TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Is Game 4 (1-2) of a 4-game series vs Cincinnati native **Kent Tekulve's Pirates** and the final game (3-3) of a 7-day, 7-game road trip that includes a 2-1 series win at **Chc**.
- This road trip does not officially include the 2 days (8/2-8/3) the Redlegs spent in **Bristol, TN** playing the **Braves** in the inaugural **MLB Speedway Classic**, as Cin served as the home team in that contest.
- The Reds haven't had a day off since 7/24.
- Following today's game, the Reds return home for a 7-day, 6-game homestand vs **Phi** (8/11-8/13) and **Mil** (8/15-8/17).
- The Reds have scored 2 runs or fewer in 40 games this season, including each of their last 4 games and 5 of their last 7.

WAKING UP LATE: The Reds have 22 comeback wins over their last 63 games beginning 5/27, including yesterday's 2-1 win at **Pit** (down 1-0, won 2-1)... through their first 55 games of the season, they managed just 6 come-from-behind victories.

- In Late and Close situations from 3/27-6/2, the Reds went 20-26 (.435) and slashed .169/.252/.241 with 3 HR...since then are 26-18 (.591) in Late and Close situations and slashing .263/.350/.414 with 8 HR (*Late and Close refers to game situations in the 7th inning or later with the batting team tied, ahead by 1, or with the tying run on base, at bat or on deck*).

NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM: The Reds have not been swept in any of their first 38 series of 2025, including this current 4-game set at **Pit** (1-2).

- This 38-series, in-season streak without being swept is the longest run in club history, eclipsing the 1970 National League championship team, which opened its season with 32 straight series without getting swept.
- Cin is the only Major League team not to have been swept this season.
- On 6 occasions avoided being swept with a win in the final game of a set (4/23 at **Mia**, 5/15 vs **CWS**, 6/22 at **StL**, 7/2 at **Bos**, 7/23 at **Wsh**, 7/30 vs **LAD**).
- Cin hasn't been swept in a series of at least 2 games since 9/24-9/25, 2024 at **Cle** (2g), a span of 39 straight series...per *Elias*, that ranks T4th for longest streaks of sweepless series in team history (see below).

TOUGH ROAD AHEAD: The Reds are in the midst of a final 59-game stretch in which 38 games have been/will be played against opponents with records at or above .500 (3-0 vs **TB**, 1-2 vs **LAD**, 2-1 at **Chc**, 3g vs **Phi**, 3g vs **Mil**, 3g at **LAD**, 3g vs **StL**, 3g vs **Tor**, 3g vs **NYM**, 3g at **SD**, 3g at **StL**, 4g at **Chc**, 3g at **Mil**).

- As of today, the Reds have the toughest remaining schedule in the Major Leagues, based on opponents' winning percentage (.532).
- NYM** has the 10th-toughest remaining schedule (.508) while **Chc** (.479) and **SD** (.475) have the third- and second-easiest remaining schedules in the league, respectively.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds lost 2 of 3 at **Pit** in their last meeting (5/19-5/21) and swept the **Pirates** in 3 games at **Great American Ball Park** in the first series this year between the clubs (4/11-4/13)...it was Cin's first sweep of **Pit** since 8/5-8/8, 2021 at **GABP** (4g).

- Cin has played the **Pirates** 504 times since both teams became charter members of the **National League Central** in 1994 (262-242, .520), more than any other **Pit** opponent.
- The 2-0 loss at **Pit** on 4/23/23 was the Reds' 100th loss at **PNC Park**... are 97-109 overall here...the Reds and **Pirates** played the first regular-season game at **PNC Park** on 4/9/01 (8-2 Reds triumph).
- The Redlegs have lost 45 of the last 65 and 14 of the last 20 games they've played at **PNC Park**, including an 11-game losing streak spanning 9/3/18 to 9/27/19 and an 8-game losing streak to begin the 2019 season (4/4-9/27, 2019).

TRIPLE DOUBLE: In yesterday's 2-1 win at **Pit**, **RF Noelvi Marte** went 3-for-4 with a career-high 3 doubles...at 23 years, 297 days, he became the second-youngest Red to collect 3 doubles in a game (*courtesy Elias*).

CHASING HISTORY: In Fri's 3-2 loss at **PIT**, **RHP Chase Burns** produced his fourth 10-strikeout game of his young career to become the first Major League pitcher since 1893 with at least 10 strikeouts in 4 of his first 8 apps.

- Is also just the third Major League pitcher since 1893 with double-digit strikeouts in 4 of his first 8 career starts, joining **Fernando Valenzuela** (1981) and **Bob Feller** (1936)...*courtesy Elias*.
- Is the first Reds pitcher to begin his career with at least 57 strikeouts over his first 8 games since **Gary Nolan** (60k, 1967).

MAN OF STEAL: **SS Elly De La Cruz** stole his 30th base of the season in last Sun's **MLB Speedway Classic**, becoming the ninth Major Leaguer in the live-ball era (since 1920) with at least 30 steals in each of his first 3 career seasons, the first since **KC's Bobby Witt Jr.** (2022-24).

- His 132 career stolen bases are fifth-most by any Major Leaguer through their first 3 career seasons in the live-ball era (since 1920), behind only **Vince Coleman** (326, 1985-87), **Rickey Henderson** (189, 1979-81), **Delino DeShields** (144, 1990-92), and **Kenny Lofton** (138, 1991-93).

PRONUNCIATION: Last name is pronounced "lih-TELL".

LAST TIME OUT (REDS DEBUT): Made his Reds debut on 8/5 at Chc and earned the 5-1 win (7.0ip, 3h, 1r/1er, 2bb, 8k, 1hr, 92TP).

- Became the fifth Reds pitcher over the last 125 years to post at least 7.0 innings and allow 1 run or none, with 8 or more strikeouts in his team debut (Also: Brady Singer 3/31/25 vs Tex, Johnny Cueto 4/3/08 vs AZ, Mo Sanford 8/9/91 at SD, and Tom Seaver 6/18/77 at Mon).
- Was his 14th quality start of 2025, the 28th of his career.
- His 8 strikeouts were a season high and his most since striking out a career-high 9 batters on 5/28/24 vs Oak.
- Threw first-pitch strikes to 17 of the 26 batters he faced... improved his first-pitch strike pct. to 65.8% which ranks among Major League leaders.

JULY 30: Did not factor in the decision in the Rays' 11-inning 5-4 loss on 7/30 at NYY (5.0ip, 2h, 0r, 4bb, 4k, 94TP)...was traded to the Reds following the game.

- Was his first scoreless app of the season and his first since 9/19/24 vs Bos (7.0ip).
- Was his 69th start and 224th career appearance.
- Was in line for the 1-0 victory but fell victim to Bryan Baker's blown save.

JULY 25: Suffered the 7-2 loss on 7/25 at Cin (6.0ip, 10h, 5r/5er, 0bb, 2k, 2hr, 97TP).

- Gave up 10 hits for the second time this season (also: 5/31 at Hou).
- Gave up a 1-out solo homer in the 2nd inning to Tyler Stephenson...retired 5 straight after that.
- Allowed 4 singles in a 2-run 4th inning.
- Stranded a leadoff double in the 5th and had 2 outs with nobody on in the 6th before allowing a double and a 2-run homer to TJ Friedl.
- Was the third time in 21 starts he gave up 5 or more runs.

MAY 31 (COMPLETE GAME): Produced his first career complete game in the 16-3 win on 5/31 at Hou (9.0ip, 10h, 3r/3er, 1bb, 6k, 2hr, 1hb, 117TP).

- It was the first CG by a Rays pitcher since Ryan Yarbrough (6/3/21 at NYY).
- Littell's CG ended the Rays' run of 647 consecutive games without a CG...was the second-longest streak in Major League history, eclipsed by TB's own 731-game streak from 5/15/16-6/2/21.

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the 6-1 loss on 8/6 at Chc (6.2ip, 7h, 4r/4er, 2bb, 3k, 2hr, 100TP).

- Was his first career loss to the Cubs (3-1) and the first time the Reds lost to Chicago when he pitched (5-1).
- Was the first time since 6/17 vs Min that he allowed multiple home runs in a game.
- Retired 9 straight until Seiya Suzuki led off the 6th inning with a home run.
- Allowed a leadoff homer in the 7th inning to Dansby Swanson, followed by a strikeout, flyout, and a double to the last batter he faced, Justin Turner...Luis Mey relieved Abbott and allowed Turner to score.

WELCOME TO THE CLUB: Was acquired by the Reds from the Rays on 7/30 for LHP Adam Serwinowski and RHP Brian Van Belle.

3 RUNS OR FEWER: Has allowed 3 runs or fewer in 18 of his last 20 outings dating back to April 16 (123.1ip, 41r/41er, 20bb, 83k, 22hr, 2.99 ERA, 13QS).

STARTING AS A STARTER: Is in his second season as a full-time starter after joining the Rays rotation in July 2023.

EFFICIENT: Averages 14.4 pitches per inning, the second-lowest mark in the majors (Sea's Bryan Woo 14.2).

- Has retired 132 batters on 2 pitches or fewer, second-most in the majors behind Sea's Bryan Woo (136)...this includes a Major League-best 60 first-pitch outs.

LIMITING FREE PASSES: His 4.1% walk rate is the third-lowest mark among all qualified Major League pitchers (Det's Skubal 3.6%, StL's Gray 4.0%).

- Since 2023, his 4.1% walk rate ranks third in the majors during that time (min. 1000bf) behind Sea's George Kirby (3.3%) and Bal's Zach Eflin (3.6%).
- Is just 1 of 2 active pitchers with 60 or more career starts, who has fewer walks as a starting pitcher (68) than games started (70)...Kirby (103gs/84bb) is the other.

BEGINNING JULY 27, 2024: Over his last 32 starts dating back to 7/27/24, is pitching to a 3.04 ERA (.233/.272/.412, 17qs, 1.05 WHIP, 4.4 BB%, 64er/189.2ip).
