**THE NL CHAMPS:** The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

**LAST GAME:** The D-backs lost 6-5 @ Dodgers on a walk-off single with 2 outs in the ninth inning.

- ◆ Joe Mantiply opened with 0.2 innings (1 H, 1 R, 0 BB, 0 K) and Ryne Nelson worked 5.0 innings (6 H, 1 R, 1 BB, 3 K, 1 IR/1 IRS).
- ◆ Christian Walker hit a game-tying, 2-run homer in the fourth inning...Ketel Marte had a go-ahead, RBI single in the seventh...Jake McCarthy had a pinchhit, go-ahead, RBI bunt single in the eighth...Joc Pederson had a go-ahead, solo homer in the ninth.

**#VOTE4KETEL FOR NL STARTING 2B: Ketel Marte** will find out today during the 4:00-5:00 p.m. broadcast if he is the NL's starting second baseman, having entered yesterday with 55 percent of the Phase 2/Finalist votes, ahead of Luis Arraez/Padres (45%).

- ♦ Marte was a fan-elected starter in 2019 and looks to join Paul Goldschmidt as the only D-backs with multiple fan elections.
  - Marte was the leading vote-getter in Phase 1 Voting (1,853,424 votes) to become a finalist, ahead of Luis Arraez/Padres (1,760,593 votes).
  - Full rosters will be anounced on Sunday at 2:30 p.m. PHX on ESPN.

MARTE'S PART-AY CONTINUES: Ketel Marte leads all second basemen with a 4.4 bWAR, .517 SLG, .871 OPS, 38 extra-base hits, 50 RBI, 166 total bases and 11 defensive runs saved, is tied for first with 17 homers, second with 19 doubles, tied for second with a 1.4 dWAR and third with 92 hits.

♦ His 4.4 bWAR is second in the NL to Shohei Ohtani/ LAD (4.9) and seventh in the Majors.

VS. DODGERS: The D-backs are 3-4 vs. Dodgers this season.
♦ In their last series @ Dodgers from May 20-22, the D-backs took 2-of-3, outscoring them 17-9.

VS. NL WEST: The D-backs are 6-4 in their last 10 games vs. NL West, 2-1 at home and 4-3 on the road.
