TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin a 3-game series against the New York Yankees...Seattle yesterday wrapped up a 4-game set against the Cleveland Guardians, splitting the Opening Series 2-2...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won yesterday's series finale against the Guardians by an 8-0 score, capturing their first shutout win of the season.

- **200 For Dan** - Yesterday marked **Dan Wilson's** 200th game as Mariners manager...Dan's .565 winning percentage (113-87) in the regular season ranks best in franchise history.
- **New Faces** - Five players have made their Mariners debut this season: RHP **Cooper Criswell**, RHP **Cole Wilcox**, INF **Brendan Donovan**, OF **Rob Refsnyder**, and LHP **José A Ferrer**...on the Mariners Opening Day roster this year, 22 of 26 players had suited up for Seattle in 2025...Wilcox was recalled from Triple-A Tacoma on March 27.
- **Nationally Televised** - Tomorrow's game against the Yankees will be televised on **Mariners TV** and simulcast on **TBS** (out of market only).

TIME TO ROCK AND ROLL...Luis Castillo is set to make his season debut tonight...in 2025, the right hander was solid for Seattle, going 11-8 with a 3.54 ERA (71 ER, 180.2 IP), 162 strikeouts and 46 walks...over 106 starts with the Mariners since joining the Mariners in 2022, La Piedra is 40-31 with a 3.46 ERA (238 ER, 618.1 IP), 633 strikeouts and 166 walks...his 3.46 ERA ranks 5th in franchise history (min. 500 IP), behind only Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 ERA.

HE'S DON IT AGAIN...Brendan Donovan last night went 2-for-3 with his 2nd home run of the season, a 2-out, 3-run homer off Guardians starter Slade Cecconi...Donovan has reached base safely in all 4 games to begin the 2026 season (3/26-c) and tallied multiple hits in 3 of those games...he is batting .429 (4x16) with 4 runs, 1 double, 2 home runs, 4 RBI, 2 walks and 1 stolen base in his first 18 plate appearances with Seattle...on Opening Day, Donovan homered in his first plate appearance, becoming the first player in Mariners history to hit a leadoff home run on Opening Day.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE...the Mariners went 51-30 (.630) at their home ballpark, T-Mobile Park in 2025, the 6th-best home record in MLB and 2nd-best in the AL...Seattle was also an MLB-best 26-9 (.743) at home after the All-Star Break last year, which included a franchise-record tying 11-consecutive wins at home (Aug. 27-Sept. 25) matching the mark set from May 20-June 8, 2001.

HEAR IT FROM THE PLAYERS:

THREE IN THE TOP-18...among the Mariners all-time wins above replacement leaders (*Baseball-Reference*) in franchise history, there are 3 active players in the team's top-18: center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** (22.8 WAR, 11th), shortstop **J.P. Crawford** (21.0 WAR, 13th), and catcher **Cal Raleigh** (18.7 WAR, 18th)...Rodríguez led the team in WAR in 2022 (6.2) and 2023 (5.5), while Raleigh led the team in WAR in 2024 (4.6) and 2025 (7.4)...debuting for Seattle in 2019, Crawford is the longest tenured player.

MARINERS TV...the Mariners announced that Mariners TV will bring Mariners Baseball to fans across television and streaming services throughout the region...in-market streaming will be available on Mariners TV for \$99.99/season or \$19.99/month...Mariners TV is available across major providers including Xfinity, DIRECTV, Fubo, Spectrum and more...fans can use the channel finder tool on Mariners.com/Watch to find providers in their area.

THE COACHING STAFF...manager **Dan Wilson** enters his second full season as Mariners skipper...returning to the Mariners coaching staff in the same roles are Bench Coach **Manny Acta**, Major League Coach and Director of Pitching Strategy **Trent Blank**, Assistant Pitching Coach and Major League Pitching Strategist **Danny Farquhar**, Infield Coach **Perry Hill**, Asst. Hitting Coach **Bobby Magallanes**, Senior Director of Hitting Strategy **Edgar Martinez**, Hitting Coach **Kevin Seitzer**, Pitching Coach **Pete Woodworth** and First Base Coach **Eric Young Jr.**...joining the staff this season are Third Base Coach **Carlos Cardoza**, Major League Field Coordinator **Jake McKinley** and Bullpen Coach **Austin Nola**...**Fleming Báez** and **Justin Novak** both return as Bullpen Catchers.

NAYL'D IT...first baseman **Josh Naylor** signed a 5-year contract through the 2030 season on Nov. 17, 2025 to remain in Seattle...Naylor was originally acquired by the Mariners from the Diamondbacks prior to the trade deadline on July 24, 2025...in 54 regular season games after the trade, Naylor hit .299 (58x194) with 32 runs, 10 doubles, 9 home runs, 33 RBI and went 19-for-19 in stolen base attempts, getting on base at a .341 clip and slugging .490 (.831 OPS)...in 11 Postseason games, he hit .340 with 3 home runs, 5 RBI and a .966 OPS.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Emerson Hancock had a stellar season debut start last night, tossing 6.0 hitless innings with 1 walk allowed and a career-high 9 strikeouts, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...he is the first Mariners pitcher to toss 6.0+ innings and 9+ strikeouts without allowing a hit since Félix Hernández's Perfect Game on Aug. 15, 2012?...he is also the first pitcher aged 26-or-younger to accomplish the feat since Paul Skenes-PIT on July 11, 2024 (7.0 IP, 11 K)...the last American League pitcher to register the same such game was Joe Ryan-MIN on Sept. 13, 2022 (7.0 IP, 9 K).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MARCH 30

- **2023** - The Mariners open their 2023 campaign with a 3-0 win over Cleveland on Ty France's 8th-inning, 3-run home run in front of a sellout crowd of 45,268.
- **2024** - **Julio Rodríguez** has his first career walk-off hit, a single scoring Josh Rojas in the 10th inning to win 4-3 against the Red Sox.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 33-year-old right-hander is set to make his 1st start of the season...he will also make the 144th start of his MLB career and 8th career start against New York-AL.
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on Dec. 23, 2011.
- Made MLB debut on June 23, 2017 vs. Washington (w/ CIN).
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
- Named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).

LAST TIME OUT...in his last Spring Training start on March 23 at San Diego, he threw 5.0 innings, allowing 1 run on 5 hits and 1 walk while recording 5 strikeouts...he threw 76 pitches (51 strikes) in his 5th Spring Training start.

MILESTONE TRACKER...with 1,493 career strikeouts, he is 7 strikeouts shy of 1,500 career strikeouts...would make him the 14th active player with 1500+ career strikeouts.

POSTSEASON PEDIGREE...went 1-1 with a 3.24 ERA (3 ER, 8.1 IP), 5 walks and 5 strikeouts across 3 appearances (2 starts) in the 2025 Postseason...across 6 career Postseason appearances (5 starts) with Cincinnati and Seattle, he owns a 2.25 ERA (7 ER, 28.0 IP) and 24 strikeouts.

NOW I AM A RELIEVER...tossed 1.1 perfect innings with 1 strikeout in the 15-inning Game 5 ALDS thriller vs. Detroit on Oct. 10, 2025 to earn his first career win as a reliever...marked his first relief appearance since June 23, 2016 with High-A Jupiter.

AGAINST THE YANKEES...has tossed 5.0+ innings in each of his 7 career starts against the Yankees, including 8.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 9, 2022 w/ SEA...has allowed 3-or-fewer runs in each of those seven career starts vs. NYY.

HOME COOKIN'...in 56 regular season starts at home as a Mariner (2022-c), he is 22-14 with a 2.80 ERA (104 ER, 334.0 IP), 377 strikeouts, 81 walks and .0991 WHIP while limiting batters to a .203 batting average and just 41 home runs.

WHO HOLDS THE TRIDENT...his 3.46 ERA (238 ER, 618.1 IP) with Seattle is the 2nd-lowest ERA in franchise history (min. 500.0 IP), behind Félix Hernández, Randy Johnson, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton (all 3.42 ERA), and ranking ahead teammates **George Kirby** (3.57) and **Logan Gilbert** (3.59)

LA PIEDRA...since his MLB debut (6/23/17 vs. WSH), he is T-2nd in quality starts (135), 3rd in games started (243), 4th in both innings pitched (1410.2) and total strikeouts (1493), and 9th in ERA (3.55) among starting pitchers in the regular season (min. 1,000 IP).

LUIS, LUIS...among qualified pitchers since his Mariners debut (8/3/22 at NYY), ranks 4th in quality starts (61), 5th in innings pitched (618.1 IP), WHIP (1.14), and ERA (3.46), T-6th in games started (106), and T-8th in total wins (40).

ONE OF FEW...threw 7.0 scoreless innings with no walks twice last season (7/5/25 vs. PIT and 5/19/25 at CHW)...has done so three times in his career (also: 4/16/23 vs. COL)...was 1 of 5 AL pitchers last season with 2-or-more such starts.

100 PITCHES AND STILL GOIN'...threw 100 pitches for the 100th time in his career on July 18 vs. HOU, doing so in back-to-back starts (also: 7/11 at DET)...since 2017, his 100 starts with 100+ pitches are tied for the 6th-most in MLB...owns a career-high 9 game streak of 100+ pitches (5/31-7/14/22 w/ CIN).

LENGTH ON THE MOUND...threw 114 pitches on May 25, 2025 at HOU, just one pitch shy of his Mariners career-high (8/27/22 vs. CLE, 115 pitches) ... in that May 25 start, he threw 76 strikes, tied for the 3rd-most strikes in a single start in his career (career-high: 85 strikes on 8/27/22 vs. CLE w/ SEA).

STEERING THE SHIP...in a Mariners uniform in the regular season, has gone 5.0+ innings in 98 of his 106 starts, 6.0+ innings in 67 starts, and 7.0+ innings in 22 starts...in his start on Aug. 26, 2025 vs. San Diego, recorded his 600th strikeout with Seattle, becoming the 13th pitcher in franchise history with 600+ strikeouts.

TOP OF CLASS...held a 3.54 ERA last season, his 7th consecutive season with a sub-4.00 ERA (2019-25), tied for the most in MLB during that span (also: Shane Bieber-CLE/TOR, Jacob deGrom-NYM/TEX and Zack Wheeler-NYM/PHI)...recorded 11-or-more wins in his 3rd consecutive season with the Mariners (2023-25), and the 4th time in his career (also: 15 wins in 2019 w/CIN).

CAREER...pitched in parts of 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2017-22) and Seattle (2022-c)...named to the All-Star Team three times in his career (2019, 2022 w/CIN and 2023 w/SEA)...finished 5th in 2023 AL Cy Young Award voting...has made 4 Opening Day starts in his career: 2019 and 2021 with Cincinnati and 2023-24 with Seattle.

- **Rare Air** - Is the only pitcher in MLB history with at least 100 strikeouts and a 1.000 winning percentage.
- **2025 Totals** - Went 5-0 with a 2.52 ERA (22 ER, 78.2 IP) with 27 walks, 82 strikeouts and a 1.017 WHIP in 73 appearances, limiting opponents to a .187 batting average in 2025.
- **El Campeón** - Won the 2026 World Baseball Classic with Team Venezuela, which included a pitching appearance in the Championship Game against Team USA on March 17.
