METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Nationals, 4-1, last night... New York has lost four-straight games, which is a season-high...The last time the team lost four straight games was when they lost five straight from September 21-26, 2021...The Mets continue a seven-game homestand (0-2) against the Nationals (0-2) and Braves (four games).

PUT AWAY THE BROOMS: The Mets are looking to avoid their second sweep of the season and their first at home...New York was swept in a three-game series in Milwaukee from April 3-5...The Mets were last swept by the Nationals from April 21-23, 2017 in New York.

RIP: Dennis Ribant, who pitched for the Mets from 1964-1966, passed away earlier this week in California...The right-handed pitcher made his major league debut with New York in 1964...Overall, he appeared in 72 games (34) starts with the Mets and compiled a 13-17 record, seven saves with a 3.68 ERA, 55 walks and 132 strikeouts...His best season came in 1966 when he went 11-9 with a 3.20 ERA in 29 games (26 starts) including 10 complete games.

FUEGO: Joey Lucchesi is slated to make his second start of the season tonight...On April 21 at Oracle Park in San Francisco, he threw 7.0 shutout innings, allowing just four hits and two walks...He fanned nine Giants batters to earn the win in his first start in the majors since 2021...Lucchesi has made one start against the Nationals since joining the Mets...In that appearance on June 18, 2021 he threw 5.1 scoreless innings at Nationals Park, allowing four hits and two walks while tallying five strikeouts in a 1-0 loss to Washington...This will be his third career start against Washington, also on June 6, 2019 in San Diego, during which he allowed four runs on four hits and three walks while striking out five in a 5-4 Padres victory...Today will be Lucchesi's has first time facing the Nationals at Citi Field.

COMMUNITY HERO HIGHLIGHT: As part of Major League Baseball's Commissioner's Community Initiative, this season the Mets will continue to recognize staff from local non-profit organizations that have gone above and beyond to make a positive impact on our community...Tonight, in honor of National Volunteer Month, the Mets are recognizing God's Love we Deliver as their Community Hero...God's Love volunteers are the heart and soul of the organization and this year alone, over 13,000 volunteers will deliver 3.4 million meals to people living with serious and chronic diseases...Volunteers will be honored with tickets, gift bags, and a ceremony prior to the game.

JEFF McHITS: Over the last 10 games, Jeff McNeil is batting .417 (15-36) with six runs, two doubles, a home run, three RBI, four walks with a .500 OBP and a .556 SLG...Since April 16, he has raised his batting average from .212 to .295 and his OBP from .359 to .415...McNeil logged his seventh multi-hit game of the year last night...He has 60 multi-hit games since the start of last season, which is the third-most during that span behind Bo Bichette and Freddie Freeman who each have 65 multi-hit games since 2022.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets are 4-4 at Citi Field this year...The team's eight home games are tied for the fewest in the major leagues...The team won 54 games at home last year...That was their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26...Overall, the Mets went 54-27 at Citi Field...The team's .667 winning percentage was the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of seven straight games against the National League East...They are 0-2 in the current stretch...Overall, the Mets are 5-4 against the division this season... New York went 50-26 against the East last year, including 26-11 at home.

A HIT'S A HIT: The Mets have collected 35 infield hits this season, which is the second-most in the majors...Last year, the Mets collected 186 infield hits, which was the fifth-most in franchise history and the third-most in the majors in 2022.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won the season series against the Nationals in four of the last five years.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: David Robertson has appeared in 10 games and has allowed one run in 10.1 innings of work, good for a 0.87 ERA... He has allowed five hits, three walks while striking out 12 in that span... He is holding left-handed hitters to a .105 (2-19) batting average this season...He has converted all four save opportunities he's had this season...Overall, he has recorded 161 saves in his career...That is the seventh-most among active players.

HIGH FIVE: Brett Baty is on a five-game on-base streak, batting .294 (5-17) with a run, a double, a walks and an RBI in that span...This comes after he went 1-8 in his first three games with the club.

NICE TO D.C. YOU: The Mets take on the Washington Nationals for the first time this season...New York went 14-5 against D.C. last year including 7-2 at Citi Field...The Mets posted a 2.68 ERA against Washington in 2022, while batting .291/.366/.460...The team's 2.68 ERA was the lowest against any team within the division.

WAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Brandon Nimmo is second in the major leagues with a 1.6 fWAR...Over the last 15 games, Nimmo is batting .400 (24-60) with 10 runs, five doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, seven walks, one steal with a .464 OBP and a .583 SLG...He has raised his batting average from .192 to .337 in that span...The Wyoming native is third in the majors with a .449 OBP, ninth in batting average (.337) and is tied for seventh in the majors with 17 walks this season.

WALK, DON'T STRIKE: The Mets are second in the majors with 105 walks this season...As a team, New York has struck out 195 times this season, the fourth-fewest in the majors...Brandon Nimmo has drawn 17 walks and struck out just 14 times this season...Jeff McNeil has 14 walks and has also struck out only nine times.

GUESS WHO'S BACH?: Over the last eight games, Daniel Vogelbach is 7-20 (.350) with two runs, a double, a home run, five RBI, four walks with a .458 OBP and a .550 SLG...He has posted a .418 OBP in 19 games this season, which is only behind Brandon Nimmo (.449) for the team lead.

APRIL, SHE WILL COME: Pete Alonso has become the first player in Mets history with 10 home runs before May 1...The last time a player hit 10+ home runs in his team's first 21 games of a season was in 2019, when Christian Yelich (11), Cody Bellinger, Khris Davis and Eddie Rosario all accomplished the feat.

LUCCHESI NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Lucchesi threw 7.0 shutout innings on April 21 at Oracle Park in San Francisco, allowing just four hits and two walks...Fanned nine Giants batters to earn the win in his first start in the majors since 2021...Lucchesi became the first Met to throw 7.0 or more shutout innings in his season debut since Jenrry Mejia on July 26, 2013.

THE (NAT)URAL: Lucchesi has made one start against the Nationals since joining the Mets...In that appearance on June 18, 2021 he threw 5.1 scoreless innings at Nationals Park, allowing four hits and two walks while tallying five strikeouts in a 1-0 loss to Washington...Lucchesi has made three other starts against the Nationals, each while with the Padres, during which he pitched to a 1-0 record with a 5.79 ERA (9 ER/14.0 IP)...His win against the Nationals came on June 6, 2019 in San Diego, during which he allowed four runs on four hits and three walks while striking out five in a 5-4 Padres victory...Today will be Lucchesi's has first time facing the Nationals at Citi Field.

PUTTING UP GOOSE EGGS: Dating back to June 13, 2021, Lucchesi has tossed 16.1 straight scoreless innings, a career-best scoreless streak...Among starting pitchers, Lucchesi's scoreless streak is the fourth longest active scoreless streak in the majors behind Zac Gallen (28.0 innings), Gerrit Cole (20.0 innings) and Eduardo Rodríguez (17.0 innings).

HE BUILT THIS CITI: Lucchesi holds a 2-0 record in four appearances and three starts at Citi Field...Has pitched to a 2.08 ERA (4 ER/17.1 IP) in games in Flushing, while fanning 17 batters...This will be his first start at Citi Field since June 13, 2021, when he allowed one run on four hits, one walk and six strikeouts in a 7-3 loss against his former team in the Padres.

JOEY FUEGO: Made his major league debut on March 30, 2018 while with San Diego in a start against Milwaukee...Played for the Padres for three season before coming to the Mets in 2021...As a Met, Lucchesi-who adopted the nickname "Fuego" while in college-made eight starts in 11 appearances in 2021, pitching to a 4.46 ERA (19 ER/38.1 IP) and racking up 41 strikeouts before his season was cut short after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...Made his Mets debut in relief on April 7, 2021 at Philadelphia, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings...Pitched to a 1.19 ERA (3 ER/22.2 IP) with 24 strikeouts over his last five outings of the 2021 season before his season-ending injury.

SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE: Lucchesi made three starts this season for Triple-A Syracuse...In his three starts at Syracuse, he has pitched to a 2.30 ERA (4 ER/15.2 IP) and has tallied 16 strikeouts...Lucchesi has held opponents to a .196 average thus far, while pitching to a 1.15 WHIP.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Last season, Lucchesi made his return to the mound after recovering from Tommy John surgery in June of 2021...Made eight rehab appearances across three minor league affiliates, posting a 2.13 ERA (3 ER/12.2 IP)...He allowed 12 hits in eight appearances-four of which were starts-while tallying three walks and fanning 12 batters.

TROUBLE WITH THE CHURVE: Has gained attention throughout his career for a pitch he created, called the "churve"...Developed from a basic changeup, Lucchesi holds the ball deep in his palm and tinkered with his wrist action and position to throw the pitch in a similar nature to a breaking ball...Since then, it is a go-to weapon for Lucchesi...In 2019, his curve had an average 8.9 vertical drop, per Statcast, which was the most movement of any pitcher's changeup by more than a full inch...According to Baseball Savant, Lucchesi's pitch arsenal also featured a sinker, curve, cutter and change the last time he was in the majors.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP DAVID PETERSON (1-3, 7.36)

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the loss against the Giants in San Francisco on April 22...Threw 5.0 innings, allowing seven earned runs in on seven hits and one walk while tallying eight strikeouts.

VS ATLANTA: Tomorrow, Peterson will make his eighth career start and ninth career appearance against the Braves...Through his first eight appearances against Atlanta, Peterson is 3-3 with a 4.50 ERA (18 earned runs/36.0 innings)...His last appearance against the Braves, October 1, 2022, pitched 0.2 inning of relief, allowed one hit and struck out two in the Mets' loss.
