**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets defeated the Pirates, 7-3, yesterday to complete a four-game sweep...The Mets completed their sixth sweep of the season and their first four game sweep of the Bucs since September 13-16, 2010 at Citi Field...The Mets are 75-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 33-10-3 in 46 series this year...The Mets begin a seven-day, six-game road trip to Milwaukee (three games) and Oakland (three games).

**20/20 VISION:** Yesterday, the Mets set a franchise record and tied a major-league for most strikeouts in a nine-inning game with 20 strikeouts...They became the ninth team in major league history to have 20 strikeouts in a nine-inning game...Also accomplished by Houston this season.

**TOTAL deGROMINATION:** Yesterday, Jacob deGrom set a major league record with his 40th consecutive start allowing three earned runs or fewer...The previous record was held by Jim Scott from 1913-1914...He has not allowed more than five hits or three runs in 29 straight games, tying Tony Gonsolin for the longest such streak in MLB history...In addition, he has allowed four runs or fewer and eight hits or fewer in 59 consecutive starts dating back to May 22, 2019, tying Rich Hill (May 4, 2019 - May 24, 2022) for the longest such streak in major league history.

**HIGH FIVE:** deGrom now has five career games with at least 13 strikeouts and zero walks, tied with Max Scherzer and Gerrit Cole for the third-most such starts since 2015...Dwight Gooden, Tom Seaver and Sid Fernandez are the only other pitchers to have multiple starts with 13 or more strikeouts and zero walks in franchise history...All three have two such starts apiece...He is the first pitcher (excluding openers) since Hyun Jin Ryu (2019) to allow four or fewer walks through their first nine starts of the season (Min. 40.0 innings).

**1010 WINS:** deGrom recorded his fourth double-digit strikeout game of the season of his career and 57th of his career...Is three shy of tying Tom Seaver's franchise record for most double-digit strikeout games...Overall, the Mets have recorded 79 double-digit strikeout games this year...That is a franchise record and the most in the majors.

**HECK OR HIGHWATER:** The Mets are a season-high 38 games over .500...It is their most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60), their highwater mark for the year...The Mets have won 93 games...That is the third-most in the major leagues...The last time they won more games was in 2006, when they tallied 97 victories...The Mets have only recorded 100 wins in a season three times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The Mets are 93-55 through 148 games...That is the second-best record in Mets history through 148 games...Only the 1986 team (97-51) posted a better record.

**GRAND CENTRAL STATION:** The Mets are 21-9 against the NL Central this year...They are in a stretch of 10 straight games (4-3) against the division...The Mets have posted a 2.85 ERA with 81 walks and 337 strikeouts against the division...They are hitting .262/.352/.396 against the Central...The team's 21 wins against the division are the most since they went 22-10 in 2016...The team's .700 winning percentage is tied for the highest in franchise history...The 2007 team was 28-12 (.700) against the Central.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets seeking their 44rd win on the road this year...That is tied with the 2016, 2011 and 1987 team for eighth-most in franchise history...Their next road victory would be their highest total since they went 47-34 in 2007...Their .597 road winning percentage is the third-best in franchise history...Only the 1986 (.654) and 1969 (.600) teams have better winning percentages on the road...Their .597 road winning percentage is third-best in MLB and second-best in the NL...Overall they are 43-29 on the road this year...New York is batting .264/.333/.424 away from Citi Field...Their .264 road average is the best in the NL and third in the majors and their .329 OBP on the road ranks second in the majors and in the NL.

**EL JEFF-E:** Jeff McNeil is batting .355 (82-231) with 28 runs, 22 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 24 RBI, 14 walks with a .401 OBP and a .498 SLG in 61 road games this year...His .355 road batting average leads the major leagues...He is batting .348/.398/.485 in 53 games following the All-Star break...His .348 average is second in the NL...McNeil has struck out just 59 times in 478 at-bats this year...Overall this season, McNeil ranks sixth among qualified hitters and second in the NL with an 11.1 percent strikeout rate.

**ABOVE AVERAGE:** Jeff McNeil is third in the majors and in the National League with a .320 batting average...He is behind only Freddie Freeman (.331) and Paul Goldschmidt (.322) for the major league lead...José Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned a batting champion after hitting .337 in 2011.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo is batting .306 with 56 runs, 14 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 40 RBI, 37 walks with a .404 OBP, a .500 SLG and a .904 OPS in 71 road games this year...This compares to a .221/.309/.329 slashline with 16 RBI and a .639 OPS in 68 games at home in 2022...His .404 road OBP ranks eighth in the majors and third in the National League.

**BREWERS-METS NOTES:** The Mets have dropped 13 of their last 18 games to the Brewers dating to May 25, 2018.

**HURTS DONUT:** The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 102 times this year, setting a franchise record...Since 1901, the Reds set the major league record in 2021 after they were hit by 105 pitches...Mark Canha has been plunked 21 times this year, which is second in the majors...His 21 hit by pitches are tied for the second-highest single-season total in franchise history...He joins Pete Alonso (2019) and Jeff McNeil (2019)...Brandon Nimmo set the record with 22 HBP in 2018.

**YOU CAN FIND ME IN ST. LUCIE:** The St. Lucie Mets defeated the Dunedin Blue Jays, 6-5, in game one of the Florida State League Championship Series last night...With the Mets trailing 5-4 and down to their last out of the ninth, Carlos Dominguez launched a go-ahead two-run home run to center field off Blue Jays reliever Trey Cumble to put the Mets up 6-5...Game 2 will be Tuesday at Clover Park at 6:10 p.m. and if necessary Game 3 will be Wednesday at Clover Park at 6:10 p.m...The Mets are seeking their first FSL title since 2006.

**HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG:** Edwin Diaz leads major league relievers with 107 strikeouts...That is 17 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest pitcher to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Diaz has posted a 0.75 ERA (three earned runs/36.0 innings) with 17 hits, eight walks and 69 strikeouts in 35 appearances since the start of June.

**HOW STRIKING:** The Mets have struck out 1,427 batters this season, which places them a top the majors...The team's 1,427 strikeouts are already the fourth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.75 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (26.2 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

**GIVE ME A BREAK:** The Mets have posted a .636 winning percentage (35-20) following the All-Star break...That is the fourth-highest winning percentage in franchise history, right below the 1969 (.671), 1988 (.644) and 2019 (.639) squads...The team's 35 wins are tied for tied for fourth-most in the majors...The Mets are batting .268/.344/.430 with 60 home runs in 55 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets rank third in average, first in OBP and sixth in SLG following the break.

**PICK SIX:** Pete Alonso has recorded an RBI in six straight games...It is the longest current streak in the majors and the longest streak of his career...Overall, he has recorded 364 RBI through his first 517 career games...Among active players, only Albert Pujols (408), Evan Longoria (365), and Miguel Cabrera (365) totaled more RBI in their first 517 games in the majors.

**RIB EYE STEAKS:** Francisco Lindor has recorded a career-high 94 RBI this season...His 94 RBI are a franchise record for a shortstop...Pete Alonso is second in the majors and owns the National League lead with 115 RBI this season...Only five times in franchise history have the Mets had multiple players with 100 more RBI on the same team...The 2008 Mets were the last team to accomplish this feat (Carlos Beltrán, Carlos Delgado and David Wright).

**LINDOR CITY:** Francisco Lindor has hit 24 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 homer runs in 2018, for the most home runs by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .300/.372/.465 with 34 runs, nine doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 28 RBI, 22 walks with an .837 OPS in 55 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks sixth in the National League with a 6.3 fWAR this season.

**TOMÁS THE TANK ENGINE:** Tomás Nido is on a six-game hitting streak, batting 11-22 (.500) with six runs, three doubles, two home runs, five RBI, a walk with a .522 OBP and a .909 SLG in that span...He is batting .310 (27-87) with 14 runs, nine doubles, two home runs, 11 RBI, five walks with a .344 OBP and a .483 SLG in 31 games since the All-Star Break.

### SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Left the game after 5.0 innings feeling fatigued on his left side...Was placed on the IL with left side irritation on September 7, retroactive to September 4...Before exiting, allowed one run on three hits, including a solo homer, in 5.0 innings with a walk and five strikeouts...Reached the 150-strikeout mark in a season for the 13th time in his career, tied with Justin Verlander for the eighth most such seasons all-time.

**20/20 VISION:** His 2.26 ERA (32 ER/127.2 IP) is the best all-time mark by a Mets pitcher through their first 20 games with the franchise (min. 100.0 IP)...His 0.92 WHIP is the second-best by a Mets pitcher through 20 games (min. 100.0 IP)...Pedro Martinez had a 0.85 WHIP in his first 20 games with the Mets.

**REHAB:** Started for Syracuse (AAA) on September 14, throwing 3.2 innings and allowing one run on three hits with a walk and seven strikeouts...Was his first game at Triple-A since 2010.

**MILESTONE ALERT:** Scherzer has 199 career wins, one away from joining an exclusive club of active pitchers with 200+ victories...Justin Verlander (243) and Zack Greinke (223) are the only active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career...He is 199-101 in his career...If he wins his next decision, he will reach 200 career wins and be 99 games over .500...Elias says there are only five pitchers in the modern era whose 200th career win came with fewer losses on their résumé: Pedro Martinez (200-84), Juan Marichal (200-97), Whitey Ford (200-79), Lefty Grove (200-83) and Grover Cleveland Alexander (200-96)...Randy Johnson was also 99 games over .500 at the time of his 200th career victory.

**200 SPRINT:** Scherzer's 200th win, if it happens today, would come in his 428th career game...He would be the 30th pitcher to win 200 of his first 428 career appearances...The other 29 pitchers include 23 Hall of Famers as well as Roger Clemens, Andy Pettitte, CC Sabathia, Justin Verlander, Tim Hudson and George Mullin.

**RETURN OF THE MAX:** Since returning from the IL for the first time on July 5, Scherzer has gone 4-3 with a 2.08 ERA (18 ER/78.0 IP) in 11 starts...That is the third-lowest ERA in the NL and the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...Despite missing the last two weeks, he is tied for eighth in the major leagues with 94 strikeouts since that date...He leads the NL and ranks fourth in the majors with an 7.83 K/BB ratio since July 5.

**VS. MILWAUKEE:** Has made 10 starts in his career against the Brewers, including a 2019 Wild Card Game start en route to a World Series championship with Washington...In 10 regular season outings (nine starts), Scherzer is 2-3 with a 2.37 ERA (15 ER/57.0 IP)...He has whiffed 10 batters in each of his last two regular season appearances against the Brew Crew.

**DOUBLE THE FUN:** Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...Roger Clemens also had 110 in his career...Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212) are the top two.

**THE 7.0 LINE:** Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings eight times in 20 starts this season...Each time Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings this season, he has finished his outing with one or no runs allowed...Despite missing a total of nine weeks on the Injured List, those eight outings of 7.0+ innings while allowing one or no runs are still tied for the fourth-most in the majors.

**CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD:** Scherzer entered the 2022 season as the active leader in strikeouts...He was passed by Justin Verlander while on the IL and the two veterans have been swapping places on the leaderboard since...He now ranks 14th all-time, three behind Verlander...Scherzer is still within striking distance of Fergie Jenkins as well this season...He needs 20 strikeouts to pass Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

**HARD TO BEAT POCKET ACES:** Scherzer had 44 strikeouts in August and teammate Jacob deGrom punched out 55 last month...It's the first time a pair of Mets each recorded at least 44 strikeouts in the same calendar month since David Cone (47) and Sid Fernandez (44) each did it in August 1990...The only duo in Mets history to produce more than Scherzer and deGrom's 99 August strikeouts in a calendar month is Tom Seaver (53) and Jerry Koosman (47) who combined for 100 strikeouts in June 1969.
