**TODAY'S TILT**...the Mariners continue the 7-day, 6-game homestand with the 2nd of 3 games against the Toronto Blue Jays (0-1)...Seattle swept the Angels in a 3-game set to open the homestand...following Sunday's game, the Mariners will travel to play the Miami Marlins (3 G, 7/7-7/9) and Tampa Bay Rays (7/10-7/12) on their final road trip before the All-Star Break...today's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as field analyst...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call and on **ESPN Radio** with **Roxy Bernstein** and **Madison Shipman** on the call.

**ODDS & ENDS**...the Mariners dropped yesterday's series opener against the Blue Jays by a 2-0 score... Seattle is 30-12 (.714) when scoring 4+ runs and 18-6 (.750) when they record 10+ hits.

- **Wild Wild West** - The Mariners (45-44) are 2nd in the AL West, trailing the 1st place Texas Rangers (45-43) by a 0.5 game.
- **Dynamic Duo Sets Sights on Futures Game** - LHP **Kade Anderson** (MLB Pipeline's No. 5 prospect) and RHP **Ryan Sloan** (MLB Pipeline's No. 8 prospect) were both named to the All-Star Futures Game roster, set for Sunday, July 12 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia.
- **Programming Note** - Tomorrow's game against the Blue Jays will be televised live exclusively on **Peacock** with **Aaron Goldsmith**, **Ryan Rowland-Smith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call.
- **Fourth Flashback** - Today's starter **Logan Gilbert** threw a complete game shutout on July 4, 2023 at San Francisco...it remains the last complete game shutout thrown by a Mariners pitcher...the Mariners are 20-25 all-time on Independence Day.
- **What A Relief** - The Mariners bullpen has an active 7.0 inning scoreless streak dating back to the 8th inning of Tuesday's game.
- **Luck Is A Part of It** - The Mariners batting average on balls in play of .275 is 3rd-lowest in MLB.
- **Yesterday's Roster Moves** - Yesterday, the Mariners selected INF/OF **Miles Mastrobuoni** from Triple-A Tacoma, placed OF **Julio Rodríguez** on the 7-day Injured List (concussion) and transferred RHP **Cooper Criswell** to the 60-day IL (right shoulder strain).

**ALL-STARS ANNOUNCED TONIGHT**...Major League Baseball is set to announce its rosters, including reserves, for the 96th Midsummer Classic **today at 4:30 p.m. PT on FOX**...the 2026 MLB All-Star Game takes place on Tuesday, July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia.

**PITCHING LATELY**...Mariners pitchers have been stellar as of late, pitching to an 3.59 ERA (148 ER, 370.2 IP) since May 17, 106 walks and 376 strikeouts...among all starting staffs during that span, the Mariners lead MLB in fWAR (7.4), 3rd in ERA, 1st in fielder independent pitching (FIP), 3rd in K% (25.9%), 3rd in lowest BB% (7.0%), 1st in SO/BB (3.55), 4th in Opp. AVG (.222), 1st in WHIP (1.13) and T-3rd in quality starts (20)...3 Mariners starters rank in the top 10 in fWAR since May 17: **Bryan Woo** (T-5th, 1.5), **Bryce Miller** (T-9th, 1.4) and **Logan Gilbert** (T-9th, 1.4).

**HONKY TONK MAN**...in 9 appearances (8 GS) this season, **Bryce Miller** has posted a 1.71 ERA (10 ER, 52.2 IP) with 62 strikeouts and just 5 walks allowed...he leads all Major League pitchers (min. 50.0 IP) in strikeout-to-walk ratio (12.40), 1st in WHIP (0.66) and ranks 1st in walk rate (2.7%)...he also ranks 2nd in ERA, 2nd in opponent batting average (.165), and 3rd in strikeout rate (33.2%).

**CANZONE RAKES**...over his last 28 games (5/30-c), **Dominic Canzone** is batting .321 (27x84) with 14 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 8 home runs, 13 RBI and 9 walks, getting on base at a .394 clip and slugging .679 (1.072 OPS)...among hitters with 90 PA over that span, Canzone ranks 5th in OPS, 4th in SLG and 3rd in wRC+ (201)...overall this season, Canzone is batting .269 (54x201) with 30 runs, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 13 home runs, 34 RBI, a .344 OBP and slugging .537 (.881 OPS) and a 149 wRC+ in 223 plate appearances... his 149 wRC+ ranks 12th in MLB among players with at least 200 plate appearances.

**YOUNG MAN'S GAME**...in 21 games since June 10, **Cole Young** is batting .295 (23x78) with 11 runs, 2 doubles, 5 home runs, 10 RBI and just 10 strikeouts, reaching base at a .329 clip and slugging .513 (.842 OPS)...on Monday, Young recorded his first career multi-homer game, becoming the 10th player in Mariners history age 22-or-younger with a multi-homer game, and the first since **Julio Rodríguez** (3x, 9/11/22 vs. ATL, 7/25/23 at MIN and 9/5/23 at CIN).

**MUÑOZ MOVING UP THE LEADERBOARD**...**Andrés Muñoz** recorded his 94th career save (93rd with Seattle), passing Aurelio López for 3rd-most saves by a Mexican-born pitcher and trailing only Roberto Osuna (155 SV) and Joakim Soria (229 SV)...Muñoz's 93 saves with the Mariners also rank 5th in franchise history, behind Mike Schooler (98 SV), J.J. Putz (101 SV), Edwin Díaz (109 SV) and Kazuhiro Sasaki (129 SV)...Muñoz has not allowed a run over his last 7 games (6/16-c), recording 10 strikeouts and holding opponents to a .167 average while recording 6 saves.

**BACK-TO-BACK ALL-STAR?**...**Randy Arozarena** is batting .280 (83x296) with 51 runs, 20 doubles, 1 triple, 8 homers, 37 RBI, 31 walks and 19 steals, reaching base at a .370 clip and slugging .436 slugging (.806 OPS)...among qualified American League outfielders this season, he ranks 6th in bWAR (2.7), 5th in OPS, T-1st in doubles and 2nd in stolen bases.

**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...**Logan Gilbert** has been stellar over his last 7 games, holding a 2.08 ERA (10 ER, 43.1 IP), 10 walks and 50 strikeouts, with the Mariners winning 6 of the 7 games, and...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...that Gilbert is 9 strikeouts away from becoming the 5th pitcher in Mariners history with 1,000 strikeouts, joining Félix Hernández (2,524), Randy Johnson (2,162), Jamie Moyer (1,239) and Mark Langston (1,078), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...when Gilbert passes the 1,000 strikeouts threshold, he will be the 8th active pitcher in MLB with 1,000+ strikeouts with their current team?...he is set to join Zac Gallen-ARI, Kyle Freeland-COL, Justin Verlander-DET, Sandy Alcantara-MIA, Aaron Nola-PHI, Zack Wheeler-PHI and Logan Webb-SF.

### ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JULY 4

- **1991** - Jay Buhner has his first two-homer game of his career, both off Greg Hibbard, in the Mariners 3-2 win vs. Chicago.
- **2010** - Ichiro and Cliff Lee are elected to the All Star team. It is Ichiro's 10th selection, and Lee's 2nd.
- **2022** - **Julio Rodríguez** homers to the 3rd deck of the Western Metal Supply Co. building in left field at Petco Park in San Diego in Mariners 8-2 win over San Diego. Julio became the fastest player in MLB history to reach 15+ homers and 20+ stolen bases, reaching the milestone in just 81 career games.
- **2023** - **Julio Rodríguez** and **George Kirby** are added to the AL All-Star Game roster. Logan Gilbert tosses a complete game shutout while Mike Ford finishes with 4 hits and a triple shy of the cycle on his birthday in 6-0 win at San Francisco.
- **2025** - The Mariners defeated the Pirates by a 6-0 score with **Cal Raleigh's** MLB-leading 34th and 35th home runs of the season, setting a career-high, besting his previous-high 34 home runs in 2024. His 35 homers match Ken Griffey Jr. (1998) for most homers by a Mariners player before the All-Star Break...**Bryan Woo** tossed 6.0 scoreless innings for his 17th consecutive outing of 6.0+ IP, tied for 2nd-longest to begin a season in Mariners history with Mark Langston (17 G in 1987).

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT ...

- Gilbert, 29, is making his 18th start of the season and the 164th start of his career...also marks his 1st start against the Blue Jays this season and the 7th of his career.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummaw on June 16, 2018.
- Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
- Named the 2022 and the 2024 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2024.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for June 15-21, marking the second time he has won the award (also: July 3-9, 2023).

LAST TIME OUT...L#4 on June 27 at Cleveland, tossed 7.0 innings and allowed 4 runs (4 ER), 7 hits and no walks with 7 strikeouts in his 7th road start of the season...marked his first losing decision on the road since April 6 at Texas...marked his 3rd start of 7.0+ innings this season and 2nd such start in the last 3 games (also: 6/16 vs. BAL)...also marked his 2nd time this season throwing 100+ pitches (also: 6/9 at BAL).

**FOURTH OF JULY FIREWORKS...**is making his second career start on the 4th of July, last throwing a complete game shutout across 9.0 innings at San Francisco on July 4, 2023...in that start, he threw 105 pitches, allowed just 5 baserunners (5 H, 0 BB) with 7 strikeouts and threw a three-pitch 2nd inning, just the 3rd in franchise history...he became Seattle's first pitcher to throw a shutout since Yusei Kikuchi in Toronto on Aug. 18, 2019.

**NEARING 1K...**is 9 strikeouts away from 1,000 career strikeouts...would become the 5th pitcher in club history to eclipse 1k strikeouts, joining Félix Hernández, Randy Johnson, Jamie Moyer, and Mark Langston.

**HENRY'S DAD SHOVES...**was named American League Player of the Week for June 15-21 after tossing a combined 13.1 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 5 hits (1 HR) with 3 walks and 18 strikeouts...across the 2 starts, he held opponents to a .116 average (5x43) with only 1 extra-base hit allowed and a .401 OPS.

**LATEST STRETCH...**across his last 7 starts since May 22, he is 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA (10 ER, 43.1 IP), 0.83 WHIP, 26 hits allowed (3 HR), 10 walks and 50 strikeouts with the Mariners winning 6 of those last 7 starts.

**LEAGUE OF THEIR OWN...**has thrown 517 strikeouts with just 85 walks across 81 career home starts...is 1 of just 2 pitchers in MLB with 500+ strikeouts and fewer than 100 walks at home since 2021, also: Aaron Nola-PHI (522 SO, 99 BB)...is the only pitcher in MLB history to record 500+ strikeouts with fewer than 90 walks allowed through his first 81 career home starts.

**HOME SWEET HOME...**is making his 11th start at home this season and the 82nd of his career...his 57 strikeouts at home this season are 7th-most in MLB while his 517 career strikeouts at home lead the American League and rank 9th-most in MLB since 2021...among AL leaders at home since 2021, he also ranks 1st in starts (81 GS) and 2nd in innings pitched (465.1 IP), trailing only Framber Valdez-HOU/DET (484.1 IP).

**IN JUNE...**went 3-1 with a 2.84 ERA (10 ER, 31.2 IP) and 38 strikeouts to 6 walks across 5 starts in June...across 28 career starts in June, he is 14-6 and owns a 3.20 ERA (59 ER, 166.0 IP) with 167 strikeouts to 30 walks allowed...among pitchers with 20+ starts in June since 2021, his 0.982 career WHIP leads MLB, ranking ahead of Logan Webb-SF (1.011), while his 5.57 strikeout-to-walk ratio in June is 3rd-best...among qualified pitchers in June 2026, he ranked 5th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.33), T-5th in strikeout rate (31.7%), 6th in WHIP (0.79).

**GET A WHIFF OF THIS...**recorded 89 swings and misses in the month of June, 3rd-most in MLB this month trailing Jacob deGrom-TEX (100) and Cristopher Sánchez-PHI...his 239 total whiffs this season are 8th-most in MLB and 5th-most among American League pitchers...among pitchers with 1000+ pitches this season, his 30.2% whiff rate ranks 5th-best in the AL...is the only American League pitcher with 2,000+ whiffs since 2021 (2,148), ranking ahead of next closest: Tarik Skubal-DET (1,925)...recorded a season-high 21 swings and misses on June 9 vs. NYM, tied for the 4th-most in a single game across his career.

**SO WE MEET AGAIN...**is facing the Blue Jays for the first time since making 2 starts against them in the 2025 ALCS, combining for 6 ER over 7.0 innings with 5 strikeouts...is facing Toronto in the regular season for the first time since throwing 9 strikeouts across 4.2 innings in a 12-inning win on April 19, 2025 at Rogers Centre...is facing the Blue Jays at home during the regular season for the first time since July 22, 2023...the Mariners have won each of the last 4 regular season starts Gilbert has made against Toronto (7/10/22-c).

**WALTER'S WORLD...**has thrown 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer runs allowed in 6 starts this season including 4 of his last 6 starts (5/27-c)...his 45 such starts across his career are 5th-most among American League pitchers since 2021...among that list, **George Kirby** ranks 8th (42 G) and **Luis Castillo** ranks 10th (38 G)...in addition, Logan has thrown 6.0+ IP and allowed 5-or-fewer baserunners in 4 starts this season (last: 6/16 vs. BAL)...his 46 such starts are 2nd-most in MLB since 2021, trailing only Zack Wheeler-PHI (55) and ranking ahead of Kevin Gausman-SF/TOR (42 G).

**AMONG THE LEAGUE...**among qualified pitchers in the AL since making his Major League debut in 2021, he ranks 1st in strikeouts (991 SO) and in total starts (163 GS), ranks 2nd in innings pitched (935.1 IP), T-4th in quality starts (77 QS), T-7th in wins (53), 8th in K/BB (4.88), T-8th in WHIP (1.05), and 10th in BB/9 (1.95)...his 87 career starts of 6.0+ innings pitched are 3rd-most in AL since 2021.

**QUALITY CONTROL...**has thrown a quality start with 1-or-fewer walks allowed in 4 games this season (last: 6/16 vs. BAL) and in 59 career games, the 5th-most such games in MLB since 2021 and are 2nd-most in the AL, just trailing behind rotation-mate **George Kirby** (61)...his 27 quality starts without a walk are 6th-most in MLB since 2021 and are 5th-most in Mariners history.

**AMONG THE GREATS...**his 3.56 career ERA (370 ER, 935.1 IP) is 5th-best among pitchers in Mariners history (min. 500 IP), trailing Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA, and ranks ahead of **George Kirby** (3.62)...among Mariners pitchers with 500+ innings, he ranks 1st in WHIP (1.053), T-2nd in K/9 (9.5) with James Paxton and 2nd in K/BB ratio (4.88), trailing only **George Kirby** (6.09).

- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

**LAST TIME OUT...**ND on June 28 at Cleveland, tossed 5.2 innings with 1 run (1 ER) allowed on 5 hits and 3 walks with 6 strikeouts...threw 98 pitches and 58 strikes...marks his 7th start with 1-or-fewer runs allowed over 5.0+ IP, tied for the 7th most such starts in the AL this season.
