## PITTSBURGH PIRATES (5-9) vs. CINCINNATI REDS (6-8)

April 12, 2025 - Great American Ball Park - Cincinnati, OH - 6:40 EDT - Game #15/Road #9  
LHP Andrew Heaney (0-0, 1.50 ERA) vs. LHP Andrew Abbott (10-10, 3.72 ERA In 2024)

**THE PIRATES:** opened their three-game road trip with a 5-3 loss Friday against the Reds...Went 3-3 in their first homestand of 2025 vs. the Yankees (1-2) and Cardinals (2-1)... Are in the fifth game of a six-game stretch against National League Central foes (took two of three from St. Louis at PNC Park from Monday-Wednesday) that was preceded by six straight games against American League East opponents (Tampa Bay and New York-AL)...Will resume their stretch of 13 out of 16 games being played at PNC Park with a seven-game homestand against Washington (April 14-17) and Cleveland (April 18-20).

**HEANEY ON THE HILL:** Andrew Heaney gets the start tonight in the middle game of this weekend series against the Reds...Heaney recorded the 21st double-digit strikeout game of his career in his last outing on April 6 vs. the Yankees...It also marked the first double-digit strikeout game by a Pirates southpaw since Steven Brault struck out 10 batters on September 27, 2019 vs. the Reds.

**SOUTHPAW SIGHTING:** The Pirates will be opposed by a starting lefthander for the third time this season (they faced the Yankees' Max Fried on April 4 and the Cardinals' Matthew Liberatore on Monday)...Ke'Bryan Hayes has gone deep twice in five career at-bats against Reds starter Andrew Abbott, including the last time the two faced each other here in Cincinnati on September 22, 2023.

**FOUR YOUR INFORMATION:** Endy Rodríguez has hit safely in four straight games (since Monday vs. St. Louis) and seven of his last eight games (since March 31 at Tampa Bay)...Rodríguez is the only Pirate with multiple hit streaks of at least three games in 2025.

**CUTCH 22:** Andrew McCutchen has 35 career home runs and 101 RBI against the Reds, both of which rank first among all active Major League players...Thirty of McCutchen's 35 home runs against Cincinnati have come as a member of the Pirates...The only three Pirates players to go deep more times against the Reds than McCutchen are Willie Stargell (41), Roberto Clemente (40) and Ralph Kiner (34).

**PUNCH 'EM OUT IN BUNCHES:** Pirates pitchers have combined for 123 strikeouts this season, matching the 2024 and 1999 teams for their most through the club's first 14 games of a season since 1901, fewer than only the 2019 (138), 2021 (127), 2015 (126) and 2020 (124) squads.

**DOWNTOWN GOES FRAZIER:** Adam Frazier went deep last night for the first time this season with his two-run shot off Brady Singer in the fifth inning...It was Frazier's 40th home run with Pittsburgh and his first in black and gold since June 24, 2021 at St. Louis off Wade LeBlanc.

**CALL TO THE 'PEN:** Joey Wentz brings a scoreless streak of 6.0 innings into tonight after not allowing a run over 1.2 innings last night...He has also struck out seven batters in his last three outings (5.0ip)...Since making his Pirates debut on September 5, 2024, Wentz has a 1.29 ERA (21.0ip/3er) and 22 strikeouts.

**FERGALICIOUS:** Caleb Ferguson, who grew up a Reds fan and is a 2014 graduate of West Jefferson High School in the Columbus, OH, area, pitched a scoreless inning in Wednesday's walkoff win against the Cardinals and has made seven consecutive scoreless appearances to begin the season...Ferguson is one of two left-handed relievers in all of Major League Baseball (minimum 7.0ip) to not allow a run yet this season, along with Kansas City's Daniel Lynch IV (also 7.0ip)...He has a 0.93 ERA (9.2ip/1er) in his last 11 outings dating back to September 16, 2024 (when he was with Houston)...Hitters are 4-for-23 (.174) against Ferguson this season.

**BACK IN BRADENTON:** Konnor Griffin, Pittsburgh's first-round selection in the 2024 First-Year Player Draft, tripled, homered (his first professional home run) and had four RBI in Low-A Bradenton's win vs. Palm Beach at LECOM Park last night...The 18-year-old Griffin, who the Pirates drafted out of Jackson Preparatory School in Flowood, MS, is rated by Baseball America and MLB Pipeline as a top-100 prospect in baseball (No. 40 by Pipeline / No. 49 by BA).

**GUIDING THE SHIP:** With Pittsburgh's next win, skipper Derek Shelton will earn his 300th managerial victory...He would become one of 12 managers in franchise history to win at least 300 games as the team's skipper, joining Fred Clarke (1422), Danny Murtaugh (1115), Jim Leyland (851), Clint Hurdle (735), Chuck Tanner (711), Frankie Frisch (539), Pie Traynor (457), Bill McKechnie (409), George Gibson (401), Lloyd McClendon (336) and Billy Meyer (317).

HOW ACQUIRED: Signed as a free agent (one-year contract) on February 22, 2025.

**STARTING OFF:** The 33-year-old southpaw is in his 12th Major League season...He signed a one-year contract with the Pirates on February 22 after spending each of the previous two years with the Texas Rangers...Was the Angels’ nominee in both 2018 and 2019 for the distinguished Roberto Clemente Award for his community involvement.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Heaney struck out 10 batters and allowed only one run on five hits and one walk over 7.0 innings on April 6 vs. the Yankees at PNC Park...The 10 strikeouts matched Roansy Contreras (September 21, 2022) for most by a Pirates pitcher in a game against the Yankees...It was also the first time that Heaney threw 100-plus pitches in an outing since also throwing 100 pitches on July 21, 2024 vs. Baltimore.

**VS. CINCINNATI:** Heaney will be making his third career appearance (all starts) against the Reds...His last start against Cincinnati came on April 17, 2022 as a member of the Dodgers at Dodger Stadium (6.0ip, 1h, 0r, 3bb, 11k)...He also faced the Reds on June 25, 2019 at Angel Stadium as a member of the Angels (5.1ip, 5h, 1r/1er, 4bb, 4k).

**STADIUM CHECKLIST:** Heaney will be making his 206th appearance in the big leagues, but it will be the first time he makes an appearance at Great American Ball Park...In his last start on April 6 vs. the Yankees, it marked the first time he ever made an appearance at PNC Park...Other than Great American Ball Park, the only other active stadiums Heaney hasn’t pitched at yet are Chase Field (Diamondbacks), George M. Steinbrenner Field (Rays), Sutter Health Park (Athletics) and Wrigley Field (Cubs).

**SIGN HERE, PLEASE:** Heaney signed a one-year contract with the Pirates on February 22...He posted a 5-14 record, 4.28 ERA (160.0ip/76er) and 159 strikeouts in 32 games (31 starts) with Texas in 2024...Heaney’s 159 strikeouts and 160.0 innings pitched both ranked second on the Rangers, trailing Nathan Eovaldi (166 strikeouts & 70.2 innings).

**WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS:** Heaney spent the 2023 campaign as a member of the World-Champion Rangers, where he posted a career-high 10 wins...His 9.22 strikeouts per 9.0 innings figure was the highest ever by a left-handed Texas starting pitcher in a season (min. 15 starts)...He finished the year 13th among American League pitchers (min. 140.0ip) in Ks/9.0 innings (9.22) and 19th in strikeout percentage (23.6 percent).

**IN NEED OF SOME SUPPORT:** During the 2024 season, Heaney received two or fewer runs of support in 23 of his 31 starts...His team-low 3.48 run support average as a starter was the eighth-lowest qualified mark in all of Major League Baseball.

**MR. RELIABLE:** Heaney is one of four Major League left-handed pitchers to record 150-plus strikeouts in each of the last two seasons, along with Yusei Kikuchi, Framber Valdez and MacKenzie Gore...He is also one of five lefties to throw 145.0-plus innings in each of the last two years, along with Valdez, Kikuchi, Patrick Corbin and JP Sears.

**THIS AND THAT:** Heaney has 21 career outings with 10-plus strikeouts, the sixth-most among all active Major League southpaws...The only ones with more are Chris Sale (87), Clayton Kershaw (68), Robbie Ray (40), Blake Snell (35) and Carlos Rodón (26).
