METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets Brewers, 7-5, last night...The Mets are 76-13 when scoring first this season...New York is now 34-10-3 in 47 series this year...The Mets continue a seven-day, six-game road trip (2-0) to Milwaukee (2-0) and Oakland (three games).

**PICK SIX:** The Mets have won six straight games...With a victory today, they would match their longest winning streak of the 2022 season, a seven-game streak from July 24-August 1...They have posted a 2.33 ERA (14 earned runs/54.0 innings) with nine walks and 79 strikeouts in that span...They are hitting .245/.374/.393 in those six games...The Mets are outscoring their opponents 37-15 over the last six games.

DAYMAN: The Mets have won three straight and 12 of their last 14 games in the sunshine...Overall, New York is 37-17 in day games this season...The team's .685 winning percentage in the sunlight is the second-best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 2.98 ERA with 138 walks and 535 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 2.98 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and second in the NL.

WALK THIS DAY: Taijuan Walker is set to make his 12th day start this year...In his previous WALK THIS DAY: laijuan Walker is set to make his 12th day start this year...In his previous 11 starts, Walker is 7-0 with a 1.53 ERA (12 earned runs/70.2 innings) with 17 walks and 64 strikeouts...Only two players in Mets history have posted a lower day ERA in a single season when throwing more innings...Jacob deGrom posted a 1.10 ERA (nine earned runs/73.1 innings) in 2015 and Jon Matlack owned a 1.52 ERA (19 earned runs/112.2 innings) in 1974...Tom Seaver owns the franchse record, posting a 1.05 mark (five earned runs/43.0 innings) in 1977...His 1.53 ERA in the sunshine is fifth in the majors and second have been been served. behind only teammate David Peterson's 1.41 ERA (five earned runs/32.0 innings) among qualified pitchers...His seven wins during the day are third in the National League... Teammate Chris Bassitt and San Francisco's Logan Webb share the NL lead with eight victories

**BABY GRAND:** Francisco Lindor hit his fifth career grand slam and his third as a member of the Mets last night...His third grand slam with the Mets is the most by a shortstop in franchise history...The Mets have hit six grand slams this season...That is tied for the seventh-most in franchise history...The last time the team hit more in a season with in 2018, when the team hit eight...The franchise record is 10 slams, accomplished in 2018.

LINDOR CITY: Francisco Lindor has reached base safely in 13 straight game batting .346 (19-55) with 11 runs, three doubles, a triple, four home runs, 13 RBI, four walks with a .400 OBP and a .655 SLG in the streak that started on September 7...He is on a seven-game hitting streak, batting .323 (10-31) with five runs, a triple, two home runs, seven RBI, a walk with a .924 OPS over that span...He has hit 25 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 homer runs in 2018, for the most home runs by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .308/.379/.489 with 38 runs, nine doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 33 RBI, 23 walks with an .868 OPS in 57 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 6.6 fWAR this season.

HOW SWEEP IT IS: The Mets are looking for their seventh sweep of the season today... It would be their first sweep of the Brewers since May 20-22, 2016 in New York and September 1-3, 2008 in Milwaukee.

AND I WOULD RECORD 500 HITS: Pete Alonso is one hit shy of 500 for his career...With a hit today, he would be the 42nd player in franchise history to record 500 hits...José Reyes was the fastest Met to record 500 hits with the club, doing so on September 6, 2006 in his 414th game...In addition, he is one run away from 300 scored in his career.

PETE & PETE: Pete Alonso has hit 15 home runs with runners in scoring position...His 15 home runs lead the major leagues and tie a franchise record set by Todd Hundley in 1996...Alonso has matched his home run total from 2021 with 37 home runs...The only Mets to have 37 or more home runs in consecutive seasons are Alonso, Darryl Strawberry (1987-88) and Mike Piazza (1999-2000)...Alonso and Strawberry are the only two Mets to reach 37 home runs in year three times.

THE ROAD TO 100: Francisco Lindor has recorded a career-high 99 RBI this season...His 99 RBI are a franchise record for a shortstop...Pete Alonso is second in the majors and owns the National League lead with 121 RBI this season, while Lindor's 99 RBI place him fourth in the NL...Only five times in franchise history have the Mets had multiple players with 100 more RBI on the same team....The 2008 Mets were the last team to accomplish this feat (Carlos Beltrán, Carlos Delgado and David Wright).

THE GRATEFUL EIGHT: Pete Alonso has recorded an RBI in eight straight games...It is the longest current streak in the majors and the streak and the longest streak of his career... He is batting .250 (7-28) in that span with eight runs, a double, four home runs, five walks, 12 RBI, a .389 OBP and a .714 SLG...Alonso joins Francisco Lindor as the third pair of players in franchise history to record an RBI streak of at least eight games in the same season.

RIB EYE STEAKS: Pete Alonso ranks second in the majors and tops the National League with 121 RBI this season...He is three RBI from tying the franchise record...Only once before in franchise history has a Met finished the season with the most RBI...Howard Johnson recorded a career-best 117 RBI in 1991 to lead the National League...He has 27 game-winning RBI this season, the most since the stat was first tracked in 1974...His 35 go-ahead RBI are tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Keith Hernandez had 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985. BREWERS-METS NOTES: The Mets are looking for their first series sweep in the Cream City since 2008.

YOU CAN FIND ME IN ST. LUCIE: Congratulations to the St. Lucie Mets who defeated the Dunedin Blue Jays, 6-3, in game two to earn their first Florida State League Championship since 2006...The Mets completed the two-game sweep over the Blue Jays and went 4-0 in the postseason after having the best record in the FSL regular season (73-56)...It's the sixth FSL title for the Mets. They previously won the league in 1988, 1996, 1998, 2003 and 2006...In 2003 and 2006 they also beat Dunedin in the Championship Series

**GRAND CENTRAL STATION:** The Mets are 23-9 against the NL Central this year...Today, they complete a stretch of 10 straight games (6-3) against the division...The Mets have posted a 2.89 ERA with 84 walks and 361 strikeouts against the division...They are hitting .259/.350/.398 against the Central...The team's 22 wins against the division are the most since they went 28-12 in 2007...The team's .719 winning percentage against the division is the highest in franchise history.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1.451 batters this season, which places them a top the majors...The team's 1,451 strikeouts are already the third-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019 followed by 1,453 in 2021...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.78 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (26.3 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets seeking their 46th road win...The team's 45 wins on the road are the seventh most all-time...Their 45 road wins is their highest total since they went 47-34 in 2007...Their .608 road winning percentage is the second-best in franchise history...Only the 1986 (.654) team had a better winning percentage on the road...Their .608 road winning percentage is third-best in MLB and second-best in the NL...Overall they are 45-29 on the road this year...New York is batting .262/.333/.425 away from Citi Field...Their .265 road average is the best in the NL and third in the majors and their .333 OBP is second in the National League.

HECK OR HIGHWATER: The Mets are a season-high 40 games over .500...It is their most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60), their highwater mark for that year...The last time the Mets were 41 games over .500 was when they were 54 games (108-54) above .500 on October 6, 1986, the final day of the season...The Mets have won 95 games...That is the third-most in the major leagues...The last time they won more games was in 2006, when they tallied 97 victories...The Mets have only recorded 100 wins in a season three times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The Mets are 95-55 through 150 games...That is the second-best mark in Mets history...Only the 1986 team (98-52) posted a better record.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .649 winning percentage (37-20) following the All-Star break...That is the second-highest winning percentage in franchise history, right below the 1969 (.671) team and before the 1988 (.644) squad...The team's 37 wins are tied for tied for third-most in the majors...The Mets are batting .266/,343/,430 with 63 home runs in 57 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets rank fourth in average, first in OBP and fifth in SLG following the break.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 103 times this year, setting a franchise record...Since 1901, the Reds set the major league record in 2021 after they were hit by 105 pitches...Mark Canha has been plunked 22 times this year, which is second in the majors...His 22 hit by pitches are tied with Brandon Nimmo (2018) for the single-season franchise record.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 110 strikeouts...That is 20 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)... Díaz has posted a 0.72 ERA (three earned runs/37.1 innings) with 17 hits, eight walks and 72 strikeouts in 36 appearances since the start of June.

TOMÁS THE TANK ENGINE: Tomás Nido is on a seven-game hitting streak, tying a career-high, batting 12-26 (.462) with six runs, three doubles, two home runs, six RBI, a walk with a .481 OBP and a .808 SLG in that span...He is batting .308 (28-91) with 14 runs, nine doubles, two home runs, 12 RBI, five walks with a .340 OBP and a .473 SLG in 32 games since the All-Star Break

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned his career-high 12th win after allowing three runs, two earned over a season-high 7.1 innings (Also: 6/29 vs. HOU) on September 16 vs. PIT...Struck out five batters without issuing a walk...Marked the first time in Walker's career with consecutive starts of at least 7.0 innings without issuing a walk.

**SHINE BRIGHT IN THE DAYLIGHT:** In 11 day game starts this season, Walker is 7-0 with a 1.53 ERA (12 ER/70.2 IP)...Walker's day game ERA is the second-best in the majors among pitchers with at least 10 daytime starts and his seven wins are tied for the fifth best daytime total this season...Walker also ranks eighth in opponent's OPS (.533) and 10th in WHIP (0.96) among starting pitchers with at least 10 day game starts...Walker and Carlos Rodón of the Giants are the only pitchers in the league to allow two home runs in day games among pitchers with at least 10 daytime starts...Currently, Walker's 2022 day-game ERA is the fourth best single-season mark among Mets starters with at least 10 day game starts... Only Jacob deGrom (1.10 ERA, 2015) and Jon Matlack (1.51, 1973 and 1.52, 1974) have had a lower day game ERA in Mets history.

**ROAD IMPROVEMENT:** In 15 road starts this season, Walker is 7-3 with a 3.36 ERA (30 ER/80.1 IP)...His seven road wins are tied for fifth in the NL and tied for 12th in the majors...Last season, Walker went 3-7 with a 5.82 ERA (44 ER /68.0 IP) in 14 road starts...His seven road wins are tied for the most Walker has had in a single-season matching his total with the Mariners in 2015...Walker's 2.46 road ERA differential from last season is the third-best in the majors among pitchers with at least 10 road starts behind Dylan Cease (3.06) and Tyler Anderson (2.56)...Courtesy of Elias.

**WELCOME TO BREW CITY:** Today, Walker will make his first career start against the Brewers...The Brewers will be the 28th opponent Walker has faced in his career, with his former teams, the Diamondbacks and Mariners, as the only other teams Walker has never faced.

**FEW KS, THAT'S OK:** Through 26 starts this season, Walker has 3.42 ERA this season (54 ER/142.0 IP) and a K/9 rate of 7.04...Among pitchers with 20 or more starts and a sub-3.50 ERA, only Johnny Cueto (5.67 K/9 rate, 3.07 ERA), Miles Mikolas (6.63 K/9 rate, 3.46 ERA), Tyler Anderson (6.71 K/9 rate, 2.52 ERA) and Adam Wainwright (6.75 K/9 rate, 3.38 ERA) are the only pitchers with a lower K/9 rate this season...Walker's 111 strikeouts are the sixth-fewest by a Mets pitcher with a sub-3.50 ERA since 2000 through their first 26 starts of the season.

**LIMITING THE LONGBALL:** Through 26 starts this season, Walker has surrendered 13 home runs over 142.0 innings, good for a HR/9 rate of 0.82... Through his first 26 starts last year, Walker surrendered 23 home runs over 138.2 innings good for a HR/9 rate of 1.48

**NICE TRY:** Walker is second in the majors with five pickoffs this season, trailing only Robbie Ray of the Mariners who has six pickoffs on the season... Since 2021, Walker has nine pickoffs, tied with Ryan Weathers and Max Fried for the most during that span...His 18 pickoffs since his debut year of 2013 are the fourth-most by a right-handed pitcher.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Worked 6.0 scoreless innings for his 18th quality start of the season...Bassitt earned his 14th win in the team's 5-1 victory over the Pirates on September 17...He struck out eight batters and walked two, allowing only three hits for the first time since June 14 after having allowed three or fewer hits in three of his first four starts of the season.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** Bassitt's eight wins away from Citi Field are tied for his most road wins in a season, with a win today he would set a career high surpassing his total 2021...Across the majors, his eight road wins rank third in MLB...His last road start came on September 7 against the Pirates going 7.0 innings allowing one run on five hits and striking out 10 batters.
