METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Mariners, 8-3 last night...The Mets have lost back-to-back games after winning four straight...The Mets are 16-14 over their last 30 games...The Mets head to the West Coast for the final time this season for a seven-day, six-game trip (0-2) against the Mariners (0-2) and Padres (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Happy birthday to Mets Bullpen Catcher Dave Racaniello...Rac is in his 26th season in the role and is the longest serving bullpen catcher in the major leagues...We wish him well.

MY BABY'S GOT THE BENGES: Carson Benge recorded his first career multi-homer game this year...Became the third Mets player to record a multi-homer game in the first 58 games of their career since 2019, joining Francisco Alvarez (2x, 2023) and Pete Alonso (2x, 2019)...He now has two lead-off homers in his career.

THE TONIGHT SHOW: Benge has recorded three home runs over his last three games...Over his last eight games, Benge is batting .300 (9-30) with five runs, two doubles, three homers, seven RBI, three walks, a .400 OBP and a .667 SLG...In 30 games since the start of May, Benge is batting .300/.375/.470 with 21 runs, seven doubles, four homers, 18 RBI, 10 walks, three steals and an .845 OPS.

READY FREDDY: Freddy Peralta is set to make the start tonight...He was originally signed by the Seattle Mariners as non-drafted free agent in 2013...Today will mark his third career game against the Mariners...He is 0-0 with a 2.79 ERA (3 ER/9.2 IP) with three walks and 12 strikeouts in those starts...Tonight will mark his fifth start on the road this year...Peralta is 1-2 with a 3.13 ERA (8 ER/23.0 IP), eight walks and 20 strikeouts away from Citi Field in 2026.

A.J. STYLES: A.J. Ewing recorded the first double of his career in his first at-bat of last night's game...He is the eighth Mets player since the start of 2000 to record a double, a triple, and a home run in their first 21 career games (last: Luisangel Acuña, 2024)...He is only the third Mets player to log a single, double, triple, home run, and four stolen bases through their first 21 career games, joining Amed Rosario (2017), and Lenny Dykstra (1985).

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen has posted a 3.27 ERA (96 ER/264.0 IP) as a group...That ranks seventh in the majors and fifth in the National League...They have struck out 275 this season, the most in The Show...The group finished May going 9-4 with a 2.40 ERA (34 ER/127.2 IP), 53 walks and 133 strikeouts...They tied for the Major League-lead with nine wins and led the majors with 133 punchouts.

ON THE MARCUS: Over his last eight games, Marcus Semien is batting .308 (8-26) with five runs, one double, three homers, five RBI, three walks and a 1.072 OPS.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 11-20 on the road in 2026...Last season, the Mets went 34-47 on the road...The team has posted a 3.62 ERA on the road, which is eighth in the majors and fifth in the National League...Their 259 road strikeouts are second in the National League.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets continue their Interleague schedule with a three-game set against the Mariners...In 2026, the Mets are 9-8 against the AL, including 5-3 over their last eight games against the league...Overall, the Mets are 311-308 against the AL.

MARINERS-METS NOTES: The Mets have dropped seven straight games in Seattle...The team's last win in Seattle came on July 18, 2017...Jerry Blevins earned the win, improving to 5-0 with 1.1 scoreless innings in relief.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has 257 career home runs...That is the 11th-most in Major League history prior to turning 28 (next: Frank Robinson, 262)...His 257 homers are 24th among active players...It is 21st all-time amongst players born in the Dominican Republic...George Bell is next with 265.

STRIKE THAT: Mets pitchers have tallied 568 strikeouts this season, that is the most in the National League and the second-most in the majors...Their 568 punchies are the third-most in franchise history through the team's first 61 games of a season...Only the 2021 team (596) and the 2018 team (574) had more.

DREAM WEAVER: Luke Weaver has not allowed a run over his last 12 appearances...He has tossed 14.0 scoreless innings, allowing nine hits, four walks and has struck out 17 in that span...He is now 2-1 with a 2.77 ERA (8 ER/26.0 IP) this season with eight walks and 25 strikeouts...He has recorded six appearances of at least four outs this season and each of those appearances have been scoreless.

WILL I AM: Over his last 14 games, Devin Williams is 2-1 with six saves, a 2.77 ERA (4 ER/13.0 IP), seven walks and 18 strikeouts...He has not allowed a run in 13 of those 14 appearances.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets left a 4-1 lead slip away as they fell to the Padres, 5-4, at Shea Stadium...Sid Fernandez took the loss, allowing five earned runs on six hits with one walk and struck out six over 6.0 innings of work...Kevin Mitchel led the offense, recorded three hits in the defeat...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at Mets.com/1986.

PREVIOUSLY ON: Allowed a season-high-tying four runs, two earned over a season-low-tying 4.2 innings on May 29 vs. Miami...Has allowed four or more runs in consecutive starts for just the fourth time in his career and for the first time since August 7-12, 2024...Struck out five, issued one walk and allowed seven hits...Marks only the second time in his career in which he has allowed seven or more hits in consecutive starts (also: 5/11-17/24).

THE GAME OF RISP: So far this season, opposing batters are 8-58 (.138) with runners in scoring position against Peralta...Peralta ranks seventh in the majors in opponents' batting average with runners in scoring position (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP)...Additionally, Peralta ranks sixth in the majors in opponents' OBP (.227) and 13th in opponents' SLG (.224) with runners in scoring position (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP)...Since 2021, Peralta has held opposing batters to a .201 (105-522) average with RISP, the best mark in the majors during that span (min. 500 batters faced w/RISP).

ADD ANOTHER ONE TO THE LIST: Today, Peralta will make his first career appearance at T-Mobile Park, the 28th different ballpark he has made at least one appearance in...The only current Major League ballparks Peralta has yet to pitch in are Fenway Park, Kaufman Stadium and Sutter Health Park...The only inactive ballpark Peralta has pitched in was the Oakland Coliseum...In two career games (one start) against the Mariners, Peralta has pitched to a 2.79 ERA (3 ER/9.2 IP) and 12 strikeouts...In three Interleague starts this season, the right-hander is 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA (6 ER/17.0 IP) and 17 strikeouts.

DAY AND NIGHT: Today, Freddy Peralta will make his ninth day start of the season, tied with Kyle Bradish for the most in the majors...In 132 career night games (97 starts), Peralta is 45-26 with a 3.60 ERA (229 ER/572.1 IP)...In 91 career day games (77 starts), Peralta is 28-20 with a 3.56 ERA (168 ER/424.2 IP).

NEW FACE IN A NEW PLACE: On January 21, the Mets acquired Peralta from Milwaukee along with RHP Tobias Myers in exchange for RHP Brandon Sproat and INF Jett Williams...Peralta spent his first eight Big League seasons with Milwaukee and went 70-42 with a 3.59 ERA (371 ER/931.0 IP) and 1153 strikeouts across 211 games (162 starts)...In Brewers franchise history, Peralta ranks third in strikeouts, fifth in ERA, eighth in wins and 10th in starts (min. 500.0 IP)...Peralta made his Major League debut at age 21 on May 13, 2018 vs. Colorado...The right-hander struck out 13 over 5.2 innings and took a no-hitter into the sixth innings...His 13 strikeouts were tied with Cliff Melton (1937) for the fourth-most in Major League history in a season debut...Peralta finished his rookie season at 6-4 with a 4.25 ERA (37 ER/78.1 IP) and 96 strikeouts over 16 games (14 starts)...From 2019-2020, 45 of 54 of his appearances during that span came in relief...In 2021, Peralta was selected to his first career All-Star game after he went 10-5 with a 2.81 ERA (45 ER/144.1 IP) and 195 strikeouts across 28 games (27 starts)...In 2022, Peralta pitched to a 3.58 ERA (31 ER/78.0 IP) over 18 games (17 starts) in an injury-riddled season...Over the past three seasons, Peralta has pitched exclusively as a starter and has gone 40-25 with a 3.40 ERA (195 ER/516.0 IP) and 614 strikeouts over 95 starts...Since 2023, Peralta ranks tied for second in the majors in wins, third in strikeouts and opponents' batting average (.210), fourth in SO/9 IP (10.71) and tied for fifth in starts...A native of Moca, Dominican Republic, Peralta was originally signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Seattle Mariners on April 18, 2013...The right-hander was acquired by Milwaukee in a four-player trade on December 9, 2015.

2025 RECAP: Last season, Peralta went 17-6 with a 2.70 ERA (53 ER/176.2 IP), a 1.08 WHIP, a .193 opponents' batting average and 204 strikeouts across 33 starts...Peralta established career bests in wins, ERA, starts and innings...In the NL, Peralta ranked first in wins, second among qualifiers in opponents' batting average, fourth in ERA, fifth in WHIP, sixth in strikeouts and tied for 11th in innings...The righty earned his second career All-Star selection (also: 2021), finished fifth in the NL Cy Young vote and was an All-MLB Second Team selection...On May 8 at Cleveland, Peralta recorded his 1000th career strikeout...From June 13 - July 19, Peralta earned a win in seven straight starts, the longest such streak in the majors last season...In five August starts, Peralta went 4-0 with a 0.32 ERA (1 ER/28.0 IP) and 32 strikeouts...He earned NL Pitcher of the Month for August, his second career Pitcher of the Month honor (also: August, 2023)...From August 5 - September 10, Peralta tossed 30.0 consecutive scoreless innings, the second-longest scoreless streak in Brewers franchise history behind Teddy Higuera's 32.0-inning scoreless streak in 1987...In each of his five starts from August 12 - September 4, Peralta threw 5.0 or more scoreless innings, the longest such streak in the majors since Zac Gallen's six straight scoreless starts of 5.0 or more innings from August 8 - September 4, 2022...Peralta started three games for Milwaukee in the Postseason and went 1-2 with a 4.70 ERA (8 ER/15.1 IP) and 19 strikeouts...He earned the win in Game 1 of the NLDS vs. Chicago-NL and suffered the loss in Game 4 of the NLDS at Chicago-NL and Game 2 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles-NL.

OPENING DAY IN THE BIG APPLE PART THREE: On March 26 vs. Pittsburgh, Freddy Peralta made his third career Opening Day start...He allowed four runs over 5.0 innings and struck out seven...Peralta's first career Opening Day start came with Milwaukee on March 29, 2024 at Citi Field...That day, the right-hander threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball and fanned eight Mets batters...The lone hit he surrendered was a solo home run off the bat of Starling Marte in the second inning...Last season, Peralta was named the Brewers' Opening Day starter for the second consecutive season...The Brewers opened their 2025 regular season at Yankee Stadium, where Peralta allowed two runs over 5.0 innings and struck out eight batters...Peralta is the fifth different Mets pitcher to get the Opening Day nod in each of the last five seasons...The last Mets pitcher to start consecutive season openers for the Mets was Jacob deGrom, who started three consecutive Opening Days from 2019-2021.

KEEPIN' IT 200: In each of his last three seasons, Peralta has recorded 200 or more strikeouts...The only other pitcher in the majors to record 200+ strikeouts in each of the last three seasons is Dylan Cease...Additionally, Peralta's three seasons of 200+ strikeouts are tied with Mario Soto for the third-most by a Dominican-born pitcher...The only Dominican Republic natives with more such seasons are Hall of Famers Pedro Martínez (9) and Juan Marichal (6)...His highest single season strikeout total came in 2023 at 210.

REVERSE, REVERSE: For his career, Peralta has held left-handed batters to a .204 batting average, the fourth-best mark in the majors by a right-handed pitcher since his debut season, 2018 (min. 1500 LHB faced)...In 2021, Peralta held lefties to a .157 batting average (43-274), the third-best mark in a single season by a right-handed pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961, min. 300 LHB faced)...Last season, left-handed batters hit .204 (66-323) off of Peralta, the fourth-lowest mark among right-handers in the NL and the 11th-lowest mark in the majors (min. 300 LHB faced).

EXPANDING HIS ARSENAL: In his first two seasons, Peralta threw his four-seam fastball 77.7% of the time as part of a three-pitch repertoire that also featured a curveball and changeup... In 2020, Peralta added a slider to his arsenal and was his second-most thrown pitch from 2021-2024 with his highest usage coming in 2021 at 26.5%...Last season, Peralta only threw his slider 10.2% of the time, his lowest-used pitch...Despite the low usage of his slider, Peralta held opposing batters to a .155 (9-58) average in at-bats ending with the pitch...With the addition of another pitch to arsenal, Peralta's fastball usage has decreased from his first two seasons, however, he has thrown the pitch at least 50% of the time in every season of his career...Peralta has increased his changeup usage from season to season and was his second-most used pitch in 2025 at a career-high 21.2%...This season, Peralta has thrown his fastball 53.9% of the time and his changeup 23.6% of the time...Peralta has held opposing batters to a .222 (28-126) average with his fastball and has struck out 29 batters with the pitch.
