk in a club-record four straight starts...the four such starts are tied for third most in the majors behind CWS Erick Fedde and PIT Jared Jones (both 5).

THE STREAK ENDS TODAY-Littell has allowed 1 HR in career-high six straight starts, surpassing a five-start stretch from Aug. 10-Sept. 2, 2023... of the 10 home runs he has surrendered this season, seven have been solo shots, with the lone outliers being a three-run homers by Miguel Anduja May 28 vs. OAK) and Marcell Ozuna (June 14 at ATL), and a two-run homer by Austin Riley (June 14 at ATL).

Despite boasting one of the best walk rates in MLB, Littell has issued a walk in a career-high seven straight outings since May 11.

BEND, DON'T BREAK-Littell has yielded 10.85 hits per 9.0 IP, the secondhighest mark in the majors behind WSH Patrick Corbin (10.87). Littell has thrown 54.1 pct. of his pitches in the strike zone, the
seventh-highest percentage in the AL ...opponents have swung at 52.7 pct. of his total pitches, fifth in the majors behind CHC Shota Imanaga (55.5\%), PIT Jared Jones (54.4\%), SEA George Kirby (54.1\%) and CIN Nick Martinez (53.0\%).
