Carlos Gómez (LF), Jonathan Lucroy (C) and Aramis Ramírez (3B) started in the 2014 Midsummer Classic.

TODAY'S GAME: Is the third game (1-1) of a 6-game homestand against Pittsburgh (1-1) and Washington (3g) leading into the All-Star break.....following the break, the team takes a 5-game road trip to Minnesota (2g) and Chicago-NL (3g).

IN THE STANDINGS (105 days): The Brewers have spent the following number of days alone or tied at each position in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 91, SECOND: 13, THIRD: 1, FOURTH: 0, FIFTH: 0.....the team is in first place, leading the Cardinals by 5.5 games, Pirates by 9.5 games, Reds by 10.0 games and last-place Cubs by 10.0 games.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Brewers are 17-9-3 in series play. Game 1: 15-15, Game 2: 18-12, Game 3: 18-10, Game 4: 3-2 Sweep Wins (4): at NYM (3q, 3/29-3/31), at STL (3q, 4/19-4/21), vs. CWS (3g, 5/31-6/2), vs. TEX (3g, 6/24-6/26) Sweep Losses [1]: at PHI (3g, 6/3-6/5)

AT HDME: The Brewers are 28-14 at home, going 10-2-1 in series play.....the team has gone 23-7 in its last 30 home games after a 5-7 start.....the Brewers had a season-high 6-game home winning streak from 5/29-6/10.....the team has won its last nine home series.....their last home series loss came from 4/26-4/28 against the Yankees (1-2).

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 26-25 on the road, going 7-7-2 in series play....the team has gone 13-21 in its last 34 road games after a 13-4 start.....the team had a season-high 4-game road winning streak from 4/9-4/13.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.....Murphy spent the previous eight seasons (2016-23) as bench coach.....his only Major League managerial experience previously came in 2015 as interim manager of the Padres, replacing **Bud Black** in June (42-54).....he enjoyed a 25-year college head coaching career primarily at the University of Notre Dame (1988-94) and Arizona State University (1995-2009).....Murphy went 1,000-457-4 as a college coach and was on pace to be the winningest coach in NCAA history before he transitioned into the professional ranks.

COACHES: First base coach Quintin Berry (4th season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (2nd season/1st in current role), hitting coach Connor Dawson (3rd season), assistant pitching coach Jim Henderson (3rd season/1st in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (6th season), third base coach Jason Lane (9th season/4th in current role), run prevention coordinator Walker McKinven (5th season/1st in current role) and hitting coach Ozzie Timmons (3rd season) all returned from the 2023 staff..... Rickie Weeks (associate manager), Daniel de Mondesert (assistant coach) and Charlie Greene (bullpen coach) are in their first seasons on the coaching staff, all Major League coaches for the first time.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 22 replay challenges this season, going 13-9.....their last challenge (lost) came on 7/7 at Los Angeles-NL as a foul ball hit by Willy Adames stood.

# TODAY'S STARTER: #32 - RHP AARON CIVALE (18gs, 2-6, 5.18)

CIVALE AT A GLANCE: Aaron Civale, 29, will make his 19th start of the season and second with the Brewers.....he made his debut with Milwaukee last Friday at Los Angeles-NL and received no decision in the Brewers' 8-5 loss (5ip, 5h, 4r, 4er, 3bb, 8k, 3hr, 102 pitches).....he left with a 5-4 lead.....Civale was acquired by Milwaukee from Tampa Bay on July 3 in exchange for INF Gregory Barrios.....he went 2-6 with a 5.07 ERA in 17 starts with the Rays (87ip, 93h, 51r, 49er, 27bb, 84k).....he has 3 quality starts.....his teams are 5-13 in his starts.....opponents are batting .268 (98-for-365, 19hr).....name is pronounced "sih-VAH-lee."

LAST SEASON: Civale went 7-5 with a 3.46 ERA in 23 starts between Cleveland and Tampa Bay.....he made 7 quality starts.....his teams went 13-10 in his starts.....opponents batted .235 [109-for-463, 12hr].....he began the season with the Guardians, going 5-2 with a 2.34 ERA in 13 starts.....he was traded to the Rays on July 31 in exchange for first baseman Kyle Manzardo and went 2-3 with a 5.36 ERA in 10 starts.

CAREER: Has gone 33-32 with a 4.12 ERA in 104 starts (567.1ip, 260er).....is in his sixth Major League season pitching for Cleveland (2019-23), Tampa Bay (2023-24) and Milwaukee (2024).....Civale was selected by Cleveland in the third round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Northeastern University.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Civale has never pitched at our beautiful venue.

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 16-15 with a 3.97 ERA in 55 starts (296.2ip, 131er).....is 1-2 with a 6.23 ERA in 9 starts this season (43.1ip, 30er).

CAREER vs. PIRATES: Is 1-1 with a 4.63 ERA in 4 starts (23.1ip, 23h, 12r, 12er, 2bb, 16k, 4hr), including a no-decision this season coming in a 3-1 win with the Rays on 6/23 at PNC Park (5ip, 3h, 1r, 1er, 1bb, 3k, 1hr).
