STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their six-game road trip against the Orioles (1-2) and Tigers (1-0, two to play) tonight in Detroit...have won back-to-back games after losing seven of their previous nine contests (Aug. 14-22), which came on the heels of a season-high tying nine-game winning streak (Aug. 3-12)...with last night's win, exceeded their win total from 2025 (77-85)...are tied for MLB's best record since July 20 at 22-11 (also: BOS & SD)...have the hardest remaining schedule in the AL with an opp. winning pct. of .512...hold a 3.5-game lead in the AL East...have spent 99 days leading the division, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...this includes a season-high 59 consecutive days in first place (June 27-pres.)...only the Dodgers (146), Braves (144), and Brewers (114) have spent more time leading their divisions...have held the AL's best record for 98 days, second most in team history behind 2023 (106), according to Stats Perform.

- ★ In last night's 4-1, series-opening win, **Drew Rasmussen** turned in his 11th start of 6.0 IP or more with one or zero runs allowed (3rd in AL/15th in MLB)...he earned the win for a seventh consecutive start, the second-longest streak in Rays history behind **Blake Snell's** nine-start run from Aug. 10-Sept. 23, 2018 and tied with MIA **Sandy Alcantara** (June 1-July 4) for MLB's longest streak this season...his five wins during August are tied for the most in a calendar month in team history (11x, last: **Shane Bieber**, March/April 2023).
- ★ The Rays improved to an AL-best 61-14 (.813) when scoring four runs or more, fifth in the majors...they have won a season-high tying 11 straight road games when reaching the mark (July 20-pres.; also: April 4-May 22)...their last longer streak was a 13-game stretch in 2024 (June 20-Sept. 7).
- ★ Rays pitchers have yielded five runs in the last three games (1.33 ERA/27.0IP, 4ER) on the heels of a season-high streak of six straight games permitting five runs or more (Aug. 16-21), which was their longest since May 19-25, 2024 (also 6G)...opponents are slashing .156/.180/.271 (15-for-96) in that span with 26 strikeouts against two walks, and Rays pitchers have produced a 0.63 WHIP.
- ★ Last night ended a streak of 13 consecutive games in which the Rays staff allowed a home run, which tied the sixth-longest streak in franchise history and was their longest since April 17-May 1 (G2), 2019 (also 13G)...it marked their first homerless game since Aug. 9 at SEA.
- ★ **Casey Legumina** will serve as an opener for bulk reliever **Ian Seymour** this evening...the Rays are 7-2 when using openers this season, with those pitchers turning in a 1.62 ERA (16.2IP, 3ER)...since introducing the concept on May 19, 2018 at LAA, the club is 115-74 (.608) in games with openers compared to 610-483 (.558) in all other contests.
- ★ The Rays need to win one of the next two games to snap a season-high three-series skid and secure their first series victory since Aug. 10-12 at ATH...they would also improve to 11-6-3 over their last 19 sets (June 19-pres.) and earn their fifth series victory in their last six road series (July 20-pres.).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, RHP **Chris Roycroft** was claimed off waivers by the Athletics.

CONTACT KINGS—The Rays did not swing and miss at any of Tigers starter **Framber Valdez's** 84 pitches last night, the third time in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008) an opposing starter threw 75 pitches or more against the Rays and did not register a whiff, joining **Jeremy Guthrie** (114) on June 15, 2013 vs. **KC** and **David Phelps** (98) on May 24, 2013 vs. NYY...it was the first such instance in the majors since AZ **Brandon Pfaadt** recorded no whiffs on 95 pitches on May 19, 2025 at LAD...the Rays swung and missed only four times on 130 Detroit offerings in the contest (7.0%), their fewest since June 26 vs. **KC** (4) and tied for their second fewest this season, more than only June 19 vs. WSH (3)...it was their third time in the pitch-tracking era recording four whiffs or fewer on 130 pitches or more, joining Aug. 7, 2013 at AZ (2 whiffs, 144 pitches) and June 27, 2010 vs. AZ (4 whiffs, 137 pitches), and marked the third occurrence in MLB this season, alongside the Royals on June 13 vs. HOU (2 whiffs, 134 pitches) and Red Sox on Aug. 17 vs. AZ (4 whiffs, 162 pitches).

- ★ The Rays have recorded more BB than SO in back-to-back games for the third time this season, joining May 6-7 and May 17-18 (4BB, 3SO last night)...they have done so in three games (or more) six times, most recently from June 17-19, 2011 (3G)...this, after going 84 games without accomplishing the feat (May 20-Aug. 22)...their 11 such contests this year are their most since 2014 (17G).
- ★ On the year, the Rays own the majors' lowest strikeout (18.6%) and whiff rates (20.4%)...the former would mark their lowest rate since 2014 (18.3%), while the latter would be their second lowest in the pitch-tracking era to 2014 (20.2%).

THE BAKE SHOW—**Bryan Baker** converted his 27th consecutive save opportunity last night, extending the longest streak in franchise history...it marks the majors' second-longest streak this season behind SD **Mason Miller's** 28-save run (March 28-July 29) and is the longest single-season streak by an AL pitcher since **CLE Emmanuel Clase** converted 34 straight saves from May 20-Sept. 25, 2024...his MLB-leading 38 saves are seventh most in a season in team history, including the most since **Alex Colomé** had 47 in 2017...Baker is on pace for 47 saves, which would tie Colomé for second most by a Ray behind **Fernando Rodney** (48) in 2012...he's already the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point after the calendar flips to August, joining Colomé (2017, led MLB), Rodney (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and **Roberto Hernandez** (1999, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform...with six games to play, Baker is two saves shy of tying Colomé (40) in 2017 for the most in club history before the end of August.

THE CHAN, THE MYTH, THE LEGEND—Earlier today, MLB announced a scoring change from the Rays 5-1 loss on Aug. 20 vs. TOR, adjusting a **Chandler Simpson** single/advance to second on throwing error by the second baseman to a two-base fielding error on the first baseman...the change retroactively halted his hitting streak, which he extended to 15 games last night, at 10 games (Aug. 8-19)...still tied for the second longest by a Ray this season behind **Yandy Diaz's** 11-game streak (Aug. 9-20)...Simpson currently leads the AL with 45 multi-hit games, ahead of HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (43G)...he could join Diaz (2025, 11st) as the only Rays to pace the AL in the category...Simpson is also tied for the AL lead in triples (6) and stolen bases (35) and is fourth in hits (143)...he owns the majors' second-lowest strikeout rate (8.5%) and third-lowest whiff rate (10.0%).

- ★ Since breaking out of a 3-for-44 skid (May 30-June 17), Simpson has hit safely in 45 of his last 54 games (June 19-pres.), pacing the majors in average (.372), hits (77), and steals (21) over that timeframe—the next closest player over that span is batting .332 (LAD **Freddie Freeman**)...Simpson's .372 batting average over that span is the best by a Ray over any 54-game stretch within a single season since **Carl Crawford** (.372) from July 15-Sept. 15, 2007 (min. 150AB).
- ★ Simpson (.310) is only 10 points behind Alvarez (.320) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join Diaz (2023) as the only AL batting champions in Rays history...he has previously won an NCAA Division I batting title at Georgia Tech in 2022 (.433) and a Minor League Baseball batting crown in 2024 (.355).
- ★ With 79 SB, Simpson is one steal shy of becoming the 30th player in the modern era (since 1900) to swipe 80 SB across their first two major league seasons...he would join CIN **Elly De La Cruz** (2023-24, 102SB) and SEA **Ichiro Suzuki** (2001-02, 87SB) as the only players in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to turn the trick.

TAKE THIS SHOW ON THE ROAD—Dating back to July 20, the Rays are an MLB-best 14-3 over their last 17 road contests, their best mark over a 17-game span on the road since going a franchise-record 15-2 from June 15-July 23, 2014...they have done this despite going 8-8 across 16 home games in that span, including losses in six of their last eight contests at Tropicana Field...they pace the AL in road average (.285), slugging pct. (.457), OPS (.801), and home runs (25) over that timeframe—this, compared to their .256 average, .379 slugging pct., .680 OPS, and 13 HR at home across that span...on the mound, Rays pitchers have worked to a 2.94 ERA (153.0IP, 50ER) on the road since July 20 (2nd in MLB; NYY, 2.17) compared to a 4.16 (145.0IP, 67ER) mark at home (24th in MLB).

- ★ Before their 14-3 run, the Rays dropped 17 of their previous 23 road games (6-17, May 24-July 19) en route to a 21-27 mark away from home, 21st in the majors, and were an MLB-best 35-15 at home.

MOTOR CITY KITTIES—The Rays and Tigers continue their three-game series at Comerica Park tonight, the second set of a six-game season series that began when Detroit swept the Rays at Tropicana Field from June 1-3, which remains the only time they have been swept at home this season...marked the second time they have dropped their first three matchups with the Tigers to begin a season, joining 2011 (5G)...the Rays can, at best, tie the season series with a sweep, which would mark the second straight stalemate between the clubs (3-3 in 2025)...since winning nine of 10 against the Tigers between May 17, 2022-Aug. 4, 2023, the Rays have gone 7-12 in the last 19 meetings, including 2-6 in the last eight (June 22, 2025-pres.)...they have lost back-to-back sets at Comerica Park (2024-25) since taking two of three games at the venue in 2023 and three of four in 2022...overall, the Rays have lost six of their last eight meetings with Detroit and are 5-11 against the club since 2024.

- ★ **Yandy Diaz** is a career .302 (.55-for-182) hitter with 7 2B, 5 HR, 24 RBI, and 29 R across 47 games vs. Detroit...includes a .338/.376/.538 (27-for-80) slash line with seven multi-hit efforts in his last 19 games against the club (April 1, 2023-pres.).

DOWN ON THE FARM—**C Caden Bodine** [MLB, 51 | TB No. 3] and **INF Xavier Isaac** [TB No. 18] have been promoted to Triple-A Durham...Bodine hit .316 (48-for-152) in 37 games with Double-A Montgomery and ranks third among all qualified full-season minor league hitters with a .344 (143-for-416) average to go with 23 2B, 2 3B, 14 HR, 90 RBI, and a .413 OBP...his 143 hits are tied for fifth most in the full-season minor leagues...Bodine is set to become the third Rays prospect since 2009 to appear in a game at the Low-A, High-A, Double-A, and Triple-A levels in the same season, joining **INF Elis Barret** (2024) and **INF Gionti Turner** (2023)...in 99 games with Montgomery, Isaac slashed .255/.400/.510 (86-for-337) with 8 2B, 3 3B, 24 HR, 71 RBI, 80 BB, and 18 SB...he paces all Double-A hitters in walks, ranks third in on-base pct., and is fourth in OPS (.910) (min. 400PA).

* Of his 78 RBI, 66 have come vs. RHP, tied for third most in the AL and tied for sixth in MLB...is batting .315 (57-for-181) vs. RHP over his last 62G (June 14-pres.).						
* Has multiple hits in 20 of his last 64G (June 12-pres.), tied for fourth-most multi-hit efforts in the AL over that span...produced a career-high-tying four-game multi-hit streak (4x, last: May 25-29) from July 8-11...was the third time he's turned the trick this season and the only other Rays to do so this season are Yandy Díaz (June 17-21) and Chandler Simpson (Aug. 8-11).						
* In May, he led the majors in average (.374/34-for-91) and on-base pct. (.464)...he also ranked highly in OPS (2nd, 1.025) and hits (T2nd)...was the first Ray to lead MLB in average over a month since Díaz in June 2024 (.400)...his 43 RBI were second most in team history through May (Evan Longoria - 2019, 55RBI).

★	Is on an eight-game hitting streak (Aug. 17–pres.), two games shy of his career-best, 10-game streak (April 15-25, 2026)...he has an RBI in five of his last six games (Aug. 19–pres.) and 10 of his last 14 (Aug. 10–pres.).					
★	Ranks among AL leaders in home runs (2nd, 35), total bases (2nd, 265), SLG (2nd, .531), RBI (3rd, 84), XBH (4th, 56), runs (6th, 80), hits (T6th, 138), and walks (9th, 68)...since June 23, he paces MLB in HR (20), RBI (50), and total bases (130), and ranks highly in SLG (2nd, .602), XBH (4th, 29), and OPS (4th, .960).					
★	Through 131 team games, Caminero is on pace to finish the season with 43 homers and 104 RBI...he would become the 15th player in the modern era (since 1900) to have triple-digit RBI in multiple seasons in age-22-or-younger seasons, the first since FLA Miguel Cabrera (2004-05)...he has started every game this season – it would be the third instance in team history, alongside Evan Longoria (2014) and Aubrey Huff (2003).					
★	He is three home runs shy of becoming the 12th player in the modern era with 90 home runs before his age-23 season...he is five home runs shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with multiple 40-homer seasons, the second player in the modern era with back-to-back 40-home-run seasons in age-22-or-younger campaigns, and the first primary third baseman to have back-to-back 40-homer seasons since COL Nolan Arenado (2015-16).					
★	His 35 hits of 110 mph or faster this year are the most in the majors, ahead of WSH James Wood (30)...also leads the majors with 165 batted balls hit at 100 mph or faster and paces MLB with an average bat speed of 79.7 mph.					
★	Min. 200 AB, his .325 (78-for-240) average vs. fastballs ranks third in the AL...has tallied 29 of his 56 XBH vs. fastballs (11 2B, 18HR).					
★	Has hit an MLB-leading 11 HR on pitches outside the strike zone—COL Hunter Goodman ranks second in the majors with eight...marks the most such HR by a Ray during the pitch-tracking era (since 2008), surpassing Carlos Peña (8) in 2010...DET Miguel Cabrera (13, 2012) holds the MLB record.					
★	Has 79 home runs between his age-21 and age-22 seasons (2025-26; age as of June 30), second most in the modern era (since 1900) behind only Mathews (87, 1953-54).					
★	Launched his 35th home run of the campaign on Aug. 11 at ATH...he became the third player in the modern era with multiple 35-HR seasons before his age-23 season, joining SEA Alex Rodriguez (1998, 1996) and MLN Eddie Mathews (1953-54)...becoming the fourth Dominican-born third baseman in MLB history with multiple 35-HR seasons (also: José Ramírez , 3; Adrian Beltré , 2; Aramis Ramírez , 2)...he is also the second Ray with multiple 35-HR seasons (Carlos Peña - 2009, 2007) and the only Ray to have back-to-back 35-HR seasons.					
★	Clubbed 11 HR in 11 games (June 23–July 4), becoming MLB's youngest player and 12th overall to turn the trick, first since WSH Kyle Schwarber (June 19 [G2]-30, 2021)...from June 24–July 1, tied a club record with a HR in six straight games, becoming the youngest player in modern era (since 1900) to accomplish the feat...had 22 RBI during the 11G span, the 3rd player since 1957 to have 22 RBI in an 11G stretch before turning 23, joining SD Fernando Tatis Jr. (2021) and WSH Bryce Harper (2015).
