METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Giants, 8-4, on Sunday Night Baseball to complete a seven-game homestand (3-4)...New York is 8-18 over its last 26 games...This afternoon, the Mets kick off their final road trip before the All-Star break...The team heads west to Arizona (three games) and San Diego (three games).

HAPPY FOURTH!: New York is 32-37 all-time on Independence Day... According to *sportradar*, Brandon Nimmo's career on-base percentage is .500 on the Fourth of July, the highest in Mets history (minimum 20 PA)... Nimmo's .409 batting average on July 4 is fourth highest in Mets history, trailing Tommie Agee and Gary Carter at .429 each, along with Cleon Jones at .425 (minimum 20 PA).

OFF DAY SWAP: Yesterday, the Mets announced that the club acquired RHP Trevor Gott and RHP Chris Flexen from the Seattle Mariners in exchange for LHP Zach Muckenhirn...New York designated Flexen for assignment and transferred RHP Edwin Uceta to the 60-Day IL.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to today's game, the Mets activated RHP Trevor Gott and selected OF DJ Stewart from Triple-A Syracuse...Gott will wear #33 and Stewart will wear #29...As corresponding moves, INF Danny Mendick and RHP Jeff Brigham have been optioned to Triple-A Syracuse...To clear a 40man roster space for Stewart, RHP Denyi Reyes has been designated for assignment.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Mets are fresh off taking a three-game set from the Giants, their first series win since their three-game sweep of the Phillies from May 30-June 2...New York had lost or split each of their last eight series.

SEE YA IN SEATTLE: On Sunday, Major League Baseball announced that Pete Alonso was selected to the National League All-Star team...He will join the NL All-Star squad as they square off against the AL All-Stars on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...This is Alonso's third career All-Star nod, tied with Keith Hernandez for the most by a Mets first baseman...Alonso is the 13th Met in club history to make at least three All-Star rosters.

MOONBLASTS BY THE SPACE NEEDLE: Alonso also announced Sunday night that he will participate in the 2023 Home Run Derby...A two-time Derby winner, Alonso will attempt to become the second player to win the event three times (also, Ken Griffey Jr.)...He will be the 10th player to compete in the HR Derby at least four times, joining Griffey Jr. (eight), Mark McGwire (seven), Barry Bonds (six), Sammy Sosa (six), Albert Pujols (five), Lance Berkman (four), Robinson Canó (four) and David Ortiz (four).

SNAKE EYES: Arizona drafted Max Scherzer 11th overall in the 2006 First-Year Player Draft and he pitched for the D-backs from 2008-2009...Scherzer has made 11 starts against his original club in his career...In those starts, he is 8-0 with a 2.38 ERA (19 ER/72.0 IP)...When facing the Diamondbacks on the road, Scherzer has pitched to a 2.81 ERA (10 ER/32.0 IP) in five starts, with a 4-0 record...His last start and last win against the Diamondbacks was on May 14, 2021, when he threw 5.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven at Chase Field.

SNAKE CHARMER: Francisco Lindor has reached base safely in all 15 of his games played vs. Arizona in his career, hitting safely in 14 of the 15 contests... All told, he has posted a .361/.406/.656 slashline with 11 RBI and 13 runs scored against the Diamondbacks.

CATCH US IF YOU CAN: New York recorded two stolen bases on Sunday night, bringing their season tally to 63 steals in 70 attempts...The team's 90 percent success rate is the best in the majors...Starling Marte was caught stealing on Friday, ending a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught...Overall, New York has been successful in 37 of their last 38 stolen base attempts...The last time a Mets player was thrown out attempting a stolen base before Friday night was on May 10 (Francisco Lindor at second)...Marte has swiped 21 bags this year, seventh in the majors and third in the National League...His 335 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

HOME RUN HAPPY: This season, the Mets have hit 105 home runs through their first 84 games, the seventh-most in franchise history during that span... Last season, the Mets had 83 home runs through their first 84 games...The Mets have homered three or more times in a game 13 times this season, surpassing their total from 2022.

D-BACKS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 13-3 over their last 16 games against the Diamondbacks...That span includes an eight-game winning streak from September 9, 2019-May 31, 2021...New York has won the season series against Arizona each season since 2018.

PHAM-TASTIC: Tommy Pham is hitting .591 (13-22) with a 1.670 OPS over his current six-game hitting streak...Has four multi-hit games in his last five contests...He recorded three-straight multi-hit games from June 26-30, his first time accomplishing the feat since June 12-14, 2021 with San Diego.

THE PHAM-NOMENON: Pham is batting .378 (37-98) since May 28 with a 1.125 OPS...He ranks second in the majors in both average and OPS over that span, trailing MLB leaders Luis Arraez (.411 average) and Shohei Ohtani (1.347 OPS)...Has 11 multi-hit efforts and 24 RBI during that timeframe.

WHEN YOU'RE IN SCORING POSITION, YOU'RE PHAMILY: Pham leads the Mets with a .350 (14-40) average with runners in scoring position...Since May 18, has 12 hits in 24 at-bats with RISP...He leads the NL in average (.500), OBP (.581), SLG (1.000) and OPS (1.581) with RISP over that timeframe.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: On Saturday, Francisco Alvarez hit his 13th home run of the season, tying Travis d'Arnaud's franchise record for most home run by a rookie catcher set in 2014...Among NL rookies, Alvarez ranks third in home runs and fourth in SLG with a .460 clip...Alvarez's 13 home runs are the fourth-most in a season by a catcher in his age-21 season or younger behind Johnny Bench (26, age 21, 1969), Darrell Porter (16, age 21, 1973) and Johnny Bench (15, age 20, 1968)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

GIRL DAD POWER: Over the last 15 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .286 (14-49) with 11 runs, two doubles, five home runs, 11 RBI, nine walks, three steals with a .393 OBP and a .633 SLG...Over the last 25 games, Lindor has posted a .917 OPS, batting .253 (21-83) with 16 runs, four doubles, seven home runs, 15 RBI, 15 walks, five steals with a .363 OBP and a .554 SLG...He has posted a 2.5 fWAR this year, which ranks 16th in the National League...His 36 extra-base hits are tied for the 13th most in the National League.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 24-11 (.686) when scoring first this season... The Mets are 14-35 (.286) when their opponent scores first.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have been outscored 59-23 in the first inning this year...New York has posted a 5.79 ERA (54 ER/84.0 IP) in the first inning this season...That is the sixth-highest first inning ERA in the majors...Last year, the Mets posted a 4.39 ERA (79 ER/162.0 IP) in the first frame.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has recorded six home runs over his last 15 games, posting a .922 OPS in that span...Nimmo is batting .317 (32-102) with 10 extra-base hits against left-handed pitchers this year...His .317 average is the seventh-highest mark by a lefty against southpaws this season...It is fourth in the National League behind Miamis Luis Arraez (.385), Philadelphia's Bryson Stott (.329) and Chicago's Cody Bellinger (.323).

DR. ROBERTSON: David Robertson has posted a 2-2 record with 11 saves, and a 1.95 ERA (8 ER/37.0 IP) in 33 appearances this season...He has walked 10, while striking out 44...He ranks ninth in ERA among NL relievers...He is tied for 19th in the NL with 42 punchouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .183 (13-71) average this year.

WHAT A PERFORMANCE!: Congrats to Head Performance Coach Dustin Clarke who will manage the NL's strength and conditioning at the 2023 All-Star Game in Seattle, WA...Clark is in his ninth season as the head performance coach and his 13th season in the organization.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: RHP Mike Vasil was named to the National League 2023 SiriusXM Futures Game roster...The 23-year-old has made 12 starts between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse where he has combined to go 1-3 with a 4.37 ERA (28 ER/57.2 IP) with 13 walks and 66 strikeouts...He was selected by the Mets in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Virginia.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Pitched 6.0 innings against Milwaukee at Citi Field on June 29...Allowed two runs on seven hits...Struck out nine and walked two in the Mets' 3-2 loss.

SNAKE EYES: Arizona drafted Max Scherzer 11th overall in the 2006 First-Year Player Draft and he pitched for the Dbacks from 2008-2009...Scherzer has made 11 starts against his original club in his career...In those starts, he is 8-0 with a 2.38 ERA (19 ER/72.0 IP)...When facing the Diamondbacks on the road, Scherzer has pitched to a 2.81 ERA (10 ER/32.0 IP) in five starts, with a 4-0 record...His last start and last win against the Diamondbacks was on May 14, 2021, when he threw 5.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven at Chase Field.

EIGHT IS GREAT: Scherzer pitched 8.0 innings for the first time this season on June 19 at Houston...The last time Scherzer pitched 8.0 innings or more was September 12, 2021 with the Los Angeles Dodgers...This was Scherzer's first time accomplishing this feat as a Met... Scherzer holds a career record of 47-3 and has a 1.25 ERA (66 ER/475.2 IP) in games where he pitches 8.0 innings or more.

TURNING THINGS AROUND: After pitching to a 5.56 ERA (14 ER/22.2 IP) in his first five starts this season, Scherzer has picked up five wins over his last nine starts (since May 14 at Washington) and has pitched to a 3.17 ERA (19 ER/54.0 IP) during that span...In that time frame, he has tallied 65 strikeouts compared to eight walks, holding opponents to a .249 average and pitching to a 1.11 WHIP.

TERRIFIC TEN: Scherzer whiffed ten batters for the first time this season on June 7 at Atlanta...Marked his first double-digit strikeout game since striking out 11 on August 28, 2022 vs. Colorado...He did not record more than six strikeouts in any of his first eight starts of the season and dating back to his final start of the 2022 season...He has had six strikeouts or fewer in eight straight starts only one other time in his career (September 2009-April 2010 with Arizona/Detroit).

DOUBLE THE FUN: With his start on June 13, Scherzer advanced to third place all-time with 111 double-digit strikeout games in his career, three more than Pedro Martinez...He broke a tie with Roger Clemens, who had 110 in his career...He'll need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

LEGENDARY: Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just 25 punchouts separating the two...With 93 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

OPENING UP: Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day...Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA (15 ER/45.2 IP) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field... Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)... Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP KODAI SENGA (6-5, 3.53)

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed two runs over 5.0 innings on June 28 vs. Milwaukee...Issued two runs and struck out eight batters...Reached the 100-strikeout mark in his 15th career start, becoming the fifth pitcher in franchise history to have 100 or more strikeouts through their first 15 major league starts.

ROOKIE LEADERBOARD: Among rookies, Senga ranks second in strikeouts (101), second in SO/9 (11.13, Min. 50.0 IP) third in innings (81.2) and tied for third in starts (15).
