GO OFF, GENO!: Eugenio Suárez matched a Major League record with home runs in each of a team's first 3 games of the season (last: Lourdes Gurriel Jr./AZ from March 28-30, 2024)...only 6 players in MLB history have homered in each of the team's first 4 games of a season, but never by a third baseman (last: Christian Yelich/MIL in 2019).

- Suárez became the first D-back in franchise history to collect 4+ home runs in the team's first 3 games.
- He is the first player in the Majors since 2016 to homer 4+ times in the team's first 3 games (last: Robinson Canó/SEA and Trevor Story/COL) and 12th Major Leaguer to do so since 1935.
- Suárez joins Eddie Mathews (4 HR, '58 Milwaukee Braves) as the only third basemen in MLB history to reach 4+ homers in the team's first 3 games...no third baseman has ever hit 5+ homers in the team's first 4 games.

LEADING THE PACK: Entering today, **Eugenio Suárez**'s 4 home runs lead the Majors, ahead of Tommy Edman/LAD (3), Aaron Judge/NYY (3) and Jordan Westburg/BAL (3), while his 1.600 SLG and 16 total bases are tied for the best with Judge...Suárez's 7 RBI are tied for second most in MLB with Miguel Amaya/CHC, behind Judge (9).
