METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Marlins, 19-9, at Citi Field...The Mets have won three of four, six of eight and nine of 13...The Mets are in a stretch of 16 straight games...The team is 7-4 in that span...Tonight, the Mets play their sixth game of a seven-game homestand (4-1) against the Phillies (3-0) and Marlins (1-1)...Following this series, the Mets head out on the road for the penultimate time of the season, a 10-game trip against Detroit (three games), Cincinnati (three games) and Philadelphia (four games).

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: This week, the U.S. Open begins at the Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in Flushing Meadows, NY...The Mets encourage all fans who attend next week's homestand to utilize mass transportation...Mass transit is the easiest and fastest way to access Citi Field.

ALMOST OVER THE HILL: The Mets have hit 49 home runs this month, the most in the National League and the second-most in the majors...The Mets have hit 50 home runs in a single month only twice in franchise history - September of 2019 and in June of 2017.

LEFTY LEADERBOARD: David Peterson's last outing on August 24 marked his 110th start, passing Johan Santana (109) and Bobby Ojeda (109) for the eighth-most starts by a southpaw in franchise history...He also passed John Franco (592 K) for the eighth-most strikeouts by a Mets southpaw...Santana is next on the list with 607 K...This season, he has pitched 5.0 innings in 21 of his 25 starts, 6.0+ IP in 16 starts, 7.0+ IP in six starts and 8.0+ IP in two starts, all of which are his most in a single season in his career...He joins Sean Manaea (16 in 2024) as the only Mets lefties to record as many 6.0+ IP starts since Steven Matz (16 in 2016 and 2019)...His two 8.0+ IP starts are the most by a Mets southpaw in a single season since Jon Niese (2014).

PAIR OF ACES: Jonah Tong and Nolan McLean became the fourth pair of Mets teammates to earn the win in their Major League debut in the same season...They other pairs are Roger McDowell and Rick Aguilera (1985), Bobby Jones and Kenny Greer (1993) and Robert Gsellman and Gabriel Ynoa (2016)...Tong and McLean are the only pair of Mets starting pitchers in franchise history to earn the win in their Major League debut in the same season.

HIS NAME IS JONAH: Tong became the fifth-youngest Mets starter to earn the win in their Major League debut and the youngest since Julio Valera who earned the win in his Major League debut on September 1, 1990 at 21 years and 323 days...Joins Dwight Gooden as the only Mets pitchers age 22 or younger to throw at least 5.0 innings and allow one or zero earned runs in the Major League debut.

KEEP THE CAR RUNNING: The Mets scored 19 runs last night which were tied for their most in a game this season (also: 4/28 at WAS)...It was their most ever in a home game breaking the previous high of 17 set on July 8, 2006 vs. Florida and September 25, 2016 vs. Philadelphia...It marked the seventh game in franchise history with 19 or more runs and the first time the Mets have accomplished the feat twice in the same season...The Mets' 19 runs were tied for the second-most scored in a pitcher's Major League debut since 1900 (last: 8/12/08 Charlie Zink BOS)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

PICK SIX: The Mets have hit six or more home runs in a game five times this season...The 2025 Mets join the 2019 Minnesota Twins and the 2000 Houston Astros as the only teams in Major League history to have five games with six or more home runs in the same season.

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The Mets had 20 plate appearances through the first two innings of last night's game, a franchise record...The previous high was 19 plate appearances on June 16, 1989 vs. Montreal...Only one other team has had 20+ plate appearances through the first two innings of a game this season (also: WAS, 22 on 5/31 at ARI)...Courtesy of Elias.

TWOFERS: The Mets have had a player hit multiple home runs in a game 20 times this season...Only the Yankees (21) have had more individual multi-homer performances this season...Are tied with the 2017 team for the most such instances in franchise history across a single season...Nimmo, Alonso and Soto have combined for 12 of the team's 20 multi-homer games this season.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets have not lost a season series against the Marlins since 2017...New York is 87-59 all-time against the Marlins at Citi Field.

MAKE IT A DOZEN: The team's 12 runs through the first two innings of last night's game were the most in franchise history breaking the previous high of 10 set on four separate occasions, August 7, 1971 at Atlanta, September 29, 2000 vs. Montreal, July 31, 2002 vs. Houston and April 12, 2013 at Minnesota...Courtesy of Elias.

HIGH FIVE: Last night marked the fourth time in franchise history that the Mets scored five or more runs before recording their first out of the game...The other instances occurred on August 28, 1971 vs. Los Angeles-NL (6 runs), July 28, 1973 vs. Montreal and September 24, 2005 at Washington...Marked the third time in franchise history the club has scored five runs through their first five batters of the game (also: 7/28/73 vs. MON and 9/24/05 at WAS)...Courtesy of Elias.

AUGUSTUS BLOOM: The Mets are 11-15 in August...In 26 games this month, the Mets are batting .288/.364/.505 with 49 doubles, one triple, 49 home runs, 166 RBI and 100 walks...In August, they rank first in the majors with an .870 OPS, in average, OBP and SLG...The Mets pace the NL in home runs during the month.

RISPY BUSINESS: In 26 games in August, the Mets are batting .388 (88-227) with 20 doubles, one triple, 13 home runs, 120 RBI, 37 walks, a .457 OBP, and a .656 SLG with RISP...They lead the majors in AVG, OBP, SLG and OPS (1.113) with RISP in August.

HOME GROWN: The Mets Major League roster currently features several players who were either drafted or signed as non-drafted free agents and developed through the Mets organization: Brandon Nimmo (1st Rd. 2011), David Peterson (1st Rd. 2017), Brett Baty (1st Rd. 2019), Pete Alonso (2nd Rd. 2016), Mark Vientos (2nd Rd. 2017), Nolan McLean (3rd Rd. 2023), Jonah Tong (7th Rd. 2022), Jeff McNeil (12th Rd. 2013), Hayden Senger (24th Rd. 2018) and Ronny Mauricio (NDFC 2017).

25TH HOUR: Francisco Lindor picked up his 25th stolen base of the season in the first...Is his fourth career season with 25+ stolen bases and has reached the mark in each of his last three seasons...He is the sixth player in franchise history with three or more seasons of 25+ stolen bases...The others are José Reyes (6), Darryl Strawberry (5), Howard Johnson (4), Mookie Wilson (4) and Lenny Dykstra...Joins Pete Crow-Armstrong and José Ramírez as the only players in the majors this season with 25 home runs, 25 doubles and 25 stolen bases.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 109 walks this year...He recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks and became the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

LAST TIME OUT: Last pitched on August 24 at Atlanta where he allowed two earned runs over 5.2 innings (5 H, 4 BB, 8 K)...It was his 110th career start, passing Johan Santana and Bobby Ojeda for the eighth-most starts by a southpaw in franchise history...Al Jackson (138 GS) is next...With his second strikeout of the night, he passed his career high in strikeouts (previous: 128 K in 2023)...He also passed John Franco for the eighth-most strikeouts by a left-hander in franchise history...He is 8 K shy of tying Johan Santana (607 K) for the eighth-most...Marked the first time he had recorded eight or more strikeouts in consecutive games since September 29, 2024 and March 31, 2025.

GOING THE DISTANCE: Has thrown 7.0+ innings in six of his 25 starts this season...Mets starters have completed 7.0 innings 10 times this season, six of those starts coming from Peterson...Joins Nolan McLean as the only Mets pitchers to complete 8.0 innings his season...His two 8.0+ IP starts are the most by a Mets southpaw in a single season since Jon Niese (2014)...He has pitched 5.0 or more in 21 of his 25 starts this season, and 6.0+ innings in 16 of those starts...His 21 such starts are the second-most on the team (most: Clay Holmes - 22) and his 16 such starts of 6.0 or more innings is the most on the team (next: Homes - 8)...He is one of 11 left-handed starters this season to record at least 16 starts with 6.0+ IP, joining Framber Valdez, Garrett Crochet, Cristopher Sánchez, Robbie Ray, Tarik Skubal, Matthew Boyd, MacKenzie Gore, Jeffrey Springs, Carlos Rodón and Max Fried...He joins Sean Manaea (16 in 2024) as the only Mets lefties to record as many 6.0+ IP starts since Steven Matz (16 in 2016 and 2019)...Peterson's 21 starts of 5.0+ IP, his 16 starts of 6.0+ IP, six starts of 7.0+ IP and two 8.0+ IP are all his most in a single season.

SEASONS GREETINGS: Over a career-high 25 starts this season, has gone 8-5 with a 3.18 ERA (53 ER/150.0 IP), 55 walks and a career-high 135 strikeouts...His ERA is the lowest by a Mets southpaw through 25 starts of a season since Johan Santana's 2.89 ERA through 25 starts of the 2010 season...He has allowed three earned runs or less in 21 of his 25 starts this season and one or zero earned runs in 10 starts...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, is tied for third in opponent GDP (18, first in NL), third in HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.54, second in NL), sixth in groundball percentage (56.0, fourth in NL) and ninth in opponents' SLG (.335, sixth in NL).

VS. MIAMI: In 10 career games (nine starts) against Miami, Peterson has gone 5-2 with a 2.82 ERA (16 ER/51.0 IP), 22 walks and 53 strikeouts...He has allowed three runs or fewer in nine of his 10 outings against the Marlins and one or zero runs in four of those contests.

POSTCARD FROM QUEENS: The Mets are 10-3 in Peterson's home starts this season...The southpaw has gone 5-1 with a 2.93 ERA (25 ER/76.2 IP), 25 walks and 65 strikeouts at home this year...Among qualified NL pitchers at home this season, he ranks first in groundball percentage (58.9), sixth in opponents' SLG (.318), and 11th in ERA and opponents' OPS (.622)...Has allowed three runs or fewer in 11 of those 13 games and two runs or fewer in 10...Has allowed just 25 earned runs through his first 13 home starts, which is the fewest by a Mets starter since Kodai Senga (22 ER through 13 home starts of 2023)...He is the first left-hander to do so since Steven Matz (17 ER in first 13 home starts of 2019)...The Mets have lost each of Peterson's last three home starts after the club had won each of his first 10 home starts to start the season...The team's 10 consecutive wins in Peterson's starts was the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history...The team's 11 straight home wins in David Cone's starts to open the 1989 season are the most...Courtesy of *Elias*...The Mets are 16-7 in his 22 home starts since the beginning of 2024 and 41-20 in Peterson's games at home in his career.

YEAR IN REVIEW: Since making his season debut last year on May 29, 2024, Peterson has allowed three runs or fewer in 37 of his 46 starts, going 18-8 with a 3.06 ERA (92 ER/271.0 IP), 101 walks and 236 strikeouts...27 of those outings have been quality starts...The Mets are 28-18 over games in which Peterson has started in that span...Since 2024, has allowed just five runs in the first inning, which is the fewest in the majors during that span (min. 40 G)...Since May 29, 2024 (min. 40 GS), he is second in HR/9.0 IP (0.56, first in the NL), third in winning percentage (.692, first in NL), sixth in groundball percentage (53.5, fourth in NL) and opponents' SLG (.341, third in NL), and 10th in ERA (fourth in NL).

LEFTY LEADERBOARD: His 599 K are the eighth-most by a left-hander in franchise history...Johan Santana is next on the list with 607 K...His 110 career starts are the eighth-most in franchise history by a southpaw...Vs. left-handers this season, has posted a .209/.255/.264

slash line (27-129) and has allowed just one home run to 138 lefty batters faced...Among qualified left-handed pitchers facing left-handed batters this season, he is third in groundball percentage (64.7), fifth in strikeouts (43), sixth in opponents' SLG and eighth in OPS (.519)...Among NL southpaws facing lefties, he is fourth in opponents' OBP and seventh in opponents' BA...He reached 500.0 career innings pitched on May 18, becoming one of 18 left-handed pitchers to reach the milestone with the franchise...He also became the 13th Mets southpaw to reach 500 strikeouts on May 6 and was the first to do so since Steven Matz (recorded his 500th strikeout on 9/11/19).

QUALITY CONTROL: Has recorded 15 quality starts in 25 total outings this season, including 12 of his last 18 starts...Recorded five straight quality starts from 7/3-8/1, which was tied for the longest such streak in his career (also: 8/14-9/3/24)...Peterson has recorded 27 quality starts since his start to last season (5/29/24), with 25 of them coming in his last 41 games (since July 1)...From July 1, 2024 to now, he is one of 10 pitchers (one of five in NL) to record at least 25 quality starts and one of four left-handers to do so (also: Tarik Skubal, Framber Valdez and Cristopher Sánchez).

APPLE PICKING: This season, Peterson has recorded a net bases prevented of seven (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant, which is tied for the best in the majors...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 31 net bases prevented is the most among qualified Major League pitchers...Chris Flexen and José Berrios are next on the list at 22...Peterson has recorded 18 career pickoffs (three this season), which is tied with Sid Fernandez for the seventh-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20)...According to *OPTA*.

CAREER NOTES: Has set new career highs in strikeouts, innings pitched and starts this season...Was selected to the All-Star team for the first time in his career in 2025...He was the first Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Kodai Senga in 2023 and the first left-handed Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Johan Santana (2009)...Had a career-high 15.0 scoreless inning streak from 6/5-17...He threw at least 5.0 innings in 12 straight starts from April 12 - June 17, which was the longest such streak of his career...Over parts of five major league seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 36-29 with a 3.86 ERA (259 ER/604.0 IP), 252 walks and 599 strikeouts in 126 games (110 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.
