METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 4-1, last night...The Mets are 43-10 when scoring first this season...The Mets are looking for their 20th series victory of the season...New York is 19-5-3 in 27 series this year...The Mets are in a stretch of 17 games in 17 days (7-5) to finish out the first-half...The Mets finish the first half of the season with a seven game road trip (1-1) to Atlanta (1-1) and Chicago-NL (four games).

THE RUBBERBAND MAN: The Mets are 11-3 in rubber games this season...According to Elias, that's the second-best winning percentage in such games this season, trailing just the Angels, who are 5-1...When playing the third game of a three-game series on the road (after splitting the first two games) the Mets are 7-2, which is the fifth best such winning percentage in the league this season and the most victories.

TRIPLES ARE BEST: The Mets recorded their 17th triple of the season last night...That places them fourth in the majors and third in the National League...The 2021 Mets recorded a total of 18 triples...Brandon Nimmo is tied for the major league lead and leads the National League with five three-baggers.

DAY MAN: New York is 23-14 in day games this season...The team's .622 winning percentage in the sunlight is the fourth-best in the majors and the second-best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.08 ERA with 93 walks and 354 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 3.15 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and second in the NL.

NL BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of seven straight games against divisional opponents...New York is 3-3 in that stretch...The Mets are 27-12 against the East this season...They have pitched to a 2.99 ERA (116 earned runs/348.2 innings) with 100 walks and 359 strikeouts against the NL East.

RIGHT ON: The Mets are batting .260 against right-handed pitchers this year...That is the best mark in the majors...Their .327 OBP is third in MLB...The Mets are 35-20 when facing a right-handed starting pitcher this season.

PICK SIX: Lindor is on a six-game hitting streak, batting .296 (8-27) with two runs, one triple, two home runs, four RBI and an .889 OPS in that span...In 12 games this month, Lindor is batting .265/.321/.490 with five runs, one triple, three home runs, three walks and five RBI...He has posted a 3.1 fWAR this year which places him 10th in the National League.

LINSANE IN THE MEMBRANE: Francisco Lindor has recorded 61 RBI in 87 games this year...Lindor recorded a total of 63 RBI in 2021...Francisco Lindor set a franchise record with the most RBI by a shortstop before the All-Star break...José Reyes was the previous record holder, collecting 43 RBI before the 2008 Midsummer Classic...Lindor's record for most RBI before the break is 62 when playing with Cleveland in 2018.

CONNECT FOUR: New York is 46-5 when scoring at least four runs in a game...The team's 46 wins when scoring four runs is third in the majors...Their .902 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors...The Mets have won 14 consecutive games in which they've scored at least four runs, and are 24-1 since May 27 when scoring at least four times...The 2021 Mets went 62-19 when scoring four or more runs.

GIMME GUILLORME: Luis Guillorme has recorded a hit in each of last six games with a plate appearance...He is batting .450 (9-20) in that span with two runs, two doubles, a home run, two RBI, four walks with a .542 OBP and a .700 SLG...He has set career highs in hits (56), doubles (eight), home runs (two) and tied his career-high with nine RBI this season.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has reached base safely in 11 straight road games...He is batting .364 (16-44) with 11 runs, three doubles, three homers, nine RBI, five walks with a .442 OBP and a .636 SLG in that span...Overall, he is batting .266/.354/.431 with 52 runs, 16 doubles, five triples, eight home runs and 32 RBI...He is 11th in the National League with a 2.8 fWAR...He is batting .299/.400/.497 with 17 extra-base hits in 44 games on the road this year.

MOVING ON UP: Edwin Díaz has converted 83 saves as a member of the Mets last night...That ties him with Francisco Rodríguez for eighth on the Mets all-time list...Next up is Roger McDowell at seventh place with 84 saves from 1985-89 and Tug McGraw who converted 86 saves with the Mets from 1965-74...Díaz has struck out 311 batters as a member of the Mets...That is eighth all-time.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz, the reigning NL Reliever of the Month, has posted a 1-0 record with nine saves, a 0.51 ERA (one earned run/17.2 innings) with 10 hits, three walks and 39 strikeouts over his last 18 appearances since May 27...Overall, he has recorded 19 saves this season, tied for the fourth-most in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 73 strikeouts...His 18.08 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...He has struck out 73 of the 142 batters he faced, good for 51.4%...Last night was his fifth inning facing three batters and striking them all out, the most such appearances in the majors...He is 2-1 with 19 saves, a 1.73 ERA (seven earned runs/35.1 innings), allowing 25 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 33-4 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

STARTING OFF: The Mets starters have gone 5-3 with 2.86 ERA (22 earned runs/69.1 innings) with 14 walks and 88 strikeouts in 12 games in July...Their 2.86 ERA places them fifth in the majors and fourth in the NL...Their 88 strikeouts in July are the most in the majors.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are looking for their first season series victory over the Braves since 2017, when they went 12-7 against Atlanta.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 54 games this season, the second-most in the National League...Their .614 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 54-34 record through the team's first 88 games...Only the 1986 (60-28) team posted a better record through the first 88 games of the season...The 1988 Mets also went 54-34 in 88 games.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is 26-19 on the road this year...Their .578 road winning percentage is the sixth-best in the majors and is the fourth-best in the NL...The Mets finished the first-half of the 2021 season going 19-26 on the road...New York is batting .257/.323/.403 away from Citi Field...Their .257 road average ranks fourth in the majors.

HOME & ROAD: The Mets have 28 home wins and 26 road victories...This is the fifth time in club history that New York will have at least 25 wins both at home and away prior to the All-Star break...The Mets also did this in 1969, 1985, 1986 and 2006.

RUNNING MATES: Brandon Nimmo (52), Starling Marte (50), and Francisco Lindor (50) are one of just three teammate trios to each score at least 50 runs this year, along with Boston's Xander Bogaerts, Rafael Devers, and J.D. Martinez and San Diego's Jake Cronenworth, Manny Machado, and Jurickson Profar...This is only the fifth time three or more Mets have scored 50+ runs by the break, and the first time since 2008, when Beltran, Delgado, Reyes, and Wright pulled it off...Courtesy of sportsradar.

MV-PETE: Pete Alonso became the third Mets player in team history to record 60 or more RBI before the All-Star break in multiple seasons...He joins David Wright (2006, 2008) and Mike Piazza (2000) as the only Mets to reach the 70-RBI mark before the All-Star break with a solo home run in the fourth inning yesterday...The Mets record for most RBI in the first half is 74, accomplished by David Wright in 2006.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 60 times this year...The Mets have been hit 294 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 65 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 46 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 45 HBP and Jeff McNeil is tied for ninth at 38 HBP...Brandon Nimmo has been hit by a franchise record 50 pitches in his career.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets rank second in the majors with 833 strikeouts this season...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 666 times this season...That is the fifth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game six times this year, which is tied for the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 45 times this year, the most in the majors.

DERBY DAY: On Monday, Pete Alonso will compete in the Home Run Derby for the third time...Pete Alonso won the 2021 Home Run Derby, defeating Trey Mancini to earn his second Derby title...He is the only Met to win the competition twice and is the lone player in team history to win the derby outright...He is the second player in franchise history to win the Derby, joining Darryl Strawberry, who shared the victory with Wally Joyner in 1986...No player in major league history has won the competition three straight years.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: Catcher Francisco Álvarez and infielder Mark Vientos will participate in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game on Saturday at Dodger Stadium at 7 pm ET...Álvarez, 20, is ranked as the top prospect in the Mets system and the number two prospect in baseball according to MLB Pipeline...Vientos, 22, ranks fifth in the organization.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Major League Baseball announced that first baseman Pete Alonso, second baseman Jeff McNeil, outfielder Starling Marte and RHP Edwin Díaz were named to the 2022 National League All-Star team...The 92nd All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 19 at Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles...The last time the Mets had four All-Stars was in 2016 (Noah Syndergaard, Yoenis Céspedes, Jeurys Familia and Bartolo Colón)...This is the 10th time in franchise history the Mets had four or more All-Stars.

BASSITT NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Faced the Marlins for a third straight start on July 8 at Citi Field... Bassitt suffered the loss after going 6.1 innings...He allowed two runs and struck out three batters...He did not allow a free pass for a second straight start...Prior to his previous three starts, Bassitt had faced the same opponent three times in consecutive games in 2019 from 9/13- 9/22 against the Texas Rangers (one start and two relief appearances).

MIDNIGHT TRAIN TO GEORGIA: Bassitt has won four of his seven road starts this season, going 4-2 with a 5.17 ERA (22 earned runs/38.1 innings)...Across those starts he has struck out 41 batters and walked 12...In his career, Bassitt is 22-13 with a 4.44 road ERA (157 earned runs/318.1 innings) with 289 strikeouts and 120 walks.

JUST PEACHY: Bassitt will face the Braves for the second time in his career, and the second time this season...He faced Atlanta earlier this season on May 2 going 7.0 innings, allowing three earned runs on six hits while striking out eight batters... In seven starts against the NL East, Bassitt is 3-3 with a 2.64 ERA (13 earned runs/44.1 innings) striking out 44 batters and walking eight.

ALL-RIGHT, ALL-RIGHT, ALL-RIGHT: Bassitt owns a .214 opponent batting average against right-handed batters which ranks seventh in the NL and 11th in the majors...His 2.86 ERA and .581 OPS against right-handers are the ninth and sixth-lowest in the NL (min. 200 batters faced).

HOOK LINE AND SINKER: Bassitt has a 59.8 percent ground ball rate on his sinker, almost nine percentage points higher than his ground ball rate from 2021 (51.2)...His next-highest ground ball rate comes from his fastball...This season his 57.1 percent ground ball rate on his four-seamer is about twice as high than last season (28.9) when it generated his lowest ground ball rate of any pitch...Overall, Bassitt's 47.5 percent ground ball rate is on pace to be the highest of his career.

WALKIN' AFTER MIDNIGHT: The right-hander has not walked a batter in his last two starts (13.1 innings) which is tied for the longest streak in his career...The only other time Bassitt went two starts without allowing a walk was in 2021 when he went 14.0 innings without allowing a free pass across his May 5 and May 11 starts.

SLOW HANDS: Chris Bassitt owns the second-lowest exit velocity in the majors (85.8 mph)...He trails Zach Eflin who owns a 85.2 mph average exit velocity.

GO LONG!: Has gone 6.0 innings or longer in 12 of his 16 starts this year, allowing three earned runs or fewer in all but four of his starts...He has five starts with at least 6.0 innings and three or fewer hits allowed...Ranks tied for sixth in that category...Bassitt has thrown for 7.0 innings or more in three starts this season.

FASTER THAN FAST: Bassitt's fastball has produced 32 strikeouts this season, which is his most with any pitch...His second-most strikeouts comes on his slider with 23 Ks...His strikeout percentage on his fastball is 42.7 percent (32 Ks in 67 at-bats).

SWEET 16: His 98 strikeouts through 16 games this season are tied for the ninth-most he has had in his career during a 16-game span in a single season...Those 98 strikeouts are the fifth-most in franchise history among starters through their first 16 games as a Met, behind only Dwight Gooden (125), Pedro Martinez (123), Noah Syndergaard (106), and Al Leiter (100).

SIX STRIKEOUTS OR MORE: Bassitt has struck out six or more batters in 11 of his 15 starts...Those 11 games with six or more strikeouts ranks tied for sixth-most in the NL and ninth-most in the majors.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (9-4, 4.55 ERA)

LAST TIME OUT: Went 5.2 innings against Miami on July 9 at Citi Field...Carrasco did not factor into the decision of the game after allowing two runs on seven hits...Carrasco struck out five batters and walked two.

ROAD TO 100: Carrasco is two wins away from 100 for his career...He will become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone...The earliest he could accomplish the feat would be in his 272nd career game, making him the fifth-fastest Venezuelan-born hurler to reach the mark.
