## BALTIMORE ORIOLES (3-4) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (4-3) April 4, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 4:05 EDT - Game #8/Home #2 RHP Shane Baz (0-0, 6.75 ERA) vs. RHP Carmen Mlodzinski (0-0, 4.15 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** won their third straight game with a 5-4 victory over Baltimore in Friday's Home Opener at PNC Park...Will play two more games vs. the Orioles (today and Sunday) before welcoming San Diego to Pittsburgh for three games (Monday-Wednesday)...Have hit 10 home runs so far, tied for the third-most in Major League Baseball.

**ONE-RUN FUN:** Pittsburgh and Baltimore have had six straight games decided by one run (began on April 6, 2024)...Per OptaStats, it is Pittsburgh's longest stretch of consecutive one-run games against any American League opponent since interleague play began in 1997...It is also tied for the Major League record for consecutive one-run games between any two opponents during interleague play (also San Francisco vs. Anaheim from 1999-2001 and Tampa Bay vs. Houston from 2003-10).

**FULL HOUSE:** A total of 38,986 fans attended Pittsburgh's Home Opener on Friday vs. Baltimore...It was the 10th-largest Home Opener crowd in PNC Park history (since 2001) and was also the largest crowd here since July 20, 2024 vs. Philadelphia (39,114).

**KONNOR IN CONTROL:** Konnor Griffin doubled and brought home Ryan O'Hearn during his first plate appearance in his Major League debut on Friday vs. Baltimore...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, at 19 years and 344 days old, he became the first Pirates teenager to record an extra-base hit in his first Major League plate appearance since pitcher Bob Moose (19 years and 345 days old) recorded a run-scoring triple in his first plate appearance during his MLB debut on September 19, 1967 at Houston...He also became the youngest Pirate with a hit in his MLB debut since Bill Mazerowski (19 years and 306 days) on July 7, 1956 at New York.

**DAZZLING DEBUT:** Konnor Griffin had an RBI double and scored a run in the second inning, while also drawing a walk in the fourth inning, of his MLB debut on Friday vs. Baltimore...He was the first Pirate since RBI became an official statistic in 1920 with a double, an RBI, a walk and a run in his MLB debut...Griffin joined Dick Bartell (October 2, 1927 at Cincinnati) and Bobby Del Greco (April 16, 1952 at St. Louis) as the only Pittsburgh teenagers in the Modern Era (since 1901) to reach base safely at least twice in their MLB debut...He also became the 12th Major League teenager since 1920 with at least one extra-base hit and one RBI in his debut and was the first since Texas' Jurickson Profar did so on September 2, 2012 at Cleveland (Washington's Juan Soto accomplished that in a game vs. New York-AL that was suspended from May 15, 2018 to June 18, 2018, but he appeared in a Major League game for the first time on May 20, 2018 vs. Los Angeles-NL).

**CARMEN'S ELECTRIC:** Carmen Mlodzinski will make his second start of the season this afternoon vs. Baltimore...He struck out a career-high eight batters and did not issue a walk over 4.1 innings during his season debut on March 29 at New York (NL)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he joined Jameson Taillon (April 2, 2018 vs. Minnesota) and Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) as the only Pirates since at least 1893 with at least eight strikeouts and zero walks in their season debut...Mlodzinski also joined Rich Gossage (May 19, 1977 vs. Los Angeles, 3.0 innings of relief) as the only Pittsburgh pitchers during the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least eight strikeouts and issue zero walks in an outing of 4.1 innings pitched or fewer.

**SO(TO) COOL:** Gregory Soto secured his first save (first since last year with Baltimore on July 24 at Cleveland) by striking out three batters in the ninth inning on Friday vs. Baltimore...He joined Angel Perdomo (2023) as the only Pittsburgh relievers in the Modern Era (since 1901) with 11 strikeouts and two or fewer hits allowed in their first five games with the team...His 11 strikeouts are tied for the most among MLB relievers (also Toronto's Jeff Hoffman).

**THE TIME IS LOWE:** Brandon Lowe recorded his 300th career extra-base hit with his first-inning double off Baltimore starter Kyle Bradish in Pittsburgh's 5-4 win on Friday afternoon here at PNC Park...Lowe has hit safely in five of his first six games with the Pirates, going 7-for-21 (.333) with three runs, two doubles, three home runs, four RBI and five walks...He is the only Pittsburgh player in the Modern Era (since 1901) with at least five extra-base hits and five walks in his first six games with the organization.

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

**April 4, 2007:** The Pirates completed a season-opening, three-game sweep of the Astros with a 5-4 win at Minute Maid Park. It was Pittsburgh's first sweep in Houston since sweeping a three-game series from May 14-16, 1991 at the Astrodome. José Bautista went 3-for-5 with an RBI double and a two-RBI single. Tom Gorzelanny earned the win after striking out four batters in 5.0 innings of work.

**FOR STARTERS:** Mlodzinski (pronounced "ma-JINSK-ee") was a member of Pittsburgh's Opening Day roster for the second consecutive season...The 27-year-old is in his fourth season with the team...He was drafted out of the University of South Carolina in 2020.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Mlodzinski had a no-decision after allowing two runs and striking out a career-high eight batters (did not issue a walk) over 4.1 innings on March 29 at Citi Field (The Pirates defeated the Mets, 4-3, in 10 innings)...He became the second Pirates pitcher (first starter) during the Modern Era to have at least eight strikeouts while issuing zero walks in an outing of 4.1 innings pitched or fewer, joining Rich Gossage, who did so across 3.0 innings in his relief appearance on May 19, 1977 vs. Los Angeles.

**AGAINST THE ORIOLAS:** Mlodzinski tossed 2.0 scoreless innings of relief in his only career appearance against Baltimore (last season on September 10 at Camden Yards).

**HALT THE HOMERS:** Mlodzinski has not allowed a home run in 51.0 consecutive innings, dating back to his appearance last season on July 6 at Seattle...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the second-longest active streak among Major League pitchers, behind Boston's Garrett Whitlock (52.2 innings, began last season on May 17).

**ON THE HOME FRONT:** Today will mark Mlodzinski's first game back at PNC Park since working 3.0 scoreless innings of relief and earning a win last year on September 21 vs. the A's...He had a 2.64 ERA (47.2ip/14er) in 16 games (five starts) here last season.

**STARTING US OFF:** Mlodzinski is in Pittsburgh's starting rotation to begin the year for a second straight season...He went 1-4 with a 5.67 ERA (39.2ip/25er) over nine starts from March 31-May 17 before being optioned to Triple-A Indianapolis on May 21...Mlodzinski was recalled on June 11 after going 2-0 with a 1.15 ERA (15.2ip/2er) and 16 strikeouts over three starts with the Indians...He went 4-4 with a 2.12 ERA (59.1ip/14er) and 61 strikeouts over 25 appearances (three starts) after he was recalled...Mlodzinski had a 4.99 ERA (48.2ip/27er) over 12 Major League starts in 2025.

**RELIABLE RELIEVER:** Mlodzinski posted a 2.15 ERA (50.1ip/12er) and 53 strikeouts in 22 relief appearances with Pittsburgh last season...His 2.15 ERA out of the bullpen ranked 10th in the National League among relievers with at least 50.0 innings pitched.

**FINISHING STRONG:** Mlodzinski pitched to a 1.63 ERA (55.1ip/10er) and recorded 58 strikeouts over his final 23 games (three starts) last season (June 21 onward)...He did not allow more than two runs in any of those 23 appearances...Mlodzinski's 1.63 ERA in that stretch was the best among all Major League pitchers (minimum 50.0 innings).

**DODGING THE DOG DAYS:** Mlodzinski had a 1.80 ERA (15.0ip/3er), 16 strikeouts and a 0.87 WHIP in six relief appearances during the month of July last season...He joined Miami's Tyler Phillips (15.1ip, 0.59 ERA) and Colorado's Jimmy Herget (15.0ip, 2.40 ERA) as the only Major League relievers to pitch at least 15.0 innings during the month.

**MEET THE MAN:** Mlodzinski was selected by Pittsburgh in the Competitive Balance A round (31st overall) out of the University of South Carolina in the 2020 First-Year Player Draft, the same draft in which the team selected infielder Nick Gonzales in the first round (seventh overall) and right-handed pitcher Jared Jones in the second round (44th overall)...Mlodzinski's younger brother, Julian, is currently in his second season with Florida International University following two seasons as a junior college pitcher.
