METSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Diamondbacks, 5-2, last night...The Mets remain a season-high 4.0 games ahead in the NL East...The Mets continue a six-game road trip to Arizona (1-1) and St. Louis (three games)...Following this trip, the Mets are off on Thursday before beginning their second homestand of the season, a six-day, seven game homestand against the Phillies (three games) and Braves (four games).

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Mets are looking for their fifth series victory of the season tonight...The Mets have won each of their first four series of the season for the third time in franchise history...They also accomplished this feat in 2006 (first four series) and in 2018 (first five series)...Courtesy of *Elias*.

INVADER NIM: In 12 games this year, Brandon Nimmo is .302 (13-43) with nine runs, two doubles, a triple, two home runs, three RBI and eight walks...His career .393 career on-base percentage ranks second in team history, behind only John Olerud's .425 mark (min. 1,000 plate appearances).

STARTING OFF: The Mets starting staff has gone 8-2 with a 2.44 ERA (23 earned runs/84.2 innings) with 18 walks and 89 strikeouts...The starting staff leads the majors in WHIP (0.89), opponent's batting average (.189) and strikeouts and is second in the majors in ERA and innings.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets are batting .278/.366/.413 with runners in scoring position this year...They rank fourth in the NL and seventh in the majors with a .278 batting average, are third in NL in OBP and SLG... Their 55 RBI with RISP is second in the NL and third in the majors... In 2021, the Mets hit .238/.334/.370 with RISP...Their .238 batting average ranked 25th in the majors and 13th in the Senior Circuit.

THIS ONE GOES TO 11: The Mets have posted an 11-5 record through the team's first 16 games...That is tied for the fourth-best record in team history (also, 2007, 2006 1988 and 1972)...New York's pitching staff has struck out 161 this season...That ranks fifth in team history... The 2018 Mets (165) own the record...The team's 161 strikeouts lead the major leagues.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: New York leads the major leagues in hits (136), is second in runs (75), OBP (.343), fourth in walks (62), fifth in average (.255), tied for fifth in home runs (15), seventh in OPS (.735) and 10th in SLG (.392)...Through 16 games this year, the Mets have outscored their opponents 75-47.

MY BAD: The Mets have committed just one error over their last 11 games...Overall, the Mets have committed only four errors this year... That is the second-fewest in the National League and tied for the third-fewest in the majors...The Mets rank third in the majors with a .933 fielding percentage.

IT'S WAR: Eduardo Escobar is 11th in the majors with a 1.0 fWAR...He has recorded seven doubles in 15 games this year...That is tied for second in the National League...Nine of Escobar's 14 hits have gone for extra bases...He has drawn 13 walks in 15 games this year...That is tied for the third-most in the majors...Escobar drew a total of 48 walks in 146 games last season.

THE CHARMING MAN: In seven games this season, Drew Smith has posted a perfect ERA, allowing only three hits and three walks while striking out eight in 7.0 innings of work...He owns a career record of 4-3 with a 2.92 ERA (27 earned runs/83.1 innings) with 27 walks and 743 strikeouts...Smith was acquired by the Mets from the Tampa Bay Rays on July 27, 2017 in exchange for Lucas Duda.

DBACKS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won the season series in each of the last three years...Since 2019, the Mets have posted a 18-7 record against Arizona...That is their best record against any NL opponent in that span.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is batting .305 (18-59) with 12 runs, four doubles, four home runs, 11 RBI, 10 walks, three steals, a .408 OBP, a .576 SLG and a .985 OPS...He has safely reached base in 15 of the 16 games this season...He ranks fourth in the major leagues with a 1.1 fWAR this year.

THE BANK IS OPEN: Eduardo Escobar, who played for the Diamondbacks from 2018-21, is a .268/.320/.509 hitter with 113 runs, 38 doubles, 13 triples, 35 home runs, 117 RBI and 56 walks in 185 career games at Chase Field...Starling Marte has played 34 career games at Chase Field and has hit .362/.425/.529 with 14 doubles, three triples, a home run, 11 walks and 16 RBI in the ballpark...Dominic Smith is 13-36 (.361) with four doubles, three home runs, five RBI and four walks in 11 games in Arizona...Brandon Nimmo 8-25 (.320) with two doubles, two home runs and three RBI in six games in AZ, while James McCann has gone 7-21 (.333) with a double, three home runs and nine RBI in six games at Chase Field.

NEED FOR SPEED: The Mets have totaled 11 stolen bases through 16 games...That is for second in the major leagues...The Mets did not record their 11th steal until May 17 last season in the team's 36th game...Overall, the Mets stole a total of 54 bases in 2021...Francisco Lindor and Starling Marte are tied for seventh in the majors with three steals.

DESIGNATED FOR HITTING: As a team, Mets designated hitters are batting .300 (18-60) with 11 runs, five doubles, four home runs, 14 RBI, seven walks, a .382 OBP and a .583 SLG...They rank second in SLG and OBP, are tied for second in doubles, third in average and tied for third in home runs.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is tied for third in the majors and tied for the lead in the NL with 16 RBI...He is batting .258 (16-62) with nine runs, three doubles, three home runs, 16 RBI, two walks and a .452 SLG this year...He is batting .353 (6-17) with six runs, two doubles, three homes, 11 RBI with a 1.389 OPS in four games as a designated hitter this year.

MOVING ON UP: Pete Alonso hit his 109th career home run last Sunday vs. Arizona...That breaks his tie with José Reyes for sole possession of 13th on the team's all-time list...Ed Kranepool (118) is next, followed by Edgardo Alfonzo (120).

OUCH: The Mets have been hit by 12 pitches this year, which leads the majors...New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 319 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 42 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019... Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 56 HBP, while Starling Marte is tied for fifth (40) in the last four seasons.

THAT'S SHOW BUSINESS: Buck Showalter is in his first year with the Mets...He became the first manager in Mets history to win each of his first three contests...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins.

MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Today, Megill makes his fourth start of the season and his first career appearance against Arizona...In his last start, he allowed four runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings on April 19 vs. San Francisco at Citi Field...Saw his scoreless streak end at 17.1 innings, falling just 0.1 innings shy of tying his career-high...He left the game with the score tied before the Mets walked off in the 10th inning.

CONTROL: Megill walked zero batters in each of his first two starts before walking a pair in his last start...He has walked just two hitters and has whiffed 15 in his first three starts of the season...In his career, Megill has walked just 29 in 106.0 innings and has racked up 114 strikeouts.

STREAKING: Megill has won three straight decisions, marking the first time he has won consecutive decisions in his career...New York has won each of his last four starts, equaling the longest team winning streak in his starts in his career...The Mets also won the first four starts of his career, June 23-July 10 last season.

100 KLUB: Megill punched out César Hernández looking, his first batter faced, on April 7 at Washington for the 100th strikeout of his career...He is the seventh Mets hurler who began his career with New York to record 100 or more strikeouts in his first 19 career starts with the club...He is the first to accomplish the feat since Steven Matz in 2016.

2021 RECAP: Had his contract selected on June 23 and remained with the Mets for the rest of the season...Went 4-6 in 18 starts with a 4.52 ERA (45 earned runs/89.2 innings), 27 walks and 99 strikeouts...Among pitchers to make their first 18 career starts with the Mets, his 99 punchouts rank seventh...Posted a major league-leading 1.04 ERA in July (min. 25.0 IP), one of three pitchers in Mets history to post an ERA of 1.04 or lower in the month of July...Held right-handed batters to a .200 average, the 10th-best mark in the National League (min. 175 batters faced)...His .244 opponents' OBP against righties ranked fourth in the NL.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Megill made his major league debut when he earned the start on June 23, 2021 vs. Atlanta...He allowed two runs on three hits (one home run) and two walks with four strikeouts through 4.1 innings...He recorded his first big league punchout when William Contreras struck out on a foul tip in the second frame...Megill earned his first major league win on July 23, 2021 vs. Toronto after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings in his sixth big league start and his second straight quality start.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY: His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut last season...According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (3-0, 2.50)

LAST TIME OUT: Took a no-hitter into the sixth inning in his Mets home debut...Allowed his first knock, a run-scoring single off the bat of Darin Ruf, with two outs in the sixth...Recorded his 105th career double-digit strikeout game.

JUST WIN, BABY: Won his 14th straight decision, a career-best winning streak...His teams are unbeaten in his last 16 regular season starts...He has not taken a loss in 22 straight starts, tied for the 12th-longest streak in modern MLB history
