TIGERS SWEEP DOUBLEHEADER FROM METS: The Tigers won both games from the Mets on Wednesday, taking the opener, 6-5, and winning the night cap, 8-1. In the first game, Eric Haase drove in five of Detroit's six runs, going 2x4 with a homer, while Javier Baez also hit a solo homer and scored three runs. Joey Wentz started for the Tigers and gave up five runs on nine hits with a walk and two strikeouts in 6.0 innings. Detroit's bullpen combined for 3.0 scoreless innings. In the second game, Haase hit a solo homer, while Matt Vierling added a two-run blast. Andy Ibanez added three hits and drove in two. Michael Lorenzen picked up his first victory in a Tigers uniform, giving up just one run on four hits with two walks and a strikeout in 7.0 innings.

ROSTER MOVE: The Tigers have announced the following roster move:
*Following last night's game, returned RHP Brendan White to Triple A Toledo after he served as the 27th man for yesterday's doubleheader.

HOMERIN' HAASE: Eric Haase had a big day at the plate in yesterday's doubleheader sweep of the Mets, combining to go 4x8 with a double, two home runs and six RBI. He homered in both games of the twinbill, the first Tiger to do so since Spencer Torkelson on October 4, 2022 at Seattle. Haase drove in five runs in the first game, his second career game with five-or-more RBI (other, six RBI on July 3, 2021 vs. Chicago (AL)). Haase has hit safely in 12 of his last 18 games with at least one at-bat, slashing .345/.410/.527 with four doubles, two home runs and eight RBI.

"LA LEYENDA" TO DEBUT TONIGHT: "La Leyenda", a five-part radio series chronicling the career of a generational player – Miguel Cabrera, debuts tonight at 7:00 p.m. on 97.1 The Ticket. Episode one focuses on Miggy's origin story and includes analysis from Daniella Bruce and Dan Dickerson, and interviews with several scouts that first discovered and signed one of the greatest players of all time.

TIGERS AND METS: The Tigers and Mets conclude their only series of the season today. The two teams last played in 2019 with New York (NL) winning two-of-three games at Citi Field. Detroit has a 15-11 lead in the all-time series against the Mets, including a 7-4 edge in games at Comerica Park.

INTERLEAGUE ACTION: The Tigers continue their interleague schedule today against the Mets. Detroit has started the season 6-1 against National League foes, sweeping a two-game series from San Francisco, taking two-of-three games at Milwaukee and winning the first two games of this series vs. New York (NL). The Tigers have finished with a winning record against NL opponents in each of the last two seasons.

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers are 3-3 on their current seven-game homestand, which includes

four games vs. Baltimore (1-3) and three games vs. New York (NL) (2-0). Detroit is 7-7 at home this season. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .253/.315/.392 at Comerica Park, while the pitching staff has a 4.64 ERA (130.0IP/67ER).

ON DECK: Following today's game, the Tigers embark on a six-game road trip, starting with a three-game weekend series against the Cardinals. Detroit and St. Louis last played in 2021 with the Tigers taking three-of-four games, including splitting a two-game set at Busch Stadium. Detroit owns a 27-14 advantage in the all-time series.

- Rodriguez will make his seventh start of the series today in the series finale vs. New York (NL).
- Picked up his second win of the season on Saturday in the first game of the doubleheader vs. Baltimore, allowing a run on four hits with two walks and five strikeouts...has given up one run-or-less in four consecutive starts, tying the longest streak of his career.
- Had back-to-back starts of at least 7.0 shutout innings with no walks and six-or-more strikeouts on April 18 vs. Cleveland (Game 2) and April 23 at Baltimore, becoming the first pitcher in franchise history to accomplish that, according to the Elias Sports Bureau...was the first Major League pitcher to do so since Jacob deGrom from June 29-July 5, 2019.
- Named Tigers Pitcher of the Month for April, starting five games during the month and posting a 2-1 record with a 1.72 ERA (31.1IP/6ER) and 25 strikeouts...among AL pitchers (min. 25.0 IP), he ranked fourth in ERA, while he was sixth in WHIP (0.86).
- Has faced the Mets just once in his career, receiving a no decision on September 21, 2021 after allowing two runs on five hits with three walks and five strikeouts in 4.1 innings...in 14 career starts at Comerica Park, he is 7-4 with a 3.08 ERA (76.0IP/26ER) and 71 strikeouts.
- Since 2018, he has a .676 winning percentage, which ranks eighth among all active Major League pitchers over that span (min. 100 starts).

- Had a pair of hits on April 25 at Milwaukee, recording his first multi-hit game of the season and the 880th of his career, breaking a tie with Robin Yount for 20th and moving into a tie with Rogers Hornsby for 19th.
- Hit a walk-off single on April 15 against San Francisco in the bottom of the 11th inning...marked his 15th career walk-off hit, his 12th as a Tiger and his first in a pinch-hitting role.
- Hit a double in the eighth inning on April 12 at Toronto...was the 1,134th extra-base hit of his career, and he is now tied with Tris Speaker (1,134) for 16th in MLB history...is also two homers shy of tying Gary Sheffield (509) for 26th in MLB history.
- Went 1x3 with a RBI and a walk on April 1 at Tampa Bay...the hit was the 3,090th of his career, passing Ichiro Suzuki for 23rd in MLB history.
- Hit the 600th double of his career May 7 at Houston, becoming the 18th player in big league history to hit 600 career doubles...joined Hank Aaron and Albert Pujols as the only players in MLB history with 3,000 hits, 500 home runs and 600 doubles.
- Recorded the 3,000th hit of his Major League career in the first game of the doubleheader on April 23 vs. Colorado with a first inning single off Antonio Senzatel...became the seventh player in MLB history with 500 homers and 3,000 hits, joining Hank Aaron, Willie Mays, Eddie Murray, Rafael Palmeiro, Albert Pujols and Alex Rodriguez and the 33rd member of the 3,000-hit club...joined Ty Cobb and Al Kaline as the only players to record their 3,000th career hit in a Tigers uniform.
- The 2023 season marks the 21st of his decorated Major League career...one of the best hitters of his generation, Cabrera is among the leaders of active players (min. 800 games) in many offensive categories, including first in batting average (.307), hits (3,098), doubles (610), home runs (507), RBI (1,850) and runs scored (1,530), second in walks (1,230) and sixth in on-base percentage (.383) and slugging percentage (.522).
