First Inning

Minnesota plated a pair of runs in last night's first inning, and has six total first-inning runs through two games this series.

On the season, Atlanta's 4.71 ERA (66 ER/126.0 IP) in the first frame ranks 19th in the majors. From the second inning on, the Braves' 3.51 ERA sits fourth.

The Braves have a run differential of -8 (63 scored, 71 allowed) in the first frame this season, and a differential of +120 (539 scored, 419 allowed) in all other innings.

TODAY'S GAME: The Braves and Twins today conclude a three-game mid-week series in what are the only scheduled matchups between the clubs this season...The clubs last saw each for three games at Truist Park in Atlanta in April of 2025.

 Minnesota has won each of the first two games of this set, meaning Atlanta has now lost its first-ever series here at Target Field...The Braves entered the week 9-2 (.818) here all time since the park opened in 2010, including five straight wins dating to 2019.

 The Twins have swept a three-game series against the Braves just once before, taking all three games at the Metrodome in 2007...That sweep is, in fact, the only time Minnesota had ever won a three-game set versus Atlanta prior to this week.

 Atlanta and Minnesota have played just 30 total games since the advent of interleague play in 1997, with the Braves going 20-10 (.667) all-time against the Twins...The two franchises squared off in the 1991 World Series, with Minnesota claiming the title in seven games.

 RH Taj Bradley is set to make the third start of his career against Atlanta this afternoon, and has gone 1-1 with a 4.09 ERA (5 ER/11.0 IP) over his first two turns...The 6-foot-2, 220-pound Los Angeles native pitched against the Braves last April while with Tampa Bay, and fanned seven over 6.0 one-run innings to earn the win...The Twins have lost each of his three starts this month, during which he owns a 6.60 ERA (11 ER/15.0 IP).

AJ SMITH-SHAWVER: Atlanta recalled RH AJ Smith-Shawver from Triple-A Gwinnett yesterday afternoon, and he is set to make his second start of the season this afternoon...Today marks his first every appearance against the Twins.

 Smith-Shawver is the reigning International League Pitcher of the Week after tossing 5.1 scoreless, one-hit innings on August 11 for Triple-A Gwinnett at Norfolk...He fanned seven...In seven total minor-league starts this season between his rehabilitation assignment and option, the right-hander is 2-0 with a 1.57 ERA and 34 strikeouts over 28.2 innings.

 The 6-foot-3, 205-pound Texan made his season debut with the Braves in Game 1 of a doubleheader against the Mets on July 29, and allowed two runs over 4.1 innings in a no-decision...He missed Atlanta's first 106 games while recovering from Tommy John surgery, and was optioned to Gwinnett following that start at Citi Field.

 Originally selected by Atlanta in the seventh round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft, he was the club's top overall prospect in 2024...In 17 career games in the majors, 16 of which are starts, he is 4-2 with a 3.79 ERA (33 ER/78.1 IP).

 His four-seam fastball averaged 97.2 mph in his start vs. New York, and the Mets went 1-for-8 against it.

OFFENSE: Atlanta managed just one run is last night's loss, and has scored just three runs over the first two games of this series...Drake Baldwin (2-for-4) and Michael Harris (3-for-4) combined for five of the Braves' six hits last night, while the rest of the lineup went 1-for-25 (.040).

 The Braves are just 1-4 in their last five games, and have hit .186/.220/.298 with 11 total runs scored in that span...Atlanta is 5-for-32 (.156) with runners in scoring position in that span, including 1-for-12 (.083) in this series at Minnesota.

TWIN CONNECTIONS: Four of Atlanta's 10 assistant coaches return to Minnesota this week after spending time on staff with the Twins earlier in their careers...Monday's starter Martín Pérez also made 32 appearances and 29 starts for Minnesota in 2019, his lone season with the club, while last night's starter Tyler Mahle made nine starts for the Twins across 2022 and 2023.

 Tommy Watkins returns to Minneapolis this season after 28 years in the Twins organization...He was selected by Minnesota in the 38th round of the 1998 draft and spent his entire professional career in the organization prior to joining Atlanta this offseason...Following his playing career he coached nine seasons in Minnesota's minor leagues, before spending seven seasons (2019-2025) as a base coach on the major league staff.

 Tony Diaz spent six seasons on staff with the Twins, from 2019-24, as third-base coach (2019-21) and assistant bench coach ('22-24).

 Jeremy Hefner was Minnesota's assistant pitching coach in 2019 after serving as the Twins' advance scout in 2017-18.

 J.P. Martinez worked for six seasons as a minor league coach in Minnesota's system, from 2015-2020, before his first major league appointment with the Giants in 2021.

RONALD NEARING HISTORY: Ronald Acuña Jr. drove a 2-2 changeup in Saturday night's first inning out to center field for his 13th home run of the season...The drive was also the 199th home run of his career.

 Acuña Jr.'s next home run will stand as the 200th of his career, and he is looking to become the fastest player in major league history, by games played, to reach at least 200 home runs and 200 stolen bases.

 Alfonso Soriano holds the current record, swiping a pair of bases in his 929th career game to reach 203 home runs and 201 stolen bases...Acuña Jr. currently has 220 stolen bases to go with his 199 home runs...Today's game will be the 892nd of his career.

 Just two Braves in history have reached 200 career homers prior to playing their 892nd game...Bob Horner hit his 200th in his 882nd game in 1986, while Eddie Mathews needed just 779 games to reach the mark in 1957.

Today's Game

- Makes his second start of the season and the 17th of his major league career in the finale of a three-game series at Minnesota.
- Is facing the Twins for the first time and pitching at Target Field for the first time.
- Was recalled from Triple-A Gwinnett on August 18 and makes his first start since rejoining the Braves.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.64 ERA (2 ER/11.0 IP) and 13 strikeouts over two starts with Gwinnett after being optioned July 30, allowing three hits and no home runs.
- His most recent major league outing came July 29 at New York (NL), a no-decision in which he allowed two runs over 4.1 innings in Game 1 of a doubleheader.
- Both runs scored in the fifth, his final inning, and Francisco Alvarez's double was the only extra-base hit he allowed.
- That start was his first major league appearance since May 29, 2025, having missed Atlanta's first 106 games while recovering from Tommy John surgery.
- Went 3-2 with a 3.86 ERA (19 ER/44.1 IP) and 42 strikeouts over nine starts with the Braves in 2025...Atlanta went 5-4 in his turns.
- Owns a 4-2 record and a 3.79 ERA (33 ER/78.1 IP) with 70 strikeouts in 17 career major league games, 16 of them starts.

2026

- Was placed on the 15-day injured list March 25 with right elbow reconstruction and transferred to the 60-day injured list April 3.
- Did not appear in a spring training game.
- Made five rehab starts from June 30 to July 23, going 1-0 with a 1.53 ERA (3 ER/17.2 IP) with 21 strikeouts and five walks...Built his pitch count from 41 in the first outing to 86 in the last.
- Made his season debut July 29 at New York (NL), allowing two runs over 4.1 innings in a no-decision, his first major league start since May 29, 2025.
- Was optioned to Triple-A Gwinnett on July 30 and recalled by Atlanta on August 18.
- Made two starts for Gwinnett during the option, going 1-0 with a 1.64 ERA (2 ER/11.0 IP) and 13 strikeouts...Fanned seven over 5.1 innings in his most recent outing, August 11 against Norfolk, allowing one hit.

2025

- Went 3-2 with a 3.86 ERA (19 ER/44.1 IP) over nine starts, striking out 42 against 21 walks...Atlanta was 5-4 in his turns.
- Was placed on the 15-day injured list that day with a strained right elbow, transferred to the 60-day injured list May 30.
- Carried a no-hitter through 7.0 innings against Cincinnati on May 5, before Santiago Espinal led off the eighth inning with a single, the Reds' only hit of the game.
- Completed 8.0 scoreless innings, the longest outing of his professional career.
- Earned his second win of the season in the 4-0 victory.
- Allowed a career-high seven runs over 3.0 innings May 22 at Washington.
- Earned his first win of the season April 29 at Colorado, holding the Rockies to four hits and two runs over 5.1 innings.
- Was removed as a precaution after being hit by a comebacker on the right arm.
- Made his first Opening Day roster with Atlanta...Was optioned to Gwinnett on April 13 and recalled April 29.
- Thirty-three of his 42 strikeouts came on the splitter...Opponents hit .143 (10-for-70) against the pitch without a home run.
- Held opponents to a .156 average (10-for-64) over three starts at Truist Park and .305 (32-for-105) over six road starts...Both of his quality starts came at home.

2024

- Started Game 1 of the NL Wild Card Series against San Diego at 21 years, 316 days old, becoming the youngest pitcher in Braves franchise history to start Game 1 of a postseason series...Allowed four hits, three runs and a homer in 1.1 innings.
- Just one Atlanta pitcher has started any playoff game at a younger age...Steve Avery made four starts in the 1991 playoffs, including two in the World Series, between 21 years, 179 days and 21 years, 195 days old.
- Went a combined 3-8 with a 4.85 ERA between Triple-A Gwinnett and High-A Rome, averaging 10.92 strikeouts per 9.0 innings between the two levels.

Career Recap

- Became the youngest pitcher to make his first start for Atlanta since Julio Teheran on May 7, 2011...Just one pitcher in baseball started at a younger age in 2023, with Eury Pérez making five such starts for Miami.
- Had thrown 33.0 professional innings prior to his debut.
- At 20 years, 207 days old, he became the youngest Braves starting pitcher to earn a win since Steve Avery (20 years, 132 days) on August 24, 1990 against Chicago (NL).
- Beat Colorado on June 15, 2023...It was just the sixth time in Atlanta franchise history (since 1966) that a pitcher his age or younger was credited with a win.
- Drafted by Atlanta in the seventh round of the 2021 MLB June Amateur Draft out of Colleyville Heritage High School in Colleyville, Texas...Born in Fort Worth, Texas.
