METSCELLANEOUS: For the third time in four days, the Mets were rained out yesterday...Today, the Mets begin a brief road trip to Detroit for a three-game series...The Mets are 6-3 in series openers this season...On Friday, the Mets return home for three games against the Rockies.

ROSTER MOVES: Yesterday, RHP Max Scherzer was reinstated from his 10-game suspension...Today, New York has appointed RHP José Butto as the 27th man for today's doubleheader...Butto will be active for both games of today's twinbill.

## HAPPY BIRTHDAY!: Elieser Hernandez turns 28 years old today.

RAINDROPS KEEP FALLING ON MY HEAD: The Mets will play their second straight doubleheader after splitting a twinbill with Atlanta on Monday...In the last 25 years, the Mets have played two straight doubleheaders with no other games in between only once...The last time was on April 14, 2011 (vs. Colorado) and April 16 (at Atlanta).

DOUBLE DARE: The Mets are set to play their second doubleheader of the season today...The Mets and Braves split a double-dip on Monday...The Mets have played 25 double dips since 2021, more than any other team in the majors...The Mets have earned at least a split in all 25 of their twinbills over the last two years...Elias notes the team's streak of 25 consecutive doubleheaders without being swept is the longest in Mets history... According to sportradar, the streak is the second-longest in the expansion era (since 1961)...Only the Yankees ( 30 in a row from 1996-2006) have had a longer streak...New York has swept seven of their last 12 doubleheaders, including five DH sweeps last season...The last time the Mets were swept in a doubleheader was September 26, 2020 at Washington.

RETURN OF THE MAX: Today, Max Scherzer makes his return from a 10game suspension...Scherzer pitched for the Tigers from 2010-2014, going 82-35 with a 3.52 ERA and 1,081 strikeouts in 161 starts... He won the first of his three career Cy Young Awards with Detroit (2013) and was twice named to the AL All-Star team (2013, 2014)...Scherzer has made three career starts against his former club...In two starts against Detroit since leaving the Tigers, he has thrown 17.0 innings, allowed three runs, struck out 34 and walked none...On May 11, 2016, he started against Detroit for the first time since he left the team and struck out 20 batters in a complete game victory for Washington...The last time he faced the Tigers was June 30, 2019, in his first start as a visitor at Comerica Park...He threw 8.0 innings of one-run ball and struck out 14 without walking a batter

GREETINGS FROM MICHIGAN!: The Mets face the Tigers for the first time since 2019...The Mets will play at Comerica Park for the first time since a three-game series from August 5-7, 2016...Overall, the Mets are 11-13 against the Tigers including a 4-8 record in Detroit and a 4-5 record in Comerica Park...New York played one series at Tiger Stadium...They were swept in a three-game set from June 30-July 2, 1997.
they're out of my league: The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 3-0 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 238-227 record in Interleague play...The team's .512 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

INTERLEAGUE PETE: Pete Alonso is 4-12 with three runs, two home runs, two RBI and three walks in three games against the American League this year... He batted .333/.410/.639 against AL opponents last season with 15 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 15 RBI and 10 walks.... His six home runs were tied for the sixth-most in the majors...Alonso has hit 31 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season... His 31 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player in that time frame...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

HERE'S THE CATCH: Francisco Alvarez is batting . 320 (8-25) with three runs, a double, a home run, three RBI and a walk over his last nine games.. This comes after he hit. 067 (1-15) in his first five games this season.

TIGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets are visiting Detroit for the first time since a three-game set from August 4-7, 2016...The two teams last played at Citi Field from May 24-26, 2019.

FIRST TIME, LONG TIME: The Mets are 12-2 when scoring first this season. Their .857 winning percentage when scoring first ranks second in the National League and fourth in the majors...The Rays are 19-0 (1.000), followed by the Blue Jays (11-1, .917) and the Brewers (14-2, .875).

EN fUEGO: Joey Lucchesi is slated to make his third start of the season tonight in Detroit...It will mark his first career start against the Tigers....The lefty is $1-0$ with a 2.19 ERA ( 3 ER/12.1 IP) with four walks and 12 strikeouts this season...Lefties are hitting . 143 (1-7) against him this season...Overall, lefties have hit just .239 ( $68-284$ ) against Lucchesi in his career.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty went 3-9 with two runs, a double, a home run, and an RBI in both games of the doubleheader yesterday...He has reached base safely in nine straight games, batting 387 (12-32) with four runs, two doubles, two home runs, three RBI and two walks in that span...This comes after he went 1-8 in his first three games.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: In game two on Monday, David Robertson notched his fourth career six-out save and his first since August 20, 2022 vs. the Mets with Philadelphia.... He matched a career-high with four strikeouts for the 12th time in his career...Overall, the Alabama native has appeared in 12 games and has allowed one run in 13.1 innings of work, good for a 0.68 ERA.... He has allowed seven hits, three walks while striking out 18 in that span...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .120 (3-25) batting average this season...He has converted all six save opportunities he's had this season.. Overall, he has recorded 163 saves in his career...That is the seventh-most among active players.

IT'S BEEN TWO WEEKS: Over his last 14 games, Jeff McNeil is batting .400 (20-50) with nine runs, two doubles, one triple, two home runs, five RBI five walks, one streal with a . 483 OBP and a .600 SLG...Since April 16, he has raised his batting average from .212 to .304 and his OBP from .359 to . 418 .... His . 418 OBP is the 10th-best in the majors and seventh-highest in the National League.

MULTIPLICITY: McNeil has recorded nine multi-hit games this season.. He has 172 multi-hit games in his career, which places him 19th on the Mets all-time list...He has 62 multi-hit games since the start of last season, which is the third-most during that span behind Bo Bichette and Freddie Freeman who each have 67 multi-hit games since 2022.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York will play its 18th and 19th road games today, which will be tied for the most in the majors...New York is 10-7 on the road this season...They are 3-1-1 in road series in 2023...The Mets are batting $.245 / .337 / .392$ on the road this year...They have posted a 4.59 ERA with 63 walks and 148 strikeouts away from Citi Field in 2023...The Mets 10 road wins are tied for the fourth-most in the majors.

WAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Brandon Nimmo is sixth in the major leagues with a 1.6 fWAR...Over the last 19 games, Nimmo is batting .364 (28-77) with 13 runs, five doubles, one triple, two home runs, 10 RBI , seven walks, one steal with a .419 OBP and a .532 SLG...He has raised his batting average from 192 to .320 in that span...The Wyoming native is eighth in the majors with a .419 OBP and 10th in batting average (.320).

GUESS WHO'S BACH?: Over his last 12 games, Daniel Vogelbach is 11-31 (.355) with three runs, two doubles, one home run, eight RBI, six walks with a . 459 OBP and a .516 SLG.... He has posted a .426 OBP in 22 games this season, which is leads the team.

## LUCCHESI NEWS \& NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Lucchesi threw 5.1 innings on April 27 at Citi Field, allowing three earned runs on five hits and two walks...Fanned three Nationals batters in the Mets' 9-8 comeback victory.

EYE OF THE TIGERS: Lucchesi has never faced the Detroit Tigers in his career... In matchups against American League teams, Lucchesi holds a 3-3 record in nine games and eight starts, and has pitched to a 4.65 ERA (21 ER/40.2 IP)... Has held opponents to a .227 average and has fanned 49 batters in Interleague contests.

PUTTING UP GOOSE EGGS: Dating back to June 13, 2021, Lucchesi tossed 18.1 straight scoreless innings, a career-best scoreless streak, which came to an end on April 27 against the Nationals...Among starting pitchers, Lucchesi's scoreless streak was the third-longest active scoreless streak in the majors at the time, behind Zac Gallen (28.0 innings) and Gerrit Cole (20.0 innings)

MAY THE FORCE BE WITH YOU: Lucchesi holds a 2-4 record in 13 appearances and 11 starts in the month of May... Has pitched to a 4.15 ERA ( 28 ER/60.2 IP) in those games, while fanning 57 batters...This will be his first start in May since May 27, 2021 against the Rockies at Citi Field, when he allowed one run on two hits, three walks and two strikeouts in a 4-2 Mets victory.

JOEY FUEGO: Made his major league debut on March 30, 2018 while with San Diego in a start against Milwaukee...Played for the Padres for three season before coming to the Mets in 2021...As a Met, Lucchesi-who adopted the nickname "Fuego" while in college-made eight starts in 11 appearances in 2021, pitching to a 4.46 ERA ( 19 ER/38.1 IP) and racking up 41 strikeouts before his season was cut short after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...Made his Mets debut in relief on April 7, 2021 at Philadelphia, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings... Pitched to a 1.19 ERA (3 ER/22.2 IP) with 24 strikeouts over his last five outings of the 2021 season before his season-ending injury.

SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE: Lucchesi made three starts this season for Triple-A Syracuse...In his three starts at Syracuse, he has pitched to a 2.30 ERA (4 ER/15.2 IP) and has tallied 16 strikeouts...Lucchesi has held opponents to a . 196 average thus far, while pitching to a 1.15 WHIP.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Last season, Lucchesi made his return to the mound after recovering from Tommy John surgery in June of 2021...Made eight rehab appearances across three minor league affiliates, posting a 2.13 ERA (3 ER/12.2 IP)...He allowed 12 hits in eight appearances-four of which were starts-while tallying three walks and fanning 12 batters.

TROUBLE WITH THE CHURVE: Has gained attention throughout his career for a pitch he created, called the "churve"...Developed from a basic changeup, Lucchesi holds the ball deep in his palm and tinkered with his wrist action and position to throw the pitch in a similar nature to a breaking ball...Since then, it is a go-to weapon for Lucchesi...In 2019, his churve had an average 8.9 vertical drop, per Statcast, which was the most movement of any pitcher's changeup by more than a full inch...According to Baseball Savant, Lucchesi's pitch arsenal also featured a sinker, curve, cutter and change the last time he was in the majors.

LAST TIME OUT: Was ejected after throwing 3.0 shutout innings at Dodger Stadium on April 19...Yielded one hit, walked two and punched out three...The next day, Major League Baseball issued Scherzer a 10-game suspension for violating the prohibitions on foreign substances.

I USED TO WORK HERE: Scherzer pitched for the Tigers from 2010-2014, going 82-35 with a 3.52 ERA and 1,081 strikeouts in 161 starts... He won the first of his three career Cy Young Awards with Detroit (2013) and was twice named to the AL All-Star team (2013, 2014)... Scherzer has made three career starts against his former club, two of which have come since he left the Tigers after 2014...In those two games, he has thrown 17.0 innings, allowed three runs, struck out 34 and walked none...On May 11, 2016, he started against Detroit for the first time since he left the team and struck out 20 batters in a complete game victory for Washington...The last time he faced the Tigers was June 30, 2019, in his first start as a visitor at Comerica Park...He threw 8.0 innings of one-run ball and struck out 14 without walking a batter.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...His next 10+K game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

LEGENDARY: Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just three punchouts separating the two...With 165 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

OPENING UP: Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day...Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA ( 15 ER/45.2 IP) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.
QUITE THE DEBUT: After signing a three-year deal with New York last offseason, Scherzer posted a 2.29 ERA ( $37 \mathrm{ER} / 145.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in his first season with the Mets...That is the lowest mark in a season in his career and the best all-time in a pitcher's first season with the Mets (min. 140.0 innings)...His 0.91 WHIP was not just the best mark by a Met in his first season with the club, it was the best by any Met in club history (min. 140.0 innings)...Scherzer did not allow more than four runs in any of his 23 regular-season starts last season.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38 th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field... Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)... Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19 , throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.
ALWAYS IMPROVING: Scherzer set a career-best mark with a 2.29 ERA last season after posting what was then a career-best 2.46 ERA in 2021...No other pitcher since 1913 has thrown 130.0 or more innings and posted an ERA below 2.50 in both his age 36 and age 37 seasons...Only five pitchers have done that twice at any point after turning 36: Hoyt Wilhelm (three times - 1959, 1964-65), Eddie Plank (three times - 1915-17), Randy Johnson (2001-02), Dennis Martinez (1991-92) and Babe Adams (1919-20).

## tomorrow's startier: rhp uustin verlander (season debut)

LAST TIME OUT: Made a rehab start for Double-A Binghamton on April 28...Threw 4.2 innings and allowed two hits with a walk and six strikeouts...Needed 69 pitches to complete the outing...Has been on the Injured List since Opening Day with a teres major strain.

BACK IN THE MOTOR CITY: Verlander pitched for the Tigers from 2005-2017.... He is the alltime leader in starts (189), wins (99), innings (1,263.2), strikeouts (1173) at Comerica Park... He has over twice as many starts, innings and strikeouts as the next-closest pitcher at the venue...Has won both of his starts as a visitor at Comerica Park.
