RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals continue on their second road trip this season and first departing from St. Louis. Tonight is the second of a three-game series against the defending National League Champion Arizona Diamondbacks. A win tonight would clinch the Cardinals their second straight road series (San Diego, 4/1-3) and three-of-five overall this season. The road trip continues April 15-17 when the Cardinals travel to the Bay Area to take on the Oakland Athletics.

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals open today's schedule in 5th place in the National League Central, 3.0 games behind Milwaukee (9-3) and Pittsburgh (10-4) in first place. St. Louis is a half-game back of Cincinnati and Chicago for 3rd place. The Redbirds are at .500 for the 5th time this season hitting the mark at 3-3, 4-4, 5-5, 6-6 and 7-7.

FIREWORKS NIGHT ALL AROUND: While it was officially Fireworks Night at Chase Field last night, the Cardinals were igniting some of their own. Despite blowing a 6-0 lead in the 5th inning, St. Louis set season highs in runs scored (9), extra base hits (6), singles (8), triples (2) and tied their season highs in hits (14), 1st inning runs (3) and home runs (2). They extended their home run streak to five games.

NOOTS HOOTS: Outfielder **Lars Nootbaar** returned from the 10-day Injured List on April 11 and came out gangbusters by smoking a 438-foot home run in his second plate appearance. The blast was the longest of the season by a Cardinals batter and the longest at Chase Field in 2024.

TRIP' CITY: **Brendnan Donovan** and **Masyn Winn** each hit a triple last night coming in the 7th and 8th innings. The last time the Cardinals hit two triples in a game was Aug. 25, 2022 at Wrigley Field. **Corey Dickerson** and **Tommy Edman** each raced out three-baggers in a game possibly more remembered for the final game at Wrigley Field for **Albert Pujols** and **Yadier Molina**.

FREE-MASYN: **Masyn Winn** hit his second triple of the season in just his 50th Major League game. He's currently tied with **Charlie Blackmon** (COL) and **Ha-Seong Kim** (SD) for the National League lead in triples. The 22-year old shortstop is the first Cardinals player to hit two triples in his first 50 games at age 22 since **Placido Polanco** in 1998. **Red Murray** (1906) and "**Sunny**" **Jim Bottomley** (1922-23) hit seven and six triples in their first 50 games before they turned 23 for the Cardinals record.

GET NOLAN ROLLIN': **Nolan Arenado** drilled a three-run home run in the 1st inning last night to give St. Louis a 3-0 lead, but more importantly snapped a career-long stretch of 39 games covering 154 plate appearances without a home run dating back to August 19, 2023. Arenado is currently leading the Cardinals with 16 hits and two three-hit games. Arenado is one of three Cardinals to play in all 14 games (**Nolan Gorman** & **Victor Scott II**) and hit safely in 11-of-the-14. His 32 career dingers against Arizona are his 2nd-most against any opponent (San Francisco, 33).

A CASE OF THE WILLIES: Dating back to September 6, 2023, Cardinals catcher **Willson Contreras** has reached base safely in his last 18 games (.459 OBP). The 18-game streak ranks T-3rd in MLB trailing only **Christian Yelich** (MIL, 23) and the suspended **Noelvi Marte** (CIN, 22). He has tied his career-long on-base streak from July 2016 as a member of the Cubs.

I LOVE THE "CHASE": **Lars Nootbaar** continued to stay red hot when playing at Chase Field going 1-for-3 with a two-run home run (#1) and a walk. Over his career of 33 plate appearances in Arizona, Nootbaar is batting .450 (9-20) with 3 HR, 9 RBI, 10 runs scored and a 12:2 walk to strikeout rate. He has reached base safely in 21 of 33 plate appearances and carries the highest on-base (.636), slugging (.952) and OPS (1.588) of any player with 30 or more plate appearances at Chase Field.

FAMILY TIES: Last night, **Chris Caray**, son of Cardinals television play-by-play announcer **Chip Caray** called his first Major League game for the Oakland Athletics against the Washington Nationals. Caray extends the broadcasting family into its 4th generation of Major League Baseball that began with **Harry** (1945-97), **Skip** (1967-2008), **Chip** (1991-present) and **Chris** (2024-present). The previous three **Harry Christopher Caray's** were all born in St. Louis.

IT'S WHACKING DAY: Since Arizona joined MLB as an expansion team in 1998, the Cardinals .618 win percentage (107-66) against the Diamondbacks is the their best against any opponent, the highest in MLB vs. the Snakes among National League and common interleague opponents, and the highest by any team against the last four expansion teams (Rockies, Marlins, Rays, Diamondbacks)

RAZING ARIZONA: St. Louis is 53-35 (.602) all-time at Chase Field, the best win pct. by any annual visitor and the club's 3rd-best winning pct. in any road city behind Kansas City (.662, 45-23 since 1997) and Miami (.630, 68-40 since 1993).

ARIZONA CONNECTIONS

Paul Goldschmidt was selected by Arizona in the 8th round of the 2009 MLB Draft...played eight seasons with the Dbacks (2011-18), hitting .297/.398/.532 with 209 home runs and 710 RBI...selected to six All-Star squads (2013-18)...won four Silver Sluggers (2013, '15, '17-18) and three Gold Gloves (2013, '15, '17)...acquired by St. Louis from Arizona for **Carson Kelly**, **Luke Weaver**, **Andrew Young**, and the 2019 Cardinals Compensation Round B selection (Dec. 5, 2018).

Nolan Arenado made his MLB debut vs. the Dbacks (April 28, 2013 at Chase Field)...Signed his letter of intent to play college baseball at Arizona State University before drafted by the Rockies.

Nolan Gorman was born in Phoenix...graduated from Sandra Day O'Connor High School in Glendale...signed his letter of intent to the University of Arizona before drafted by the Cardinals.

Dbacks First Base Coach **Dave McKay** served in the same position for the Cardinals for 16 seasons (1996-2011).

Dbacks Hitting Coach **Joe Mather** was selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2001 MLB Draft...played parts of two years in St. Louis (2008, '10).

Keynan Middleton pitched in 18 games for the Diamondbacks in 2022.

Daniel Descalso played two seasons for the Diamondbacks (2017-18)...served as a Special Assistant to Baseball Operations for Arizona in 2023.

Brandon Crawford resides in Scottsdale, Ari.

JoJo Romero played college baseball at Yavapai College in Prescott, Arizona.

Matthew Liberatore was born in Peoria, Ari...graduated from Mountain Ridge High School in Glendale...signed his letter of intent to the Univer-

sity of Arizona before drafted by the Rays.

Randal Grichuk played parts of his first four MLB seasons in St. Louis (2014-17)...originally joined the Cardinals via trade with the Angels, packaged with **Peter Bourjos** in exchange for **David Freese** and **Fernando Salas** (Nov. 22, 2013).

Turner Ward played two seasons (1999-2000) and spent eight years coaching in the Dbacks organization, serving as AA-Mobile Hitting Coach (2008-10) and Manager (2011-12), and Arizona Asst. Hitting Coach (2013) Hitting Coach (2014-15)...Ward's Mobile teams won Southern League championships in 2011 and 2012...Turner's son, **Tucker Ward**, was selected by Arizona in the 40th round of the 2015 MLB Draft draft and pitched three seasons in the Arizona organization (2015-17).

Brandon Allen played parts of three seasons (2009-11) with the Dbacks...made his MLB debut

- Making his 3rd start as a member of the Cardinals and his 2nd road start, both against N.L. West opponents (San Diego & Arizona).
- This will be his 297th career start, three shy of becoming the 9th active starting pitcher with 300 or more games started. Justin Verlander leads the list with 509.
- Was hit for seven runs in his last start including two 1st inning three-run home runs. The six 1st inning runs set an opening frame record for him and the second time in his career (5/10/14 at DET, 2nd inning) in any inning.
- Became the most recent Cardinals pitcher to allow six runs in the 1st inning and still pitch 6.0 or more innings since **Bob Tewksbury** at CHI (6/29/1991 - 6.0 IP, 6 R, 1 ER).
- St. Louis area resident and University of Missouri Baseball alum signed with the Cardinals as a free agent last November.
- Is one of three free-agent starters (**Sonny Gray & Lance Lynn**) that the Cardinals signed this past off-season.
- Joins his fifth Major League team Twins (2013-19), Rangers (2020-21), Phillies (2021-22), Orioles (2023) and Cardinals (2024).
- Was 1-2 with a 7.80 ERA in four Grapefruit League starts this spring. Led the Cardinals pitching staff with 16 strikeouts, including 9 in his final Spring start.

- Has career marks of 105-101, one of 17 active pitchers with 100 or more wins. Ranks 11th among active pitchers with 105 wins, two behind Carlos Carrasco (107) for 10th.
- Durable starting pitcher, has made 29 or more starts in eight of the last 10 seasons, the most by any MLB pitcher.
- Has posted eight 10-win seasons since his MLB debut in 2013, tied for 4th-most among over that period trailing only **Max Scherzer** (10), **Gerrit Cole** (9) & **Clayton Kershaw** (9).
