COLORADO ROCKIES (16-25) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (22-19)

May 12, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #42/Home #21

RHP Michael Lorenzen (2-4, 6.92 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (5-2, 2.36 ERA)

THE PIRATES: had the day off on Monday following a 3-3 road trip to Arizona (2-1, May 5-7) and San Francisco (1-2, Friday-Sunday)...Will begin a six-game homestand vs. Colorado (Tuesday-Thursday) and Philadelphia (May 15-17) with tonight's series opener against the Rockies...Have the best stolen base percentage (88.4, 38-for-43) in all of Major League Baseball...Have posted the sixth-best run differential (+31) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Atlanta (+87), New York-AL (+72), Los Angeles-NL (+63), Milwaukee (+54) and Chicago-NL (+47)...Have the fifth-best rotation ERA (3.43) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Atlanta (3.03), New York-AL (3.06), Tampa Bay (3.15) & Los Angeles-NL (3.28).

ROCK YOUR WORLD: Pittsburgh won four of six games against Colorado last season (the Rockies won two of three games from August 1-3 at Coors Field, while the Pirates swept a three-game series from August 22-24 at PNC Park)...Pittsburgh has gone 43-26 (.623) against Colorado since the beginning of the 2014 season and has won or split 10 of 11 season series during that time.

SKENES DAY: Paul Skenes will start for Pittsburgh in tonight's homestand opener vs. Colorado...He won a 1-0 decision after allowing just two hits (back-to-back singles from Lourdes Gurriel Jr. and Nolan Arenado in the fourth inning) and striking out seven batters over 8.0 scoreless innings in his last start on May 6 at Arizona...Skenes became only the sixth Pirate (seventh instance) to pitch at least 8.0 scoreless innings with seven strikeouts, two or fewer hits allowed and zero walks issued in a game during the Modern Era (since 1901), along with Bob Harmon (April 21, 1916 vs. St. Louis), Bullet Joe Bush (September 20, 1926 at Philadelphia), Bob Friend (September 7, 1955 at Chicago), Woodie Fryman (July 1, 1966 at New York) and Larry McWilliams (April 9, 1983 at Houston and September 20, 1983 at New York)...He has a 1.83 career ERA (73.2ip/15er) vs. the National League West.

INDISPENCEABLE: Spencer Horwitz went 2-for-5 with two doubles, three RBI and a walk on Sunday at San Francisco...He became one of only five Pirates since 2016 to have two doubles, three RBI and a walk in a game, joining Sean Rodríguez (June 29, 2016 at Seattle), Gregory Polanco (May 9, 2019 at St. Louis), Corey Dickerson (June 26, 2019 at Houston) and Andrew McCutchen (last year on August 22 vs. Colorado)...Horwitz has recorded at least one RBI in a career-high four straight games (six RBI total), dating back to May 7 at Arizona...The only Pirate to do that in at least five straight games last season was Tommy Pham (seven straight, June 22-30)...He is batting .333 (8-for-24) with four doubles, nine RBI, five walks and two runs in his last seven games (since May 2 vs. Cincinnati)...His nine RBI in that stretch are tied with New York (AL)'s Aaron Judge for the sixth-most in all of MLB.

HIGH FIVE: Pirates starting pitchers have tossed at least 5.0 innings in 11 straight games (since April 29 vs. St. Louis), their longest streak since an 11-game streak from April 25-May 6, 2024...Their last such streak of more than 11 games was a 15-game streak from April 1-17, 2024...Pittsburgh's 17 quality starts are tied with Detroit for the sixth-most in all of Major League Baseball.

KONNOR KONNECTS: Konnor Griffin hit his third home run with his solo blast (off Tyler Mahle) in the second inning on Sunday at San Francisco...He also homered on his 20th birthday (April 24 at Milwaukee)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Griffin became one of two Pittsburgh players to go deep on both his birthday and Mother's Day in the same season (since Mother's Day became an official holiday in 1914), along with Bill Robinson (1977)...He has gone 20-for-59 (.339) with three doubles, a triple, three home runs, 11 RBI, seven walks, five stolen bases and eight runs scored in his last 16 contests (since April 24).

MASTERFUL MASON: Mason Montgomery had a strikeout while tossing 1.2 scoreless innings of relief on Sunday at San Francisco...He has not allowed a run in his last 11 appearances/two starts (11.0ip), dating back to April 10 at Chicago-NL (he has lowered his ERA from 9.64 to 2.87 in that span)...Montgomery's 21 strikeouts out of the bullpen this season are tied with Philadelphia's Tanner Banks for the seventh-most among left-handed relievers in the National League, trailing only Milwaukee's Aaron Ashby (37), New York's Sean Manaea (26), San Diego's Adrian Morejon (26), teammate Gregory Soto (26), Atlanta's Dylan Lee (23) and Cincinnati's Brock Burke (22)...He has also allowed just one home run over 15.2 total innings of work.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

May 12, 1987: Pittsburgh overcame a 2-0 deficit and went on to defeat San Diego, 12-5, at Three Rivers Stadium. Barry Bonds, who went 3-for-5 with a walk, a stolen base and four runs scored, gave the Pirates the lead for good with his three-run home run off Padres starter Andy Hawkins in the second inning. Rick Reuschel improved to 2-2 after allowing three earned runs over his 6.0 innings of work.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes won a 1-0 decision after allowing just two hits (he did not surrender a walk) and striking out seven batters across his 8.0 scoreless innings of work on May 6 at Arizona...He became only the sixth Pirate (seventh instance) to pitch at least 8.0 scoreless innings with seven strikeouts, two or fewer hits allowed and zero walks issued in a game during the Modern Era (since 1901), along with Bob Harmon (April 21, 1916 vs. St. Louis), Bullet Joe Bush (September 20, 1926 at Philadelphia), Bob Friend (September 7, 1955 at Chicago), Woodie Fryman (July 1, 1966 at New York) and Larry McWilliams (April 9, 1983 at Houston and September 20, 1983 at New York).

AGAINST THE ROCKIES: Skenes has a 3.00 ERA (12.0ip/4er) in two career starts against Colorado...He had a no-decision after allowing four runs over 5.0 innings last year on August 2 at Coors Field (the Pirates lost, 8-5)...Skenes also won a 4-0 decision after allowing just three hits in 7.0 innings of work last year on August 24 at PNC Park.

HOW THE WEST WAS WON: Skenes is 8-1 with a 1.83 ERA (73.2ip/15er) and 84 strikeouts in 12 career starts vs. the National League West...He is 7-0 with a 0.88 ERA (51.1ip/5er) & 61 strikeouts in his last eight starts vs. the division (since April 25, 2025).

CASHING IN AT PNC: Skenes has a 2.10 ERA (184.1ip/43er) in 31 career starts at PNC Park...The only Major League pitchers with a lower home ERA since May 11, 2024 (debut date) are Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (1.89)/Detroit's Tarik Skubal (2.09).

TRAFFIC CONTROL: Skenes allowed just two baserunners (back-to-back singles from Lourdes Gurriel Jr. and Nolan Arenado in the fourth inning) over 8.0 innings in his last start on May 6 at Arizona...His 6.86 baserunners per 9.0 innings rank first in all of MLB.

BEST OF THE BEST: Skenes' 2.01 ERA (362.2ip/81er) through his first 63 Major League starts is the third-best mark among all Major League pitchers since earned runs became an official stat in both leagues in 1913, trailing only Boston (AL)'s Rube Foster (1.88, 1913-15) and Boston (AL)'s Ernie Shore (1.96, 1914-16)...His 22 scoreless starts (last on May 6 at Arizona) in his first 63 career starts are the most by any pitcher since 1901.

HISTORIC PERFORMANCE: Skenes pitched 6.2 perfect innings before allowing a single to Jake Bauers on April 24 at Milwaukee (he went on to strike out seven batters and surrender just the one hit over his 7.0 innings)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he tied Nellie Briles (August 22, 1972 at San Francisco), Bert Blyleven (August 16, 1980 vs. Montréal) and Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) for the third-longest perfect game bid by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Ken Brett (8.0ip, May 27, 1974 vs. San Diego) and Jeff Karstens (7.2ip, August 6, 2008 at Arizona)...Skenes was the sixth Pittsburgh pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have a start of at least 7.0 scoreless innings with one or zero hits allowed, zero walks issued and at least seven strikeouts...Skenes joined Bob Friend (September 7, 1955 at Chicago), Woodie Fryman (July 1, 1966 at New York), A.J. Burnett (April 17, 2013 vs. St. Louis), Kingham (April 29, 2018) & Jared Jones (May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado).

WHAT'S UP, DOC: Skenes won the National League Cy Young Award in 2025, one year after being named the National League Rookie of the Year...He became the second pitcher in Major League history to win the Rookie of the Year Award and the Cy Young Award in consecutive seasons, along with the Mets' Dwight Gooden (1984-85)...Skenes joined Vernon Law (1960) & Doug Drabek (1990) as the only Pirates to win the award.

FOR A GOOD CAUSE: Skenes has pledged to donate \$100 for every strikeout he records to the Gary Sinise Foundation to support our nation's defenders, veterans, first responders, their families and those in need...Skenes, who spent his first two collegiate seasons (2021-22) at the United States Air Force (CO) Academy, raised \$500,000 for the foundation at his Raising Cane's event in Royal Palm Beach, FL, this past Veterans Day.

 Has thrown out three runners attempting to steal against him this season...Has started behind the plate in two of Pittsburgh's five shutouts in 2026.
 Has hit safely during eight of his last 11 starts, dating back to 4/14 (.342/13-for-38)...Hit his two homers on 4/14 vs. Washington and 5/7 at Arizona.

 Is 17-for-50 (.340) with four home runs, 11 RBI and a .985 OPS against left-handed pitchers this season (he was 11-for-108 vs. southpaws last year).

 Is 20-for-59 (.339) with seven extra-base hits, 11 RBI, seven walks, five stolen bases and eight runs in his last 16 contests (since 4/24 at Milwaukee).
