METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday, on Wednesday, they defeated the Rangers, 6-5, in extra-innings...The Mets continue a 10-day, ninegame homestand (2-4) against the Angels (1-2), Rangers (1-2) and Mariners (three games)...New York is off on Labor Day before the start of a five-game road trip against Washington (two games) and Minnesota (three games).

ROSTER MOVES: With active rosters expanding to 28 players today, the Mets have made the following moves: RHP José Butto, INF Ronny Mauricio and INF Brett Baty have been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse...INF Danny Mendick was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse.

THE BIG APPLE TV+: Friday's game against the Seattle Mariners will be aired exclusively on Apple TV+...Fans can access the game by using the Apple TV app or by visiting tv.apple.com.

PLAYERS FIREHOUSE VISIT: Today, in honor of the 22nd anniversary of September 11, New York Mets and Seattle Mariners players visited Engine 301/Ladder 150 in Queens...The players received a tour of the firehouse, connected with current and retired first responders, took pictures, and shared baseball stories...As another way to say, 'thank you,' the Mets also donated tickets and lunch for the members of the firehouse.

WE'RE #1: The New York Mets have been named the winner in the 2023 USA TODAY 10Best Readers' Choice travel award contest for Best Stadium Food...Citi Field's nomination was chosen by a panel of relevant experts, which includes a combination of editors from USA TODAY, editors from 10Best.com, relevant expert contributors, and sources for both these media and other Gannett properties before being voted on by the public online...To celebrate the victory, a delicious assortment of items from around Citi Field will be available to the media at 6 p.m. in the Press Box.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: The Mets are encouraging all fans attending the games taking place August 25 - September 3 to take the train to the game...With the capacity crowds expected at both Citi Field and the US Open, using mass transit and rideshare will be the most efficient ways to arrive to the ballpark...The LIRR and the 7 train have added additional trains for baseball and tennis fans...If you drive, please arrive early to avoid traffic delays.

DOWN ON THE FARM: In 116 games at Triple-A this season, Ronny Mauricio has batted .292/.346/.506 with 76 runs, 30 doubles, three triples, 23 home runs, 71 RBI, 24 steals and 35 walks...He leads all Triple-A players with 248 total bases, is tied for second with 143 hits and ranked third with 56 extra-base hits...He has posted an .852 OPS...He is ranked as the fourth-best prospect in the system and the 90th-best prospect in baseball according to MLB Pipeline.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: In 36 games this year, DJ Stewart is batting .279 (24-86) with 12 runs, five doubles, nine home runs, 18 RBI, nine walks, a .364 OBP and a .651 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

MARINERS-METS NOTES: The Mets will play the Mariners in back-toback seasons for the first time in team history.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga now has 164 strikeouts on the season...He became the seventh pitcher in franchise history to record at least 150 strikeouts in his rookie season...Senga's 164 punchouts through 24 career games are they fourthmost in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (193), Matt Harvey (172) and Noah Syndergaard (166) recorded more...He is the fifth pitcher of Japanese origin to post at least 150 strikeouts as a rookie, joining Hideo Nomo (236 in 1995), Yu Darvish (221 in 2012), Daisuke Matsuzaka (201 in 2007), and Kenta Maeda (179 in 2016)...Courtesy of sportsradar.

FRIDAY THE 13TH: DJ Stewart has eight homers, three doubles, nine runs scored and 15 RBI with a .378/.429/.978 slashline in his last 13 games...His eight homers since August 15 are tied for the most in the majors, while his 1.407 OPS is the fifth-highest in the majors during that span (min. 30 PA)...He is the first Mets player with eight or more homers in a 13-game span since Neil Walker in April 2016...Courtesy of Sarah Langs

WALK IT OFF: On Wednesday, the Mets earned their sixth walk-off win of the season...The team improved to 7-2 in extra innings this season and are now 17-4 in extra innings since 2022, the best record in the majors during that span.

DINGERS!: The Mets have socked 174 home runs this season...That is the fourthmost in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has hit a career-best 19 home runs this season He is batting .284 (48-169) with 11 doubles, one triple, two home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks with a .349 OBP against left-handed pitchers this year...His .284 average is the 12th-best in the majors by a left-handed hitter against fellow lefties.

LINSANITY: Over his last 63 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .295 (69-234) with 47 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 35 RBI, 29 walks, 18 steals with a .381 OBP, a .517 SLG and a .899 OPS...Lindor has stolen 24 bases in 131 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

THIS IS ALMOST 40: Pete Alonso is third in the majors and second in the National League with 39 home runs...Alonso is one home run shy of recording his third season of 40 or more home runs...He socked 53 in 2019 and 40 last season...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs... Since he entered the league in 2019, only two other players have recorded multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs (Shohei Ohtani and Mike Trout)... Only one active player (Nelson Cruz, four) has more than three 40-HR seasons...Alonso's 185 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues... With one more long ball, he'll become the fifth player in MLB history with three or more seasons with 40+ home runs in a player's first five years...He would join Ralph Kiner (4), Ryan Howard (3), Albert Pujols (3) and Eddie Matthews (3).

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is fifth in the majors and is third in the NL with 96 RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...He is seeking to become the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1975, Tom Seaver became the first pitcher to record eight consecutive 200-strikeout seasons...Seaver struck out 10 Pirates hitters as he tossed a complete game, four-hit shutout to win his 20th game of the season and lower his ERA to 2.06...Seaver would finish the year with 243 punchouts and go on to capture the last of his three Cy Young Awards after the 1975 season.

SENGA NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: In his last start on August 25 against Los Angeles-AL, Senga threw 6.2 innings allowing four hits, two runs with three walks and 10 strikeouts...He recorded his third double-digit strikeout game of the season to become the first Met rookie since Noah Syndergaard (5 games in 2015) to accomplish the feat...Additionally, Senga became the first se-born rookie since Masahiro Tanaka (5 games in 2014) with three or more doubledigit strikeout games.

METS ROOKIE MILESTONE WATCH: On August 19 at St. Louis, Senga became the seventh Mets rookie pitcher ever to reach the 150-strikeout mark...Senga finished his start reaching 154 strikeouts, tied with Gary Gentry for sixth all-time among Mets rookie hurlers...The right-hander also earned his 10th win of the season in his last start, becoming the 12th rookie in franchise history to reach double-digit wins in a season...Senga became the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee won 13 games as a rookie in 2011...Senga enters tonight's contest just two strikeouts away from tying Noah Syndergaard for fifth all-time among Mets rookies.

HARD TO HIT: This season, Senga has three starts of 7.0 or more innings and two or fewer hits allowed, tied with Shohei Ohtani and Reid Detmers of the Angels for the second-most such starts this season...That is tied with Dwight Gooden for the most such starts by a Mets rookie in a single season...Only Nolan Ryan (4, 1970) and Jacob deGrom (5, 2015) have had more such starts in a single season in franchise history.

I LOVE MY NEW HOME: Senga's 2.64 ERA (22 ER/75.0 IP) is the fifth-best mark in the NL and the seventh-best mark in the majors...Senga has held opposing batters to a .184 average at home, the lowest-mark in the NL and the third-lowest mark in the majors...His $11.28 \, \text{SO/9}$ rate at home is the fourth-highest in the NL and the eighth-highest in the majors (Min. 60.0 IP at home).

SENGA GENESIS: Senga has recorded 164 strikeouts through his first 24 career major league games, the fourth-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (193), Matt Harvey (172) and Noah Syndergaard (166) have recorded more during that span...His 164 strikeouts are the fourth-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 23 career games...He trails only Hideo Nomo (212), Yu Darvish (172) and Masahiro Tanaka (159)...Sengal's 3.19 ERA is the eighth-lowest mark by a Mets pitcher through their first 23 career major league games (Min. 100.0 IP).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Senga's 10 wins are tied for the most among all major league rookies this season and his 164 strikeouts also lead all major league rookies. Among qualified National League pitchers, Senga is fourth in the in opponent's average (.210), fifth in SO/9 (10.83) and third in ERA (3.17)...Senga ranks third in the majors in opponent's average against left-handed batters with a .192 (43 - 224) clip (Min. 200 LHB

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On July 8, Major League Baseball announced that Kodai Senga was added to the National League All-Star team, which took place on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He is the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 89 of his 164 strikeouts through 24 starts...The pitch has a 60.4 percent whiff rate and a 28.5 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just 16 hits in 133 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .120 batting average.

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

NPB CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).
