ROSTER MOVES: RHP Jared Hughes has been reinstated from the IL and added to the team's 30-man active roster...He will wear #35...RHP Franklyn Kilome has been optioned to the team's Alternate Training Site...INF Jed Lowrie has been transferred to the 45-day IL...Hughes went 5-5 with a 4.04 ERA in 72 combined games with the Reds and Phillies last year...He has appeared in 60 or more games in each of the last six seasons...Hughes posted a 1.94 ERA in 72 games with Cincinnati in 2018.

METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 7-1, last night...New York has dropped four in a row after winning two straight...The Mets are looking to avoid their third series loss today.

ESCAPE FROM ATLANTA: The Mets are 2-8 in their last 10 games at Atlanta...The pitching staff has a 8.01 ERA (73 earned runs/82.0 innings) during those 10 games...Despite that, the team owns a .317/.386/.469 slash line with 10 home runs in that span.

PUT THE "IMPRESS" IN FIRST IMPRESSION: David Peterson is looking to become the fifth pitcher in Mets history who has started and won his first two major league games...Steven Matz was the last to do so in 2015...The others are Dick Selma (1965), Gary Gentry (1969) and Mike Pelfrey (2006)...There are 49 southpaws in the modern era who have made the start and earned the win in each of their first two major league appearances...Today, Peterson aims to be the 50th to join that club...Only 31 pitchers since 1900 have started and won each of their first two big league games with each of those games coming on the road and only 10 lefties have done so.

LEFT IS ALRIGHT: Peterson is just the third left-handed pitcher ever selected by the Mets in the first round to win a game for New York (others: 1967 fourth-overall selection Jon Matlack and 1965 second-overall pick Les Rohr)...The Mets have chosen nine LHP in the first round in franchise history.

HERE'S TO YOUR MR. ROBINSON: Robinson Canó has reached base safely six straight games and is on a five-game hitting streak, batting .625 (10-16) with three runs, two doubles, a home run, two walks and four RBI in that span...He has recorded multiple hits in four of those five games...He ranks third among active players in hits (2,581), RBI (1,276), total bases (4,186), extra-base hits (922) and in runs scored (1,238).

CONFORTOBLY NUMB: Michael Conforto has safely reached base in all nine games this season...He is batting .313 (10-32) with three runs, a double, a home run, four walks, a steal and three RBI...Conforto has hit 110 home runs in his career which is 12th on the Mets all-time list...Ed Kranepool is 11th with 118 followed by Edgardo Alfonzo who is 10th with 120.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Franklyn Kilome became the third player to make his major league debut with the Mets this year, joining Andrés Giménez and David Peterson...With Peterson's addition to the roster, the Mets now have four of their first-round selections on their active roster...Peterson (20th overall pick in 2017) joins Michael Conforto (10th overall, 2014), Dominic Smith (11th overall, 2013) and Brandon Nimmo (13th overall, 2011) as Mets first-rounders on the active roster.

AMED IN THE ATL: Rosario has collected 30 hits at Truist Park, the most by any Met...He has hit .326 (30-92) with 16 runs, seven doubles, two triples, two home run, 15 RBI, five steals and an .837 OPS in 22 career games at Truist Park.

ESQUIRE DAVIS: J.D. Davis is batting .421 (8-19) with four runs, two home run, two walks and six RBI over his last six games...This comes after starting the season 0-3 in his first two games...J.D. Davis ranked 10th in the NL with a 136 wRC+ (weighted runs created plus) and was 17th in the NL with a .373 wOBA (weighted on-base average) last season.

OUCH: The Mets have been hit by 12 pitches this season, which ranks second in the majors...The Cubs have been hit by 14 pitches...Pete Alonso and Brandon Nimmo have each been hit by three pitches, tied for second in the majors...The Mets were hit by a major league leading 95 pitches last season...That was a franchise record, surpassing their total of 73 in 2018...Alonso and Jeff McNeil were plunked 21 times each last season, the second-highest total in franchise history...That also placed them tied for fifth in MLB.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are playing at Truist Park for the first time this year...The Mets own a 14-17 lifetime record at the new home of the Braves...Offensively, the team collectively owns a .272/.353/.437 slash line with 31 home runs at the ballpark.

TWENTY, TWENTY, TWENTY FOUR GAMES AGO: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in all nine games this season...Nimmo has reached base safely in each of his last 24 games dating back to last season...He is batting .290 (9-31) with seven runs, two doubles, a home run, three RBI and five walks this year...He owns a .436 OBP and a .888 OPS...The 24-game on-base streak is the second-longest in his career...Nimmo safely reached base in 28 straight games from August 11-September 21, 2018...In addition, Nimmo has scored a run in each of his last five games, tied for the longest streak of his career (third time).

BULLPEN NOTES: The Mets rank 29th in the majors with a 6.81 bullpen ERA after nine games...Last year, the Mets pen ranked 26th in the majors with a 4.99 ERA...The pen's 4.99 ERA was the highest in franchise history...Mets relievers are tied for first in the majors with three losses this season and are third in the majors with three blown saves...The pen is fourth in the majors allowing eight homers.

HE'S HEATING UP: Jeff McNeil went 1-3 with two walks last night...Over his last five starts, McNeil is batting .421 (8-19) with two runs, a double, four walks and four RBI...This compares to his first three starts where he went 1-10.

JUST THE HITS: The Mets are second in the major leagues with 81 hits this season, are fourth with a .259 batting average and sixth with a .340 OBP...The Mets have recorded four games where they racked up 10 or more hits this season, which leads the majors...In 2019, the Mets recorded 69 such games, the fifth-most in the majors and the second-most in the National League...Colorado recorded 77 such games.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 2-2 on the road this year...This compares to 1-4 at home...The team was an NL-best 21-12 on the road in the second half of the 2019 season...The Mets finished winning 13 of their last 20 and four of their last five games on the road...Overall, the team went 38-43 on the road last year after finishing 40-41 on the road in 2018.

THE NEW KID: Andrés Giménez is hitting .308 (4-13) with two runs, a triple, an RBI and a steal in eight games...Giménez entered the season as the third-best Mets prospect and the No. 84 overall prospect in the majors, per MLB Pipeline...After spending the 2019 season with Binghamton (AA), the Venezuelan shortstop led the Arizona Fall League with a .371 (26-70) average and .999 OPS.

SIXTY-GAME SPRINT: Over the final 60 games of the 2019 season, the Mets' 39-21 mark tied for the second-best in the majors and co-led the NL...Only one team, the Astros (42-18), had a better record in the season's last 60 games...The Rays, Twins, Dodgers and A's all also ended last year on a 39-21 run...See the chart below for the Mets' best 60-game starts to a season:

LAST TIME OUT: Peterson made his major league debut on July 28 at Fenway Park and defeated the Red Sox to pick up his first major league win...He threw 5.2 innings and allowed two runs, earned, on seven hits with two walks and three strikeouts...He whiffed J.D. Martinez (who owns a .990 career OPS vs. LHP) in the first inning for his first career punchout.

PUT THE "IMPRESS" IN FIRST IMPRESSION: There are just four pitchers in Mets history who have started and won their first two major league games... Steven Matz was the last to do so in 2015...The others are Dick Selma (1965), Gary Gentry (1969) and Mike Pelfrey (2006)...There are 49 southpaws in the modern era who have made the start and earned the win in each of their first two major league appearances...Today, Peterson aims to be the 50th to join that club...Only 31 pitchers since 1900 have started and won each of their first two big league games with each of those games coming on the road.

ON THE PETERBOARD: Peterson and Mitch Keller (Pittsburgh) are the only rookie starting pitchers to earn a win in the NL this season...His 5.2 innings pitched rank fourth among NL rookies.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Peterson, the Mets' first-round selection in the 2017 First-Year Player Draft, won his major league debut...He is just the third left-handed pitcher ever selected by the Mets in the first round to win a game for New York (others: 1967 fourth-overall selection Jon Matlack and 1965 second-overall pick Les Rohr)...Before Peterson, the last Mets pitcher to make his major league debut in a start was Drew Gagnon on July 10, 2018 vs. Philadelphia...The last Mets starting pitcher to earn the win in his major league debut was Steven Matz, who defeated the Reds on June 28, 2015 at Citi Field.

FIRST ROUND'S ON ME: With Peterson's addition to the roster, the Mets now have four of their first-round selections on their active roster...Peterson (20th overall pick in 2017) joins Michael Conforto (10th overall, 2014), Dominic Smith (11th overall, 2013) and Brandon Nimmo (13th overall, 2011) as Mets first-rounders on the active roster...The last pitcher whom the Mets drafted in the first round to make his major league debut with the club was Matt Harvey (2010 seventh overall pick, debuted in 2012).

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Peterson has made 49 appearances (all starts) across four levels of the Mets' minor league system, spanning his three years in the organization...After being drafted in 2017, the lefty made three starts at Brooklyn (A), tossing a total of 3.2 innings and allowing just one earned run... The following year, he dominated the SAL with Columbia (A), posting a 1.82 ERA (12 earned runs/59.1 innings) before earning a mid-season promotion to St. Lucie, where he made 13 starts...Last year, he pitched at Binghamton (AA) and made a career-high 24 starts, averaging more than 9.00 K/9 (122 strikeouts/116.0 innings).

TOMORROW’S STARTER: RHP JACOB deGROM (0-0, 0.00)

LAST START: In his last outing, July 29 vs. Boston, deGrom extended his career-best scoreless streak to a career-high 31.0 innings before surrendering a run, ending what was tied for the third-longest run in Mets history...He finished his start with 6.0 innings, allowing two runs, earned, on three hits with a walk and four strikeouts.

SLINGING IT: Threw a 101.1 mph fastball in his last start...That was the hardest-thrown pitch of his career...His fastball velocity through two starts has averaged 98.6 mph, the second-highest in the majors (min. 100 pitches thrown)...Only Dustin May (98.9 mph average four-seamer velocity) throws harder.

- Has gone deep in 50 of his first 170 games, the most games with a home run through 170 career appearances in major league history.
- Has 54 career home runs...Only one player has hit more home runs through 170 career games (Rudy York, 55).
- Won the 2019 Jackie Robinson NL Rookie of the Year Award...Hit a rookie-record 53 home runs...Was the first Mets player and first rookie to lead MLB in homers.
- During the shutdown, honored those who went "above and beyond their call of duty" through his newly-launched Homers for Heroes foundation...The foundation will honor a hero after each of the Mets' 60 games this season...The hero will receive a care package, which will include game-used memorabilia from Alonso.
