**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Angels, 3-1, on Friday night...New York has dropped three straight contests...The Mets continue a 10-day, nine-game homestand (0-1) against the Angels (0-1), Rangers (three games) and Mariners (three games).

**MUST SEE TV:** Sunday's game against the Los Angeles Angels will be aired exclusively on Peacock...Fans can access the game by using the Peacock app or by visiting peacocktv.com.

**TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME:** The Mets are encouraging all fans attending the games taking place August 25 - September 3 to take the train to the game...With the capacity crowds expected at both Citi Field and the US Open, using mass transit and rideshare will be the most efficient ways to arrive to the ballpark...The LIRR and the 7 train have added additional trains for baseball and tennis fans...If you drive, please arrive early to avoid traffic delays.

**METS WOMEN'S DAY CELEBRATION:** The New York Mets are hosting their second annual Women's Day at Citi Field, presented by Citi...Led by the Mets female driven employee resource group, "She-Unit," Women's Day is a celebration of women in sports with female focused pregame and in-game programming in honor of Women's Equality Day...The Mets are hosting a panel of female industry leaders, who will speak to an all-female audience, including young women from Girls Inc...In addition, the Mets are also hosting the Massapequa International 12 and under softball team who won the Little League Softball World Series earlier in August in Greenville, NC...The team also plans to honor Joan Payson with a tribute video on Citi Vision.

**HOOR CHILDREN:** As part of Major League Baseball's Commissioner's Community Initiative, this season the Mets are recognizing staff from local non-profit organizations that have gone above and beyond to make a positive impact on our community...In honor of Women's Day, the Mets are recognizing Hour Children along with members of the Hour Working Women Program as their August Community Hero...Hour Children is a Long Island City, New York-based organization working to meet the needs of incarcerated and formerly incarcerated women and their children...The Hour Working Women Program provides employment services and educational programs to Hour Women, women on work release, and justice impacted members of the wider community who lack access to resources. Staff will receive tickets and be honored on the field during a pregame ceremony.

**LINSANITY:** Lindor is on an 11-game hitting streak, batting .386 (17-44) in that span with 11 runs, four doubles, two home runs, nine RBI, three walks and three steals...Over his last 57 games, he is batting .310 (66-213) with 45 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 35 RBI, 28 walks, 16 steals with a .397 OBP, a .554 SLG and a .951 OPS...Lindor has stolen 22 bases in 127 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

**I DECLARE fWAR:** Francisco Lindor ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.3 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.1 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (18.4) and Mookie Betts (17.4) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.1 fWAR since 2021 ranks fifth in the majors in that span.

**GIMME A BREAK:** Alonso is hitting .246 (34-138) with 20 extra-base hits, 34 RBI, 23 runs, 20 walks and a .945 OPS in 39 games following the All-Star break...He batted .211 (64-304) with 50 runs, seven one triple, 26 home runs, 61 RBI and an .807 OPS in the 82 games before the break.

**ANGELS-METS NOTES:** The Mets will host the Angels at Citi Field for the first time since May 19-21, 2017.

**THE ROAD TO 100:** Pete Alonso is tied for second in the majors and is second in the NL with 95 RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...He is seeking to become the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.

**MONTHLY REPORT:** Pete Alonso has recorded nine home runs in 24 games this month...His career-best for any single month is 11 home runs, which he recorded in 27 games in September of 2019...He has recorded five months with at least 10 home runs in his career...His next home run would mark the second time this year that Alonso has hit 10 homers in a single month...He hit 10 home runs in May...He also hit one home run in March and nine in April.

**THIS IS ALMOST 40:** Pete Alonso is third in the majors and second in the National League with 39 home runs...Alonso is one home run shy of recording his third season of 40 or more home runs...He socked 53 in 2019 and 40 last season...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...Since he entered the league in 2019, only two other players have recorded multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs (Shohei Ohtani and Mike Trout)... Only one active player (Nelson Cruz, four) has more than three 40-HR seasons...Alonso's 185 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...With one more long ball, he'll become the fifth player in MLB history with three or more seasons with 40+ home runs in a player's first five years...He would join Ralph Kiner (4), Ryan Howard (3), Albert Pujols (3) and Eddie Matthews (3).

**INVADER NIM:** Over the last 16 games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .323 (20-62) with eight runs, two doubles, three home runs, four RBI, nine walks, a .408 OBP and a .500 SLG...He is batting .289 (46-159) with 11 doubles, one triple, two home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks with a .358 OBP and a .409 SLG against left-handed pitchers this year...His .289 average is the ninth-best in the majors by a left-handed hitter against fellow lefties.

**JEFF McHITS:** Jeff McNeil has safely hit in 17 of his last 20 games, batting .346 (27-78) with 13 runs, four doubles, three home runs, 13 RBI, and five walks with a .513 SLG in that span...In 39 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting .294 (45-154) with 22 runs, seven doubles, one triple, three home runs, 21 RBI, eight walks with a .347 OBP...He has struck out only 12 times in 167 plate appearances following the All-Star break.

**THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY:** On this day in 2012, Jeremy Hefner tossed 8.0 innings, allowing one run on five hits with one walk and struck out eight as the Mets defeated the Astros, 2-1...Ike Davis provided all of the offense with two home runs, including a walk-off shot.

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** The Syracuse Mets, playing as the Syracuse Salt Potatoes, came from behind three times to beat the Buffalo Bisons, 9-7, in 10 innings at NBT Bank Stadium on Friday Night...Brandon McIlwain hit a walk-off home run punctuated a three-run bottom of the 10th inning for the Salt Potatoes, marking Syracuse's ninth walk-off win this season...Playing in his first rehab game, Mark Vientos went 1-4 with two runs, one double and a walk.

### CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Tossed 4.0 innings against the St. Louis Cardinals on August 20 at Busch Stadium...Allowed three earned runs on nine hits...Fanned three batters in a 7-3 Mets loss.

**I CAN SEE YOUR HALO:** Carrasco will face the Angels for the first time this season, making his seventh career start and 13th career appearance against the Halos in his career...In his last start against Los Angeles-AL on June 11, 2022 at Angel Stadium, he suffered the loss after throwing 4.2 innings, allowing five earned runs on nine hits and one walk while fanning seven batters...Throughout his career against the Angels, Carrasco has pitched to a 2.68 ERA (16 ER/53.2 IP) and holds a 3-1 record...Carrasco holds a 1-0 record with a 2.18 ERA (5 ER/20.2 IP) at home compared to a 2-1 record and a 3.00 ERA (11 ER/33.0 IP) when on the road...Has held Angels batters to a .216 average throughout his career, tallying 54 strikeouts.

**MILESTONES & MEMORIES:** Carrasco made his 300th career appearance on August 8 against the Cubs at Citi Field...Made his 250th career start at Fenway on July 23, becoming the 21st active pitcher and seventh Venezuelan pitcher to reach that milestone...Became the 16th active pitcher to make 300 career appearances and 250 career starts...With 4.0 innings on June 30, Carrasco became the 21st active pitcher to reach the 1500.0 inning milestone...Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.

**COOKIE CRISP:** In his start against the Giants on June 30, Carrasco tallied a season-high 18 whiffs and six whiffs on four-seam fastballs...According to Baseball Savant, Carrasco also currently stands in the 77th percentile in curve spin.

**COOKIE'S COMEBACK:** In his starts on May 25 and May 31 against Chicago-NL and Philadelphia, respectively, Carrasco allowed just two runs over 12.2 innings compared to 18 runs allowed across the 18.2 innings he threw in his first four starts of the season...In those 12.2 innings, Carrasco fanned eight batters, which equals the total strikeouts he tallied in his first three starts of the year.

**WINNER, WINNER:** Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 last season at Miami after tossing 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...His 15 wins were tied for the eighth-most in the majors...He was the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joined Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017...Won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Was the first Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season since Zack Wheeler won seven from July 14-August 25, 2017.

**VENEZUELAN BORN:** Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...Is one of 18 active pitchers with 100 career victories...Became one of eight Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,500.0 career innings pitched on July 6 vs. Arizona...Carrasco is currently ranked seventh among Venezuelan-born pitchers with 1513.2 career innings pitched.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: DAVID PETERSON (3-7, 5.59)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 4.2 innings on August 21 against the Braves at Truist Park...Allowed four earned runs on seven hits and two walks while striking out four batters in a 10-4 Mets victory.

**MAKIN' IT MAJOR:** Since returning to the majors on June 27 after a stint with Syracuse (AAA), Peterson has pitched to a 2-1 record with a 3.05 ERA (13 ER/38.1 IP) in 13 games, seven of which were starts....Has tallied 38 strikeouts since his return.
