THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY

SEPT. 9

1987 - In the Dome, Hall of Fame **RHP Nolan Ryan** has one of the most memorable nights of his career in a 4-2 win over the Giants. In addition to tallying 16 punchouts in 8.0 innings of work, Ryan also picks up his 4,500th career strikeout in the 7th inning when he fans Mike Aldrete.

1967 - In a 5-3 win over the Dodgers, Jimmy Wynn hits 2 HR and becomes the 1st player in frachise history to reach 100 RBI in a season.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Astros and Phillies will play the 2nd game of this 3-game set tonight at Citizens Bank Park...**RHP Hunter Brown** (5-3) will start for the Astros as he takes on Phils **LHP Cristopher Sánchez** (16-5)...tonight will be Brown's 1st career app. at Citizens Bank Park and his 3rd career app. overall vs. PHI (2nd start).

REMATCH: **RHP Hunter Brown** and **LHP Cristopher Sánchez** faced each other on June 26 of last season in what was a pitcher's duel at Daikin Park...Brown hurled 7.0 scoreless innings with 9 K's and no walks while Sanchez allowed just 1 run in 6.0 innings with 11 K's and no walks...HOU won the game, 2-1 (Brown had ND).

ASTROS-PHILS: The Astros have won 5 straight games vs. the Phillies...in those 5 wins, which include 3 shutouts, Astros pitchers have combined for a 1.00 ERA (4ER/36IP)...Astros starters have a 0.83 ERA (3ER/32.2IP) in those 5 wins...the starters had gone 4 cons. starts without allowing a run vs. PHI until last night...HOU swept a 3-game series vs. PHI at Daikin Park in the last meeting between the 2 clubs, June 24-26 of 2025...in those 3 games, Astros pitchers allowed just 1 run in 27.0 IP...**Last Visit to CPB:** The Phils took 2 of 3 from HOU in the last series here in Philly, Aug. 26-28 of 2024...in the final game of that series, **Yordan Alvarez** went 4x4 with 3 HR in a 10-0 Astros win...**Postseason History:** The Astros and Phils have met twice in the postseason, with PHI taking the 1980 NLCS and the Astros winning the 2022 World Series.

BROTHER BROWN: **RHP Hunter Brown** has pitched well as of late, posting a 2-0 record in his last 3 starts with a 1.96 ERA (4ER/18.1IP) and 21 strikeouts...tonight will be his 17th start of the season as he missed several weeks due to a right shoulder strain...**Last Season:** In 2025, Brown finished 3rd in the AL Cy Young voting after posting a 12-9 record with a 2.43 ERA and 206 strikeouts.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP: The Astros edged the Phillies in last night's series opener, 6-5...**RHP Hayden Wesneski** (5-1) earned the win (6 IP, 3 ER)...the Astros tallied 3 HR in the game with Norristown native **1B Christian Walker** going deep along with **RF Cam Smith** and **CF Daulton Varsho**...**LHP Josh Hader** earned his 24th save in as many chances.

LEAD PROTECTORS: The Astros are 64-0 this season when leading after 8.0 innings...they are one of four MLB teams with a perfect record when leading after 8.0 innings this year.

BIG WES: With last night's outing, **RHP Hayden Wesneski** is now 3-0 in his last 4 starts with a 1.57 ERA (4ER/23IP)...for the season, he is 5-1 with a 3.35 ERA in 8 starts (Astros are 7-1 in his starts).

ROAD WARRIORS: Tonight is the 2nd game (1-0 thus far) of a 6-game trip (3g at PHI, 3g at TB)...since going 1-9 on the first road trip of 2026, the Astros have gone 36-24 (.600) on the road since April 14, which ranks third in the Majors in that span...more recently, they are 20-12 (.625) on their last 6 road trips combined (includes current trip).

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Astros rank 2nd in the AL in HR (190), 1st in SLG (.408) and 4th in runs scored (653).

SLOW AND STEADY RECOVERY: Since starting the season with a 20-31 record after 51 games, the Astros are 54-40 (.574) in their last 94 games (since May 22)...that is the second-best record in the AL in that span, behind only the Red Sox.

WINNING THE WEST: The Astros currently hold a 2.0-game lead in the AL West over the 2nd-place Rangers...HOU finished at 9-4 vs. TEX, so they hold the tiebreaker vs. them.

STARTING STRONG: In the last 8 games, Astros starters have combined for a 2.45 ERA (12ER/44IP) ...the Astros are 5-3 in that span...additionally, the Astros are 9-5 in their last 14 games, during which the starters have posted a combined 3.03 ERA (24ER/71.1IP).

THE HIT MAN: **Jose Altuve** enters tonight just 1 hit shy of reaching 2,500 for his career...**Another Record:** Altuve's 3-hit game on Sunday vs. ARI was the 225th of his career, which ties **Craig Biggio** for the most in franchise history...among active players, Altuve ranks 2nd in hits, trailing only **Freddie Freeman** (2,587).

TRIPLE THREAT: **Yordan Alvarez**, who is a solid candidate for the AL MVP Award, currently ranks 1st or 2nd in the AL in all three **Triple Crown** categories...he enters tonight leading the AL in batting avg. (.311), while ranking 2nd in HR (38) and RBI (95)...Alvarez also leads the Majors in OPS (1.022) and leads the AL in SLG (.593) and OBP (.428)...**Rare Feat:** Since **Carl Yastrzemski** won the AL Triple Crown in 1967, there has been just one Triple Crown winner in the Majors, **Miguel Cabrera** in 2012 (AL).

CHALLENGING STRETCH: The Astros are 5-3 thus far while in the midst of a stretch of playing 4 cons. teams that would be in the postseason if the season ended today (CWS, ARI, PHI, TB, respectively)...they went 3-1 vs. CWS and 1-2 vs. ARI.

MEASURING UP: The Astros are 30-20 (.600) vs. teams currently at .500 or above, which is the 2nd-best record in the Majors in that category.

STREAK SNAPPED: **LHP Josh Hader** had his cons. scoreless innings streak snapped at 22.0 innings last night...this is the longest streak by an Astros hurler this season and had been 2nd-longest active streak in the Majors...despite the end of the scoreless streak, in last night's win, Hader did convert his 24th save in 24 chances this season...his 24 saves are the most in the MLB without a blown save.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Single A Fayetteville defeated Fredericksburg last night in game one of the North Division Carolina League playoff series.

LAST START, SEPT. 3 vs. CWS: Earned his 2nd consecutive win on his last start last Wednesday vs. the White Sox, tossing 6.0 innings, allowing 2 runs on 6 hits with 7 strikeouts...tossed 101 pitches (65 strikes) in the Astros 6-2 victory.

THE DIESEL: The Astros 2026 Opening Day starter, Brown has been limited to 16 Major League starts on the season due to a 2-plus month-long IL stint (April 5-June 16) due to a right shoulder strain...the Astros have gone 8-8 in his 16 starts...owns a .213 opponent average and has fanned 93 in his 87.0 innings pitched on the season.

THE TURNAROUND: Has returned to form as the Astros ace over his last 8 starts, posting a 4-2 record with a 2.68 ERA (14ER/47IP), 50 strikeouts, a .218 opponent batting average and a 1.17 WHIP dating back to his start on July 25 at CWS...prior to this run, he struggled in his first 6 starts back from the IL, posting a 5.22 ERA (17ER/29.1IP) from June 16-July 19.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Had his best start of the season on July 25 at CWS, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings with 7 strikeouts while allowing just 2 hits and no walks...was the 1st start of his career in which he tossed 7.0+ scoreless innings while allowing 2-or-fewer hits without issuing a walk...was outstanding in his start on Aug. 28 at NYM, allowing 1 run on 5 hits and 1 walk with 10 strikeouts in 6.2 innings...his 10 strikeouts are a season-high and the most he's recorded since he struck out a career-high 12 on June 14, 2025 vs. MIN.

SAVANT SAYS: Among all Major League pitchers, he ranks in the 96th percentile in average exit velocity (86.0) and 95th percentile in groundball percentage (55.4)...also ranks in the 88th percentile in xBA (.202) and the 79th percentile in extension (6.8).

FOUR SEAMS: Has held opponents to a .159 batting average (13x82) with his 4-seam fastball and has tossed the pitch at a 32.3-percent rate, the highest of all his pitches.

VS. PHI: Has faced the Phillies twice in his career, once in relief and once as a starter, combining to toss 9.1 scoreless innings over the 2 outings...started against them on June 26, 2025 in Houston, working 7.0 shutout innings in an Astros 2-1 win...was on the Astros 2022 World Series roster but did not pitch in the series.

MINOR LEAGUE WORK: Made 4 rehab appearances this season on his way back from injury between Double A and Triple A...combined for a 1.88 ERA (3ER/14.1IP) with 21 strikeouts, 3 walks, a 0.77 WHIP and a .157 opponent average.

ALL-STAR SEASON: A 2025 All-Star, Brown finished third in the AL in Cy Young voting last season after turning in the best year of his career with a 12-9 record, a 2.43 ERA (50ER/185.1IP) and posting a 1.03 WHIP...in 2025, Brown held opponents to a career-low .201 average and posted 206 strikeouts in 185.1 innings pitched...his 2.43 ERA ranked 10th all-time among Astros starters and was the second-lowest by an Astros starter in the last 20 seasons (since 2005)...among AL starters, he ranked first in opponent SLG (.318) and second in ERA (2.43)...lastly, by reaching 206 strikeouts, he became the 18th pitcher in club history to reach 200 strikeouts in a season.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU: By finishing third in the AL Cy Young voting in 2025, the Astros were granted a compensation pick immediately after the first round of the 2026 draft (No. 28 overall)...the Astros earned the pick through the Prospect Promotion Incentive (PPI), which was ratified into the latest CBA...the PPI rewards teams for promoting their best prospects to the big leagues at the start of the season, having them accrue one full year of service time and then having them factor into a major award that season or prior to qualifying for arbitration...the Astros used that selection on **RHP Jack Radel** out of Notre Dame.

LAST APPEARANCE (9/8 at PHI): Struck out 2 in a scoreless 8th inning last night at PHI to notch his 14th hold of the season...struck out **IF Alec Bohm** looking to end the inning, stranding **IF Trea Turner** at 2nd base and preserving the Astros' 2-run lead.

ABREU OF LATE: Has recorded 7 consecutive scoreless outings (7.1 IP since Aug. 28 at NYM), which is the longest active streak of scoreless apps. among Astros pitchers...has also been scoreless in 11 of his last 12 apps. (since Aug. 16 vs. SEA), posting a 0.69 ERA (1ER/13IP) with 15 strikeouts, a 1.15 WHIP and a .163 opponent batting average in that span.
