METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Braves, 10-4, last night...The Mets are seeking their third straight series win and their 16th series win of the season... New York improved to 37-15 when scoring first this season...The Mets continue a seven-game road trip (4-1) to St. Louis (3-1) and Atlanta (1-0)...The Mets are off on Thursday before returning to New York for a 10-day, nine-game homestand against the Angels (three games), Rangers (three games) and Mariners (three games).

REVOLUTION NO. 9: New York has won seven of its last nine games...The Mets are batting .282/.350/.506 and have posted a 3.83 ERA (34 ER/80.0 IP) during the streak...Over the last nine games, the Mets have outscored their opponents 63-34.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: In 29 games this year, DJ Stewart is batting .246 (15-61) with nine runs, two doubles, six home runs, 12 RBI, eight walks, a .388 OBP and a .574 SLG...Over the last six games, Stewart is 8-20 with five home runs and nine RBI...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

LINSANITY: Lindor is on an eight-game hitting streak, batting .400 (14-35) in that span with nine runs, three doubles, one home run, eight RBI, one walk and two steals...Over his last 54 games, he is batting .309 (63-204) with 43 runs, 11 doubles, two triples, 11 home runs, 34 RBI, 26 walks, 15 steals with a .391 OBP, a .544 SLG and a .936 OPS...Lindor has stolen 21 bases in 124 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.1 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.2 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (17.9) and Mookie Betts (16.8) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.2 fWAR since 2021 ranks fifth in the majors in that span.

TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUIST: Jeff McNeil has hit .385 (40-104) with 16 runs, nine doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, six walks with a .423 OBP and a .523 SLG in 27 career games at the home of the Braves...In 66 career games against Atlanta, McNeil is a .344 (86-250) hitter with 33 runs, 22 doubles, five home runs, 25 RBI, 10 walks with an .874 OPS...He has safely hit in seven straight games against ATL, batting .406 (13-32) with five runs, one double, two RBI, two walks and an .879 OPS in that span.

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil is on a six-game hitting streak, batting .407 (11-27) with six runs, two doubles, one home run, six RBI, one walk and one steal...He has safely hit in 15 of his last 17 games, batting .358 (24-67) with 13 runs, three doubles, three home runs, 13 RBI, and four walks with a .405 OBP and a .537 SLG in that span...In 36 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting .296 (42-142) with 22 runs, six doubles, one triple, three home runs, 21 RBI, seven walks with a .348 OBP...He has struck out only 12 times in 155 plate appearances following the All-Star break.

DINGERS: The Mets have homered in eight straight games, blasting 20 home runs in that span...It is tied for the third-longest streak of the season...Overall, the Mets have hit 164 home runs, which is fourth in the National League.

MONTHLY REPORT: Pete Alonso has recorded nine home runs in 20 games this month...His career-best for any singly month is 11 home runs, which he recorded in 27 games in September of 2019...He has recorded five months with at least 10 home runs in his career...His next home run would mark the second time this year that Alonso has hit 10 homers in a single month...He hit 10 home runs in May...He also hit one home run in March and nine in April.

THIS IS ALMOST 40: Pete Alonso is third in the majors and second in the National League with 39 home runs...Alonso is one home run shy of recording his third season of 40 or more home runs...He socked 53 in 2019 and 40 last season... He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...Since he entered the league in 2019, only two other players have recorded multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs (Shohei Ohtani and Mike Trout)... Only one active player (Nelson Cruz, four) has more than three 40-HR seasons...Alonso's 185 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...With one more long ball, he'll become the fifth player in MLB history with three or more seasons with 40+ home runs in a player's first five years...He would join Ralph Kiner (4), Ryan Howard (3), Albert Pujols (3) and Eddie Matthews (3).

BRAVES-METS NOTES: With a win last night, the Mets snapped a seven-game losing streak at Truist Park...Overall, the Mets are 23-33 in the history of the ballpark.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is second in the majors and in the NL with 95 RBI... He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...He is seeking to become the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.

GIMME A BREAK: Alonso is hitting .263 (34-130) with 20 extra-base hits, 34 RBI, 23 runs, 17 walks and a .983 OPS in 36 games following the All-Star break...He batted .211 (64-304) with 50 runs, seven one triple, 26 home runs and 61 RBI in the 82 games before the break.

INVADER NIM: Over the last 13 games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .400 (20-50) with eight runs, two doubles, three home runs, four RBI, nine walks, a .492 OBP and a .620 SLG...He is batting .299 (46-154) with 11 doubles, one triple, two home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks with a .368 OBP and a .422 SLG against left-handed pitchers this year...His .299 average is the eighth best in the majors by a left-handed hitter against fellow lefties.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 28-39 on the road this year...They have posted a 4.81 ERA in away games...New York has played 67 games on the road this year...That is tied for the most in the majors.

150: Kodai Senga now has 154 strikeouts on the season...He became the seventh pitcher in franchise history to record at least 150 strikeouts in his rookie season... Senga is tied with Gary Gentry for sixth place among rookie pitchers in team history (Gentry had 154 in 1969)...His is the fifth pitcher of Japanese origin to post at least 150 strikeouts as a rookie, joining Hideo Nomo (236 in 1995), Yu Darvish (221 in 2012), Daisuke Matsuzaka (201 in 2007), and Kenta Maeda (179 in 2016)... Courtesy of sportsradar.

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .297 (73-246) with 37 runs, 11 doubles, three triples, seven home runs, 30 RBI, 35 walks, a .385 OBP and a .451 SLG on the road this season...This compares to a .238/.345/.444 slashline with 21 extra-base hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a .278 (73-263) hitter with 49 runs, 19 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs, 53 RBI, 24 walks, a .346 OBP, and a .525 SLG on the road in 2023...He is slashing .223/.322/.398 with 18 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 37-10 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 15-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 2006, Carlos Delgado hit his 400th career home run as the Mets defeated the Cardinals, 8-7 at Shea Stadium...The Mets were down 7-6 heading into the bottom of the ninth, but Carlos Beltrán hit a two-run walk-off homer to give the Mets the victory...Delgado finished the game going 2-5 with five RBI in the win...He spent four seasons with the Mets, batting .267/.351/.506 with 104 home runs and 339 RBI.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The DSL Mets Blue defeated the DSL Rockies, 12-2, yesterday...RHP Lucas Gordillo tossed 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed two hits, walked two and struck out...He improved to 2-2 on the season and lowered his ERA to 1.21 (5 ER/37.1 IP) with 21 walks and 55 strikeouts...INF Leyderman Ruiz collected two hits, going 2-4 with three RBI and a double in the win.

MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his seventh win of the season on August 16 against the Pirates at Citi Field...Allowed two runs over 5.0 innings, issued four walks and struck out five batters.

BRINING THE HEAT AGAINST HOTLANTA: Tonight, Megill will make his ninth career appearance, eighth start against the Braves, his most against any single one opponent in his career...For his career against Atlanta, Megill is 1-2 with a 4.66 ERA (19 ER/36.2 IP) and a 9.82 SO/9 rate...Megill has faced the Braves twice this season, both times at Citi Field and is 0-1 with a 6.55 ERA (8 ER/11.0 IP) in those outings...In three career outings (two starts) at Truist Park, Megill has a 4.22 ERA (5 ER/10.2 IP)...The righty's lone win against the Braves came at Truist Park on October 1, 2021 when Megill allowed one hit over 5.0 scoreless innings.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: This season, Megill is 2-4 with a 8.20 ERA (34 ER/37.1 IP) in nine road starts this season...In nine home starts this season, Megill is 5-2 with a 3.49 ERA (19 ER/49.0 IP)...Megill's 4.71 home/road ERA differential is the fourth-highest in the majors this season (Min. 7 GS)...Courtesy of Elias...In 26 career road games (22 starts), Megill is 6-9 with a 6.08 ERA (70 ER/103.0 IP) and in 25 career home games (23 starts), Megill is 9-5 with a 4.14 ERA (55 ER/119.2 IP).

THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY: On April 7, the Mets home opener vs. Miami, Megill threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.

COMBINED NO-NO: Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodríguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen.

2022 RECAP: Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

OPENOR: Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY: His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021...According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP JOSÉ QUINTANA (1-4, 3.03)

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his first career win as a Met on August 17 against the Cardinals at Busch Stadium...Allowed two runs over 6.0+ innings on three hits and four walks, while striking out five batters...Saw his major league-leading homerless inning streak come to an end at 97.1 innings after he allowed a solo homer to Tyler O'Neill to begin the seventh.

QUALITY EATS: Quintana has posted a quality start in each of his last five starts, tied with three others for the longest active such streak in the majors...It is the longest such streak by a Met hurler this season and the longest by a Met since Jacob deGrom tossed six straight quality starts from August 13 - September 13, 2022.
